TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

Sept. 20, 2022: Aaron Judge hits his 60th HR of the season in the ninth inning vs. Pittsburgh, tying Babe Ruth (60HR in 1927) for the second-most HR in a single season in Yankees history and American League history, trailing only Roger Maris' 61HR in 1961. Judge also becomes just the sixth player in Major League history (ninth time) to hit at least 60 home runs in a single season.

Sept. 20, 2010: The Yankees dedicate a monument to Principal Owner George M. Steinbrenner III in Monument Park. The Yankees go on to defeat the Rays that night, 8-6.

Sept. 20, 1980: In a pregame ceremony, the Yankees dedicate a plaque in Monument Park in honor of Thurman Munson.

Sept. 21, 2014: Brett Gardner hits the 15,000th home run in franchise history in a 5-2 win vs. Toronto.

AT A GLANCE: The Yankees continue their final homestand of the season tonight with the second game of a three-game set vs. Toronto (0-1 thus far)...will also play a three-game series vs. Arizona this weekend (Fri.-Sun.)...went 5-2 on their recent seven-game road trip, winning three-of-four games at Boston and winning two-of-three at Pittsburgh.

- Have won three of their last five games and six of their last nine games (since 9/10).
- **Have posted a 14-7 (.667) record since 8/28, tied with Baltimore for the best record in the Majors in that span.**
- Are 16-10 in their last 26 games (since 8/23).
- Eight of the Yankees' last 10 wins have been come-from-behind wins (since 9/2).
- Have won five of their last six completed series (since 8/28).

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees fell to the Blue Jays, 7-1, on Tuesday at Yankee Stadium...**RHP Clarke Schmidt** (5.0IP, 4H, 4ER, 2BB, 1K, 2HR) started and took the loss...**2B Gleyber Torres** (2-for-4, 1 double, 1RBI) drove in the Yankees' only run of the game with a game-tying RBI double in the first inning...**1B DJ LeMahieu** (1-for-3, 1BB) and **RF Aaron Judge** (2-for-4, 1R) each reached base twice...**LHP Nick Ramirez** (1.1IP, 2H, 1K) and **RHP Greg Weissert** (1.2IP, 1H, 1BB) were both scoreless in relief...**RHP Zach McAllister** (1.0IP, 3H, 3R/2ER, 1HR) allowed 3R/2ER in the ninth inning.

ALL RISE: OF Aaron Judge has reached base in 27-of-63 plate appearances over his last 14 games (since 9/5), posting a .429 OBP in that span (11H, 16BB).

- Has reached base safely in 79 of his 97 games this season...has hit safely in 57 of those games...has reached base safely in 56 of his last 68 games (since 5/12).
- Has reached base multiple times in 49 of his 97 games this year, including 37 of his last 68 games (since 5/12).
- Has hit 32 career home runs vs. the Blue Jays, his second-most against any club (39HR vs. Baltimore)...**are the most by any Yankee vs. the Blue Jays all-time**...are the third-most HR by any Major League player vs. a single opponent since 2017, trailing his own 39HR vs. Baltimore and Mike Trout's 33HR vs. Seattle.
- Has hit 4HR in his last five games vs. the Blue Jays (since 5/15/23).
- Despite missing 51 games on the injured list this year, **his 32HR this season are the fifth-most in the AL and his 78BB rank sixth.**
- Since being reinstated from the injured list on 7/28, leads the AL with 43BB and ranks second in the Majors, trailing only Philadelphia's Kyle Schwarber (53).
- Has 11HR in his last 25 games vs. the AL East (since 5/13).

GOT YOUR NUMBER: DH/OF Giancarlo Stanton has hit .417/.417/.667 (5-for-12) with 1HR in his career against Toronto's Kevin Gausman...**OF Aaron Judge** has hit .300/.432/.667 (9-for-30) with 2 doubles, 3HR and 6BB vs. Gausman.

FOR STARTERS: Yankees starters have posted a 3.18 ERA (147.0IP, 52ER) in their last 28 games (since 8/20)...have allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 25 of those 28 starts and 2ER-or-fewer in 20 of those starts.

ON A ROLL: INF Oswald Peraza had his career-high 10-game on-base streak snapped on Tuesday (9/6-9/17)...is still hitting .315/.339/.463 (17-for-54) with 3R, 5 doubles, 1HR, 6RBI and 2BB in his last 14 games (since 9/2).

GO WITH THE FLO: OF Estevan Florial has reached base safely in each of his last six games (since 9/12-G2), reaching base in 11-of-26 PA over that span (.423 OBP, 5H, 4BB, 2HP).

