OPENING DAY: The St. Louis Cardinals open their 130th season of play in the National League today as they visit the division-rival Cincinnati Reds in the opening game of the regular season ... The Cardinals are 59-68-2 (.464 win pct.) overall on Opening Day, including a 23-36 (.393) mark on the road. **ROAD OPENERS:** Since 2010, the Cardinals open their season on the road for the 9th time in 12 seasons (at Busch Stadium in 2011 vs. SD, 2017 vs. CHI, & 2020 vs. PIT).

VS. THE RED LEGS: Today marks St. Louis' 19th Opening Day meeting against Cincinnati, with the Cardinals holding an all-time 10-8 margin (9-8 in Cincinnati) and winning the last three (2014, 2010, 1994) and five of the last six. **OPENERS IN CINCINNATI:** Seventeen of 18 season openers between the Cardinals and Reds have taken place in Cincinnati, with the only opening day vs. the Reds in St. Louis occurring in **1948** at Sportsman's Park (4-0 win)... the last time the Cardinals and Reds faced off on Opening Day was **2014** at Great American Ball Park in a 1-0 win, thanks to **Yadier Molina's** 7th inning solo homer and 7.0 scoreless IP from **Adam Wainwright** ... St. Louis opened the **2010** campaign with an 11-5 win over the Reds as **Albert Pujols** went deep twice and scored four runs; Molina also hit a three-run homer in the 9th inning ... **Ray Lankford** led off the 1994 season by homering off Cincy's **José Rijo** in a 6-4 win at Riverfront Stadium on ESPN Sunday Night Baseball.

ROOKIES & FIRST TIMERS: **Jake Woodford, John Nogowski, Edmundo Sosa, Dylan Carlson, and Justin Williams** are the five rookies on the Cardinals Opening Day roster, while this marks the first Opening Day rosters for **Alex Reyes, Woodford, Nogowski, Carlson, and Williams.**

NEW TO THE FLOCK: **Nolan Arenado** is the only first-time Redbird on the Opening Day roster, while 19 players were developed within the Cardinals organization.

OPENING DAY NOTABLES: **Paul DeJong's** fourth straight Opening Day start at shortstop (2018-21) is the club's most since **Edgar Renteria's** six consecutive (1999-2004) ... At age 22.160, **Dylan Carlson** today becomes the the 3rd-youngest starting center fielder in Cardinals Opening Day history behind **Jack Smith** (20.294 in 1916) and **David Green** (22.111 in 1983). Notable recent younger MLB center fielders to start Opening Day include **Byron Buxton** (22.108 in 2016) **Mike Trout** (21.237 in 2013), **Andrew Jones** (21.347 in 1999), **Carlos Beltran** (21.346 in 1999), and **Ken Griffey Jr.** (19.133 in 1989).

LINEUP CHATTER: For the second consecutive season (2020-21), four infielders (excluding catcher) occupy the first four spots of the Cardinals Opening Day lineup, something that never occurred over the club's previous 120 Opening Days from 1900-2019 ... Last season, the Cardinals (Wong, Edman, Goldschmidt, DeJong) were joined by Cleveland and Toronto with four infielders batting 1-4 on Opening Day. (*Elias*)

IN THE CARDS: Entering his 18th season (2004-21), **Yadier Molina** sports the longest active tenure with only one franchise in MLB, ahead of Washington's **Ryan Zimmerman** (16, 2005-18, '20), and **Adam Wainwright** (16, 2005-10, '12-21) ... Molina's 18th season with the same organization is the most by any primary catcher in MLB history, surpassing 17 by **Bill Dickey** (Yankees, 1928-43, '46), **Johnny Bench** (Reds, 1967-83), and **Jorge Posada** (Yankees, 1995-2011) ... Molina's 18 seasons with the same franchise tie for 29th-longest tenure with one team in MLB history and is the longest since Hall of Famers **Derek Jeter** (20, 1995-2014, Yankees) and **Chipper Jones** (19, 1993, '95-2012, Braves).

