**RAY REPORT**—The Rays continue a nine-game, 11-day, season-opening road trip through St. Louis (1-2), Milwaukee (1-0, two to play), and Minnesota (three to play) tonight at American Family Field...marks the longest road trip to begin a season in club history...are .500 or better through four games for the eighth straight season (2019-26)...are opening with back-to-back Interleague series for the second time, joining 2025 (COL, PIT)...are opening with a road trip for the eighth time, first since 2021, and second time in the last 17 seasons (2010-26)...are scheduled for five games in March, most in franchise history, more than their four in 2025, 2024, and 2019...will return to Tropicana Field on April 6 vs. CHC, their first game at the ballpark in 561 days (Sept. 22, 2024 vs. TOR).

- \* A pair of solo homers from **Yandy Diaz** (leadoff) and **Jonny DeLuca** and a go-ahead double in the 9th inning by **Nick Fortes** led the Rays to a 3-2 win in last night's series opener...Fortes became the first Rays catcher with a two-out, go-ahead hit in the 9th or later since **Francisco Mejia** on Aug. 17, 2022 at NYY (10th inn. double off **Aroldis Chapman**).
- \* The Rays went hitless (0-for-5) with runners in scoring position, their first road win without tallying a hit in scoring situations since Sept. 8, 2024 at BAL (W, 2-0 - DeLuca two-run HR).
- \* **Nick Martinez** (6.0IP, 6H, 2ER, 3SO, HR) became the 19th Ray to log a quality start in his debut with the club, first since **Brendan McKay** on June 29, 2019 vs. TEX...he was the second to turn the trick without issuing a walk along with **Steve Trachsel** on April 3, 2000 at MIN (Elias).
- \* With a victory tonight, the Rays would secure their second road series win over the Brewers, joining their first visit to this ballpark from June 20-22, 2011...they would also move above .500 through five games for the second straight year (4-1 in 2025) and sixth time in the last eight seasons since 2019.

**RETURN OF THE MAC**—Shane McClanahan is slated for his first major league start since Aug. 2, 2023 at NYY, 972 days ago...he missed the 2024 season after undergoing his second Tommy John surgery in August 2023 and was sidelined last year with nerve-related issues in his left triceps...according to Stats Perform, the 972-day stretch will mark the fourth-longest gap between starts for the Rays in franchise history, trailing **Erasmio Ramirez** (2,237 days - June 21, 2017-Aug. 6, 2023), **Jalen Beeks** (1,010 days - Aug. 14, 2019-May 20, 2022), and **Chris Archer** (988 days - July 27, 2018-April 10, 2021)...both Ramirez and Archer pitched for other clubs during their hiatuses.

- \* McClanahan (2) is one of two players in Rays history to earn multiple All-Star selections in his first three major league seasons, joining **Evan Longoria** (3).
- \* Min. 400.0 IP, his 3.02 ERA (404.2IP, 136ER) from 2021-23 was second in the AL to LAA **Shohei Ohtani** (2.84) and second among all MLB left-handers to ATL **Max Fried** (2.71)...under the same qualifier, it was the lowest mark by a southpaw in his first three MLB seasons since STL **Joe Magrane** (2.89) from 1987-89.
- \* McClanahan is one of three left-handers in the live-ball era (since 1920) to post a 3.02 ERA or lower with 450 strikeouts or more (456) through his first three seasons (min. 400.0IP), joining CLE **Herb Score** (2.63/547SO) and CAL **Frank Tanana** (2.88/471SO).

**SMALL BALL**—The Rays lead the majors in hits (48), batting average (.312), singles (39), infield hits (11), and bunt hits (T1st, 2) while ranking second in on-base pct. (.368) the Brewers (4.07) and third in contact rate (77.9%)...the 48 hits are their second most through four games behind their inaugural 1998 season (53)...the 39 singles are the most by any major league team through four games since the 2023 Cardinals (40) and the most by an AL club since the 1973 Red Sox (39)...Rays hitters have gone from first to third on singles an MLB-leading seven times.

- \* The Rays are batting an MLB-best .358 (19-for-53) with two outs...their 19 two-out hits are tied with the Astros for the major league lead and are their most through four games in club history, ahead of the 2000 and 1998 Devil Rays (both 15).
- \* Despite tying for 19th in extra-base hits (9), the Rays offense is averaging 6.5 runs per game, third in the majors to the Brewers (7.75) and Nationals (7.75).

