TWINS PEAK: Winners of five of their first six games to start the month of June, the Detroit Tigers tonight play the first of three games against the Minnesota Twins, the second and final series of this two-team, six-game homestand that began with a series win vs. the Seattle Mariners (2-1) ... after this series, the Tigers on Friday begin a two-city, six-game road trip through Cleveland and Houston.

- Thanks to Kevin McGonigle's first-career walk-off hit on Sunday, the Tigers have now won two series in a row for the first time since turning in a perfect 6-0 homestand from April 10-16 ... overall the Tigers began the season 5-2-1 in their first eight series and lost 10 of their next 11 series before winning their first two series of June.
- The Tigers are 5-1 in June, their best start to this calendar month in 10 years when the Tigers started off 5-1 en route to a 6-1 start in June of 2016.
- This homestand marked the start of 16 home games within the month of June for the Tigers, as the Tigers will play 16 of 22 games at Comerica Park from June 5 - June 28.

MELTON LAVA: Troy Melton last time out turned in the best start of his young major league career as he picked up a 7-2 win last Wednesday after limiting the Tampa Bay Rays to two runs on four hits and two walks in a career-best 8.0 innings pitched, the longest start by a Tigers pitcher this season.

- Melton retired his final 17 batters faced and at one point threw 22-consecutive strikes between the fifth and eighth innings.

CENTRAL CASTING: This series with the Twins starts a packed two-week stretch against A.L. Central competition as the Tigers, starting tonight, will play nine of their next 12 games against intradivision foes ... the Tigers are 4-13 (.235) against the A.L. Central this season, by far the worst intradivision record of any of the five clubs ... the top three teams in the division all have winning records vs. the A.L. Central, and the teams other than Detroit all have nine+ wins against intradivision foes thus far.

- Detroit's .235 intradivision win percentage is/was its third-lowest entering June in the last 26 seasons starting in 2000, ahead of only the 2008 (5-17, .227) and 2003 (5-22, .185) campaigns ... the four division wins into June are Detroit's fewest since joining the A.L. Central in 1998.
- The Tigers are 4-2 vs. Kansas City this season and 0-11 against the other three teams in the division (0-4 at Minnesota, 0-4 vs. Cleveland, 0-3 at Chicago).

IT'S KEVIN AND BOBBY: Kevin McGonigle (3.4 bWAR) and Bobby Witt Jr (3.7 bWAR) are the only two shortstops on the American League All-Star ballot with a bWAR greater than 2.2, making them the clear-cut favorites for the A.L. All-Star team this season ... Witt Jr. is tied for first in all of baseball in bWAR while McGonigle is closely behind at fifth-best in the majors.

- McGonigle also has a substantial lead on the next closest A.L. rookie in bWAR, as Chicago's Munetaka Murakami is way behind Kevin at a 2.0 bWAR ... McGonigle has a 3.4 bWAR at 21-years-old ... the next closest 21-year-old?: Baltimore's Samuel Basallo at a 1.5 bWAR.

IT'S DILLON AND SHEA: Dillon Dingler leads A.L. catchers with 44 RBI and ranks second in the A.L. with 14 homers, a .488 slugging percentage and an .808 OPS, trailing only the Athletics' Shea Langeliers in those categories among league qualifiers ... no other catcher in the A.L. is close to those two ... metrics show that Dingler has received 118.34 called strikes looking above expected called strikes, by far the best number in the majors (New York's Austin Wells is second at 92.73).

- Dingler has a 2.1 bWAR this season, the second-best mark among A.L. catchers and behind only Langeliers and his 2.8 bWAR this year ... no other catcher on the A.L. All-Star ballot has a bWAR above 1.8 this season ... visit [Tigers.com/vote](https://www.tigers.com/vote).

GREENE WITH ENVY: Riley Greene, who is vying for his third-straight All-Star honor, is now batting .335 (62-for-185) with 12 doubles, 23 RBI, a .425 on-base, a .497 slugging and a .923 OPS in his last 52 games over the past eight+ weeks starting April 11 ... he leads the A.L. in batting average, is second in the majors in on-base percentage and is ninth in the A.L. in OPS in this span.

JUNE SLUG: The Tigers offense leads the A.L. with a .549 slugging percentage and an .885 OPS in June, 48 points higher than the next closest club (White Sox, .837) ... the Tigers also rank third in the A.L. with a .279 team batting average this calendar month.

IT'S BEEN A GRIND: Through their first 26 games, the Tigers went 14-12 and woke up on April 24 with a share of first place in the A.L. Central ... in their 40 games since, the Tigers have gone 13-27 to drop their record to 27-39 and tied for last place in the division ... Detroit's 13-27 (.325) record in the last six+ weeks starting April 24 is the second-lowest win percentage in baseball in this span.

- Despite going 5-1 to start the month of June, the Tigers have still lost 14 of their last 21 games, 17 of their last 25 games and 22 of their last 31 games starting May 4.

AND FINALLY: Troy Melton is 4-1 with a 2.40 ERA (10 ER/39.0 IP) through his first seven big league starts ... he is only the fourth pitcher in the history of the franchise to post a 2.40 ERA with one loss or fewer in his first seven starts (non-openers edition), joining Drew Smyly (1-0, 2.31 ERA in 2012), Mark Fidrych (6-1, 2.10 ERA in 1976) and Herman Pillette (4-1, 1.89 ERA in 1922).

- Turned in the best start of his young major league career last Wednesday against Tampa Bay, as he picked up his second win of the season, limiting the Rays to two runs on four hits and two walks in a career-best 8.0 innings pitched, the longest start by a Tigers pitcher this season...Melton retired his final 17 batters faced and at one point threw 22-consecutive strikes between the fifth and eighth innings.
- Allowed one run on six hits and a walk while striking out one over 7.0 innings on May 29 against Chicago-AL, his second straight outing of surrendering just one run to begin his season.
- Started the 2026 season on the 60-day injured list with right elbow inflammation...activated on May 24 and pitched that night, allowing just one earned run on two hits and three walks while striking out three over 5.2 innings.
- Made his Major League debut on July 23, 2025, against Pittsburgh...earned his first big league win on July 28 last year against Arizona in his first home start, tossing seven scoreless innings, allowing just five hits while also striking out five.
- Selected by Detroit in the fourth round (117th overall) of the 2022 MLB Draft out of San Diego State University.

- Blew back-to-back save opportunities on May 29 and May 31 against Chicago-AL...allowed three earned runs on five hits over 1.1 innings between the two outings.
- Tossed 3.0 perfect innings and earned the win on May 27 against Los Angeles-AL...continued a stretch of 14.0 consecutive innings over five games dating back to May 13 in which he has not allowed an earned run...has allowed just five hits and four walks compared to 16 strikeouts over this span.
- Earned a six-out save on May 24 against Baltimore, striking out four over his two scoreless frames.
- Made the third big league start of his career on May 20 against Cleveland, his first since Aug. 7, 2021, with the Texas Rangers against the Athletics...tossed 4.2 scoreless frames, allowing just two hits and two walks while striking out a career-high seven batters.
- Threw 4.0 scoreless innings on May 15 against Toronto, allowing just one hit while striking out one...was called upon for long relief after the original Tigers bulk pitcher left the game early with an injury.
- Earned his first win of the season and second of his major league career on April 30 against Atlanta, tossing 2.0 scoreless frames...allowed one hit and one walk while striking out two, keeping Detroit within a run before they took the lead late.
- Earned his first career major league save with 3.1 scoreless innings, allowing two walks while striking out two in a victory over the Marlins on April 11.
- Signed with Detroit on a one-year major league contract with a club option for the 2027 season on Dec. 16, 2025.
- Spent each of the previous two seasons with the SSG Langers of the KBO League...went 12-7 with a 2.25 ERA (43 ER/171.2 IP) in 30 starts for SSG last season, recording 245 strikeouts in his 171.2 innings pitched, an average of 12.8 strikeouts per nine innings.
- In his two seasons with SSG, went 23-10 with a 2.91 ERA (93 ER/287.1 IP) in 54 appearances (53 starts)...released by Detroit after nine appearances with Triple-A Toledo in 2024 prior to signing with the Langers.
- Has spent parts of five seasons with the Philadelphia Phillies (2017-19), Chicago White Sox (2020) and Texas Rangers (2021) prior to joining the Tigers this year...also pitched with Hiroshima in the NPB for the 2022-23 campaigns.