MORE MOLINA MILESTONES: **Yadier Molina** makes his 17th straight (2005-21) Opening Day start at catcher, extending his Cardinals franchise record for most consecutive starts at a single position ... Yadi's 17 consecutive Opening Day starts rank 2nd in franchise history, trailing only **Stan Musial** (18, 1946-63) ... Molina's 17 Opening Day starts at catcher surpass **Benito Santiago** for 2nd-most all-time by a catcher in MLB history, trailing **Ivan Rodríguez** (20), while Molina is the only catcher in MLB history (since 1913) to make 16 or more Opening Day starts with only one team, surpassing White Sox's **Ray Schalk** (15, 1913-27) and Yankee's **Bill Dickey** (15, 1930-43, '46).

250 GOLDBY DINGERS: **Paul Goldschmidt's** next homer will be the 250th of his career, as he seeks to become the 9th player to hit home run #250 in a Cardinals uniform and join **Stan Musial** (9/4/53 at Milwaukee Braves), **Ken Boyer** (7/10/65 at Chicago Cubs), **Orlando Cepeda** (6/9/67 at LA Dodgers), **Jim Edmonds** (7/18/03 at LA Dodgers), **Reggie Sanders** (4/9/04 at Arizona), **Albert Pujols** (10/1/06 vs. Milwaukee), **Scott Rolen** (8/23/06 at New York Mets), and **Matt Holliday** (9/27/13 vs. Chicago Cubs) ... **Nolan Arenado** enters the season with 235 career homers.

CINCINNATI CONNECTIONS

Daniel Ponce de Leon (38th round in 2012) and **Tyler Webb** (48th round in 2011) were both selected by the Reds, but did not sign.

Daniel Ponce de Leon (July 23, 2018 at GABP) and **Alex Reyes** (August 9, 2016 at Busch) made their MLB debuts vs. Cincinnati.

Mike Maddux was born in Dayton, Ohio...originally selected by the Reds in the 36th round of the 1979 MLB draft, but did not sign to attend the University of Texas at El Paso.

David Bell previously served as a Cardinals assistant hitting (2014) and bench coach (2015-17)...played parts of four seasons with St. Louis (1995-98)...traded by Cleveland with **Pepe McNeal** and **Rick Heiserman** to St. Louis for **Ken Hill** (July 27, 1995).

Reds Executive Advisor to the CEO **Walt Jock-ety** served as the Cardinals GM for 13 seasons (1995-2007)...during tenure, St. Louis compiled seven NL Central Division championships (1996, 2000-02, '04-06), two NL Championships ('04, '06), and one World Series Championship ('06)...named MLB Executive of the Year (2000, '04, '10).

Reds broadcaster **Jeff Brantley** pitched in 48 games for St. Louis in 1998.

Reds first base coach **Delino DeShields** played two seasons with St. Louis (1997-98).

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Scott Rolen** played his final four seasons with the Reds (2009-12), where he was a 2010 Gold Glove Award winner and two-time All-Star (2010-11).

Cardinals broadcaster and Hall of Famer **Jim Edmonds** played 13 games for the Reds during his final professional season in 2010.

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Vince Coleman** played in 33 games for the Reds in 1996.

Reds Assistant Hitting Coach **Joe Mather** was selected by the Cardinals in the 3rd round of the 2001 MLB draft...played parts of two seasons with St. Louis (2008, '10).

Cardinals Principal Owner and Chief Executive Officer **William DeWitt Jr.** was a prior owner of the Reds and shareholder of the Cincinnati Bengals... his father, **William O. DeWitt**, was a sole owner of the Reds from 1961-67.

Reds pro scout **Bruce Manno** worked in the Cardinals for six seasons as Director of Player Development (2002-06) and Senior Director of Pro Scouting & Special Assistant to the GM (2007).

Reds Bullpen Coach **Lee Tunnel** pitched in 32 games for St. Louis in 1987.

Reds Special Asst. to the GM **Marty Maier** spent 24 seasons with St. Louis as an area scout, Latin American coordinator, asst. director of scouting, scouting director and special asst. to the GM.

Reds Special Assistant to the GM, Player Personnel **Cam Bonifay** played two minor league seasons with the Cardinals...later worked for St. Louis as a professional scout and special assistant.

Reds Player Performance Special Asst. **Eric Davis** played two seasons (1999-2000) for St. Louis.

Reds Special Assistant to the GM **John Morris** played five seasons for St. Louis (1986-90).

Reds CEO **Robert Castellini**, Chairman **W. Joseph Williams Jr.** and Vice Chairman **Thomas Williams** were Cardinals investors from 1995-2006...interests were sold as a condition of their acquisition of a controlling ownership stake of the Reds.

