TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

Sept. 27, 1938: An ailing Lou Gehrig hits his 493rd and final Major League home run, a solo shot off Senators' right-hander Dutch Leonard. On the same date exactly 15 years earlier (9/27/1923), the Yankees first baseman homered off Bill Piercy at Fenway Park for his first career home run.

AT A GLANCE: The Yankees continue their final regular season homestand with the first game of a three-game set vs. Baltimore (through Sun)...are 3-0 on the homestand after sweeping Chicago-AL. **► Their 91-68 (.572) record is tied with Toronto (91-68, .572) for the best in the AL and the third-best in the Majors,** trailing only Milwaukee (96-63, .604) and Philadelphia (94-65, .591). **► Have won 11 of their last 13 series (since 8/11).** **► Have won each of their last five games (since 9/20)...are 8-1 in their last nine games (since 9/16), 11-3 in their last 14 games (since 9/11), 22-8 in their last 30 games (since 8/24), 27-11 in their last 38 games (since 8/15) and a Major League-best 31-14 in their last 45 games (since 8/6).** **► Their +154 run differential is the highest in the AL and the second-highest in the Majors,** trailing only Milwaukee (+175). **► Are a season-high 23G over .500.** **► Are 47-31 at home this season...marks their 34th straight winning season at home (since 1992)...according to Elias, their streak is the second-longest in Major League history, trailing only their own 47-year streak from 1918-64.**

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees completed a three-game sweep of the White Sox with a 5-3 win on Thursday at Yankee Stadium... **LHP Carlos Rodón** (6.0IP, 4H, 3R/ER, 1BB, 5K, 1HR, 1HP) earned his career-high 18th win of the season... **DH Giancarlo Stanton** (1-for-3, 1 double, 3RBI, 1BB) hit a go-ahead, bases-clearing double in the fifth inning... **C Austin Wells** (2-for-4, 1 double, 1RBI) hit an RBI double in the seventh inning... **RF Aaron Judge** (2-for-3, 1R, 1 double, 2IBB) reached base four times... **LF Cody Bellinger** (1-for-3, 1R, 2BB) reached base three times... **RHP Luke Weaver** (1.0IP), **RHP Devin Williams** (1.0IP, 1H, 1BB, 2K) and **RHP David Bednar** (SV, 1.0IP, 1K) combined to toss 3.0 scoreless innings of relief.

BRONX BOMBERS: Yankees batters have hit a Major League-leading 266HR this season, 27 more than the next highest team (Los Angeles-NL: 239HR)... their 266HR this season are their third-most in a single season in franchise history and the seventh-most by any team in Major League history.

► Yankees batters were held homerless on Thursday...have won each of their last three games they did not homer, four of their last five such games and five of their last seven...own a .405 winning percentage in games they don't hit a home run this season, the fourth-highest winning percentage in the Majors...their .405 winning pct. in those games is 86 points higher than the Major League average (.319).

POSTSEASON BOUND: The Yankees have clinched their 60th playoff appearance in franchise history (123 seasons, 48.8%)...marks the Yankees' eighth postseason appearance in the last nine seasons (since 2017) and 26th trip to the postseason in the last 31 years (since 1995)... their 26 trips to the postseason since 1995 are the most in the Majors in that span, five more than the next highest team (Atlanta-21)...the next highest AL teams are Boston and Cleveland who entered this season with 14 trips over that span.

► The Yankees are one of only three teams to make the playoffs in at least eight of the last nine years (since 2017), joining the Dodgers (nine: 2017-25) and Astros (eight: 2017-24). **► Manager Aaron Boone is the second manager in Major League history to reach the postseason in seven of his first eight seasons as manager** (credit: Elias - min. 2G manager per season), joining Dave Roberts (first 10 seasons with the Dodgers)...is the third manager to make the playoffs in seven of his first eight seasons with the Yankees, joining Joe Torre (each of his first 12) and Casey Stengel (nine of his first 10). **► The Yankees** have seven players on their active roster who have not appeared in a postseason game: **RHP David Bednar, RHP Paul Blackburn, INF/OF José Caballero, RHP Fernando Ruz, C/INF Ben Rice, RHP Cam Schlichter** and **RHP Will Warren**... Rice was on the Yankees' 2024 ALDS roster but did not play.

