METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Cubs, 2-1, in extra-innings on Sunday in Chicago...Today the Mets start 10-day, nine-game homestand against the Twins (three games), Rockies (three games) and Nationals (three games).

HAPPY BIRTHDAY: Former Mets pitcher Jesse Orosco and broadcaster Keith Raad celebrate their birthdays today...We wish them well...Orosco spent eight years with the Mets, going 47-47 with 107 saves, a 2.73 ERA, 240 walks and 506 strikeouts...Raad, a native of Long Island, is in his fourth season as a radio play-by-play broadcaster for the Mets.

THIS ONE GOES TO 11: The Mets are on a season-long 11-game losing streak...The Mets have posted a 5.70 ERA (60 ER/94.2 IP) in that span with 38 walks and 88 strikeouts...As a team, they are batting .200/.239/.289... They have been outscored 62-19 in the current streak...This is the longest losing streak since an 11-game streak from August 28-September 8, 2004...This is tied for the seventh-longest losing streak in franchise history...The last time the team lost 12 games in a row was from August 10-23, 2002...The team's longest losing streak in franchise history is 17 from May 21-June 6, 1962.

AHEAD OF THE PACK: This season, Nolan McLean is 1-1 with a 2.28 ERA (6 ER/23.2 IP), 28 strikeouts and is holding opposing batters to a .125 (10-80) over four starts...Among qualified NL pitchers, he is first in opponents' batting average, first in WHIP (0.76), eighth in ERA and tied for 10th in strikeouts.

RECORD BOOKS: Through 12 career starts, McLean is 6-2 with a 2.13 ERA (17 ER/71.2 IP) and 85 strikeouts...His ERA is the second-best in franchise history through a player's first 12 career starts, only trailing Terry Leach's 1.70 ERA from 1981-1987...His 85 strikeouts rank fourth in franchise history through a pitcher's first 12 career starts, only trailing Dwight Gooden's 93, Matt Harvey's 89, and Nolan Ryan's 88...Per *Elias*... He is only one of two pitchers in Major League History to record at least 85 strikeouts and allow 17 or fewer earned runs through their first 12 career Major League starts (also: Paule Skenes 97 K's and 16 ER)...He is one of only three players in Major League History to throw at least 5.0 innings, strike out six or more batters and allow two or fewer earned runs in nine of his first 12 career games (also: Matt Harvey and Paul Skenes).

SAY HEY MJ: Since being recalled from Triple-A, MJ Melendez has appeared in four games, going 5-14 with two runs, two doubles, one home run, two RBI and two walks.

TWINS-METS NOTES: The Twins are visiting Queens for the first time since July 29-31, 2024...The Mets own an 8-3 record against the Twins at Citi Field.

SPIN THAT THING: This season, he has thrown his curveball 11.0% of the time and he is generating an average of 3,322 RPM on the pitch...That is the highest average RPM on any pitch in the majors this season...He is posting a 40.9% whiff rate on his curveball...Batters are hitting just .059 (1-17) in at-bats ending with his curveball...Over his first 12 career starts, opposing batters are hitting .068 (3-44) in at-bats ending with McLean's curveball, and he has recorded a career 45.45% whiff rate on the pitch.

THE HUASCAR GOES TO: Huascar Brazobán has not allowed an earned run in 11 multi-inning appearances since 2025...He has yet to allow a run over 9.1 innings this season, the sixth-most innings without allowing a run in the Majors by a relief pitcher.

STOP SIGN: The Mets are 30th in the league with a .288 OBP and 28th in the league in walks with 64...Francisco Lindor has not drawn a walk in each of his last 14 games (min. 1 PA)...His 14 straight such games (min. 1 PA) is his second-longest single regular season streak...He had an 18-game streak from August-September 2016...Courtesy of *Elias*.

IN A PINCH: The Mets have recorded an MLB leading eight RBI from their pinch-hitters this season...In 2025, the Mets recorded a total of nine RBI from their pinch-hitters...Overall this year, Mets pinch hitters are batting .294 (5-17) with two runs, one double, one home run and eight RBI.

WE REMEMBER: The New York Mets announced that the club will wear a memorial "Davey" patch on the sleeve of their home and road uniforms during the 2026 season...Johnson passed away on September 5, 2025 at the age of 82...He finished his Mets career with the most managerial wins in franchise history (595) and the best winning percentage (.588)...In 1986, Johnson guided the team to a franchise-record 108 regular season victories and capped the year off with a dramatic World Championship... From 1984-1990, under his helm, the Mets averaged more than 95 wins.

