**THIS DATE IN ORIOLES HISTORY**  
On this date in 1969, LHP Dave McNally improved his record to 16-1 and went 1-for-4 at the plate with a two-run home run as the Orioles defeated the Kansas City Royals, 10-2, at Memorial Stadium.



**ALL ABOUT THAT (ON) BASE:** The Orioles rank fourth in the American League and ninth in the majors with a .735 team OPS (on-base percentage plus slugging percentage)...INF Renato Núñez (.996) leads the team and ranks 13<sup>th</sup> in the AL in OPS among qualifying hitters.

**RACKING UP THE K'S:** From July 29-August 2, O's pitchers struck out at least 10 batters in five consecutive games, setting a new club record...The previous record of four-straight had been done three times...The O's have recorded 10-or-more strikeouts in seven of their 11 games this season.

- ✪ The Orioles rank fourth in the AL and ninth in the majors with a 9.26 strikeouts per 9.0 innings mark (106 K/103.0 IP).
- ✪ Orioles starting pitchers rank eighth in the AL and are tied for 15<sup>th</sup> in the majors with 53 strikeouts...Only Rays starters (58 K) have more among AL East clubs.

**FORGET ABOUT IT:** The Orioles fell to the Marlins by a score of 8-7 in Thursday night's four-game series finale...The loss marked the O's first time being swept in four games by Miami in franchise history...The series was marred by a doubleheader sweep by the Marlins on Wednesday in which the O's fell 1-0 in Game 1 and 2-1 in Game 2.

- ✪ Prior to Thursday, the Orioles were swept in three-game series three times: September 1-3, 1997 at Florida, July 15-17, 2001 at Florida, and June 23-25, 2009 at Florida.
- ✪ The Orioles fell to 8-26 all-time against the Marlins (since 1997).

**TAKE A CHANCE:** C Chance Sisco led off the fourth inning with his first home run of the season on Thursday night, and his first since August 31, 2019 at Kansas City...He improved his average on the year to .455 (5-for-11) to lead all catchers in the majors with at least 10 at-bats.

**HOMER HAPPY:** Renato Núñez collected his first multi-homer game of the season on Thursday night, and the third of his career (last: June 29, 2019 vs. Cleveland)...He has hit safely in nine of the first 12 games, including recording an extra-base hit in seven of the 12.

- ✪ Dwight Smith, Jr. and Renato Núñez hit back-to-back home runs to lead off the sixth inning in Thursday's loss...It marked the second time this season the Orioles have hit back-to-back home runs.

**INTERLEAGUE INFO:** The O's will play a total of 20 games against National League opponents this season, including contests with the Miami Marlins (0-4), Washington Nationals (six games), Philadelphia Phillies (three games), New York Mets (four games), and Atlanta Braves (three games)...Since Interleague Play began in 1997, the O's are 197-230...The O's went 7-13 in Interleague Play last season...Baltimore's 14 Interleague victories in 2016 were the most in club history.

**THAT HANSER IS SO HOT RIGHT NOW:** Since the start of the 2019 season, INF Hanser Alberto leads the majors with 94 hits off of left-handed pitching (20 more than the next on the list)...In that time, he also leads the majors with a .407 (94-for-231) average against lefties... This season, Alberto ranks tied for eighth in the AL with a .333 (17-for-51) against all pitchers.

**ROUGH ROAD AHEAD:** Based on 2019 winning percentages, the Orioles own the second-toughest strength of schedule in the American League (tied for third-toughest in the majors)...The Orioles will play four of last year's 10 postseason teams in 2020...The toughest 2020 schedules based on 2019 winning percentages:

**SABR 50 2.0:** The Society for American Baseball Research (SABR) has announced that their 50<sup>th</sup> national convention will be held in Baltimore from June 16-20, 2021...SABR 50 was originally scheduled for July 2020, but was rescheduled due to the COVID-19 pandemic...The SABR national convention is an annual gathering of writers, researchers, fans, players, executives, scouts, and many others throughout the baseball community...Attendance is open to all baseball fans...For more information, visit [SABR.org/convention](http://SABR.org/convention).

**#F16HT AGAINST COLON CANCER:** INF/OF Trey Mancini has teamed up with the Colorectal Cancer Alliance to raise awareness for colon cancer...Mancini participates in the organization's "Never Too Young" advisory board, which advocates for all young-onset patients and survivors...In support of Mancini's fight and his partnership with the CCA, the O's are selling #F16HT t-shirts to benefit the Alliance...All net proceeds from the shirts will benefit the Colorectal Cancer Alliance Patient and Family Support Services...The shirts are available for \$25, sold exclusively at [Orioles.com/Auctions](http://Orioles.com/Auctions).

