RAYS REPORT—The Rays continue a nine-game, 10-day homestand against the Astros [2-1], Blue Jays (2-0, one to play) and Twins (three to play) today at Steinbrenner Field nave won four straight games and are 9-5 in their last 14, 11-8 in their last 19 and 16-12 in their last 28, are 7-4 on a stretch of 19 games in 20 days (May 13- June 1) and 4-1 over a span in which 15 of 19 games will take place at home (May 19- June 8), following the latter stretch, 59 of their remaining 97 games (60.8%) will be on the road, have already played a majors-most 33 nome games, are 6-2 in their last eight home games, are tied with the Blue Jays for third in the AL East, half a game behind the Red Sox (26-26), after spending 16 straight days in fourth from May 8-23...have spent two days in first, four in second, 18 in third, 30 in fourth and four in fifth.

** Junior Caminero's three-run in the 1st inning was the only offense the Rays needed in last night's 3-1 win, securing their fifth straight series win over Toronto while improving to 7-1-1 in their last ingests with the Blue Jays in the 18 years needed in last night's 3-1 win, securing their fifth straight series win over Toronto while improving to 7-1-1 in their last in the sets with the Blue Jays and the proving the set of the read of the Rays needed in last night series wins at Steinbrenner Field.

The Rays have now won four of five and seven of their last 10 series overall...this includes four straight series wins at Steinbrenner Field.

They have won four straight games for the second time this season, joining a five game streak from April 23-27. It ties the Guardians for the second-longest active winning streak in the majors behind the Phillies (9G).

Tampa Bay has recorded back-to-back 3-1 wins, with a total of 3 HR accounting for all of its offense in those games. Active by the season came on home runs.

The Rays have belted 7 HR over the last three games (1HR in prev. 5G)....they have 18 years and 19 years and 11-0 home victories over the Athletics from April 29-26 at 5

WHAT'S AT STAKE—With a win today, the Rays would:

Record their second series sweep, joining April 25-27 at SD.

Sweep the Blue Jays for the first time since Sept. 20-22, 2024 at Tropicana Field...it would mark their first home sweep over any opponent since that series.

Record their 18th sweep vs. Toronto and second in the last four seasons since 2022.
Claim their fifth straight win, matching their longest streak of the season from April 23-27...win five straight home games for the first time since a six-game run from April 24-May 7, 2024 (single-season streaks only).

Improve to 9-1 in their last 10 games against Toronto dating back to July 25, 2024.

Win their sixth straight home game vs. the Jays, the third-longest streak in club history (8G: May 22-Sept. 23, 2012; 7G: Sept. 8, 2007-July 19, 2008).

Return to .500 for the fifth time and first since entering play on April 29 (14-14).

VINTAGE RAYS—The Rays have been held to exactly three runs in three of four games during their four-game winning streak...entering that span, they had four such wins in their first 47 games...since the start of last season, Tampa Bay has recorded 31 wins with three runs or fewer, the most in the majors...their seven such wins this year are tied for third most in the AL behind the Royals (11G) and Astros (9G)...Rays pitchers have allowed one run (or fewer) in back-to-back games for the third time this season, joining March 31-April 1 and April 25-26...they have not done so in three consecutive games since June 5-7, 2023.

The Rays have five relievers with 15.0 IP or more and a sub-2.50 ERA (Bigge, Cleavinger, Fairbanks, Orze, Rodríguez), tying the Astros for the most in the majors... the bullpen's 3.34 ERA ranks eighth in MLB, but its 2.91 ERA (127,0IP, 41ER) over the last 37 games since April 13 is third behind the Astros (2.53) and Giants (2.79).

FEELING BLUE—Following his home run last night, Junior Caminero has hit safely in each of his 13 career games against the Blue Jays, tied for the sixth-longest career-opening streak opposite Toronto since the club's inaugural 1977 season and the longest since TEX Michael Young (13G) from 2001-03...MIN Marty Cordova (16G, 1995-96) owns the last longer streak...it ties Carl Crawford's 13-game run vs. the Orioles (2002-03) for the second-longest career-opening streak against a single opponent in Rays history, trailing Rocco Baldelli's 18-game streak against the Orioles in 2003...Caminero is hitting .291 (16-for-55) with 3 2B, 3 HR, 13 RBI and an .848 OPS in his career against the Jays.

He is 3-for-6 with 1 2B and 1 HR in this series on the heels of a 1-for-17 skid.