THIS DAY IN 1986: The Mets defeated the Pirates, 6-5, in walk-off fashion on this day in 1986...Gary Carter hit a single to left, allowing Tim Teufel to score and sending the Mets to their fourth straight victory...This season, the Mets will celebrate the 40th anniversary of the 1986 World Series Champions New York Mets...The Mets will also host a 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration to celebrate the 1986 World Champion Mets on Saturday, August 1 prior to the 4:10 p.m. game against the Miami Marlins...Additional information regarding programming for the 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration will be available at a later date at [Mets.com/1986](https://www.mets.com/1986).

LAST TIME OUT: Allowed one earned run on two hits, two walks and eight strikeouts on April 14 at Los Angeles-NL (7.0 IP, 2 H, ER, 2 BB, 8 K)...He has recorded at least eight strikeouts in three of his four starts this season and he has allowed two or fewer earned runs in all four of his starts.

AHEAD OF THE PACK: This season, McLean is 1-1 with a 2.28 ERA (6 ER/23.2 IP), 28 strikeouts and is holding opponents' batters to a .125 (10-80) over four starts...Among qualified NL pitchers, he is first in opposing batting average, first in WHIP (0.76), eighth in ERA and tied for 10th in strikeouts.

RECORD BOOKS: Through 12 career starts, McLean is 6-2 with a 2.13 ERA (17 ER/71.2 IP) and 85 strikeouts...His ERA is the second-best in franchise history through a player's first 12 career starts, only trailing Terry Leach's 1.70 ERA from 1981-1987...His 85 strikeouts rank fourth in franchise history through a pitcher's first 12 career starts, only trailing Dwight Gooden's 93, Matt Harvey's 89, and Nolan Ryan's 88...Per *Elias*...He is only one of two pitchers in Major League History to record at least 85 strikeouts and allow 17 or fewer earned runs through their first 12 career Major League starts (also: Paule Skenes 97 K's and 16 ER)...He is one of only three players in Major League History to throw at least 5.0 innings, strikeout six or more batters and allow two or fewer earned runs in nine of his first 12 career games (also: Matt Harvey and Paul Skenes).

IN THE CITI: Has made six career starts at Citi Field, and he has a 1.26 ERA (5 ER/35.2 IP) in those starts...It is the lowest mark in franchise history by a Mets pitcher through their first six career home starts (next closest: Matt Harvey, 1.42)...Courtesy of *Elias*...He has struck out at least six batters in all of those starts...His first three home starts were scoreless and he became the first Met pitcher to not allow a run in their first three career starts at home and the seventh pitcher in Major League history not to allow a run in each of their first three home starts (min. 15.0 IP)...His 19.1 inning scoreless streak at home is the longest to start a career since Robert Suarez didn't allow a run through all 24.0 innings he threw at home during the 2022 season...Per *Elias*.

PERFECT FIVE: Earned his first win of the season after allowing one earned run and striking out four through 5.1 innings on April 3 at San Francisco (5.1 IP, H, 2 R, ER, 2 BB, 4 K)...He was perfect through 5.0 innings, and the last Mets pitcher to retire each of their first 15 batters faced was Sean Manaea on August 21, 2024, vs. Baltimore, when he retired the first 17 batters he faced...The last pitcher in the majors to retire each of their first 15 batters in one of their first 10 career starts was Bubba Chandler of Pittsburgh, who did so in his second career start on September 13, 2025, at Washington...Per *Elias*.

SPIN THAT THING: This season, he has thrown his curveball 11.0% of the time and he is generating an average of 3,322 RPM on the pitch...That is the highest average RPM on any pitch in the majors this season...He is posting a 40.9% whiff rate on his curveball...Batters are hitting just .059 (1-17) in at-bats ending with his curveball...Over his first 12 career starts, opposing batters are hitting .068 (3-44) in at-bats ending with McLean's curveball, and he has recorded a career 45.45% whiff rate on the pitch.

SINK SINK BABY: McLean has thrown his sinker 32.3% of the time this season, up from 27.9% last season...His sinker has produced a 4-run value, which is tied 17th-highest run value on any pitch in the Majors this season and tied for the sixth-highest mark on any sinker this season...Batters are hitting just .103 (3-29) in at-bats ending with his sinker.