**PLAYING THE HITS**—Yandy Diaz's 11 hits are the most in the majors and a franchise record through the Rays first four games...his 12 times on base are tied for the club record, matching **Akinori Iwamura** in 2007...the 11 hits are tied for fifth most in the modern era (since 1900) through four team games, trailing DET **Gee Walker** (13) in 1937, MIL **Cecil Cooper** (12) in 1982, BOS **Ira Flagstead** (12) in 1926, and the Philadelphia Athletics **Nap Lajoie** (12) in 1901...he is the first player in the majors with 11 hits through his club's first four games since LAD **Adrian González** (11) in 2015 and the first AL batter since DET **Chris Shelton** (11) in 2006...Diaz is the fifth player in AL history with 11 hits or more, 6 RBI or more, and 2 SO or fewer through his club's first four games, joining Shelton in 2006 (11H, 6RBI, 1SO), ANA **Darin Erstad** in 2000 (11, 6, 0), Cooper in 1982 (11, 6, 1), and DET **Harry Heilmann** in 1923 (11, 9, 1)...he is the second Ray to reach those marks over any four-game span, joining **Austin Meadows** (2x, last: May 26-29, 2019).

- \* He needs one hit tonight to match **Quinton McCracken** (12, 1998) for the most by any player over the Rays first five games in franchise history...he also needs to reach base once to match the franchise record through five games (13) shared by Iwamura (2007) and **Fred McGriff** (1998).
- \* In addition to pacing the majors in hits, Diaz is tied for first in RBI with five others, ranks third in average (.550, 1st in AL), fourth in on-base pct. (.571), and is tied for fifth in total bases (15)...his 11 hard-hit balls (95 mph EV or higher) are the most in MLB...he has scored or driven in nine of the Rays 26 runs (34.6%).
- \* He tallied his 22nd career leadoff homer last night, extending a franchise record...his 11 leadoff blasts since 2024 are tied with MIN **Byron Buxton** for the AL lead and tied for fourth most in the majors behind LAD **Shohei Ohtani** (18), PHI **Kyle Schwarber** (15), and NYM **Francisco Lindor** (13).
- \* The home run was his 100th as a Ray, making him the eighth player to reach that mark in a Tampa Bay uniform along with **Evan Longoria** (261), **Carlos Peña** (163), **Brandon Lowe** (157), **Aubrey Huff** (128), **B.J. Upton** (118), **Ben Zobrist** (114), and **Carl Crawford** (104).
- \* Diaz is 6-for-8 (.750) with 1 2B and 1 HR in at-bats ending with breaking and offspeed pitches...he has swung and missed at only four total pitches on the season.

**DELUCA DINGER**—Jonny DeLuca's 5th-inning homer last night traveled 438 feet and left the bat at 109.0 mph, the farthest homer of his career and second-hardest-hit ball behind a 109.4-mph ground out on July 21, 2024 at NYY...he has hit safely and tallied an RBI in all three of his appearances (with a PA), going 5-for-12 (.417) with 1 2B, 1 HR, and 4 RBI...DeLuca is looking to become the sixth Ray to tally an RBI in each of his first four games with a plate appearance...he would join **Jose Siri** (5G, 2023), **Ji-Man Choi** (5G, 2021), **Evan Longoria** (4G, 2009), **Jorge Cantú** (4G, 2005), and **Eduardo Pérez** (4G, 2004).

**STILL STANDING**—With his walk in the opening frame last night, **Jonathan Aranda** extended his career-long on-base streak to 18 games (July 19, 2025-pres.), the third-longest active run in the majors (see table to the right)...he is slashing .318/.413/.545 (21-for-66) with 3 2B, 4 HR, 14 RBI, and 12 BB during the streak...Aranda went 0-for-3 at the plate yesterday to snap a career-long 10-game hitting streak.

\* Of Aranda's 13 balls in play, nine have been hard hit (95 mph EV or higher), tied for fourth in the majors to teammate **Yandy Diaz** (11), CHC **Alex Bregman** (10), and HOU **Christian Walker** (10).

**CASH CONSIDERATIONS**—Kevin Cash has 898 wins in his managerial career, two shy of becoming the fourth active skipper with 900 career victories...he would join CIN **Terry Francona** (2,036), DET **A.J. Hinch** (966), and LAD **Dave Roberts** (947)...Cash would also become the ninth manager in MLB history to reach the mark while managing only one team in his career, joining LAD **Walter Alston**, LAA **Mike Scioscia**, LAD **Tommy Lasorda**, BAL **Earl Weaver**, MIN **Tom Kelly**, DET **Hughie Jennings**, PIT **Danny Murtaugh**, and STL **Red Schoendienst** (Stats Perform).

