## CINCINNATI REDS (35-38) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (35-38) June 19, 2024 at PNC Park, Pittsburgh, PA - 12:35 EDT - GAME \#74/HOME \#36 RHP HUNTER GREENE ( $5-2,3.61$ ERA) vs. RHP MITCH KELLER ( $8-4,3.36$ ERA)

THE PIRATES:..lost 2-1 last night in the middle game of their current three-game series against the Reds...Are $8-4$ in their last 12 games against Cincinnati, including 6-3 at PNC Park in that time...Have gone 12-12, including 7-6 at home, in one-run games...Have won eight games in their last at-bat (won 10 in all of 2023)...Have gone $27-3$ (. 900 winning percentage) when outhitting their opponents this season.

GIMME FIVE: Mitch Keller worked 6.0 innings in his last start Thursday at St. Louis, giving him 45 straight starts of working at least 5.0 innings in a game...lt's the longest active streak in all of MLB coming into today and the longest in MLB since Max Fried had 50 straight from June 6, 2021 to September, 30, 2022...It's also the longest streak by a Pirate since A.J. Burnett made 49 straight starts of at least 5.0 innings from May 8, 2012, to August 10, 2013.

STRIKING DISTANCE: Mitch Keller enters today's action one strikeout shy of 600 in his career... He has also whiffed 284 batters in 58 career games at PNC Park and currently ranks sixth on the PNC Park strikeout list...Zach Duke is fifth with 286 and A.J. Burnett is fourth with 294...Only three pitchers have struck out 300 or more batters in their career at PNC Park; Paul Maholm (383), Francisco Liriano (371) and Gerrit Cole (356).

ON DECK: The Pirates are off tomorrow but will return to action Friday night here at PNC Park to begin a three-game series against the Rays...It will be Tampa Bay's first visit to PNC Park since 2017 and fourth one ever in the ballpark's history along with 2005 and 2008.

CARMEN'S ELECTRIC: Carmen Mlodzinski allowed a leadoff single before the retiring the next three batters he faced Tuesday night against the Reds...Since being scored upon four times in his first five appearances from May 17-31, Mlodzinski has recorded an 0.84 ERA (10.2ip/1er), . 162 batting average against and 0.84 WHIP in his last eight appearances (two starts).

BRYAN WITH THE BAT: Bryan Reynolds has recorded 44 hits since May 13 when he went 5 -for5 against the Brewers...Since May 13, Reynolds' 44 hits are the third-most in all of MLB behind Luis Arraez (46) and Bobby Witt Jr. (46)...Reynolds is also tied for ninth in all of MLB during that time in total bases (72).

LET'S GO REYNOLDS: Bryan Reynolds is hitting .358 (24-for-67) with eight doubles, a triple, two home runs and nine RBI during his current season-high 16-game hitting streak...It's the longest active hitting streak in MLB coming into today (the longest hitting streak this season in MLB is 21 games, which was accomplished by Ketel Marte and Anthony Volpe)...Reynolds' hitting streak is also the longest by a Pirate since 2019...That year Reynolds hit safely in a career-high 17 straight games, while Kevin Newman had a 19-game hitting streak.

HOT ROWD: Rowdy Tellez went 2-for-4 with a pair of doubles in Monday's win against the Reds...Tellez is hitting .429 (15-for-35) with four doubles, a home run, nine RBI and 1.102 OPS in his first 11 games of this month.

KEEPING BUSY AT THE HOT CORNER: Ke'Bryan Hayes became the second third baseman (also Jose Ramirez on May 17) this season in MLB to turn three double plays after doing so last night... It was the third time in his career Hayes turned three double plays in a game...Hayes also comes into today third among all third basemen in the National League with a .971 fielding percentage.

ANDREW ON THE BASES: Andrew McCutchen comes into today with a season-high 11-game on-base streak (it's tied for the second-longest by a Pirate this year)...During his current 11-game on-base streak, McCutchen is hitting . 295 (13-for-44) with two doubles, two home runs and a . 367 on-base percentage.
ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY
June 19, 2014: Russell Martin drew a base on balls in the 12th inning in the first walkoff walk in PNC Park history, as the Pirates defeated

## 2024 RECORD: 8-4, 3.36 ERA

HEIGHT/WEIGHT: 6-2/205<br>BATS/THROWS: R/R<br>BORN: April 4, 1996<br>AGE: 28<br>SIGNED: Thru 2028<br>HOW ACQUIRED: Selected by the Pirates in the 2nd round of the 2014 Draft.