BATTERS' EYE: Since the All-Star break, the Yankees lead the Majors with a 9.24 PA/BB ratio and a 4.04 pitches per plate appearance ratio...prior to the All-Star break, ranked 20th in the Majors in PA/BB (11.90) and P/PA (3.86).

GLEYBER DAY: INF Gleyber Torres recorded multiple hits and drove in the Yankees' only run on Tuesday with a game-tying RBI double in the first inning...has recorded multiple hits in two of his last three games (since 9/16) and four of his last seven games (since 9/12-G2).

- Has reached base multiple times in 12 of his last 19 games (since 8/28) and 14 of his last 23 games (since 8/24).
- His team-leading 43 multi-hit games this year are a career high.
- Is batting .315/.406/.562 (51-for-162) with 27R, 13 doubles, 9HR, 22RBI, 23BB, 2HP and 5SB in his last 43 games (since 8/1)...has hit safely in 30 of those games and has reached base safely in 36 of those contests...**his .968 OPS since 8/1 is the sixth-highest in the AL (min. .130PA).**
- Since 7/6, is batting .308/.376/.525 (74-for-240) with 37R, 14 doubles, 1 triple, 12HR, 30RBI, 26BB, 2HP, 3SF and 6SB in 62 games.
- Has recorded a career-high 62BB in 148G this season.
- Has hit .342/.359/.534 (25-for-73) with 10R, 5 doubles, 3HR, 17RBI, 2BB, 2SF and 1HP in his last 18 games against Toronto (since 5/11/22)...in his last 29 games vs. the Blue Jays (since 9/28/21), has hit .321/.339/.545 (36-for-112) with 15R, 7 doubles, 6HR, 23RBI and 3BB.

LEMACHINE: INF DJ LeMahieu reached base twice on Tuesday vs. Toronto...**has hit safely in each of his last six games (since 9/12-G1), batting .360/.407/.480 (9-for-25) with 4R, 3 doubles, 5RBI and 2BB.**

- Has reached base in 16 of his last 17 games (since 8/30), 34 of his last 37 games (since 8/1), 51 of his last 56 games (since 7/4) and 58 of his last 65 games (since 6/23).
- Is a career .332/.387/.524 (90-for-271) batter with 42R, 20 doubles, 1 triple, 10HR, 31RBI, 23BB and 4SB in 70 games vs. the Blue Jays...in 67 games vs. Toronto as a Yankee, has hit .336/.392/.531 (88-for-262) with 42R, 19 doubles, 1 triple, 10HR, 31RBI, 23BB and 4SB...owns the highest BA among players with at least 100PA against the Blue Jays as a Yankee (next: Oscar Gamble, .331, 48-for-145).
- Since the All-Star break, has batted .280/.380/.457 (52-for-186) in 51 games...prior to the break, had batted .220/.285/.357 (61-for-277) in 76 games.

FANS FOR A CURE: Once again, the Yankees will partner with **Fans for the Cure** (fansfortheure.org) to mark **National Prostate Cancer Awareness Month** with an education and screening event on the Main Level behind home plate...Yankees full-time employees, game-day employees and media members may access the area beginning at 3:00 p.m., and guests may visit it when gates open at 5:30 p.m....the area will remain open until approximately 8:00 p.m....medical personnel from **Montefiore Hospital** will be standing by to administer PSA blood tests to men 40-and-older...those receiving a PSA test will receive a voucher from the Yankees, redeemable for two tickets to select home games during the 2024 season.

KING OF THE HILL: RHP Michael King will make his seventh start of the season tonight vs. Toronto...as a starter this season, has gone 1-2 with a 1.93 ERA (23.1IP, 5ER) and 32K...has recorded 17K over his last two starts (9.2IP).

- Since 7/21, has gone 2-2 with a 1.98 ERA (36.1IP, 8ER) and 51K in 15 games (six starts).

TROPHY CASE: Prior to tonight's game, **LHP Nestor Cortes** will be presented with his 2022 LatinoMVP American League Pitcher of the Year Award...the LatinoMVP Awards are the oldest and most prestigious awards given to Latino baseball players...the awards are voted on by members of Latino Sports, Latino Sports Writers and Broadcasters Association (LSWBA) and Latino Sports writers throughout the country, the Caribbean and Latin America.

PITCH PERFECT: Yankees pitchers have posted a 3.25 ERA (83.0IP, 30ER) and 85K over their last nine games (since 9/10).

WHAT A RELIEF: Yankees relievers have posted a Major League-best 3.29 ERA this season...also lead the Majors with a .218 opponents' BA...rank second in the Majors in HR/9.0IP (0.87) and third in WHIP (1.21).