TODAY'S GAME

- Takes the mound in season opener after drawing starting assignment in final game of Cardinals' 2020 season in Game 3 of the National League Wild Card Series at San Diego (10/2/20).
- Joins Chicago White Sox's Lucas Giolito and Atlanta Braves' Max Fried as today's Opening Day starters who graduated from Harvard-Westlake School in Los Angeles, California.
- Today marks his second consecutive Opening Day start (2020-21). Since 1901, becomes the 5th pitcher in Cardinals history to make multiple Opening Day starts before turning age 26, joining Joe Magrane (3), Dizzy Dean (3), Lee Meadows (2), and Johnny Lush (2).
- Is honoring late Hall of Famers Lou Brock and Bob Gibson on his Opening Day baseball cleats today. Also featured is a depiction of the St. Louis arch surrounding the Cardinals logo and mural of other Black baseball legends that includes other historic Cardinals.
- His most previous April appearance was in 2019, also vs. Cincinnati (4/28/19), tossing 7.0 scoreless innings of four-hit ball in a 4-2 win at Busch Stadium.
- Owns the 6th-lowest ERA vs. the Reds (2.48) among active pitchers with seven or more career starts (Scherzer 2.01; Fiers 2.17; Hamels 2.30; Greinke 2.38; Kennedy 2.44).

SPRING TRAINING

- Made four starts in Grapefruit League games going 0-2 with a 5.40 ERA.
- Pitched in two practice games including a "B" game at Houston (3/5) and an Intrasquad game at the Cardinals complex (3/16).
- Rolled over first two innings pitched vs. WSH (2/28) in his first Spring Training start retiring Victor Robles on a strikeout and allowed seven straight batters to reach safely.
- Matched zeroes with Max Scherzer for three innings in his second game start at WSH (3/10) including not allowing a hit to his first 10 batters faced before a single to Trea Turner and a two-run home run by Starlin Castro.
- Pitched a Spring schedule high 5.1 innings vs. WSH (3/22) compiling 90 pitches.

2020 SEASON

- Had a streak of 22 consecutive regular season starts holding his opposition to three runs or less snapped at MIL (9/15), when he surrendered a career-high nine runs. The 22-game streak was the longest in Cardinals history out-distancing Bob Gibson (19) in 1968 and Lance Lynn (19) in 2014. It came up nine games short of the MLB record by a non-opener held by the Mets' Jacob deGrom (31).
- Held his opposition to three runs or less in eight of his nine starts.
- Threw a career high 43 pitches in the 1st inning at Chicago Cubs (9/4), the most by a Cardinal in the 1st inning that season and the most since Daniel Ponce de Leon hurled 41 vs. CLE (8/28).
- The Cardinals were 5-4 in his starts with three losses coming when he received zero runs of support.
- Pushed his mark to 9-1 with a 0.99 ERA in 14 career starts in August, making him the MLB leader in August ERA and opponent BA (.139) since the Live Ball Era (1920).

CAREER

- In 75 career starts, is 23-7 when receiving 2 runs of support or more, and 18-1 when receiving 3 runs or more.
- Has the 4th-lowest day game ERA (2.48) among active pitchers with 20 or more starts, trailing only (Jacob deGrom 1.82, Mike Clevenger 2.21 & Clayton Kershaw 2.36).
- At age 24.283, was the 16th youngest Cardinal to make an Opening Day start (since 1904) and youngest since Joe Magrane (Age 24.275) on April 3, 1989 vs. the NY Mets.
- Has struck out 482 batters over his first 76 career games, the most ever by a Cardinal and 12th-most in National League history (since 1908).
- Recorded five double-digit strikeouts games in 2019 and has nine for his career. His eight games with 10+ strikeouts in his first 67 career games are a Cardinals record.
- Is the third Cardinal in franchise history to strike out 180 or more in two of his first three career seasons (2018-19), joining Dizzy Dean (1932-33), and Lance Lynn (2012-13).
- Struck out 231 in 2019 (6th in NL), becoming the 8th different Cardinal (19th instance) and youngest in franchise history to strike out 200 or more in a season.
- Two-time 2019 National League Pitcher of the Month award winner (August and September). Became the first NL pitcher to win the award in back-to-back months since Max Scherzer (April & May 2018) and first Cardinal to win twice in a single season since the award was first given out in 1975.