WINNING WAYS: The Yankees have recorded at least 90 wins for the seventh time in their last eight 162-game seasons (2017-19, '21-22, '24-25)...are one of only two teams to record at least seven 90-win seasons over that span, joining the Los Angeles Dodgers (eight: 2017-19, '21-25)... **have recorded at least 90 wins in 22 of their last 29 full seasons since 1996 (1996-99, 2001-07, '09-12, '17-19, '21-22, '24-25)...** their 22 seasons are the most in the Majors over that span (next: Atlanta-16, Boston entered this season with 15).

► The Yankees have clinched their 33rd consecutive winning season (since 1993), marking the second-longest streak in the four major sports (MLB/NFL/NBA/NHL), behind only their 39 straight winning seasons from 1926-64.

FAN-TASTIC: The Yankees have drawn 3 million fans at home for their Major League-record 25th straight season when there was full attendance (also 1999-2019, '22-24).

FIRST THINGS FIRST: The Yankees have scored in the first inning in a Major League-best 62 games this year...are 43-19 (.694) in those games.

ALL RISE: OF Aaron Judge reached base four times on Thursday vs. Chicago-AL... **was intentionally walked twice for the sixth time this year...his Major League-leading 36IBB this season surpassed Ted Williams (34IBB in 1957) for the most in AL history (since 1955 when IBB were first tracked)...** marks the most by any Major League player in a single season since 2010 when St. Louis' Albert Pujols recorded 38IBB.

► Has hit at least 50HR in a single season for the fourth time in his career (also 52HR in 2017, 62HR in 2022 and 58HR in 2024), tying the Major League record for most 50HR seasons... **is the fourth player — and second Yankee — to record four such seasons,** joining Sammy Sosa (4x: 1998-2001), Mark McGwire (4x: 1996-99) and Babe Ruth (4x: 1920-21, '27-28).

► Has reached base safely in 133 of his 149 games this year, batting .330/.457/.683 (175-for-530) with 134R, 30 doubles, 2 triples, 51HR, 109RBI, 123BB/36IBB, 7HP, 7SF and 12SB... **leads the Majors in BA by 17 points, OBP by 61 points, SLG by 64 points and OPS by 130 points...his 9.8 WAR (FanGraphs) is 0.8 higher than the next highest player (Seattle's Cal Raleigh: 9.0 WAR)...** would be only the third player in Major League history to hit at least 50HR and win a batting title in the same season, joining Mickey Mantle (1956) and Jimmie Foxx (1938)... **would also be only the fifth player in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to lead the Majors in BA, OBP and SLG in a single season...** would join Miguel Cabrera in 2013, Barry Bonds in 2002, Larry Walker in 1999 and George Brett in 1980.

► Is hitting .375/.544/.784 (33-for-88) with 32R, 3 doubles, 11HR, 16RBI, 32BB/7IBB, 3HP, 2SF and 4SB over his last 27G (since 8/27).

► Has reached base multiple times in a Major League-leading 99 games this season.

► Has reached base multiple times in 13 of his last 14 games (since 9/11), including at least three times in nine of those games...has reached base in 41-of-67PA over that span (20H, 19BB/6IBB, 2HP), batting .455/.612/.977 (20-for-44) with 19R, 2 doubles, 7HR, 11RBI, 19BB/6IBB, 2HP, 2SF and 15B over that stretch.

► Has 7HR over his last 14G (since 9/11), 8HR over his last 16G (since 9/9) and 11HR over his last 27G (since 8/27).

► In 117 career games vs. Baltimore, has hit .320/.457/.729 (131-for-409) with 111R, 20 doubles, 49HR, 104RBI, 98BB/7IBB, 7HP, 2SF and 5SB... **his 49HR against Baltimore are his most vs. any opponent...marks the most by any Major League player vs. a single opponent since 2017...also marks the most home runs among active players vs. Baltimore.**

FOR STARTERS: Yankees starting pitchers have allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 24 of their last 30 starts (since 8/24), going 17-5 with a 2.72 ERA (172.0IP, 52ER) and 152K over that span...have allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 37 of their last 46 starts (since 8/5), posting a Major League-best 2.89 ERA (258.2IP, 83ER) during that stretch.