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP MICHAEL KING (4-6, 2.77 ERA)

RHP Michael King will make his 47th appearance (seventh start) of the season tonight vs. Toronto...the 28-year old will pitch on extended five days' rest due to Monday's team off day...made his last start in Game 1 of Thursday's doubleheader at Boston, taking his sixth loss of the season after allowing just 1ER in 4.2IP (6H, 1BB, 8K, 0HR)...in his last five starts (since 8/24), is 1-1 with a 1.27 ERA (21.1IP, 3ER) and 29K in that span...**his 1.27 ERA leads the AL and ranks third in the Majors in that span (min. 20.OIP)**...is 4-6 with six saves and a 2.77 ERA (87.2IP, 74H, 30R/27ER, 27BB, 108K, 7HR) in 46 appearances (six starts) this season...in six starts this season, has gone 1-2 with a 1.93 ERA (23.1IP, 5ER) and 32K...as a reliever this season, is 3-4 with six saves, a 3.08 ERA (64.1IP, 22ER) and 76K in 40 appearances...has thrown 2.0 innings-or-more in 21 of his 46 appearances this season (15 in relief, six starts), with 13 of those 21 outings being scoreless...his 12 relief appearances of at least 2.0 scoreless innings are the most in the AL and tied for the most in the Majors...has recorded at least five outs in 26 of his 46 outings this season (20 in relief, six starts)...his 20 such relief appearances are tied for the third-most in the AL and tied for the fifth-most in the Majors...over five seasons with the Yankees (2019-23), has gone 13-15 with seven saves and a 3.43 ERA (230.2IP, 98R/88ER, 78BB, 263K, 21HR) in 112 appearances (16 starts)...was acquired by the Yankees from Miami along with 2017-18 signing bonus pool money in exchange for INF Garrett Cooper and LHP Caleb Smith on 11/20/17.

LAST TIME OUT: Last started in Game 1 of Thursday's doubleheader at Boston, taking his sixth loss of the season after allowing just 1ER in 4.2IP (6H, 1BB, 8K, 0HR)...his 87 pitches marked a career high.

- ✦ Allowed his only run by an RBI single to Wilyer Abreu in the first inning.
- ✦ Was his second straight start of eight-or-more strikeouts...marked the first time in his career he has recorded eight-or-more strikeouts in consecutive outings.

FOR STARTERS: Has made six starts for the Yankees this season, going 1-2 with a 1.93 ERA (23.1IP, 5ER) and 32K.

- ✦ In his last five starts (since 8/24), is 1-1 with a 1.27 ERA (21.1IP, 3ER) and 29K in that span...**his 1.27 ERA leads the AL and ranks third in the Majors in that span (min. 20.OIP)**.
- ✦ Has allowed 2R-or-fewer in each of his six starts this season.
- ✦ Has surrendered 1BB-or-fewer in five of his six starts and OBB in three starts.
- ✦ Earned his first career win as a starter on 9/3 at Houston after allowing just 1ER over 5.0IP (5H, OBB, 4K).
- ✦ In 16 career starts, has gone 1-7 with a 4.79 ERA (62.0IP, 33ER) and 68K.

VS. TORONTO: Has made 16 career appearances (two starts) vs. the Blue Jays, going 2-1 with two saves, a 3.75 ERA (36.0IP, 15ER) and 29K.

- ✦ Will mark his fourth outing vs. Toronto this season...has posted a 2.45 ERA (3.2IP, 1ER) in three relief appearances against the Blue Jays this year.
- ✦ In seven career appearances vs. Toronto at home, has one save with a 3.18 ERA (17.0IP, 6ER).

HOME SWEET HOME: In 24 appearances (two starts) at home this season, has gone 2-3 with three saves, and a 3.66 ERA (39.1IP, 39H, 16ER, 15BB, 50K, 4HR).

- ✦ Has recorded four-or-more outs in 16 of his 24 home outings this season.
- ✦ Made his first home start of the season on 8/24 vs. Washington, recording a no decision after allowing 1R/0ER over 2.2IP (1H, 2BB, 3K).
- ✦ In six career starts at Yankee Stadium, has gone 0-2 with a 3.86 ERA (25.2IP, 26H, 14/11ER, 9BB, 29K, 3HR).
- ✦ In 59 career home appearances (six starts), is 9-7 with four saves and a 3.56 ERA (113.2IP, 108H, 51R/45ER, 40BB, 136K, 14HR, 6HP).