DAWG DAYS—Brandon Lowe extended his hitting streak to seven games with a 1st-inning double last night, his longest since another seven-game run from Sept. 7-16, 2020...
during the current streak, he is 7-for-23 (304) with 2 ZB, 2 HR and 3 RBI...he has not had a longer streak since hitting safely in 10 straight from Aug. 9-19, 2020...Lowe has also tallied an extra-base hit in four straight games, tied for the fourth-longest streak of his career and his longest since homering in four straight from April 8-11, 2023...today, he looks to become the first Ray to collect an extra-base hit in five straight games since Wander Franco (5G) from April 16-22, 2022.

He has hit safely in 10 of his last 11 games, slashing, 350/.409/.725 (14-for-40) with 3 2B, 4 HR and 9 RBI, raising his average from .190 to .226 and his OPS from .550 to .682.

The Rays are 8-1 when Lowe homers this season, 45-12 since the beginning of 2022 and 92-34 in his career.

SIMPLE CHAN—Chandler Simpson has a career-high nine-game hitting streak, tied for the sixth-longest active run in the AL...he is batting .382 (13-for-34) with 3 2B and 5 RBI during the streak, which is the longest by a Ray since Yandy Diaz's franchise-record 20-game streak from June 7-28, 2024...paired with his career-opening eight-game run (April 19-27), Simpson owns the two longest hitting streaks by Rays batters this season. since his April 19 MLB debut, he is tied for the major league lead in both stolen bases (13) and infield hits (12)...his 30 hits in that span are tied for second most among MLB rookies behind ATH Jacob Wilson (42H) and are the most through a Rays hitter's first 28 career games (with a PA) since Nathaniel Lowe (30H) in 2019.

IAYS IN THE BAY—The Rays and Blue Jays wrap up a stretch of six games over 13 days (May 13-25) this afternoon...Tampa Bay has won four of the first five meetings, taking two of three at Rogers Centre from May 13-15 before claiming the first two games of the current set...the Rays have won 13 of 18 matchups since the start of last season and are 8-1 in the last nine...their rotation has allowed three runs or fewer in all nine of those games, turning in a 2.12 ERA (51.0IP 12ER)...the club's pitching staff as a whole has registered a 2.06 ERA (35.0IP, 8ER) in the last four meetings since yielding nine runs on May 13 in Toronto...the Rays have won each of the last seven season series and nine of 10 since Keyin Cash took the helm in 2015.

The Rays are 6-1 in their last seven games vs. AL East opponents and 8-2 in their last 10 against all AL foes...they began the year 3-14 vs. the Junior Circuit.

The Rays have 7 HR in their last three games against the Blue Jays, and their 10 HR vs. Toronto this season are their most against any opponent...they have homered in eight of nine and 22 of their last 24 matchups with the Jays.

Brandon Lowe is 16-for-43 (372) with 4 2B, 6 HR, 14 RBI and a 1,309 OPS in his last 11 games against the Jays...he is 7-for-14 with 2 2B and 3 HR lifetime against Toronto starter Chris Bassitt, his most extra-base hits vs. any pitcher in his career.

TODAY'S START—Ryan Pepiot (PEP-ee-oh) gets the ball for his team-leading 11th start of the season and sixth at home in today's series finale... marks his 54th career appearance (47th start) and 32nd at home (28th start)...is his second career start vs. the Blue Jays...has thrown three straight quality starts...is seeking his first win since April 26 at SD and first at home since April 9 vs. LAA...acquired from the Dodgers along with OF Jonny DeLuca for RHP Tyler Glasnow, OF Manuel Margot and seek sepsidentians Dec 14 2023 cash considerations, Dec. 16, 2023.

LAST TIME OUT—Took his second no-decision in his last three starts in the Rays 4-3 loss to the Astros on May 19 at Steinbrenner Field (6.0IP, 8H, 3ER, BB, 2SO, HR)...faced the minimum in the 1st inning thanks to a double play, but a two-out rally in the 2nd led to all three runs against him...allowed a solo homer to Victor Caratini before going walk, RBI-double, RBI-single to his next three batters...escaped the jam with a pickoff of Jeremy Peña, his second of the season and the third of his career...worked around back-to-back singles to open the 3rd inning and settled in to retire nine of his final 11 batters faced to conclude the outing...departed after six frames with the Rays trailing, 3-2, but avoided the loss thanks to a game-tying double by José Caballero in the bottom half of the 6th. half of the 6th.

Pepiot scattered eight hits, tied for the second most of his career behind April 15, 2025 vs. BOS (9H)...he has yielded a home run in back-to-back starts on the heels of a three-start homerless streak (April 26–May 8). He worked 6.0 IP (or more) for the third straight start, matching his longest streak of the campaign from April 15-26.

