METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets returned to action on Friday and defeated the Rockies, 4-2...The Mets are back to a season-high-tying 13 games above .500...The Mets have won five of their last six games...The Mets are in a stretch of 10 straight games (1-0)...The Mets continue a nine-game homestand (5-2) against the Dodgers (2-1), White Sox (2-1) and Rockies (1-0)...Following this series, the Mets head back on the road to Los Angeles (four games) and Colorado (three games).

MAY DAY: The Mets enter the final day of May with a 14-12 record and a 3.12 ERA...The Mets have not had a losing record in a month since they went 9-19 in May of 2024.

SENGA GENESIS: Kodai Senga has recorded a 1.46 ERA (9 ER/55.2 IP) this season which is the third lowest through a starter's first 10 games of a season with the club...He trails only Jacob deGrom (0.56 ERA in 2021) and David Cone (1.38 ERA in 1988)...Courtesy of *Elias*.

THREE'S COMPANY: Senga has allowed three earned runs or less in 27 consecutive starts, the fourth-longest such streak in franchise history...He trails only Jacob deGrom's 40 starts (from 9/9/19-9/18/22), deGrom's 31 starts (from 4/16/18-4/3/19) and Dwight Gooden's 29 starts (from 9/7/84-8/10/85).

IN THE CITI: The Mets have won nine out of their 10 series openers at home this season...They are 22-7 at home this season, tied with the 1986 team and the 2021 team for the best home start in franchise history...Their 2.57 ERA at home this season is the seventh-best mark in franchise history through their first 29 home games of a season...Only the '21 team (2.17), the '85 team (2.27), the '76 team (2.36), the '71 (2.41), the '68 team (2.45) and the '88 team (2.51) have a better ERA through as many home games...Their .759 home winning percentage is also the best in the majors.

SIDE TO SIDE: Francisco Lindor homered from both sides of the plate for the seventh time in his career and for the fifth time with the Mets...Courtesy of *Elias*...His five games with homers from both sides is tied with Todd Hundley and Carlos Beltrán for the most such instances in franchise history.

LUCKY LINDOR: The Mets have won the last 25 games in which Francisco Lindor has homered...The streak that goes back to July 9, 2024 is the longest streak in team history...Prior to Lindor's streak, the longest was 21 straight wins when George Foster homered between July 3, 1985, and June 29, 1986...It is tied for the second-longest such streak in Major League history with Lou Gehrig (1927-28) and Ken Caminiti (1997-1998)...Carl Furillo (29, 1951-53) holds the record...Courtesy of Sarah Langs.

FIRST THINGS FIRST: Francisco Lindor has hit seven lead-off homers as a member of the Mets...That is tied with Michael Conforto for the sixth-most in team history...Tommie Agee and Lenny Dykstra are tied for fourth with eight leadoff homers.

ROCKIES-METS NOTES: The Mets are 30-23 against the Rockies at Citi Field since the ballpark opened in 2009.

BRETT THE MET: Since being recalled from Syracuse on May 5, Brett Baty has hit .293 (17-58) with nine runs, one double, five home runs, 13 RBI, three walks, one stolen base and a .908 OPS in 20 games.

OUCH: The Mets have been plunked 36 times this year, which is the most in the majors...New York was hit 92 times last season, the third-most in the majors and the most in the Senior Circuit...Pete Alonso owns the franchise record, having been hit by 91 pitches in his career...Brandon Nimmo is second with 81, followed by Jeff McNeil at 77 HBP.

PITCHING IN: The Mets lead the majors with a 2.86 ERA and are sixth with 509 strikeouts...They are tied for sixth with five shutouts...New York's starting staff has posted a 2.89 ERA this year, the second-best in the majors...The bullpen ranks second in the majors with a 2.82 ERA.

ED, EDD AND EDDY: Edwin Díaz has not allowed a hit in 30 consecutive at-bats, the longest active streak in the majors...He has not allowed an earned run over his last 13 games, recording six saves and allowing four hits, five walks and 19 strikeouts during that span...He has not allowed a hit over last nine appearances, is the longest streak of his career...He has 54 career saves with three or more strikeouts, the most such games in the majors since 2016.