KING OF THE HILL: Is 4-6 with six saves and a 2.77 ERA (87.2IP, 74H, 30R/27ER, 27BB, 108K, 7HR) in 46 appearances (six starts) this season.

- ✦ In six starts for the Yankees this season, has gone 1-2 with a 1.93 ERA (23.1IP, 5ER) and 32K.
- ✦ Did not issue a walk from 8/29-9/3, matching his career high in consecutive innings with a walk (9.0IP, also from 9/27/19-8/2/20).
- ✦ Has allowed 2R-or-fewer in each of his six starts this season.
- ✦ Did not allow a run in eight straight relief outings from 7/21-8/16...recorded 17K over 11.2 scoreless innings during that span.
- ✦ Has thrown 2.0 innings-or-more in 21 of his 46 appearances this season (15 in relief, six in starts), with 13 of those 21 outings being scoreless...his 12 relief appearances of at least 2.0 scoreless innings are the most in the AL and tied for the most in the Majors.
- ✦ Has recorded at least five outs in 26 of his 46 outings this season (20 in relief, six starts)...his 20 such relief appearances are tied for the third-most in the AL and tied for the fourth-most in the Majors.
- ✦ Has recorded at least 1K in 35 of his 41 relief outings this season...has collected multiple strikeouts in 27 of those appearances...has 3K-or-more in 12 relief outings this season, the fifth-most such games among AL relievers and the seventh-most in the Majors.
- ✦ Has recorded multiple strikeouts in a career-high 12 straight games (since 7/28)...has recorded multiple strikeouts in 19 of his last 22 outings (since 6/23).
- ✦ As a reliever, has gone 3-4 with six saves and a 3.08 ERA (64.1IP, 51H, 23R/22ER, 23BB, 76K, 6HR).
- ✦ Has six saves this season after entering 2023 with just one career save...has tossed more than 1.0 inning in four of his six saves this season.

RHP Gerrit Cole will make his 32nd start of the season in Thursday's series finale vs. Toronto...the 33-year-old will start on extended five days' rest due to Monday's team off day...last started on Friday at Pittsburgh, taking a no decision after allowing 2ER over 5.0IP (6H, 3BB, 4K)...**is 13-4 with a 2.81 ERA (192.OIP, 60ER) and 208K in 31 starts this season...owns the lowest ERA in the American League and the third-lowest in the Majors**, trailing only San Diego's Blake Snell (2.33) and Chicago-NL's Justin Steele (2.73)...**has allowed 2R-or-fewer in 24 of his 31 starts this season, tied with San Diego's Blake Snell for the most such starts in the Majors**...started for the American League in the 93rd Midsummer Classic on 7/11 and retired all 3BF, becoming the 12th pitcher in franchise history (20th time) to start an All-Star Game...was named to his sixth career All-Star team via the player ballot...reached 10 years of Major League service on 5/29...recorded his 2,000th career strikeout on 5/23 vs. Baltimore (Jorge Mateo swinging), becoming the third-fastest pitcher in Major League history to reach the milestone (in terms of games and innings pitched)...his Major League-leading 257K last season were the most by a Yankees pitcher in a single season in franchise history, surpassing Ron Guidry's previous record of 248K in 1978...the six-time All-Star (2015, '18-19, '21-23) has finished in the top-five of Cy Young Award voting five times (second in 2021, fourth in 2020, second in 2019, fifth in 2018, fourth in 2015)...in 106 starts with the Yankees, is 49-23 with a 3.14 ERA (647.0IP, 226ER) and 802K...was originally selected by the Yankees in the first round (28th overall) of the 2008 MLB First-Year Player Draft but did not sign and went on to play at UCLA for three seasons (2009-11)...was the first overall pick of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft, the 15th pitcher (and 11th right-hander) to be chosen first...is the fifth player selected first overall to play for the Yankees, joining Alex Rodriguez, Darryl Strawberry, Tim Lincecum and Ron Blomberg...signed a nine-year contract extending through the 2028 season with a player opt-out following the 2024 season on 12/18/19.

- #17 AARON BOONE—ManagerCareer Managerial Record: 503-356 (8th-most wins by a Yankees manager, next: Billy Martin, 556)
- Is in his sixth season at the helm for the Yankees (2018-23)...guided the Yankees to a 99-63 mark in 2022 (first place in the AL East) and their first division title since 2019.
 - With the Yankees reaching the playoffs in each of his first five seasons as manager, he became the first manager in Baseball history to reach the postseason in each of his first five managerial seasons...is the third manager to make the playoffs in his first five seasons with the Yankees, joining Casey Stengel (first five from 1949-53) and Joe Torre (first 12 from 1996-2007).