STARTING OFF: The 28 -year-old righthander is in his sixth Major League season, all with the Pirates...Keller signed a five-year contract extension through the 2028 season on February 22, 2024...The 2023 All-Star has been Pittsburgh's Opening Day starter in each of the last two seasons, making him the first Pirate to do so since Francisco Liriano started three straight season openers from 2014-16...He was selected by the Pirates in the second round of the 2014 First Year Player Draft.

LAST TIME OUT: Snapped a streak of six consecutive starts with a winning decision on June 13 at St. Louis...Took the loss after allowing four runs on eight hits with four strikeouts against no walks in 6.0 innings of work.

He was the first Pirates right-handed pitcher since Gerrit Cole from May 22-June
18,2015 to win at least six consecutive starts.
LEAGUE LEADERS: Keller enters play among the NL leaders in several categories, including tied for third in wins (8), seventh in run support (53), ninth in innings pitched (85.2) and 12th in home runs per 9.0 IP (0.84).

VS. CINCINNATI: Keller will be making his 15th career start against the Reds and his first of the 2024 season...He made three starts against Cincinnati in 2023, going 1-0 with a 3.78 ERA (7 ER in 16.2 IP).

- Is 1-0 with a 2.12 ERA (4 ER in 17.0 IP) in his last three starts against Cincinnati at PNC Park since Sept. 27, 2022.

CENTRAL PERK: Keller has gone 4-1 with a 3.51 ERA ( 15 ER in 48.2 IP) in his last eight starts against teams from the National League Central since August 13, 2023.

DAY MAN: Today marks Keller's ninth day game start of the season, which will tie him for the National League lead in that category this season with MIA Trevor Rogers and PHI Zack Wheeler...Dating back to last season, this will be Keller's 22nd day game start, which is the third-most among NL hurlers trailing only WSH Patrick Corbin (24) and PHI Zack Wheeler (23)

ALL HE DOES IS WIN: Keller posted his seventh win of the season on June 1, marking the second consecutive year he had seven wins by June 1 (was 7-1 in 2023)... Prior to Keller doing so last year, the last Pirate with seven-plus wins through play on June 1 was Gerrit Cole (8) in 2015.

- Keller is the first Pirate to have seven-plus wins through June 1 in consecutive years since Howie Camnitz from 1908 (7) to 1909 (8)...The only other Pirates to accomplish this feat were Frank Killen in 1896 (10) and 1897 (8) (courtesy of Elias Sports Bureau).
Keller is the fifth MLB pitcher since 2013 to reach seven-plus wins by June 1 in back-to-back seasons...The other four: Justin Verlander ('18-'19) Clayton Kershaw ('16-'17) Felix Hernandez ('14-'15) Adam Wainwright ('13-'14) [Source: OptaStats].

IT'S GOING TO BE MAY: In four starts in the month of May, Keller went $4-0$ with a 1.30 ERA (27.2ip/4er) and a . 212 opponents average...He ranked in the top 10 in the NL in several categories, including complete games (T1st, 1), wins (2nd), ERA (3rd), opponents OPS (9th, .572 ) and opponents slugging percentage (10th, .313 ).

GETTING IT DONE: In seven starts since the beginning of May, Keller owns a 1.77 ERA ( 9 ER in 45.2 IP) and .238 (41-for-172) batting average against... His ERA in that time is the best mark in the NL and third in the Majors behind only CWS Garret Crochet (1.13) and NYY Luis Gil (1.14).

- He has allowed two or fewer runs in six of those seven starts in that time.

COMPLETE GAME MITCH: On May 6 vs. Los Angeles-AL, Keller threw his second career complete game, with the other being on May 8, 2023 vs. Colorado.

LAST SEASON: In 2023, Mitch Keller set the franchise record by a right-handed pitcher with 210 strikeouts, surpassing the previous mark of 209 held by A.J. Burnett in 2013.. Keller also rewrote the Pirates record book for strikeouts at various points throughout the season, including being the first pitcher in team history to record $90+$ strikeouts prior to June 1 as well as being the first Pirates pitcher in the Modern Era (since 1900 ) to record eight or more strikeouts in seven consecutive starts from April 27-May 31.
