THE TWINS: Completed their six-game homestand with a record of 2-4, going 1-2 against Washington over the weekend and 1-2 vs. Boston this week...tonight, they will begin a six-game roadtrip with the first of three in Cleveland through the weekend...after this series, they will travel to Detroit to play the Tigers from Monday-Wednesday.

RED SOCKED IN SERIES FINALE: The Twins lost to the Red Sox on Wednesday afternoon by a score of 13-1, dropping the series 2-1, making them 14-19-2 in series play...they finished July with a record of 11-13...Zebby Matthews (2-3) was the starter and was issued the loss, allowing five runs on eight hits in 4.1 innings pitched, with no walks and four strikeouts...the offense recorded five hits and walked four times...Harrison Bader had two of the five hits, both singles...Matt Wallner hit his 13th home run, his fifth home run in his last 17 games.

SO, WHO'S IN THE BUILDING: With nine players being traded away since Wednesday afternoon's game against Boston, here is who has been added to the roster for tonight: recalled six players from Triple-A St. Paul: right-handed pitchers Travis Adams and Pierson Ohl, infielders Ryan Fitzgerald and Edouard Julien, outfielder Alan Roden and utility player Austin Martin...additionally, the Twins have selected the contract of two right-handed pitchers: Erasmo Ramirez and José Ureña...Twins will play tonight with 25 active players on roster.

RYAN KING: Over his last 16 starts (15 games), since April 27, Joe Ryan has gone 9-3, 2.48 ERA (94.1 IP, 26 ER) with 21 walks, 109 strikeouts and a .193 opponent batting average...below are his AL ranks since that date:

GUARD PLAY: The Twins are playing the Guardians tonight for the seventh of 13 games in 2025...these two last met for a three-game series that was scheduled for May 19-21, but ended up being a one-day, doubleheader on May 21 at Target Field, where the Twins won game one and lost game two...the first game was a continuation of the May 19 game that was suspended by rain in the fourth inning.

- ⌘ These two last met in Cleveland for a four-game series, from April 28-May 1 as the Twins won the first two games then dropped games three and four.
- ⌘ During that four-game series at Progressive Field, Twins starters combined to go 1-1, 2.28 ERA (23.2 IP, 6 ER), with six walks, 14 strikeouts and a .207 opponent batting average.
- ⌘ Notable individuals during that four-game series in April/May at Cleveland: Ryan Jeffers went 3-for-8 (.375) with one double and one home run...Brooks Lee went 3-for-10 (.300) with one double and one home run.
- ⌘ Since 2019, the Twins have hit 73 home runs at Progressive Field, their second-most of any opposing ballpark, trailing Rate Field (91)...also in that span, no opponent has homered more in this ballpark (next: Royals with 55).
- ⌘ Royce Lewis is hitting .348 (8-for-23) with four walks, six RBI, a .444 on-base percentage and a .923 OPS in seven career games at Progressive Field.
- ⌘ Matt Wallner is hitting .333 (12-for-36) with two home runs and a .942 OPS in 11 career games at CLE...his first career homer was in this ballpark on September 17, off Shane Bieber.

YES JEFF: Over his last 15 games, Ryan Jeffers is hitting .380 (19-for-50) with four doubles, one home run, five RBI, three walks, a .426 on-base percentage, a .520 slugging percentage and a .946 OPS.

ALL IN DUE TIM: The Twins would like to welcome Double-A Wichita broadcaster Tim Grubbs, who will be calling games on the Treasure Island Baseball Network during this roadtrip...Grubbs, who has been the voice of the Wind Surge since the franchise's inception, called his 4000th career minor league baseball game on April 25...2025 marks his 30th season with affiliated ball as he began his career with the Hickory Crawdads in 1995, broadcasting games that featured Hall of Famers Todd Helton and Vladimir Guerrero...he joined Winston-Salem from 1996-98, then on to Knoxville from 1999-2001 and was named Southern League Broadcaster of the Year in 2001...in 2002, Grubbs joined the New Orleans Zephyrs, where he called games for 18 seasons, until the franchise's relocation to Wichita after the 2019 season.

⌘ He called the longest game in Pacific Coast League history in 2006, a 24-inning marathon that ran for two days due to a curfew...he also called a rehab start by Rogers Clemens in Round Rock during that same season.

ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: In 1985, the Twins acquired Bert Blyleven from Cleveland, in exchange for outfielder Jim Weaver, pitcher Curt Wardle and shortstop Jay Bell...in 1986 vs. Oakland, Blyleven became the third pitcher to join the 3,000 strikeout club, fanning Mike Davis in the fifth inning; he finished that game with 15 strikeouts - which tied the Twins single-game record and was eventually broken by Johan Santana, who struck out 17 Rangers on August 18, 2007...in that same game, Kirby Puckett hit for the cycle, then the seventh cycle in Twins history (12 now).