- Saw his first major league action of the season on May 30 against Chicago-AL, allowing three earned runs on three hits (two home runs) and striking out three.
- Began the season on the 60-day injured list with a left adductor strain...rehabbed with Lakeland and Toledo in May, allowing four earned runs on six hits including two home runs while walking three and striking out five over 5.2 innings with Toledo.
- Made his first career Opening Day roster in 2025...pitched in 22 games (one start) to a 1-3 record and a 6.55 ERA.
- Pitched in 46 games (12 starts) for the Tigers in 2024, finishing with a 4-5 record, 3.59 ERA (27ER/67.2IP) and 69 strikeouts...set career-best marks in strikeouts, wins, holds (6), opponent batting average (.224), slugging percentage (.354) and OPS (.664).
- Started on Sept. 13 and 14 vs. Baltimore in 2024, becoming the first Tigers pitcher to start back-to-back team games, which were on consecutive days, since George Uhle on Aug. 4-5, 1929.
- Made his postseason debut on Oct. 1, 2024, at Houston, walking one in a scoreless two-thirds of an inning to pick up the save...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he became the first pitcher in franchise history to record a save in his first career playoff game.
- Started his postseason career with 5.1 no-hit innings with two walks and six strikeouts in his first four outings.

- Since the year 1990, McGonigle is one of only four players with at least 53 hits and 31 walks in his first 50 major league games, joining Juan Soto (Nationals, 2018), Logan Morrison (Marlins, 2010) and Kosuke Fukudome (Cubs, 2008)...he is the first in Tigers history to accomplish the feat.

- Named the American League Rookie of the Month for March/April on May 4, becoming the seventh-ever Tiger to win the award and first since Colt Keith in July of 2024...is the second Tiger to ever win it in the first month of the season, joining Austin Jackson who did so in April of 2010.
- Reached base safely in 27 consecutive starts spanning exactly one month, from March 30-April 30...he is the first Tigers rookie to do so since outfielder Dick Wakefield reached in 29 straight starts back in 1943 (thanks to Elias)...the last 21-year-old or younger Tiger prior to reach base safely in 27-or-more starts in a row was Al Kaline, who reached in 34-straight starts nearly 70 years ago from July 26-Aug. 28, 1956.
- Is the first 21-year-old or younger Tiger with nine doubles in any calendar month in 110 years when 21-year-old Harry Heilmann also had nine doubles in April 1916.
- Just the fifth player in major league history with 30 or more hits, 10 or more doubles and less than 15 strikeouts in his first 25 big league games at 21-years-old or younger, and the first such player in 90 years when Cleveland's Roy Weatherly and New York's Joe DiMaggio each did so at 21-years-old in 1936.
- Clubbed his first major league home run on Sunday, April 12, against Sandy Alcantara and the Miami Marlins.
- Became the first player in Tigers franchise history to notch a multi-RBI game in each of his first two major league games when he laced his tiebreaking, game-winning two-run eighth-inning single into right field in game two for Detroit.
- First Tiger with a go-ahead or game-winning RBI in the eighth inning or later within his first two major league games since Omar Infante was credited with an eighth-inning game-winning RBI on Sept. 7, 2002, in his big league debut at Yankee Stadium (Elias).
- Ripped the first pitch he ever saw in the big leagues into right field for a two-run double, instantly becoming only the sixth Tiger since the RBI became a stat in 1920 to record two RBI in his major league debut, the first since Isaac Paredes on Aug. 17, 2020...is the second of the six to accomplish this feat on Opening Day, joining Paredes, JaCoby Jones (Aug. 30, 2016), Rob Richie (Aug. 19, 1989), Jake Wood (Opening Day April 11, 1961), Hank Riebe (Aug. 26, 1942) and Sammy Hale (April 20, 1920) in turning this trick.
- Became the first Tiger ever with two doubles in his major league debut on Opening Day and the second in the history of the franchise with two doubles in his major league debut on any day, joining Hank Riebe on Aug. 26, 1942.
- McGonigle is the second player in franchise history to collect four hits in his major league debut, joining Billy Bean (April 25, 1987).
- At 21 years, 220 days old on Opening Day, he became the second-youngest player in the history of the Tigers franchise to make his major league debut in the starting lineup on Opening Day and the youngest in 112 years since starting first baseman George Burns made his major league debut on Opening Day April 14, 1914...thanks to Elias.
