**RAY REPORT**—The Rays begin a six-game homestand against the Marlins (three to play) and the Orioles (three to play) tonight at Tropicana Field...have won 10 of 12, 16 of 19, and 23 of their last 30 games...have won nine of their last 11 series openers (April 6–pres.), and gone on to win six straight series...since April 4, have the majors' best record (26-9) and ERA (3.04)...own MLB's second-best record overall behind the Braves (30-14)...are tied for the third-best start in club history (see table on the right) in spite of having the fourth-toughest strength of schedule thus far (.506)...have led the AL East for six straight days...have spent 12 days atop the division, 25 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth.

- ★ The Rays fell, 5-3, to the Blue Jays in the series finale on Wednesday via a **Daulton Varsho** walk-off grand slam in the 10th inning...marked the 15th walk-off grand slam against the Rays in franchise history and the first since **Shohei Ohtani** on Aug. 23, 2024 at LAD.
- ★ Defensively, the Rays turned four double plays in the contest, one shy of the franchise record (8x, last: July 16, 2012 vs. CLE) and their most since April 12, 2025 vs. ATL (also 4DP).
- ★ **Yandy Diaz** recorded an RBI-single in the 10th inning for his second hit of the game...marked his 273rd multi-hit game in a Rays uniform, surpassing **Ben Zobrist** (272) for third most in franchise history.
- ★ The loss ended a run of five straight wins in extra-inning games (April 5–May 12), tied for the fourth-longest streak in franchise history (4x, last: Aug. 18, 2024–April 24, 2025)...marked the second extra-inning loss for the Rays in 2026 (also: March 28 at STL)...marked the club's first loss when leading after the 7th inning this season (21-1).
- ★ The Rays had won each of their last 17 games where they scored first, the second-longest streak in club history, per Elias.
- ★ Despite the loss, the club is 16-3 in its last 19 games, tied for their fourth-best stretch in franchise history...the surge has boosted their postseason odds from 28.5 pct. (April 21) to 81.5 pct. entering play today, a 53.0 pct. increase (FanGraphs)...the Cubs (+19.2%) have the second-largest odds increase over that timeframe.
- ★ The Rays have won six straight series openers, their longest streak since a span of 10 straight from May 23–June 24, 2025—that stretch was the second longest in team history and one shy of the franchise record (11G) established from April 21–May 26, 2023.

**RECENT TRANSACTIONS**—Today, the Rays designated RHP **Aaron Brooks** for assignment and recalled RHP **Trevor Martin** from Triple-A Durham...they currently have 39 players on their 40-man roster.

**AN OPENING ACT**—**Ian Seymour** will start tonight as an opener, with **Jesse Scholtens** scheduled to handle bulk innings in relief...Seymour is set for his first start of the season and the sixth of his career (last: Sept. 28, 2025 at TOR)...the Rays have used an opener on three occasions this season, split between **Griffin Jax** (April 26 vs. MIN & May 2 vs. SF) and **Cole Sulser** (April 15 at CWS), and have went 3-0 in those contests...since first introducing the concept on May 19, 2018 at LAA with **Sergio Romo** opening for **Ryan Yarbrough**, the Rays have gone 111-72 (.607) when using an opener and 564-446 (.558) in all other games.

★ With the exception of 2025 (0-1), they have produced a winning record when employing an opener in each season since 2018...the Rays went 6-5 with an opener in 2024, 12-9 in 2023 and 2022, 14-7 in 2021, 6-1 in 2020, 26-17 in 2019, and 32-23 in 2018.

**TIP TROP SHAPE**—The Rays have won 10 straight games at Tropicana Field, their longest home winning streak since a franchise-record 14-game run to open the 2023 season (March 30–April 24)...it ties the fourth-longest streak in club history (also: April 21–May 4, 2012)...the Rays have held opponents to three runs or fewer in all 10 games of the winning streak, the second-longest stretch at home in franchise history behind a 14-game streak from Aug. 13–Sept. 5, 2022...they have outscored opponents, 44-12, during the streak and out-homered them, 10-4...they have trailed in only two of the 10 contests, falling behind the Blue Jays 2-0 and 3-2 on May 5 and facing a 1-0 deficit against the Giants on May 3...the Rays staff has pitched to a 1.19 ERA (91.OIP, 12ER) at home since the streak began.

★ Rays pitchers posted a 0.98 ERA (55.OIP, 6ER) during their previous homestand (May 1-6 vs. SF/TOR)—per Elias, it was the lowest ERA in a multi-series homestand in team history, surpassing a 1.32 (75.OIP, 11ER) from Aug. 18-25, 2022 (vs. KC/LAA).

★ The Rays 14-4 home record is the second best in the majors behind the Cubs (18-5)...it is tied for their second-best start at home in franchise history with the 2012 team and behind only 2023 (16-2)...only the 2023 team (17-2) has won 15 or more of their first 19.

**MAY FLOWERS**—**Jonathan Aranda** is slashing .467/.545/.667 (7-for-15) with 1 HR, 4 RBI, and a 1.212 OPS during a season-best five-game hitting streak (May 8–pres)...he paces the majors in average (.462/18-for-39) and OBP (.531) during May, and ranks highly in hits (T2nd) and OPS (4th, 1.095)...among qualified hitters over that span, he trails only **CIN JJ Bleday** (1.184), **ATH Shea Langeliers** (1.172), **NYG Cody Bellinger** (1.152), and **MIN Byron Buxton** (1.136) in OPS...his 33 RBI lead the AL, marking the fourth-latest into a season a Rays hitter has led the Junior Circuit in RBI, earlier than only **Evan Longoria** in 2010 (May 22) and 2009 (June 9) and **Austin Meadows** in 2021 (June 10), per Stats Perform...it is the seventh-most RBI by a Ray through the club's first 42 games and marks the most since **Randy Arozarena** (35) in 2023.

★ In his last 23 games (April 18–pres.), he is batting .346 (27-for-78) with 1 2B, 5 HR, 18 RBI, a .442 OBP, and a .993 OPS...his .346 average is the fourth best in the AL and seventh best in the majors during that timeframe.

**THE RAY WAY**—The Rays staff ranks highly in the majors in saves (1st, 19), opp. average (3rd, .217), opp. OPS (.648), WHIP (4th, 1.17), and ERA (5th, 3.49)...they have posted a top-six WHIP in the majors in each of the last nine seasons (2017-25), MLB's longest active streak...the Rays have permitted three runs or fewer 21 times (T4th in AL), going 19-2 in those games compared to a 9-12 mark when allowing four runs or more...they have held opponents to two runs or fewer 16 times (T4th) and one or zero runs 11 times (T1st).

★ The rotation paces the majors in WHIP (1.08) and opp. on-base pct. (.271) while ranking second in ERA (3.00) behind the Braves (2.96)...this includes an MLB-best 2.91 ERA (176.OIP, 57ER) in their last 35 starts dating back to April 4.

★ Despite yielding 11 runs over the last two games, the Rays bullpen's 2.08 ERA (69.1IP, 16ER) over the last 19 games still leads the majors (April 22–pres)...the Rays are the only team in MLB that has not lost when leading after five innings (21-0)...their seven blown lead losses are tied for the third-fewest in baseball (also: BAL, CHI, CIN, LAD, SF, STL), behind only the Padres and Rangers (6 each)...they had five blown lead losses in their first seven games compared to two in their last 35 games (April 19 at PIT - led 2-1, lost 6-3 & May 13 at TOR - led 3-1, lost 5-3).

**NATIONAL PASTIME**—The Rays have won each of their last four games against the NL (April 22–pres.) on the heels of a 4-10 start in Interleague games...MLB began scheduling teams to play each of the 15 teams in the opposite league in 2023...since 2023, the Rays have a 89-69 record (.563) in Interleague games, the best mark over that span in the AL.

★ **Chandler Simpson** is batting .333 (58-for-174) in 46 career Interleague games with 4 2B, 2 3B, 13 RBI, and 14 SB...he posted a 13-game hitting streak between March 26–April 20, tied for the fifth-longest streak in team history against the NL...he has hit safely in 16 of 18 Interleague contests this season and reached base in 17 of 18.

★ **Junior Caminero** has hit safely in nine straight (April 17–pres.) against the NL...over that span, he is slashing .314/.400/.600 (11-for-35) with 1 2B, 3 HR, 6 RBI, and a 1.000 OPS...he has hit safely in 14 of 18 Interleague games this season and reached base safely in 15.

**FINDING MARLIN**—The Rays and Marlins are set to meet in the Citrus Series as part of MLB's second annual Rivalry Weekend...the Rays lead the all-time series, 84-63, after the clubs split the 2025 season series 3-3...the Rays have won eight of 12, 16 of 21, and 28 of their last 35 against the Marlins...Tampa Bay has won 11 of its last 14 series against Miami, including eight straight from May 14, 2019–Aug. 31, 2022...since 2019, the Rays 27-7 (.794) record is the best by any team against a single opponent (min. 20G).

★ Five active players tonight (**Nick Fortes**, **Cole Sulser**, **MIA Pete Fairbanks**, **MIA Calvin Faucher**, and **MIA Christopher Morel**) have played for both clubs in their careers.

★ The Rays held an all-time record of 46-47 against Miami prior to **Kevin Cash** becoming manager in 2015...under Cash, the club is 38-16 and won a franchise-best nine straight games against the Marlins between July 22, 2018–Sept. 4, 2020.

★ In five games against the Marlins last season, **Yandy Diaz** went 7-for-21 (.333) with 1 2B, 1 HR, 6 RBI, a .524 slugging pct., and an .887 OPS.

**TONIGHT'S APPEARANCE**—Jesse Scholtens will take the mound tonight after opener LHP Ian Seymour for his seventh appearance of the 2026 season...marks his first career appearance against Miami and his fourth at Tropicana Field...was claimed off of waivers on Aug. 4, 2025 from the White Sox.

- ✦ A win tonight would mark Scholtens' fifth career victory and his third straight win at Tropicana Field, joining Shane McClanahan (April 25-pres.) as Rays arms to turn the trick this season...all four of Scholtens' career wins have come after pitching behind an opener.
- ✦ Will mark his first career appearance during MLB's "Rivalry Weekend".

**LAST TIME OUT**—On May 8 at BOS, made his second start of the season and first on the road, yielding his only two hits on home runs by Willyer Abreu and Cedanne Rafaela...walked a pair of batters in the opening frame and retired 13 of his next 16 BF before issuing free passes to his final 2 BF...the four walks tied a career high (also: Aug. 19, 2025 at COL with CWS)...marked the second time this season that both hits given up by a Rays starter were long balls and resulted in a loss, joining Shane McClanahan on March 31 at MIL...his 91 pitches thrown signaled the second time he eclipsed 90 pitches in 2026, joining his 95-pitch outing on April 20 vs. CIN...Scholtens generated a 36.0 pct. (4-of-11) whiff rate on his sinker against the Red Sox, his highest rate on the pitch in any outing this season.

**GOT FISH TO FRY**—Miami is one of nine clubs that he has yet to face (AZ, HOU, LAD, MIA, NYY, PHI, SD, STL, and TB).

- ✦ In three career outings (all relief) against NL East clubs, Scholtens has gone 0-0 with a 10.80 ERA (5.0IP, 6ER) and two strikeouts...has not faced an NL East opponent since Sept. 20, 2023 at WSH (968 days), when he yielded six earned runs on six hits, including two homers, across 2.0 innings of work.
- ✦ In Interleague games, Scholtens has posted a 1-3 career record with a 6.34 ERA (32.2IP, 23ER) across 10 appearances (three starts).

**THE LIFE OF A SWINGMAN**—The right-hander has made 34 career appearances and 13 starts in the majors, with 19 of the 34 being 4.0 innings or more...as a starter in his career, he is 0-8 with a 5.91 ERA (64.0IP, 42ER) and 48 strikeouts compared to a 4-4 record with one save, a 3.65 ERA (56.2IP, 23ER), and 43 strikeouts as a reliever...in those 13 career starts, he has received three runs of support or more on two occasions (2.53 RSA)...as a reliever, he has a 5.72 RSA (56.2IP, 36RS).

**SPLIT CITY**—Scholtens has posted reverse splits through six appearances this season, limiting left-handed batters to a .196 average (10-for-51) compared to a .235 (12-for-51) mark against righties...has followed a similar pattern over his career, holding LHB to a .232 (51-for-245) clip and RHB to a .309 (80-for-285) average.

**TROPS OF JUPITER**—Tonight's contest marks his fourth outing of the season at Tropicana Field...his most recent came behind opener Griffin Jax on May 2 vs. SF, when he earned his second win of the year after spinning 3.0 innings of one-run ball on four hits, no walks and three strikeouts in a 5-1 victory over the Giants.

- ✦ Is 3-4 with a 4.99 ERA (52.1IP, 29ER) and 41 strikeouts over 14 career home games (five starts)...he has worked 2.0 innings or more in 12 of the 14 outings, but his teams have gone 4-10 in those games.
- ✦ Both of Scholtens' wins as a Ray have come inside Tropicana Field: April 26 vs. MIN and May 2 vs. SF.

**SLIDE AROUND**—Has thrown his slider 33.2 pct. of the time in 2026, second highest among AL pitchers (min. 400 pitches) behind only TEX Kumar Rocker (35.7%)...Scholtens has limited opponents to a .182/.206/.424 (6-for-33) slash line against the pitch this year.

**CAREER RECAP**—Began the year in the White Sox organization in 2025, making his season debut May 6 with Triple-A Charlotte in his first appearance post-Tommy John surgery after suffering a rehab setback during spring training...made eight appearances (6 starts) with the Knights, but was designated for assignment Aug. 3 before being claimed off waivers by the Rays Aug. 4 and optioned to Triple-A Durham...made seven starts with the Bulls before he was recalled Sept. 20 and finished the year in the majors.

- ✦ Made two appearances with the Rays out of the bullpen...on Sept. 20 vs. BOS, worked 3.0 IP with 1 ER allowed in his first major league outing since Sept. 20, 2023 at WSH...on Sept. 25 at BAL, collected a career-high 9 SO over 5.1 IP of relief, generating a career-high 17 whiffs, most by a Rays reliever in the pitch-tracking era (since 2008)...tied Ryan Yarbrough (May 31, 2018 at OAK) for the most strikeouts by a reliever in franchise history.
- ✦ Had a 34.2 pct. whiff rate, 31.6 pct. strikeout rate and 32.1 pct. chase rate...his 12 SO marked the most in team history through a pitcher's first two relief appearances with the Rays, surpassing Cooper Criswell (10) in 2023.
- ✦ Across 17 outings (15 starts) between Triple-A Durham (7 starts), Triple-A Charlotte (8G/6GS), and Class-A Winston-Salem (2 starts), went 2-2 with a 4.72 ERA (68.2IP, 36ER)...allowed 3 ER or fewer in 14 of the 17 appearances.
- ✦ Missed the 2024 season after suffering a torn right UCL during spring training that required March 1 Tommy John surgery, performed by Dr. Keith Meister in Arlington, Tx. ...placed on the 60-day IL on Feb. 27 and spent the year rehabbing at the White Sox training complex in Arizona.
- ✦ Broke into the majors in 2023, appearing in 26 games (11 starts) after the White Sox selected his contract on April 7...was in the majors from April 7-13, May 22-June 1, and June 16-end of season...made his final appearance on Sept. 20 at WSH and was placed on the 15-day IL on Sept. 24 with a left calf strain.