► The Yankees are the only team in the Majors to have two pitchers with at least 18 wins (Fried-19 and Rodón-18)...marks the first time since 2010 the Yankees have had two pitchers accomplish the feat in a single season (CC Sabathia-21 and Phil Hughes-18)... **also marks only the second time in franchise history the Yankees had two left-handers record at least 18 wins in a season (Tommy John-21 and Ron Guidry-18 in 1979).**

► The Yankees have had three pitchers make at least 32 starts in a single season (Fried/Rodón/Warren) for only the third time in the last 49 years (since 1977) and for only the 11th time in franchise history (also three in 1962, '64-65, '69-72, '76, 2006 and '09)...are the only team in the Majors this season to accomplish the feat.

PEN PALS: Yankees relievers have not allowed a run in their last 15.2 innings (since 9/19) and have posted a 0.38 ERA (23.2IP, 1ER) and 26K over their last eight games (since 9/17).

STANTON ISLAND: DH/OF Giancarlo Stanton hit a go-ahead bases-clearing double in the fifth inning on Thursday vs. Chicago-AL...has hit .300/.412/.657 (21-for-70) with 4 doubles, 7HR, 41RBI, 14BB/3IBB and 1SF with RISP this season...over his last 64 games (since 6/30), has batted .351/.457/.789 (20-for-57) with 4 doubles, 7HR, 39RBI, 12BB/3IBB and 1SF with RISP.

► Has hit .309/.374/.541 (64-for-207) with 26R, 9 doubles, 13HR, 47RBI, 22BB/2IBB and 1SF in 55 games vs. the Orioles since 2021.

TO THE LEFT, TO THE LEFT: Yankees batters have hit .257/.338/.455 (375-for-1,458) with 77 doubles, 5 triples, 67HR and 173BB vs. left-handed pitchers this year, ranking first in the Majors in SLG and OPS (.793), second in OBP (first in AL) and sixth in BA (fifth in AL)...the Yankees own three of the four highest OPS against left-handed pitching this season (**Judge** - first with 1.264, **Goldschmidt** - third with 1.007 and **Bellinger** - fourth with 1.006).

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP WILL WARREN (8-8, 4.35 ERA)

RHP Will Warren will make his 33rd start of the season in tonight's series opener vs. Baltimore...the 26-year-old will pitch on extended six days' rest...made his 32nd start of the season on 9/19 at Baltimore, taking his eighth loss of the year despite allowing 3R/1ER over 5.1IP (4H, 2BB, 4K, 1HR)... **in 15 starts at Yankee Stadium this year, has gone 6-4 with a 3.28 ERA (82.1IP, 65H, 32R/30ER, 33BB, 89K, 10HR)**...is 3-4 with a 3.58 ERA (73.0IP, 29ER) over his last 14 starts (since 7/8)...has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 11 of those 14 starts...has allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 24 of his 32 starts this season, including 2ER-or-fewer in 22 of those starts...according to *Elias*, **his 22 starts of 2ER-or-fewer are the second-most by a Yankees rookie in a single season**, trailing only Stan Bahnsen (25 in 1968)...according to *Elias*, **his 164K this season are the third-most by a Yankees rookie in a single season in franchise history**, trailing only Russ Ford (209K in 1910) and Luis Gil (171K in 2024)...saw his first Major League action with the Yankees in 2024, going 0-3 with a 10.32 ERA (22.2IP, 33H, 27R/26ER, 10BB, 29K, 5HR) in six games (five starts) over five stints with the club (7/30, 8/7, 8/14, 8/21-31, 9/28).

LAST TIME OUT: Made his 32nd start of the season on 9/19 at Baltimore, taking his eighth loss of the year despite allowing 3R/1ER over 5.1IP (4H, 2BB, 4K, 1HR).

TOEING THE SLAB: Will make his 33rd start of the season tonight...will be just the third Yankees rookie to make at least 33 starts in a season, joining Stan Bahnsen (34GS in 1968) and Russ Ford (33GS in 1910).

- Will also be the first Major League rookie to make at least 33 starts in a single season in the last 17 years (since 2009, Nick Blackburn, 33GS with Minnesota in 2008).

HOME SWEET HOME: Will be making his 16th home start of the season tonight... **in 15 starts at Yankee Stadium this year, has gone 6-4 with a 3.28 ERA (82.1IP, 65H, 32R/30ER, 33BB, 89K, 10HR)**...has allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 13 of those 15 starts, including 2ER-or-fewer in 11 starts...has also tossed at least 5.0IP in 13 home starts this year.

