METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets blanked the Brewers, 4-0, last night...The Mets are seeking their 13th series victory of the season and their sixth road series...With a win today, the Mets would win consecutive road series victories for the second time this year (also, May 1-3 at LAA & May 4-6 at COL)...The Mets are 7-7 in rubber games this year...Today, the team concludes a six-game road trip (3-2) against the Phillies (2-1) and Milwaukee (1-1)...New York is off on Thursday...On Friday, the team begins a 10-game homestand against the Dodgers (three games), Braves (three games) and Marlins (four games).

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets are 22-31 on the road this season... They have won five of their last seven road games...New York has posted a 4.10 ERA, while hitting .232/.298/.378.

CREW-METS NOTES: The Mets are 32-45 at the ballpark and 4-13 since it was renamed.

A.J. IN STYLE: Over his last 13 games, A.J. Ewing is batting .304 (17-56) with eight runs, three doubles, three homers, six RBI, four walks, three steals, a .350 OBP, a .518 SLG and an .868 OPS...He has posted a .271/.344/.422 mark this year with 18 extra-base hits and 25 RBI in 62 games this season.

BO KNOWS: Over his last 40 games since June 3, Bo Bichette has a .323/.359/.490 slashline with 23 runs, nine doubles, one triple, five homers, 10 walks, 23 RBI with an .859 OPS...He has drawn a walk in four straight games, which matches his career-long streak (also, 9/2-9/6/25 & 5/7-5/10/25).

TAYLOR MADE: Since returning from the IL on June 28, Tyrone Taylor has appeared in 15 games, batting .379 (11-29) with seven runs, three doubles, four homers, four RBI, three walks with a .438 OBP, an .897 SLG and a 1.334 OPS...He owns a .286/.297/.556 slashline against left-handed pitchers this year.

BRETT THE MET: In 15 games since June 30, Brett Baty is batting .276 (16-58) with 10 runs, four doubles, two homers, six RBI, two walks, two steals with a .290 OBP, a .448 SLG and a .739 OPS...He has reached base safely in all but two of those contests.

THIS DAY IN 1986: The Mets defeated the Reds, 6-3, in 14 innings despite a protest made by Cincinnati...The game included a bench-clearing brawl, several ejections, and players playing out of position...Jesse Orrosco and Roger McDowell alternated between the mound and outfield, while Gary Carter played third base...The Mets scored three runs in the top of the 14th to earn their 62nd victory...The Mets recorded three hits in the loss...This season, the Mets will celebrate the 40th anniversary of the 1986 World Series Champions...The Mets will also host a 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration to celebrate the 1986 title on Saturday, August 1 prior to the 4:10 p.m. game against the Miami Marlins...Additional information for the 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration is available at [Mets.com/1986](https://mets.com/1986).

NEW SKIPPER: Andy Green has been named Interim Manager for the remainder of the 2026 season...Green, who joined the Mets organization in 2023 and previously served as Senior Vice President, Baseball Development, managed the San Diego Padres from 2016-19, guiding the club to a 274-366 (.428) record...The 48-year-old played parts of four Major League seasons with the Diamondbacks (2004-06) and appeared in four games with the Mets in 2009...He will wear #70...The Mets are 9-12 since Green took the helm.

BLAME IT ON THE BENGE: In 15 games in July, Carson Benge is batting .298 (17-57) with eight runs, three doubles, two homers, eight RBI, seven walks, five steals with a .369 OBP, a .456 SLG and a .825 OPS...His .263 batting average is third the NL among qualified rookies...He has collected 97 hits this year, which is third among all rookies...Benge has recorded 16 steals this season, the second-most by any rookie this year...The record by a Mets rookie is 24 set by Mookie Wilson in 1981.

LIN DOOR COUNTY: Over the last three games, Francisco Lindor is 7-11 with two runs, two doubles, one homer, four RBI, three walks and a 1.805 OPS...He owns a .240/.317/.440 slashline against right-handed pitching this year...In 16 games in July, Lindor is batting .271/.358/.475 with three doubles, three homers and an .833 OPS.

LAST TIME OUT: Threw 5.2 scoreless innings and earned the win on July 16 against Philadelphia (5.2 IP, 3 H, 0 ER, 0 BB, 7 K) while striking out seven batters...Recorded his second consecutive scoreless start...Did not issue a walk for his first start since May 1...Prior to his previous two starts, he allowed six homers over his last three starts...He only allowed one home run over his first eight starts of the season and hadn't allowed a home run in each of his previous six starts dating back to May 7.

FOUR IS THE MAGIC NUMBER: Through 22 career Major League starts, Christian Scott has allowed four or fewer runs in each of them...Scott is the only starting pitcher in franchise history to allow four or fewer runs in his first 22 Major League games...Three other Mets starters allowed four or fewer runs in 21 of their first 22 Major League games: Matt Harvey, Kodai Senga and Zack Wheeler...Scott is only the eighth starter in Major League history to allow four or fewer runs in each of their first 22 career outings.

VS. BREWERS: Today, Scott will make his first career start against the Brewers...Has previously faced only the Pirates and Cardinals among NL Central clubs

NO BIG FLY ZONE: Prior to his previous five starts, Scott had only allowed one home run on the season...From his season debut, April 23 - June 10, Scott was one of eight pitchers in the majors to log 30.0 innings and allow one or zero home runs...Across nine starts (47.1 IP) in 2024, Scott allowed eight home runs.

ADD A W TO HIS LEDGER: Scott has earned a win in three of his last seven starts...Scott's career-opening streak of 15 games without a win was the second-longest such streak by a starter (no relief appearances during span) behind Liam Hendriks' 17 straight career-opening winless streak from 2010-2011.

2024 SEASON RECAP: Scott finished his rookie season going 0-3 with a 4.56 ERA (24 ER/47.1 IP), adding 39 strikeouts and 12 walks before being placed on the IL with a sprained UCL in his right elbow...Made his MLB debut on May 4 in Tampa Bay, throwing 6.2 innings and allowing just one run, adding six strikeouts and one walk...Recorded a career-high eight strikeouts on May 11 against Atlanta, throwing 6.0 innings and allowing just three runs.

WHAT A DEBUT: Scott made his Major League debut on May 4 in Tampa Bay...He recorded a no decision in the Mets 3-1 loss, throwing 6.2 innings and allowing just one run on five hits with one walk and six strikeouts...He became the third Mets player to make his major league debut this year...Scott is the first Mets pitcher to toss at least 6.0 innings in their debut since Steven Matz did so on June 28, 2015 vs. Cincinnati.

SLIDE TO THE RIGHT: While seeking a third pitch, looked at Pitching Ninja video and discovered the slider grip used by Max Scherzer...It's still the grip he uses today... Was predominately a reliever throughout his career at the University of Florida and transitioned to a starting role after he was selected by the Mets.

MINOR LEAGUE BACKGROUND: Was Named the New York Mets 2023 Pitcher of the Year after making 19 starts this across three levels season and posting a 5-4 record with a 2.57 ERA (25 ER/87.2 IP) with 12 walks and 107 strikeouts...In 2023, held opposing hitters to a .199 batting average and posted 10.98 strikeouts per nine innings...Started for the Rumble Ponies in Game One of the Northeast Division Series...In 2022, he split his time between A St. Lucie and A+ Brooklyn with a combined 4.45 ERA in 18 appearances...In 2021, he had three relief outings for FCL Mets and threw 12 strikes out of 16 total pitches.

