RAY REPORT—The Rays open a six-game, seven-day homestand against the Cubs (three to play) and Yankees (three to play) this afternoon at Tropicana Field...are coming off a 4-5 road trip through St. Louis (1-2), Milwaukee (1-2), and Minnesota (2-1), the longest trip to begin a season in franchise history...are coming off their first series win since Sept. 1-3 vs. SEA, snapping an 0-8-1 skid, their longest since Sept. 10, 2007-April 10, 2008 (0-6-3)...will seek their first series win at Tropicana Field since a three-game sweep from Sept. 20-22, 2024 vs. TOR...are tied for second in the AL East, 3.0 GB the first-place Yankees (7-1)...have spent one day in second, three in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth.

- ★ **Nick Martinez** became the eighth starting pitcher to open his Rays tenure with back-to-back quality starts (first since **Jake Faria** in 2017) and **Richie Palacios** delivered a go-ahead two-run homer on the second pitch of the 10th inning in yesterday's 4-1, rubber-game win on Easter Sunday at Target Field...Palacios' blast was his first go-ahead RBI in extra frames since May 30, 2024 vs. OAK (walk-off single in 12th) and the first go-ahead homer by a Ray in extras since **Jonathan Aranda's** two-run, walk-off shot on April 19, 2025 vs. NYY (10th).
- ★ Over their last six games, nine of the Rays 22 runs (40.9%) have come via their 7 HR...in their first three games, they hit 1 HR, a **Jonathan Aranda** solo shot on Opening Day (March 26 at STL).
- ★ Through nine games, the Rays offense ranks second in the AL in hits (86), average (.265), on-base pct. (.342), and OPS (.732), trailing the Astros in all four categories, and third in slugging pct. (.391)...they have been out-hit only once in nine games (April 1 at MIL - 8-5)...in all of MLB, only the Astros (73) have more hits against fastballs than the Rays (61).
- ★ The Rays held a lead in all nine games during their road trip and scored first in six of them...only the Braves (8), Pirates (7), and White Sox (7) have scored first more often than the Rays...they have stacked out a multi-run lead in five consecutive games.
- ★ **Shane McClanahan** is slated for his first start at Tropicana Field since July 22, 2023 vs. BAL, 989 days ago...he has gone 5-0 over his last nine starts at the Trop.

RECENT TRANSACTIONS—Today, the Rays reinstated **INF Taylor Walls** (right oblique strain) from the 10-day IL and optioned **INF Carson Williams** to Triple-A Durham...Walls is scheduled to start at shortstop and bat ninth this afternoon in his season debut.

DOMESTIC SWEET DOME—The Rays return to Tropicana Field for their first game at the venue in 561 days since Sept. 22, 2024 vs. TOR...last season, they hosted home games outdoors at George M. Steinbrenner Field in Tampa, sping home of the Yankees, following extensive damage to Tropicana Field sustained during Hurricane Milton in October 2024...for more information on Tropicana Field's restoration and upgrades, visit www.mlb.com/rays/ballpark/under-the-roof.

- ★ The Rays are 15-13 in home openers, including 4-1 since 2021...they are facing an NL opponent in their home opener for the second time, joining last season on March 28, 2025 vs. COL.
- ★ Including postseason games, the Rays are 1,142-1,006 (.532) at Tropicana Field.
- ★ The Rays will recognize the efforts of the Tropicana Field repair team and Rays staff, who helped the Rays return home after 18 months...participants and their guests will take part in a special flag unfurling ceremony that will highlight the strength and resiliency of the community during the rebuild. Pregame ceremonies begin at approximately 3:30 p.m.
- ★ Media will have the opportunity to tour newly renovated spaces inside Tropicana Field shortly after pregame ceremonies...those who plan to attend should meet in the media dining room across from the press box at 3 p.m.

CASH CONSIDERATIONS—Yesterday's 4-1, 10-inning win at Target Field was the 900th victory of **Kevin Cash's** managerial career, making him the fourth active skipper to reach the mark along with **CIN Terry Francona** (2,039), **DET A.J. Hinch** (968), and **LAD Dave Roberts** (951)...Cash is the ninth manager in MLB history to record 900 wins while managing only one team in his career, joining **LAD Walter Alston**, **LAA Mike Scioscia**, **LAD Tommy Lasorda**, **BAL Earl Weaver**, **MIN Tom Kelly**, **DET Hughie Jennings**, **PIT Danny Murtaugh**, and **STL Red Schoendienst** (Stats Perform)...Jennings also filled in for Giants manager **John McGraw**, who was ill for parts of the 1924-25 seasons, but was never considered the club's full-time skipper.