TORONTO TALK—Pepiot made his first career start against the Blue Jays on May 14 at Rogers Centre, taking the loss despite registering a quality start (6.0IP, 6H, 3ER, BB, 7SO, HR)...he is 2-6 with a 4.22 ERA (53.1IP, 25ER) over 10 career starts opposite AL East opponents, yielding three runs or fewer in eight of the 10 starts...however, he has taken the loss in each of his last five starts against division rivals dating back to Sept. 29, 2024 at BOS...the Rays have been outscored, 20-6, in those games and provided him with a total of four runs of support (1.37 RSA).

QUALITY IN QUANTITY—Pepiot has recorded three straight quality starts, matching the longest streak of his career from April 18-29, 2024... today, he could join Taj Bradley (4QS from July 6-25, 2024) as the only Rays pitchers to record four straight quality starts since the beginning of last season...five of his last six starts have been quality, and he has gone 6.0 IP or more in six of his last seven outings...Pepiot's six quality starts on the year are tied with Bradley and Zack Littell for the club lead.

IN NEED OF SUPPORT—Pepiot's 2.40 run support average is fifth lowest in the majors, more than only PIT Mitch Keller (2.11), LAD Yoshinobu Yamamoto (2.17), COL Kyle Freeland (2.28) and CWS Jonathan Cannon (2.29)...Pepiot has seen three runs of support or fewer in nine of 10 starts, two or fewer in seven starts and one or zero in five starts...Tampa Bay is averaging 2.6 runs in 10 games (26 total runs) started by Pepiot and 4.2 runs in its other 41 games (173 total runs)...he has received two runs of support or fewer in 25 of his 36 career starts with the Rays.

* The Rays have lost each of Pepiot's last four starts and are 1-6 in his last seven outings dating back to April 15 vs. BOS...they won two of his first three starts to open the season.

his first three starts to open the season. In 16 career starts in which he has received three runs of support or more, he is 11-0 with a 2.83 ERA (82.2IP, 26ER) and .205 (61-for-298) opp. average...his teams are 14-2 in those starts (9-2 with TB).

REVERSE, REVERSE—He has limited lefties to a .194 (18-for-93) average, including a 5-for-34 (.147) clip over four starts in May...it is the fourth-lowest mark among qualified AL right-handed pitchers, trailing TEX Tyler Mahle (.143), HOU Hunter Brown (.160) and CWS Shane Smith (.180), and the eighth best among all qualified righties in the majors... lefties are 9-for-39 (.231) with 15 SO in at-bats ending with Pepiot's four-seam fastball and 5-for-37 (.135) with 7 SO against his slider.

** Meanwhile, right-handed hitters are batting .311 (38-for-122) against Pepiot, going 11-for-33 (.333) across his last two starts...they are hitting .405 (17-for-42) against his four-seamer.

AMBUSHED—Opponents are 12-for-32 (375) against Pepiot when putting the first pitch in play, including 6-for-12 (500) off his four-seam fastball...they are batting .383 (23-for-60) when putting one of his first two offerings in play compared to .213 (33-for-155) in at-bats of three pitches or more pitches or more.

TOP HEAVY—The first three spots in opposing lineups are batting 373/404/711 (31-for-83) with 6 HR against Pepiot, but 4-9 hitters have produced a .189/.265/.341 (25-for-132) line with 4 HR...this includes a .087 (2-for-23) average against cleanup hitters, the second-lowest mark among qualified MLB pitchers behind MIL **Freddy Peralta** (1-for-25/.040).

A MODEL OF CONSISTENCY—Pepiot yielded 3 ER or fewer in 17 consecutive starts from June 21, 2024 at PIT—April 9, 2025 vs. LAA, the fourth-longest streak in team history behind runs by Shane McClanahan (23GS, 2021-22), Drew Rasmussen (19GS, 2021-22) and Tyler Glasnow (18GS, 2018-20)...since the streak began, he has permitted 3 ER or fewer in 22 of his 24 starte. in 22 of his 24 starts.

LEADING OFF—Pepiot became the 17th Opening Day starter in franchise history and third in the last three years along with **Zach Eflin** (2024) and **Shane McClanahan** (2023)...he was announced as the club's Opening Day starter on March 23 in place of McClanahan, who was scheduled for his third career Opening Day start before suffering a nerve-related issue in his left triceps during his spring training start on March 22 vs. BOS...he was the seventh pitcher in the last eight years to start on Opening Day for the Rays (2018-25) on the heels of **Chris Archer's** four consecutive starts from 2015-18...it marked the fifth straight year and 25th time in 28 seasons a pitcher below age 30 has started for the Rays on Opening Day... the exceptions: **Charlie Morton** (36) in 2020, **James Shields** (30) in 2012 and **Tanyon Sturtze** (31) in 2002.