- ⚡ Making his 22nd appearance (21st start) of the season and the 106th appearance (105th start) of his career.
- ⚡ Took his fifth loss of the season in his last outing on June 26 vs. the Nationals, allowing five runs (4 ER) on six hits (1 HR), with one walk and five strikeouts over 5.0 innings of work.
- ⚡ In 10 career appearances (9 starts) against Cleveland, is 3-4 with a 2.58 ERA (59.1 IP, 17 ER), five home runs allowed, eight walks and 48 strikeouts.
- ⚡ In 10 road starts this season, is 5-2 with a 2.51 ERA (61.0 IP, 17 ER), eight home runs allowed, nine walks and 62 strikeouts.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Took his fifth loss of the season and his first since July 1 at Miami in his last outing on July 26 vs. Washington...started opposite Mitchell Parker in Minnesota's 9-3 loss...allowed five runs (4 ER) on six hits (1 HR), with one walk and five strikeouts over 5.0 innings of work...in the first inning, RBI single by Alex Call drove in Drew Millas...Luis Garcia Jr. opened the fourth frame with a home run...loaded the bases with no outs in the fifth on two singles and an E4; bases-clearing double by CJ Abrams put the Nats up 5-0.

- ⚡ Became one of four pitchers in baseball this season to record four-or-more strikeouts in each of their first 21 games (Sonny Gray, Carlos Rodón and Garrett Crochet have done so in their first 22).
- ⚡ Has allowed five-or-more hits in five-straight games for the third time in his career...did so in six-straight from June 19-July 21, 2024 and in eight-straight from June 27-August 23, 2023; his 2.70 ERA over the last five games is his lowest of those streaks (4.67 in 2024 and 7.71 in 2023).
- ⚡ In Ryan's 14 career games with five-or-more runs allowed, the Twins are 1-13, their lone win coming on September 29, 2023 at Colorado (7-6 win).

**TWO STARTS AGO:** Earned his 10th win of the season on July 20 at Colorado opposite Germán Márquez, a 7-1 Twins victory...allowed one run on five hits (1 HR), with no walks and a season-high-tying 11 strikeouts over a season-high-tying 7.0 innings...gave up a solo home run to Mickey Moniak with two outs in the third inning...allowed two doubles, both to Ryan McMahon (2nd and 7th inn.).

- ⚡ Marked his 11th career double-digit strikeout outing, tying Francisco Liriano and José Berrios for seventh-most in Twins history (1961-).
- ⚡ 2025 became the third season in his career with double-digit wins (13 in 2022, 11 in 2023).

**FACING CLEVELAND:** Is facing Cleveland for the 11th time in his career (10th start)...is 3-4 with a 2.58 ERA (59.1 IP, 17 ER), eight walks and 48 strikeouts...Guardians batters are hitting .188 (40-for-213) with 12 doubles, five home runs, a .224 on-base percentage and a .539 OPS...last faced Cleveland earlier this season on May 21 at Target Field, starting the resumption of May 19's rain-suspended game; did not factor into the Twins' 6-5 walk-off win, allowing three runs on eight hits (1 HR), with two walks and four strikeouts in the fourth-eighth innings (5.0 IP).

- ⚡ His 0.81 WHIP and .224 on-base percentage against Cleveland are the fourth-best among all of Ryan's career opponents.

**CENTRALIZED FORCE:** In 33 career starts against the AL Central, Ryan is 17-6 with a 2.59 ERA (201.2 IP, 58 ER), 19 home runs, 37 walks and 216 strikeouts...AL Central batters are slashing .191/.234/.322...is making his third appearance of the season against the division (also 4/9 at KC and 5/19 vs. CLE)...since 2021, he leads Twins starters with a 2.59 ERA against American League Central teams (minimum 50.0 IP)...among such pitchers, he ranks first in WHIP (0.87) and wins (17), second in strikeouts (216) and strikeouts-per-walk (5.84).

- ⚡ Among all active starters since 2021 with a minimum 50.0 IP against the AL Central, his 6.20 hits-per-9.0 innings pitched rank fifth, his 216 strikeouts rank seventh and his ERA ranks 16th.

**HOME/ROAD SPLITS:** In 10 road starts this season, is 5-2 with a 2.51 ERA (61.0 IP, 17 ER), nine walks and 62 strikeouts, compared to 5-3 with a 3.13 ERA (60.1 IP, 21 ER), 15 walks and 75 strikeouts over 11 home games (10 starts)...in 51 career games away from Target Field, is 19-16 with a 3.79 ERA (284.2 IP, 120 ER), 60 walks and 300 strikeouts.

- ⚡ In four career starts at Cleveland, is 2-2 with a 1.46 ERA (24.2 IP, 4 ER), three walks, 16 strikeouts, a 0.77 WHIP and a .182 (16-for-88) opponent batting average.

**LEFT-RIGHT SPLITS:** This season, lefties have slashed .226/.274/.392 with 11 doubles, eight home runs, 10 walks and 53 strikeouts against Ryan, while righties have slashed .177/.243/.301 with 10 doubles, six home runs, 14 walks and 84 strikeouts...in his career, left-handed hitters are slashing .210/.270/.368 with 72 walks and 262 strikeouts (3.63 K/BB), while right-handed hitters are slashing .226/.273/.423 with 61 walks and 400 strikeouts (6.56 K/BB).

**THE ARSENAL:** Through 21 appearances (20 starts) in 2025, Ryan has relied on a six-pitch mix...here is his pitch repertoire and results, per Baseball Savant:
