RECENT REDBIRDS: The Cardinals continue their homestand tonight with the second game of a three-game series vs. the Nationals. St. Louis opened its homestand by dropping two of three to division-rival Milwaukee. With 12 games remaining, St. Louis enters today in first place in the NL Central, 2.0 games ahead of the Cubs (vs. Reds) and 3.0 games in front of the Brewers (vs. Padres).

TIME TO FLY: After a five-game losing streak on a West Coast trip to Oakland and Los Angeles-NL (August 3-7), the Cardinals are 26-11 since August 9, leading Major League Baseball in wins while boasting a MLB-best 2.90 ERA.

THE HUNT FOR A RED OCTOBER: The Cardinals have 12 games remaining, all against winning teams in contention for playoff positions (.535 combined win pct.). St. Louis sports a 35-37 record (.486) this season when facing opponents with winning records (5th in the NL). Beginning Thursday, seven of St. Louis' remaining 10 games are against the Cubs: Sept. 19-22 at Wrigley Field (4G) and Sept. 27-29 at Busch Stadium (3G).

NATIONAL NEWS: Since Busch Stadium III opened in 2006, the Cardinals' .732 home winning percentage (30-11) against the visiting Washington Nationals is their 2nd-best against any opponent, trailing only the Colorado Rockies (.745, 38-13). St. Louis has won the home series vs. the Nationals in 11 of 13 visits.

TOMMY BOY: Tommy Edman has hit safely in his last six home games (9-23, .391), raising his season batting average at Busch Stadium to .352 (45-128), currently ranking 7th-highest by a Cardinals rookie at home in franchise history (minimum 134 plate appearances).

CLOSE CALLS: St. Louis is 21-21 in one-run games and 14-14 in two-run games this season, with those 70 games ranking 6th-most in the NL (Cincinnati leads with 81). Last season, St. Louis also sported a .500 record (22-22) in one-run games, but went 40-32 in games decided by two runs or fewer. In 12 games between the St. Louis and Washington since 2018, nine have been decided by two runs or fewer (STL is 6-3), with all three Cardinals losses by only one run.

STARTING TO FINISH: In 16 games since September 1, the Cardinals starting rotation of Jack Flaherty (3 GS), Dakota Hudson (3 GS), Miles Mikolas (3 GS), Michael Wacha (3 GS), Adam Wainwright (3 GS) and Daniel Ponce de Leon (1 GS) have combined to record a 1.84 ERA, lowest in Major League Baseball this month (Arizona is 2nd at 2.70), and matching the 1963 Cardinals (Bob Gibson, Ray Sadeski, Curt Simmons, Ernie Broglio, Lew Burdette, and Ron Taylor) for lowest September ERA by a starting rotation in franchise history (Elias). Overall this season, St. Louis' team ERA by starting pitchers (3.84) ranks 2nd in the NL.

RUNNIN' REDBIRDS: The Cardinals (109-for-135) lead the NL in stolen bases this season, six more than 2nd place Washington (103). Their 80.7% SB success rate (4th in NL) currently stands as the highest all-time in franchise history since 1951 (STATS LLC)...19 different Cardinals have stolen at least one base, most in MLB and T5th-most in franchise history (record held by 1906 club with 21 Cardinals)...St. Louis has stolen multiple bases in 30 games (1st in MLB) and swiped four or more bags in six games (T1st in MLB-Texas). Last night's four stolen bases off the Nationals were their most since four at RFK Stadium on August 28, 2005 by Yadier Molina (2), Jim Edmonds, and John Rodriguez (off Gary Bennett), also matching their most against the club since relocating from Montreal.

THIS DATE IN CARDINALS HISTORY (September 17, 1941): Playing right field and batting third, 20-year-old Stan Musial makes his Major League debut for the Cardinals, notching his first two hits against the Boston Braves en route to 3,630 in his 22-season Hall of Fame career.

WASHINGTON CONNECTIONS

Tyler Webb was born in Nassawadox, Va...graduated from Northampton High School in Eastville, Va.

John Gant made his Major League debut against the Nationals (April 6, 2016) while with Atlanta.

Matt Wieters played the previous two seasons with Washington (2017-18) before signing with St. Louis this offseason.

Andrew Knizner was born in Glen Allen, Va...graduated from Hanover (Va) High School, where he was a quarterback and punter for the football team and was an All-State shortstop on the 2013 Virginia AAA State Championship team...was teammates with Trea Turner at North Carolina State University in 2014.

Nationals broadcaster **Bob Carpenter** worked 10 seasons with the Cardinals on both radio and television before joining Washington...graduated from nearby McBride (Mo.) High School...his sister, **Judy Carpenter-Barada**, previously served as Cardinals Director of Major League Administration.

Cardinals pitching coach **Mike Maddux** served in the same role with the Nationals for two seasons (2016-17)...also pitched parts of two seasons (1998-99) for the Expos.

Cardinals bullpen coach **Bryan Eversgerd** pitched in 25 games for Montreal in 1995...became an Expo via trade with St. Louis (April 5, 1995), packaged with pitcher **Kirk Bullinger** and outfielder **DaRond Stovall** to Montreal for pitcher **Ken Hill**.

Max Scherzer is a native of Chesterfield, Mo...graduated from Parkway Central (Mo.) High School...originally selected by St. Louis in the 43rd of the 2003 MLB Draft, but did not sign...pitched at the University of Missouri (2005-07).

Matt Adams played parts of last seven seasons in a Cardinals uniform (2012-18), including 26 Postseason games (2013-14)...originally selected by St. Louis in the 23rd round of the 2009 MLB Draft...later traded by St. Louis with cash to Atlanta for infielder **Juan Ypez** (May 20, 2017).

Nationals Bench Coach and interim manager **Chip Hale** played in 132 games for Memphis (AAA) in the Cardinals organization during his final professional season in 1998.

Nationals Manager **Dave Martinez** made his Major League debut vs. St. Louis (June 15, 1986) while with the Chicago Cubs.

Joe Ross' older brother, **Tyson Ross**, pitched in nine games for the Cardinals last season.

Cardinals Sr. Special Asst. to the GM **Bob Gebhard** was a player/coach in the Expos organization from 1974-75, and coached through 1986, including on the Montreal coaching staff in 1982.

Hall of Famer **Lou Brock** served as a baserunning consultant for Montreal in 1993.

Cardinals Hall of Famer and broadcaster **Tim McCarver** played in 92 games for Montreal (1972).

Nationals broadcaster **Charlie Slowes** worked three years at KMOX (1984-86).

TONIGHT'S GAME

- Makes his team-leading 31st start of the season (73rd career start) and 100th career appearance, as he faces the Nationals for the 2nd time this season.
He's the first Cardinals pitcher age 30+ to start 30 or more games in consecutive seasons since Adam Wainwright did so in three consecutive seasons from 2012-14.
Had his team-record streak of having walked two or fewer batters in 43 straight starts dating back to July 4, 2018 broken on 9/6 at PIT. The streak surpassed the Cardinals previous best of 39 games by Curt Davis (July 3, 1938-Sept. 3, 1939).

LAST TIME OUT

Helped Cardinals avoid a series sweep at Coors Field last Thu. (9/12) in a 10-3 win over the Rockies. Worked 5.0 innings allowing three runs, including two HR's, as the Cardinals won for the 4th time in his last five starts & 6th time in his last eight starts.

Has a 2.91 home ERA in 14 starts, ranking 4th on the team and 18th in NL.