- Threw a scoreless eighth inning and recorded two strikeouts on July 19 at Philadelphia (1.0 IP, 2 K, BB)...32 of his 41 appearances this season have been scoreless.
- Entered with one out and the bases loaded on July 11 vs. Boston and didn't allow anyone to score (0.2 IP, K).
- He throws his changeup 41.0% of the time and opponents are hitting .176 (13-74) in at-bats ending in his changeup....He has recorded 22 of his 46 strikeouts via the changeup...His changeup produces a 18.9% hard-hit rate, which is the second-best mark in the majors among qualified changeups.
- Dating back to September 20, 2025, he hasn't allowed an earned run in 37 of his last 45 appearances...He is 4-2 with a 2.33 ERA (14 ER/54.0 IP) and is holding opposing batters to a .169 batting average (32-189) over that span.
- Has made 44 appearances against NL Central opponents...In those contests, he is 6-0 with eight holds and a 1.59 ERA (8 ER/45.1 IP)...Hasn't allowed an earned run over five appearances (4.2 IP) lifetime against Milwaukee.
- Threw 2.0 innings in relief and didn't allow a run (2.0 IP, 3 H, 2 K, 2 BB) on July 7 vs. Kansas City (2.0 IP, 3 H, 2 K, 2 BB)...Has completed at least 2.0 innings six times this season and allowed an earned run in only one of those appearances.
- Recorded one out and allowed a career-high-tying five runs on July 5 at Atlanta (0.1 IP, 4 H, 5 ER, K, BB)...The only other time he has allowed at least five runs in an outing was June 26, 2024 at Kansas City while with Miami.
- Entered with no outs and two men on in the fourth inning on June 24 (G2) vs. Chicago-NL (2.0 IP, 4 K) and struck out the side...He also threw a scoreless fifth inning while recording one more strikeout...Is the ninth time in his career he has recorded at least four strikeouts in an outing and has done so twice this season (also: 6/12 vs. ATL).
- Made his sixth start of the season on June 7 at San Diego and he threw a scoreless first inning (1.0 IP, 2 BB)...Over 7.0 innings as a starter this season he has allowed four earned runs and four of his six starts have been scoreless...For his career as an opener, he has pitched to a 3.27 ERA (4 ER/11.0 IP) over nine starts.
- Made his third career Opening Day roster and his second consecutive with the Mets.
- Pitched in three games for the Dominican Republic in the World Baseball Classic...He tossed 4.0 scoreless innings and struck out seven of the 13 batters he faced.
- Last season, he made a career-high 52 appearances and finished with a 5-2 record, two saves, 12 holds, 57 strikeouts, and a 3.57 ERA (25 ER/63.0 IP).
- In 2025, he allowed just five earned runs over 25 combined appearances in March, April, and May (1.34 ERA)...His ERA through his first 25 games of the season is the 11th-best in franchise history.

- Was recalled from Triple-A Syracuse prior to their game on July 21...Marks his fourth stint with the team this season...Hasn't allowed a run over three appearances in the majors this season (5.0 IP).
- His last appearance with the Mets came on June 14 vs. Atlanta (1.2 IP, BB, K) and he recorded five outs without allowing a run.
- In 24 appearances (seven starts) with Syracuse this season he is 3-2 and has pitched to 4.75 ERA (16 ER/30.1 IP) with 30 strikeouts...His last appearance came on July 17 vs. Buffalo where he tossed a scoreless inning and stuck out the side on 15 pitches.
- Tossed 2.1 scoreless innings in his season and Mets debut on May 19 at Washington (2.1 IP, H, K)...Marked his longest Major League appearance.
- Made two Grapefruit League appearances this spring and allowed three runs over 1.1 innings pitched.
- Pitched in the WBC for Mexico, and over two appearances, he allowed one run over 2.0 innings.
- Before this season, his last Major League appearance came on April 3rd, 2024, at Milwaukee while with Minnesota...He pitched in two games for the Twins that season.
- Made 31 appearances for the Reds in 2023 and pitched to a 3.69 ERA (13 ER/31.2 IP) with three wins and one save...Over 34 Major League appearances between Cincinnati and Minnesota from 2022-2024, he went 3-0 with one save, a 3.99 ERA (17 ER/38.1 IP) and 28 strikeouts.
- Pitched for Los Mochis in the Mexican Winter League in 2025-2026, and he didn't allow an earned run over 24.0 innings.