ROTATIONAL DOMINATION—The Rays starting rotation leads the majors in WHIP (0.84), opp. average (.168), opp. on-base pct. (.215), and opp. OPS (.488) while ranking fifth with a 2.94 ERA (49.0IP, 16ER)...it marks their best opp. average, on-base pct., and OPS through nine starts in franchise history, and the 0.84 WHIP ranks second to 2019 (0.80)...between **Steven Matz** and **Nick Martinez**, the Rays have recorded back-to-back starts of 6.0 IP or more with two hits or fewer for the first time since Sept. 17-19, 2024 (3GS).

DIG DUG—Yesterday, **Junior Caminero** drew a bases-loaded walk and launched his first homer of the season, a 397-foot shot on a pitch only 1.04 feet off the ground, the second-lowest pitch a Ray has homered off under Statcast (since 2015) behind current first base coach **Corey Dickerson** (0.82 ft.) on Oct. 1, 2016 vs. TEX...only 39.2 pct. of the pitches Caminero has seen have been located in the strike zone, third lowest in the majors (min. 150 pitches faced) to **DET Kerry Carpenter** (37.1%) and **HOU Jordan Alvarez** (39.1%)...despite this, his 28.3 pct. chase rate is still the lowest mark of his career.

TABLE SETTER—**Yandy Diaz** has reached base safely 21 times (15H, 4BB, 2HBP), tying **Akinori Iwamura** (2007) for the most in Rays history through the club's first nine games...Iwamura also holds the record through 10 games (23 TOB)...Diaz's 15 hits are the most by a Ray in such a span since **Evan Longoria** (15) in 2009...his 10 RBI are tied for third in the AL and pace all MLB leadoff hitters, ahead of **KC Maikel Garcia** (7)...since 2022, the only hitters with more RBI as a leadoff man than Diaz (233) are **PHI Kyle Schwarber** (265) and **NYM Marcus Semien** (245)...his 502 hits when batting first in that span rank second to **CLE Steven Kwan** (616).

CHAN ON A MISSION—**Chandler Simpson** is the first player to reach base safely in each of the Rays first nine games of a season since **Randy Arozarena** in 2023 (first 10)...he has a 10-game on-base streak overall dating back to Sept. 27, 2025, second longest of his career (18G from June 25-July 19, 2025)...he paces the majors in infield hits (6), and his five multi-hit games, which are tied with **BOS Willyer Abreu** for third in the AL behind **TEX Brandon Nimmo** and **NYG Giancarlo Stanton** (both 6G), are the most by a Rays outfielder through the club's first nine games since **Rocco Baldelli** and **Carl Crawford** (both 5G) in 2003.

- ★ His nine hits off fastballs are tied for second in the AL behind Nimmo (10).
- ★ According to Baseball Savant, Simpson leads all major league left fielders with two outs above average...he recorded -5 OAA last season.

HOLDING DOWN THE FORT(ES)—**Nick Fortes** has reached base safely in eight straight games, tied with **Mike Difelice** (1998) for the second-longest season-opening streak by a Rays catcher behind **Toby Hall** (14G) in 2002...he has a career-high 10-game on-base streak overall dating back to Sept. 25, 2025...his nine hits while playing catcher are tied with **ATL Drake Baldwin** for the most in the majors...between Fortes (9-for-22) and **Hunter Feduccia** (3-for-8), Rays backstops lead the majors in hits (12) and average (.400).

- ★ All nine of his hits have come off fastballs (9-for-18/500)...he has whiffed on only two of 38 swings on heaters (94.7% contact rate)...his 84.0 pct. contact rate overall is 10th in the AL (min. 25PA).
- ★ Fortes has hit safely in a career-high 11 consecutive starts dating back to Sept. 17, 2025 vs. TOR, batting .341 (14-for-41) with 2 2B, 1 HR, and 7 RBI in those games...it marks the longest streak by a Rays backstop since **Wilson Ramos'** club-record (for a catcher) 18-game streak from April 14-May 12 (G2), 2018.

