RECENT REDBIRDS: The Cardinals continue their seven-game beerstand homestand with tonight's opener of a four-game series against the Colorado Rockies over Players' and Cardinals Hall of Fame Weekend. St. Louis opened its homestand by taking two of three from division-rival Milwaukee...tonight is the Cardinals' 10th of 16 straight games without an off-day (August 13-28).

FLIGHT PATTERN: Winners of nine of their last 12, and sporting the 3rd-best win pct. (.622, 23-14) in the NL since the All-Star break, the Cardinals enter play today in 2nd place in the National League Central (trailing Chicago by 0.5 games), and hold the 2nd NL Wild Card position (1.5 games ahead of the Mets and Phillies). 20 of St. Louis' final 37 games remaining this season are against National League Central opponents.

LEONE RECALLED; FERNANDEZ OPTIONED: The Cardinals today recalled right-handed reliever **Dominic Leone** from Memphis (AAA). Rookie right-hander **Junior Fernandez**, who worked 2.0 scoreless innings last night, was optioned to Memphis following last night's game. Leone, 27, will be making his fourth stint with the Cardinals, already appearing in 28 games earlier this season with 35 strikeouts in 29.0 innings pitched.

ABOUT LAST NIGHT: The Cardinals played their first rain-shortened game in Busch Stadium III history last night, losing 5-3 to the Brewers after 7 1/2 innings as the umpires called the game after 1-hour, 6-minute rain delay. It was the Cardinals first rain-shortened game since May 23 2015 at Kansas City (3-2 loss after 5 1/2 innings) and first in St. Louis since May 30, 2001, which also resulted as a Brewers victory (11-1) after 5 1/2 innings.

TAP THE ROCKIES: The Cardinals are playing the Colorado Rockies for the first time during the 2019 season, with tonight's game marking the latest on the calendar the two teams have begun a season series since the Rockies joined the National League as an expansion team in 1993. The previous latest date for a first game between the two clubs was last season (July 30, 2018). After tonight, the Cardinals have faced all NL clubs...the only other two NL teams yet to face each other this season are the Cincinnati Reds and Arizona Diamondbacks (first meeting is September 6 at the Great American Ball Park).

BEER WARS: Since Busch Stadium III opened in 2006, St. Louis' .723 home winning percentage (34-13) against the visiting Rockies is its 2nd-best against any opponent, trailing only the Washington Nationals (.725, 29-11). The Cardinals have defeated the Rockies in eight of their last nine games at home (May 18, 2016-present) and are 25-6 (.807 winning pct.) at Busch Stadium vs. Colorado over their last 31 meetings (since September 30, 2010). The last time St. Louis lost consecutive home games to the Rockies was during a four-game series sweep (June 5-8, 2009).

MOLINA MILESTONES: Last night, **Yadier Molina** passed **Red Schoendienst** (6,841) for 4th all-time in Cardinals history in career at-bats and hit his 372nd career double, passing **Gary Carter** (372) for 10th all-time among MLB catchers. The backstop needs two RBI for 900 in his career, and four games at catcher to tie **Benito Santiago** (1,917) for 11th in MLB history.

HOME SWEET HOME: The Cardinals conclude the season by playing 21 of their final 37 games at Busch Stadium, where they are 36-24 with a .600 home win pct. ranking 4th in the NL. Only the Mets (57) have played fewer home games than St. Louis this season in all of MLB. Last night's rain-shortened defeat ended the Cardinals season-best six-game home win streak (August 1-20).

COLORADO CONNECTIONS

Dexter Fowler played his first six seasons with the Rockies (2008-13)...originally selected by Colorado in the 14th round of the 2004 MLB Draft...is the Rockies franchise record holder in career triples (53)...later traded by Colorado with cash to the Astros for outfielder **Brandon Barnes** and pitcher **Jordan Lyles** (Dec. 3, 2013).

Marcell Ozuna's cousin, **Pablo Ozuna**, played in 17 games for the Rockies in 2003...was originally signed by the Cardinals and part of the trade which acquired **Edgar Renteria** from the Marlins.

Paul DeJong made his MLB debut at Colorado (May 28, 2017)...became the 9th Cardinal in history to homer in his first MLB at-bat, a pinch-hit 9th inning solo home run off **Greg Holland**.