REEDING RAINBOW: Reed Garrett has pitched to a 0.73 ERA (2 ER/24.2 IP) this season, the third-best mark in franchise history by a pitcher through their first 25 games of the season, behind Doug Sisk (0.50, 1984) and Francisco Rodríguez (0.70, 2009)...Is unscored upon over his last seven appearances (8.0 IP) and has 10 strikeouts during that span.

LAST TIME OUT: Recorded his fifth win of the season after allowing one earned run over 5.1 innings on May 25 vs. Los Angeles-NL... Recorded 100+ pitches for the third consecutive game and for the first time since August 25 - September 20, 2023 (five straight games)...Gave up a lead-off home run to Shohei Ohtani in the first inning, snapping his career-high streak of eight games without allowing a homer...Entering May 25, he had not given up a homer to his last 202 batters faced.

SO FAR SO GOOD: In 10 starts this season, Senga has gone 5-3 with a 1.46 ERA (9 ER/55.2 IP), 26 walks and 52 strikeouts...His ERA is the third lowest through a starter's first 10 games of a season with the club...He trails only Jacob deGrom (0.56 ERA in 2021) and David Cone (1.38 ERA in 1988)...Courtesy of *Elias*...Has given up five earned runs in the first inning this season compared to four earned runs in all other innings combined...Has allowed three earned runs or less in 27 consecutive starts, the fourth-longest such streak in franchise history...He trails only Jacob deGrom's 40 starts (from 9/9/19-9/18/22), deGrom's 31 starts (from 4/16/18-4/3/19) and Dwight Gooden's 29 starts (from 9/7/84-8/10/85).

CRUISING AT CITI: In 22 career games at Citi Field, he has gone 10-4 with a 2.10 ERA (29 ER/124.0 IP), which is the third best in the history of the ballpark (min. 90.0 IP)...He has allowed just 10 home runs to 508 batters faced, recording a 0.73 HR/9.0IP ratio at home...His 11.54 K/9.0IP is the third-highest among pitchers at Citi Field behind Edwin Diaz's 15.09 K/9.0IP and Jacob deGrom's 11.61 K/9.0IP (min. 400 BF).

GHOSTING THE BATS: In 2023 Senga's "ghost fork" accounted for 110 of his 202 strikeouts...The pitch had a 59.5% whiff rate and a 28.2% put away rate...Opponents managed just 18 hits in 163 at-bats ending with the forkball, a .110 batting average...In Senga's first 10 starts of the 2025 season, he has picked up 35 of his 52 strikeouts on the "ghost fork" and generated a 39.9% whiff rate...His forkball has a run value of five which is tied for third in the majors.

SENGA GENESIS: Through Senga's first 39 career starts he has posted 258 strikeouts which is tied for the 15th-most through a pitchers first 39 starts in major league history...It is the fourth most by a Met, trailing Dwight Gooden (first, 333), Matt Harvey (seventh, 285) and Noah Syndergaard (T-ninth, 276)...It is also the third-most among Japanese-born pitchers in that span, trailing only Yu Darvish (312) and Hideo Nomo (312).

2024 REWIND: He missed nearly the first four months of the 2024 season with a right shoulder capsule strain...Returned and made one regular season start on July 26 vs. Atlanta, throwing 5.1 innings and allowing two runs on two hits with nine strikeouts and one walk before exiting with an injury...Missed the rest of the regular season with a strained left calf...He made it back for the Postseason and he made his first career Postseason start on October 5 in Game 1 of the NLDS against the Phillies...Threw 2.0 innings allowing one run, a home run in the first inning, and recorded one walk and three strikeouts...Finished the Postseason making three appearances and pitching 5.0 innings while striking out four.