**BRATS AND BASEBALL**—The Rays play their 10th series against the Brewers this week (fourth on the road), winning five of the first nine sets...they took two of three games from May 9-11 last year at Steinbrenner Field, tallying both wins by one run in come-from-behind fashion, and have claimed two of the last three series between the clubs (2025, 2023)...however, the home team has won the last four series in this matchup...the Rays nine road games vs. the Brewers are their fewest against any opponent.

- \* Sixteen of the 26 all-time meetings between the Rays and Brewers have been decided by two runs or fewer, including 11 of 14 since 2022...each of the Rays last four wins over Milwaukee and six of their last seven since 2017 have come by one run.

**SUGAR SHANE**—Shane McClanahan will toe the rubber for his 2026 debut tonight at American Family Field...marks his first major league start since Aug. 2, 2023 at NYY, 973 days ago...missed the last two seasons after his second Tommy John surgery wiped out his 2024 season and nerve-related issues sidelined him for 2025...marks his 75th career start and 35th on the road...selected by the Rays in the Compensatory Round (31st overall) of the 2018 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of South Florida.

**LAST TIME OUT**—In his final Grapefruit League outing on March 20 vs. BOS, he spun 5.0 scoreless frames (W, 5.0IP, 3H, OR, 2BB, 4SO, HBP)...struck out the side in the opening inning and worked a perfect 2nd...yielded one baserunner in the 3rd and 4th frames...two of the first three batters reached in the 5th, but escaped with an infield fly and a pickoff by catcher **Hunter Feduccia**...threw a spring-high 73 pitches, 41 for strikes...registered three of his four strikeouts on his slider.

- ★ McClanahan earned the win in three of his four spring starts, going 3-0 with a 2.08 ERA (13.0IP, 3ER), 5 BB, 15 SO, and a 1.00 WHIP...held opponents to a .178 (8-for-45) average, eighth among GL left-handers (min. 10.0IP).
- ★ The three wins tied for second most in the GL behind STL **Michael McGreevy** (4).

**MIDWEST MATCHUP**—McClanahan will be making his second career start opposite the Brewers and first on the road...he worked 7.0 scoreless innings on May 19, 2023 at Tropicana Field in a 1-0 win (ND, 7.0IP, 6H, OR, BB, 7SO)...in that outing, he tied the longest scoreless start of his career, matching May 11, 2022 at LAA, but settled for a no-decision after **Francisco Mejía** plated the winning run on a sacrifice fly during the Rays final at-bat in the 8th inning.

- ★ He is 3-1 with a 1.18 ERA (45.2IP, 6ER) 59 SO, 8 BB, and a 0.83 WHIP in seven career starts vs. NL Central opponents, six of which were quality...min. 40.0 IP, it marks the second-lowest ERA against the division among active pitchers, trailing only PIT **Gregory Soto** (1.07).
- ★ McClanahan has gone 8-1 with a 1.97 ERA (77.2IP, 17ER) in 13 career Interleague starts...min. 10 starts, it signals the lowest career Interleague ERA among active AL pitchers.

**THE ROAD BACK**—McClanahan exited his start on Aug. 2, 2023 at Yankee Stadium with left forearm tightness and was placed on the 15-day IL the next day...he consulted with three doctors before opting for his second Tommy John surgery, performed by Dr. Keith Meister on Aug. 21, 2023 in Dallas, Tx....resumed throwing off the mound in August 2024 and faced live hitters at the Rays spring facility in Port Charlotte, Fla. the following month...entered the offseason fully healthy and began his usual spring build up...in his third Grapefruit League start, was removed with left triceps tightness, which was later diagnosed as nerve irritation...began the year on the 15-day IL and was moved to the 60-day IL on April 26...consulted with nerve specialist Dr. Gregory Paul in Dallas after feeling discomfort during his first full-distance bullpen session June 7...resumed throwing progression shortly after the visit...made three rehab starts between the FCL Rays (July 8) and Triple-A Durham (July 8 & 13)...was pulled from his rehab assignment on July 22 with biceps tendinitis...underwent radial nerve decompression surgery on his left triceps Aug. 11, performed by Dr. Steven Shin in Los Angeles, officially ending his hopes of a 2025 return.