**INJURED LIST:** Four players are on the Injured List...RHP Hunter Harvey (right forearm strain) and RHP Dillon Tate (right elbow contusion) are on the 10-day Injured List...INF/OF Trey Mancini (colorectal cancer recovery/treatment) and INF Richie Martin (right wrist fracture) are on the 60-day IL...LHP John Means is currently on the bereavement list.

**COACHING STAFF:** The O's named Fredi González as Major League Coach, Darren Holmes as Bullpen Coach, and Anthony Sanders as First Base Coach...José Hernández shifted from Major League Coach to Assistant Hitting Coach...All other coaches remained in their same positions from the 2019 season: Doug Brocail as Pitching Coach, Tim Cossins as Major League Field Coordinator/Catching Instructor, José Flores as Third Base Coach, and Don Long as Hitting Coach.

**THE SKIPPER:** Brandon Hyde was named the 20<sup>th</sup> manager in O's history on December 14, 2018...He began his first Major League managerial role following 16 professional seasons in the coaching ranks and four as a player...Most recently, Hyde served as bench coach for the Chicago Cubs in 2018, his second season in that role (also 2014)...Hyde spent three seasons as the Cubs first base coach from 2015-17, and previously served as Chicago's Director of Player Development from August 2012-2013, after joining the Cubs in December of 2011 as their Minor League Field Coordinator...Prior to joining the Cubs, Hyde spent nine seasons in the Marlins organization.

**LAST START:** Made his first home start as an Oriole on 8/2 against the Rays... Did not factor in the decision after tossing 5.0 innings and allowing just one run on six hits and one home run...Struck out eight batters, which was his most since 8/1/18 vs. NYM when he racked up nine strikeouts.

**CAREER VS. WASHINGTON:** Has pitched in two games (both starts) against the Nationals in his career...He holds a 1-0 record and 0.73 ERA (1 ER/12.1 IP) with 12 strikeouts through his first two starts...His most recent start against Washington came on 8/27/17 when he tossed 4.1 innings and allowed one run on six hits and one walk with five strikeouts.

**FAMILIAR FACES:** Milone spent the 2011 and 2018 seasons with the Nationals...He was originally drafted by the Nationals in the 10th round of the 2008 MLB First-Year Player Draft...In six career games (five starts) at Nationals Park, he is 1-1 with a 5.74 ERA (20 ER/31.1 IP) and 26 strikeouts...In 93 career road games (72 starts), Milone has gone 26-27 with a 4.56 ERA (229 ER/452.0 IP) with 344 strikeouts...On the road, opponents are batting .274 (490-for-1786) with 71 home runs against him.

**AGAINST THE NL EAST:** Milone has made 15 outings (10 starts) against NL East opponents in his career...He is 4-1 with a 4.41 ERA (32 ER/65.1 IP) and has 50 strikeouts through his first 15 appearances...NL East opponents are batting .267 (67-for-251) with 25 extra-base hits (nine doubles, four triples, and 12 home runs) against Milone.

**GETTING THE NOD:** As a starter, Milone owns a 47-40 record and 4.33 ERA (370 ER/769.2 IP) in 138 career starts, compared to his 3-8 record and 5.50 ERA (69 ER/113.0 IP) in 38 outings as a reliever...Made six starts in 2019 and went 1-3 with a 4.65 ERA (16 ER/31.0 IP) while holding opponents to a .252 (30-for-119) clip...Made 17 appearances out of the bullpen in 2019 and pitched to a 3-7 record and 4.80 ERA (43 ER/80.2 IP) with a .237 (72-for-304) opponent average...Tossed four-or-more innings in 16 of his 17 relief appearances in 2019.

**HOME WOES:** Made 12 appearances (four starts) at home last season, and posted a 1-6 record with a 5.46 ERA (37 ER/61.0 IP), compared to 3-4 with a 3.91 ERA (22 ER/50.2 IP) in 11 appearances (two starts) on the road...Made his third career start (fourth appearance) at Oriole Park on 8/2, and now owns a 0-0 record and 3.63 ERA (7 ER/17.1 IP) with four home runs allowed and 17 strikeouts in these outings.

**OPENING DAY:** Made his Orioles debut and first career Opening Day start on 7/24 at Boston...Was dealt the loss after surrendering four runs on four hits and three walks with five strikeouts through 3.0 innings...Milone now owns a career 0-4 record and 9.57 ERA (28 ER/26.1 IP) in six starts against Boston.

**HURT BY THE LONG BALL:** Milone surrendered 24 home runs in 2019, tying the second-highest total in his career (also allowed 24 in 2012 with Oakland)...It was his highest home run total in a season since he allowed 25 home runs with Oakland in 2013...Allowed his first home run of the 2020 season on 8/2 off the bat of Tampa Bay's second baseman Brandon Lowe.