ROOKIE SENSATION: McLean was called up to the Majors on August 16, 2025, and he finished the season with the big-league club...Last season he made eight starts for the Mets, and he finished 5-1 with a 2.06 ERA (11 ER/48.0 IP) and 57 strikeouts...The Mets went 6-2 as a team in games started by McLean...His ERA is the third-best in franchise history through a player's first eight career starts, only trailing Terry Leach's 1.68 ERA and Rick Aguilera's 1.92 ERA...His 57 strikeouts are the third-most in franchise history through a pitcher's first eight career games, only trailing Nolan Ryan's 64 and Dwight Gooden's 59...He became the first pitcher in Major League history to throw at least 5.0 innings, strikeout five or more, and allow two or fewer earned runs in each of his first seven career starts...He is one of four players in Major League history to record 57 or more strikeouts and allow 11 or fewer earned runs through their first eight career games...He joins Nolan Ryan, Stephen Strasburg, and Paul Skenes as the only other pitchers to do so...Because McLean threw less than 50.0 innings last season, he is still considered a rookie under MLB's eligibility criteria...He entered the season as the No. 6 prospect in all of baseball, the No. 1 pitching prospect in baseball, and the No. 1 prospect in the Mets system according to *MLBPipeline.com*.

MC-USA: He represented the USA in the WBC...He made two starts and he finished with a 5.87 ERA (5 ER/7.2 IP) with eight strikeouts...He held opposing batters to a .222 (6-27) batting average during the event...He got the ball in the championship game vs. Venezuela on March 17 and he tossed 4.2 innings and allowed two earned runs while striking out four.

DAZZLING DEBUT: Made his Major League debut on August 16 vs. Seattle...Earned his first Major League win after tossing 5.1 scoreless innings and striking out eight...He joined Matt Harvey as the only pitchers in Mets history to earn a win, strike out eight or more batters, and allow zero runs in their Major League Debut...His eight strikeouts are tied for the third-most by a Met in their Major League debut (also: Tom Seaver, Bill Denehy, and Kodai Senga)...The only Mets who have recorded more strikeouts in their Major League debut are Harvey (11) and Collin McHugh (9)...Became the second pitcher in franchise history to throw at least 5.0 scoreless innings, allow two or fewer hits and strike out eight or more batters in their Major League debut (also: McHugh).

MINOR LEAGUE RECAP: Last season, he appeared in 21 games between Double-A Binghamton and Triple-A Syracuse and posted a 2.45 ERA (31 ER/113.2 IP)...He recorded 127 strikeouts over those 113.2 innings, good for a K/9 of 10.06...His 127 strikeouts were the second-most among Mets minor leaguers and the 18th among all minor leaguers at the time of his callup...He only surrendered two or more earned runs in one of his last 14 appearances prior to being called up...Overall from 2023-2025, he made 48 minor league appearances (44 starts) and finished 12-15 with a 3.10 ERA (78 ER/226.2 IP) and 245 strikeouts.

TWO-WAY COWBOY: The Willow Spring, North Carolina native, was a two-way player during his time at Oklahoma State and during the beginning of his professional career...During his final collegiate season he pitched in 14 games and posted a 3.30 ERA (11 ER/30.0 IP) while batting .250 (31-124) and having a .911 OPS...Overall he finished he career at Oklahoma State with a career .957 OPS and 36 home runs...Was originally drafted by Baltimore in the third round of the 2022 First-Year Player Draft but decided to return to school and was drafted by the Mets in the third round of the 2023 First-Year Player Draft...He hit in his first two professional seasons and overall he finished as a .185 (27-146) hitter with nine home runs and 24 RBI.

- Didn't allow any runs while recording the last two outs of the fourth inning on April 17 at Chicago-NL (0.2 IP, 2 H, K)...He hasn't allowed an earned run over 9.1 innings this year...He is one of seven pitchers in the majors to throw as many innings without allowing an earned run.
- Since joining the Mets in 2024, he has made 37 appearances (two starts) at Citi Field...In those contests, he is 3-1 with eight holds, a 3.07 ERA (15 ER/44.0 IP) and 37 strikeouts.
- Over three career appearances (one start) against Minnesota, he has thrown 4.0 scoreless innings and hasn't surrendered a hit over 11 at-bats.
- Fired 2.2 scoreless innings in relief on April 11 vs. the Athletics (2.2 IP, 2 H, 3 K)...Marked his ninth scoreless relief appearance of at least 2.0 innings since the beginning of last season...Is tied for the seventh-most such games among NL relievers during that span.
- Earned his first win of the season after tossing 1.1 scoreless innings on April 5 at San Francisco (1.1 IP)...Since the start of last year, he has recorded four or more outs without allowing an earned run in 17 relief appearances, which is tied for the seventh-most appearances among NL relievers.
- Dating back to September 20, 2025, he hasn't allowed an earned run in each of his last 13 appearances (15.2 IP).
- Made his third career Opening Day roster and his second consecutive with the Mets.