**STRIKEOUT ARTIST**—During his first three seasons (2021-23), McClanahan's 10.14 strikeouts per 9.0 IP ranked second among MLB left-handers (min. 400.0IP) behind **Blake Snell** (11.85)...under the same parameter, it was the second-highest mark by a southpaw through his first three major league campaigns, trailing SD/PIT **Oliver Pérez** (10.34)...his 456 career strikeouts are sixth-most by a left-hander in franchise history and are the most by any Ray through his first three seasons, regardless of handedness, outpacing **James Shields** (448, 2006-08) despite McClanahan (404.2IP) throwing 150 fewer innings than Shields (554.2IP).

- ★ Min. 1,000 BF, his 33.4 pct. whiff rate from 2021-23 ranked fourth in the majors behind ATL **Spencer Strider** (37.0%), SD **Blake Snell** (33.7%), and MIL **Corbin Burnes** (33.7%)...he led the majors with a 48.4 pct. whiff rate on his changeup in that span (min. 1,000 changeups thrown).
- ★ Min. 400.0 IP, his 3.02 ERA (404.2IP, 136ER) from 2021-23 ranked second in the AL to LAA **Shohei Ohtani** (2.84) and was second among all left-handed pitchers in the majors to ATL **Max Fried** (2.71).

**SHINING STAR**—He was selected for the AL All-Star team in 2022 and 2023, earning a starting nod in the former season...joined **David Price** (2010) as the only Rays pitchers to start an All-Star Game...McClanahan and **Evan Longoria** (3x) are the only Rays players to earn All-Star nods in two of their first three major league seasons...he also joined Price (2010-12) as the only Rays pitchers to be tabbed as All-Stars in back-to-back seasons...also joined Price, **Chris Archer** (2x) and **Scott Kazmir** (2x) as the only Rays pitchers with multiple All-Star selections in their careers.

**MLB CAREER RUNDOWN**—In 2023, was the Rays Opening Day starter for the second straight year and started 21 games before Tommy John surgery ended his season...after his final start on Aug. 2 at NYY, led the AL in whiff rate (33.4%) while ranking highly in wins (72nd, 11), opp. average (6th, .222), and ERA (8th, 3.29)...earned the win in each of his first five starts, matching **Matt Moore** (2013) for the longest streak to begin a season in Rays history and was the first Rays pitcher to win 11 of his first 12 decisions in a season...from Opening Day—June 16, went 11-1 with a major-league-best 2.12 ERA (89.1IP, 21ER), 15 points lower than the next closest pitcher (HOU **Framber Valdez** - 2.27)...marked the third-lowest ERA through a Rays pitcher's first 15 starts of a season behind himself in 2022 (1.77) and **Chris Archer** in 2015 (2.08)...was the Rays Roberto Clemente Award nominee.

- ★ Named the Rays Don Zimmer MVP by the Tampa Bay chapter of the BBWAA and finished sixth in AL Cy Young voting in 2022 after leading the club in wins (12), innings (166.1), and strikeouts (194)...started on Opening Day, for the AL in the All-Star Game and in Game 1 of the Rays Wild Card Series at CLE...his 0.93 WHIP ranked second in the AL and was the lowest in Rays history, passing **Blake Snell** (0.97) in his 2018 Cy Young season.
- ★ In 2021, established himself as a full-time big leaguer, tying for the team lead in wins (10), which tied for second most among AL rookies...min. 100.0 IP, his 3.43 ERA ranked third in club history among rookies behind **Jeremy Hellickson** (2.95) in 2011 and **Chris Archer** (3.22) in 2013.
- ★ Saw his first major league action during the Rays run to the 2020 postseason...made four appearances, including his MLB debut in Game 1 of the ALDS vs. NYY...became the second player and first pitcher in major league history to appear in a World Series game before appearing in a regular season contest, joining KC **Adalberto Mondesi** in 2015.

## TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTER: RHP DREW RASMUSSEN (0-0, 1.80)

**LAST TIME OUT**—Worked 5.0 innings of one-run ball on Opening Day (March 26) at STL (ND, 5.0IP, 4H, 1ER, 2SO, HR)...the only run came on a solo homer by JJ Wetherholt...generated seven whiffs, including six on his cutter, and averaged 96.0 mph on his four-seam fastball...was his first career Opening Day start.

**vs. BREWERS**—Made his first career start against the Brewers on May 11, 2025 at Steinbrenner Field and took the loss (L, 5.0IP, 4H, 3ER, BB, 3SO, 2HR)...began his career with Milwaukee (2020-21) before the Rays acquired him on May 21, 2021 along with RHP **J.P. Feyereisen** for INF **Willy Adames** and RHP **Trevor Richards**.