- Over his last 12 home starts (since 5/20), **is 5-3 with a 3.06 ERA (67.2IP, 55H, 23R/ER, 24BB, 71K, 7HR)**...has allowed 2R-or-fewer in nine of those starts with three being scoreless.
- Allowed 2R-or-fewer in seven consecutive home starts (6/22-8/11), tied for the seventh-longest such streak by a Yankees starter in franchise history (excluding openers)**, trailing only Luis Severino (9GS from 9/27/17-6/16/18), Bob Shirley (9GS from 8/17/83-6/16/85), Adam Warren (8GS from 8/21/13-9/26/15), Orlando Hernández (8GS from 7/22/98-4/23/99), David Cone (8GS from 5/29-8/12/98) and Fritz Peterson (8GS from 5/29-9/10/73)...Chad Green had eight such starts as an opener from 6/11/17-8/12/19-G2...his seven-start streak was also tied the fourth-longest by a Yankees starter at home in a single season, trailing only Severino (8GS from 4/14-6/16/18), Cone and Peterson.
- Is 6-7 with a 4.75 ERA (94.2IP, 50ER) and 107K in 19 career home games (18 starts).

ON A ROLL: Is 3-4 with a 3.58 ERA (73.0IP, 29ER) over his last 14 starts (since 7/8)...has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 11 of those 14 starts, including one-or-zero ER in six of those starts.

- Has tossed at least 5.0IP and allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 10 of those 14 starts, including four of his last five starts (since 8/28).
- Has gone 4-5 with a 3.78 ERA (100.0IP, 42ER) over his last 19 starts (since 6/12) after going 4-3 with a 5.34 ERA (57.1IP, 34ER) over his first 13 starts this season (4/1-6/6)...has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 14 of those 19 starts and one-or-zero ER in eight of those starts.
- Has issued 10BB over his last eight starts (since 8/11) after allowing 7BB over his previous three starts (7/25-8/5).

2025: Has gone 8-8 with a 4.35 ERA (157.1IP, 76ER) and 164K in 32 starts this season...has allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 24 of his 32 starts this season, including 2ER-or-fewer in 22 of those starts.

- Is tied for fourth in the Majors in starts (32, tied for third in AL).**
- According to *Elias*, **his 164K this season are the third-most by a Yankees rookie in a single season in franchise history** (see chart).
- According to *Elias*, **his 22 starts of 2ER-or-fewer are the second-most by a Yankees rookie in a single season**, trailing only Stan Bahnsen (25 in 1968).
- According to *Elias*, **his five scoreless starts are tied for the third-most by a Yankees rookie in a single season in franchise history**, trailing only Russ Ford's eight such starts in 1910 and Luis Gil's six such starts in 2024 (Hippo Vaughn also had five such starts in 1910).
- The Yankees went 13-6 in his 19 starts from 5/9-8/17...his 13 team wins over that span were tied with Boston's Lucas Giolito for the second-most in the Majors, trailing only Detroit's Tarik Skubal (14 team wins).
- Among Major League rookies, ranks first in strikeouts, starts and innings pitched fifth in wins (fourth in AL).
- Has allowed 4H-or-fewer in 15 of his 32 starts this season, tied for the ninth most such starts in the AL.
- Has surrendered one-or-zero home runs in 29 of his 32 starts this season, including no home runs in 15 starts...his 29 starts with one-or-zero HR allowed are tied for the fourth most in the Majors this season.
- Allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 11 of his 17 road starts this season, including nine of his last 13 road starts (5/9-9/19)... went 1-0 with a 1.37 ERA (19.2IP, 3ER) and 15K over four road starts from 8/5-9/3.
- Went 2-1 with a 2.81 ERA (48.0IP, 42H, 21R/15ER, 7HR, 14BB, 41K) over nine starts from 7/25-9/9.
- Has made two starts of at least 6.0IP with OBB allowed (6.2IP/OBB on 8/11 vs. Minnesota and 6.0IP/OBB on 6/17/25 vs. Los Angeles-AL).
- His 112K prior to the All-Star break were the third-most strikeouts by a rookie in franchise history (since the All-Star Game was established in 1933), trailing only Masahiro Tanaka (135K in 2014) and Luis Gil (118K in 2024).

VS. BALTIMORE: Will make his fourth career start vs. the Orioles tonight...is 0-2 with a 4.20 ERA (15.0IP, 7ER) in three starts vs. Baltimore.

- Made his third career start vs. Baltimore on 9/19 at Camden Yards and took the loss despite allowing 3R/1ER over 5.1IP (4H, 2BB, 4K, 1HR).