REMARKABLE ROOKIE: During his rookie campaign in 2023, Kodai Senga recorded 202 strikeouts and became the 18th rookie pitcher in the Modern Era (Since 1900) to have 200 or more strikeouts in a season...Senga's 202 punch outs were the second-most by a Mets pitcher behind only Dwight Gooden's 276 strikeouts in 1984...He joined Hideo Nomo (236), Yu Darvish (221) and Daisuke Matsusaka (201) as the only Japanese-born rookie hurlers to reach 200 strikeouts...Senga's 12 wins were tied with Ron Darling (1984) for the seventh-most wins in a single season by a Mets rookie and was the first Mets rookie to reach double-digit wins since Dillon Gee (13, 2011)...His 2.98 ERA (55 ER/166.1 IP) was the fifth-lowest in a single season by a Mets rookie behind only Jerry Koosman (2.08, 1968), Jon Matlack (2.32, 1972), Dwight Gooden (2.60, 1984) and Tom Seaver (2.76, 1967).

KODAI THE FRIENDLY GHOST: In 2023, Senga finished second in the NL and fifth in the majors among qualifiers in ERA...His 202 strikeouts were the tied for the eighth-most in the NL and tied for the 14th-most in the majors...Senga held opposing batters to a .208 average, the third-lowest mark among qualifiers in the NL and the fourth-lowest mark in the majors...His 10.93 K/9 rate was the fifth-best mark among qualified major league pitchers in 2023...He finished seventh in NL Cy Young voting.

HEY NOW YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR: In 2023 Senga joined Pete Alonso (2019), Dwight Gooden (1984), Jerry Koosman (1968) and Tom Seaver (1967) as the only Mets rookies selected to an All-Star Game...He was the eighth Japanese-Born rookie ever to be selected to an All-Star Game joining Masahiro Tanaka (2014), Yu Darvish (2012), Kosuke Fukudome (2008), Hideki Okajima (2007), Hideki Matsui (2003), Ichiro Suzuki (2001) and Hideo Nomo (1995).

METS-JAPAN CONNECTION: Senga is the 14th Japanese-born player to appear in at least one game for the Mets, the most by any major league team...Prior to Senga, the last Japanese-born player to appear in a game for the Mets was OF Norichika Aoki in 2017.

- Recorded his seventh hold of the season after tossing 1.1 innings in relief on May 30 vs. Colorado (H, ER, K, HR)...Stranded two inherited runners in the sixth and gave up a solo homer to Sam Hilliard in the seventh...Was his first home run allowed since April 18...Has allowed two earned runs over his last three games after recording just two earned runs in his previous 14 outings (from 4/18-5/21/25)...Marked the first time he's thrown 1.1+ innings in consecutive appearances since March 27 (2.1 IP) and March 31 (2.0 IP).
- Stranded an inherited runner and tossed four outs in relief on May 26 vs. Chicago-AL (BB, K).
- Recorded his first loss of the season after allowing two runs (one unearned) in the 13th inning on May 23 vs. Los Angeles-NL (3 H)...Marked his first loss since August 3, 2024 at Los Angeles-AL (career-high 39 G without a loss)...Snapped a 10-game streak of not

- allowing an earned run (13.2 IP, from 4/27-5/21).
- Has stranded 17 of 19 inherited runners this season (10.5%), which is the best mark in the majors (min. 15 IR).
 - Over his last 13 games since April 27 (one opening start), has gone 2-1 with four holds, a 1.04 ERA (2 ER/17.1 IP), five walks, 17 strikeouts and a .143 opponents' BA (8-56).
 - Has gone 3-1 with one save, seven holds and a 1.34 ERA (5 ER/33.2 IP) through 25 appearances (two as an opener) this season, holding batters to a .170 average (19-112)...19 of his 25 outings this season have been scoreless...With runners on base, has held batters to a .115 average (6-52)...He is one of 11 Mets pitchers to record as low of an ERA through their first 25 games of a season.
 - Has recorded a 1.47 ERA (5 ER/30.2 IP) in 23 games as a reliever this season...Among qualified NL relievers this season, is sixth in ERA, tied for seventh in wins and eighth in WHIP (0.85).
 - His nine scoreless outings of 1.1 inning or more are tied for the most in the majors...Eight of his 23 relief appearances have been for five or more outs and each of those outings have been scoreless...His eight such appearances are tied for the most in the majors...Is also one of six relievers to record at least six scoreless appearances of 2.0+ innings.
 - Has produced a run value of six with his sinker this season, tied for the seventh-best among qualified Major League pitchers...He is one of 10 pitchers with as high of a run value on the pitch.