NORTH SIDERS HEAD SOUTH—The Rays and Cubs meet for their 10th all-time series (4-3-2 in prev. nine) this week, including their fourth at Tropicana Field (2-0-1)...despite dropping two of three games at Wrigley Field last year from Sept. 12-14, the Rays are seeking their third series win in their last four sets with the Cubs...since 2023, seven of the nine games between the clubs have been one-run affairs...the winning run has been scored in the 7th inning or later in six of the last seven meetings.

- ★ Since the clubs began meeting annually in 2023, the Rays have pitched to a 2.92 ERA (77.0IP, 25ER) in nine games against Chicago, their fifth-best mark vs. any opponent in that span...they are 83-63 (.568) in Interleague play since balanced schedules were introduced during the same season, the second-best winning pct. vs. the NL among AL clubs behind the Astros (81-59/.579).

SUGAR SHANE—Shane McClanahan will toe the rubber for his second start of the season and first at home...is seeking his first win since June 16, 2023 at SD...missed the last two years after his second Tommy John surgery wiped out his 2024 season and nerve-related issues sidelined him for 2025...marks his 76th career start and 41st at home...selected by the Rays in the Compensatory Round (31st overall) of the 2018 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of South Florida.

LAST TIME OUT—Making his first major league start in 973 days, McClanahan shouldered the loss in a 6-2 setback on March 31 at MIL (L, 4.2IP, 2H, 3R-2ER, 3BB, 4SO)...did not allow a hit until **Brandon Lockridge's** one-out single in the 5th—the 4.1 IP stretch was the longest individual no-hit bid by a Ray since **Ryan Pepiot** (5.0IP) on Sept. 4, 2025 vs. CLE and longest on the road since **Taj Bradley** (5.2IP) on June 24, 2025 at KC...retired 12 of his first 13 BF through 4.0 innings, yielding only a **Gary Sánchez** walk in the 2nd...with the Rays ahead, 2-0, loaded the bases with two outs in the 5th on two walks and a single before his final batter **Brice Turang**, plated all three baserunner with a single...gave way to **Cole Sulser**, who escaped the frame with a ground out on the first pitch he threw.

DA CUBS—McClanahan will be starting opposite the Cubs for the third time, with both of his previous outings coming at Wrigley Field...he is seeking his first career win over Chicago despite pitching to a 2.31 ERA (11.2IP, 3ER) with 16 SO against 2 BB in two starts.

- ★ He is 3-2 with a 1.43 ERA (50.1IP, 8ER) 63 SO, 11 BB, and a 0.85 WHIP in eight career starts vs. NL Central opponents, six of which were quality...it marks the lowest ERA against the division among active starters (min. 8GS).
- ★ McClanahan has gone 8-2 with a 2.08 ERA (82.1IP, 19ER) in 14 career Interleague starts...min. 10 starts, it signals the lowest career Interleague ERA among active AL pitchers.

HOMECOMING—This marks McClanahan's first start at Tropicana Field in 989 days, with his last outing coming on July 22, 2023 vs. BAL...he is 21-8 with a 2.96 ERA (221.2IP, 73ER) in 40 career starts at the Trop...it marks the third-lowest ERA in the ballpark's history (min. 200.0IP) to **Blake Snell** (2.70) and **David Price** (2.85).

- ★ He is seeking his first win at Tropicana Field since June 11, 2023 vs. TEX...it would mark his 22nd win at the venue, tying **Matt Moore** and **Jake Odorizzi** for the seventh-most wins in Trop history...his .724 (21-8) career winning pct. at Tropicana Field is the best by a starting pitcher (min. 20GS).

THE ROAD BACK—McClanahan exited his start on Aug. 2, 2023 at Yankee Stadium with left forearm tightness and was placed on the 15-day IL the next day...he consulted with three doctors before opting for his second Tommy John surgery, performed by Dr. Keith Meister on Aug. 21, 2023 in Dallas, Tx. ...resumed throwing off the mound in August 2024 and faced live hitters at the Rays spring facility in Port Charlotte, Fla. the following month...entered the offseason fully healthy and began his usual spring build up...in his third Grapefruit League start, was removed with left triceps tightness, which was later diagnosed as nerve irritation...began the year on the 15-day IL and was moved to the 60-day IL on April 26...consulted with nerve specialist Dr. Gregory Paul in Dallas after feeling discomfort during his first full-distance bullpen session June 7...resumed throwing progression shortly after the visit...made three rehab starts between the FCL Rays (July 8) and Triple-A Durham (July 8 & 13)...was pulled from his rehab assignment on July 22 with biceps tendinitis...underwent radial nerve decompression surgery on his left triceps Aug. 11, performed by Dr. Steven Shin in Los Angeles, officially ending his hopes of a 2025 return.

STRIKEOUT ARTIST—During his first three seasons (2021-23), McClanahan's 10.14 strikeouts per 9.0 IP ranked second among MLB left-handers (min. 400.0IP) behind **Blake Snell** (11.85)...under the same parameter, it was the second-highest mark by a southpaw through his first three major league campaigns, trailing SD/PIT **Oliver Pérez** (10.34)...his 456 career strikeouts are sixth-most by a left-hander in franchise history and are the most by any Ray through his first three seasons, regardless of handedness, outpacing **James Shields** (448, 2006-08) despite McClanahan (404.2IP) throwing 150 fewer innings than Shields (554.2IP).

- ★ Min. 1,000 BF, his 33.4 pct. whiff rate from 2021-23 ranked fourth in the majors behind ATL **Spencer Strider** (37.0%), SD **Blake Snell** (33.7%), and MIL **Corbin Burnes** (33.7%)...he led the majors with a 48.4 pct. whiff rate on his changeup in that span (min. 1,000 changeups thrown).
- ★ Min. 400.0 IP, his 3.02 ERA (404.2IP, 136ER) from 2021-23 ranked second in the AL to LAA **Shohei Ohtani** (2.84) and was second among all left-handed pitchers in the majors to ATL **Max Fried** (2.71).

SHINING STAR—He was selected for the AL All-Star team in 2022 and 2023, earning a starting nod in the former season...joined **David Price** (2010) as the only Rays pitchers to start an All-Star Game...McClanahan and **Evan Longoria** (3x) are the only Rays players to earn All-Star nods in two of their first three major league seasons...he also joined Price (2010-12) as the only Rays pitchers to be tabbed as All-Stars in back-to-back seasons...also joined Price, **Chris Archer** (2x) and **Scott Kazmir** (2x) as the only Rays pitchers with multiple All-Star selections in their careers.

MLB CAREER RUNDOWN—In 2023, was the Rays Opening Day starter for the second straight year and started 21 games before Tommy John surgery ended his season...after his final start on Aug. 2 at NYY, led the AL in whiff rate (33.4%) while ranking highly in wins (T2nd, 11), opp. average (6th, .222), and ERA (8th, 3.29)...earned the win in each of his first five starts, matching **Matt Moore** (2013) for the longest streak to begin a season in Rays history and was the first Rays pitcher to win 11 of his first 12 decisions in a season...from Opening Day—June 16, went 11-1 with a major-league-best 2.12 ERA (89.1IP, 21ER), 15 points lower than the next closest pitcher (**HOU Framer Valdez** - 2.27)...marked the third-lowest ERA through a Rays pitcher's first 15 starts of a season behind himself in 2022 (1.77) and **Chris Archer** in 2015 (2.08)...was the Rays Roberto Clemente Award nominee.

- ★ Named the Rays Don Zimmer MVP by the Tampa Bay chapter of the BBWAA and finished sixth in AL Cy Young voting in 2022 after leading the club in wins (12), innings (166.1), and strikeouts (194)...started on Opening Day, for the AL in the All-Star Game and in Game 1 of the Rays Wild Card Series at CLE...his 0.93 WHIP ranked second in the AL and was the lowest in Rays history, passing **Blake Snell** (0.97) in his 2018 Cy Young season.
- ★ In 2021, established himself as a full-time big leaguer, tying for the team lead in wins (10), which tied for second most among AL rookies...min. 100.0 IP, his 3.43 ERA ranked third in club history among rookies behind **Jeremy Hellickson** (2.95) in 2011 and **Chris Archer** (3.22) in 2013.
- ★ Saw his first major league action during the Rays run to the 2020 postseason...made four appearances, including his MLB debut in Game 1 of the ALDS vs. NYY...became the second player and first pitcher in major league history to appear in a World Series game before appearing in a regular season contest, joining KC **Adalberto Mondesi** in 2015.