Harrison Bader (July 25, 2017 at Busch Stadium) and **John Brebbia** (May 28, 2017 at Coors Field) both made their MLB debuts against the Rockies.

Matt Wieters (junior) and **Charlie Blackmon** (medical redshirt-tendinitis in throwing arm) were teammates at Georgia Tech Univ. in 2007.

Andrew Miller and **Bryan Shaw** were teammates on the 2016 AL Champion Cleveland Indians.

Rockies manager **Bud Black** previously managed **Miles Mikolas** (2012-13) while in San Diego, where he made his MLB debut under Black.

Cardinals President of Baseball Operations **John Mozeliak** began his baseball career with the Rockies...initially served as a left-handed batting practice pitcher in 1993 and worked in a variety of positions in the home clubhouse and in baseball operations...joined St. Louis as an assistant in scouting operations following the 1995 season...graduated from Fairview High School in Boulder, Colo., where he was a first baseman and pitcher...graduated from University of Colorado at Boulder.

Cardinals Scouting Director **Randy Flores** pitched in a combined 82 games in three seasons (2002, '09-10) over two stints with Colorado.

Rockies catcher **Dom Nuñez** and Cardinals 2016 1st rounder **Dylan Carlson** were teammates at Elk Grove (Calif.) High School in 2013.

Rockies bullpen coach **Darren Holmes** pitched in five games for St. Louis during the 2000 season.

FOX Sports Midwest reporter **Erica Weston** is originally from Highlands Ranch, Colo...attended Colorado State University.

Cardinals Senior Special Assistant to the GM **Bob Gebhard** served as the Rockies' first General Manager from 1991-99...hired **John Mozeliak** in 1993...worked as a special assistant to former Cardinals General Manager **Walt Jocketty** in St. Louis after leaving the Rockies in 1999...resides in nearby Centennial, Colo.

MLB.com Cardinals reporter **Anne Rogers** previously worked as a Rockies Associate Reporter under Thomas Harding in 2018.

St. Louis Post-Dispatch reporter **Derrick Goold** is originally from Boulder, Colo...attended Centaurus High School in Lafayette, Colo...previously worked as a staff writer for the Rocky Mountain News (2000-01).

St. Louis Post-Dispatch columnist writer **Benjamin Hochman** previously worked as a sports writer and columnist for the Denver Post (2007-15).

Rockies VP Ticket Sales, Operations & Services **Sue Ann McClaren** worked 15 seasons (1978-92) in the Cardinals sales department before joining the Rockies in 1992. Rockies VP of Communications and Marketing **Jill Campbell** is a St. Louis native.

TONIGHT'S GAME

- Makes his team-leading 26th start of the season (68th career start) and 95th career appearance tonight.
- Has walked two or fewer batters in 40 straight starts dating back to July 4, 2018 (4 BB at Arizona). It's Major League Baseball's longest active streak and the longest in Cardinals history, surpassing Curt Davis (39, 7/3/1938-9/3/1939).
- The consecutive starts with two walks or less is the longest streak in MLB since 2017 when Clayton Kershaw (47) and Andy Sonnanstine (45) each ran streaks of 40+ dating back to the 2015 season. Carlos Silva holds the MLB all-time mark at 99 (2003-07).
- Has allowed two HR's in each of his last two starts after having allowed just one round-tripper in his first five starts following the All-Star break.
- Has induced seven grounded into double plays post All-Star break, T2nd in the N.L. and currently ranks T3rd in the N.L. with teammate Dakota Hudson with 18 this season.
- Lowered his ERA from 4.88 to 3.94 from May 17 to August 6, the lowest it had been since standing at 3.83 following his game on May 11.
- Has walked one or fewer in 18 of his 25 starts, including no walks in seven outings.
- The Cardinals sport a 35-21 record (.625 win pct.) in his games pitched since 2018. Since July 4, 2018, St. Louis is 25-15 (.625) in his games started.

LAST TIME OUT

- Saw his losing streak reach three games in a 6-1 defeat at Cincinnati last Sat. (8/1), allowing a pair of home runs. He did set the Cardinals franchise record by holding his opponent to two walks or less for a 40th straight start.

- Hurlled an eight-hit shutout vs. PIT (7/15), walking none and fanning three in a 100-pitch effort. It was his 2nd career shutout (5/21/18). He became the first Cardinals pitcher to throw a shutout with eight or more hits and no walks since Bob Forsch (9/8/1982).
