METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Braves, 5-2, yesterday...The Mets have won five of their last six, 12 of their last 14 and 16 of their last 21 games...This Mets are in a stretch of 27 games in 26 days (9-2), a span that includes two doubleheaders (August 6 vs. Atlanta and August 20 at Philadelphia) and one scheduled off day (August 11)...The Mets are 54-11 when scoring first this season...New York is 25-6-3 in 34 series this year... The Mets continue an 11-game homestand (4-1), their longest of the year, against the Braves (4-1), Reds (three games) and Phillies (three games).

deGREATEST: Jacob deGrom made the 200th start of his career yesterday...He recorded 12 strikeouts, giving him 1,523 for his career..That is a major league record for most strikeouts through a pitcher's 200th career game...The previous record belonged to Yu Darvish (1,517)...His career ERA sits at 2.50...Only five pitchers have had a lower ERA after 200 career games (min. 1,000 IP): Dutch Leonard (2.09), Carl Mays (2.23), Reb Russell (2.28), and Baseball Hall of Famers Red Faber (2.41) and Tom Seaver (2.42)... Sunday was deGrom's 54th double-digit strikeout game, the second-most in team history behind Tom Seaver's 60.

LUCKY STRIKE: Mets starters have struck out 10 or more hitters in back-to-back starts for the first time since April 14-17, 2021...David Peterson struck out 10 on April 14 vs. Philadelphia and Jacob deGrom struck out 14 on April 17 at Colorado...The last time the Mets have had starters strike out 10 or more in three straight games was September 19-21, 2020 (Peterson - 10, Rick Porcello - 10 and deGrom - 14).

HEY NINETEEN: The Mets struck out a season-high 19 yesterday...It tied a franchise record for the most strikeouts in a nine-inning game...David Cone on October 6, 1991 at Philadelphia and Tom Seaver on April 22, 1970 vs. San Diego each recorded 19 strikeouts in complete games...It was just the seventh time in team history the Mets struck out 19 in a game...It was their highest total since they set a franchise record with 26 punchouts in a 14-inning game on August 23, 2019 vs. Atlanta.

STRIKE THAT: The Mets rank second in the majors with 1,039 strikeouts this season... Only the Braves (1,045) have struck out more...The Mets have struck out 15 or more batters in a game eight times this year, which is the second-most in the majors...The team has struck out 10 or more in a game 56 times this year, the most in MLB...On the other side of the ball, the Mets have struck out 826 times this season....That is the fourthfewest times in the majors and the second-fewest times in the Senior Circuit.

RUNNIN' DOWN A DREAM: Francisco Lindor has scored at least one run in each of his last 10 games...He became the seventh Met in franchise history to accomplish that feat...It is tied for the most by a Mets shortstop with Melvin Mora who did so in 10 games from June 22-July 1, 2000...It is the longest such streak by a shortstop in the majors since Wander Franco scored in 10 straight games from August 15-27, 2021...Only three players have had a longer streak...David Wright owns the franchise record with a 13-game streak with at least one run from July 13-29, 2008.

TRIPLE THREAT: In 2022, Lindor has now recorded a 10-game hitting streak (twice, 11 games: July 7-17 and 10 games: July 23-August 3), a 10-game streak with at least one RBI (May 22-June 1) and a 10-game streak with at least one run scored (July 30-current)... He is the first Met to ever accomplish this in the same season...The last major league player to accomplish all three streaks in a single year was Bobby Abreu in 2005.

LINDOR CITY OVER HERE: Francisco Lindor is on a 15-game on-base streak...Since July 23, he is batting .429 (24-56) with 15 runs, five doubles, three home runs, 11 RBI, nine walks with a .500 OBP and a .679 SLG...In 33 games since the start of July, Lindor is batting .333/.408/.558 with 24 runs, six doubles, a triple, seven home runs, 21 RBI, 16 walks and a .966 OPS...He ranks tied for third in the majors with 20 go-ahead RBI behind teammate Pete Alonso (29)...He ranks eighth in the majors and fifth in the National League with a 4.7 fWAR.

IN VOGUE: Since Daniel Vogelbach made his Mets debut on July 24, he has appeared in 13 games and started 11 times as the DH...Since that date, Mets designated hitters are hitting .326/.446/.500, leading the NL in average and OBP in that span...Through July 23, Mets DHs ranked 13th in the NL in both average and OBP...Vogelbach is hitting .344/.500/.594 against rightes as a Met, contributing to the team's overall .310/.378/.509 line vs. RHP since his team debut...No team has hit for higher average against right-handers since July 24...Only the Brewers have a higher OBP, SLG and OPS vs. RHP in that span.

BIG BASSITT FISHING: Chris Bassitt has thrown at least 6.0 innings in each of his last eight starts...That is a career-best streak...In eight starts since June 14, Bassitt is 4-3 with a 2.52 ERA (15 earned runs/53.2 innings) with 10 walks and 47 strikeouts...He has not allowed a run in his last 11.0 innings...He has posted a 3.06 ERA (22 earned runs/64.2 innings) with 14 walks and 68 strikeouts in 10 starts at home this season.

CITI SLICKERS: The Mets have played 53 games at Citi Field this year, which is tied for the fourth-fewest in the majors and tied for the third-fewest in the National League...By comparison, the Braves have played 59 home games, the most in the majors...The Mets are 35-18 at home...They are fourth in the majors and second in the National League with a .660 winning percentage at home...The team's .660 winning percentage is currently the fourth-highest in team history...Only the 1988 (56-24, .700), 2000 (55-26, .679) and 1986 (55-26, .679) teams had a better record at home...The Mets have posted a 3.38 ERA with 153 walks and 518 strikeouts at Citi Field...The Mets own the third-best home ERA in the NL.

HANG 10: Jeff McNeil is on a 10-game hitting streak, batting .409 (18-44) with seven runs, six doubles, two home runs, six RBI with a .422 OBP and a .682 SLG in that span... He has recorded six multi-hit games in that span...He has recorded 140 multi-hit games in that span...He has recorded 140 multi-hit games.

REDS-METS NOTES: Since the start of the 2014 season, the Mets have gone 16-7 against the Reds at Citi Field...The team has alternated wins and losses in each of the last 12 games...The Mets have not lost a season series to the Reds since 2013.

HOMESTAND BY ME: The Mets are batting .302/.379/.448 during their current homestand...They have recorded 15 extra-base hits and 19 walks...New York is 18-56 (.321) with a .381 OBP with RISP during the current stand..The Mets outscored the Braves 31-22 during the five-game series.

HECK OR HIGH-WATER MARK: The Mets are a season-high 31 games over .500...Prior to this year, it's the most games over .500 since they were 32 games over with a record of 97-65 to end the 2006 season...New York has won 70 games this season, second-most in the National League...Their .642 winning percentage is tied for second in the majors and is the second-best in the NL...The team has posted a 70-39 record through the team's first 109 games...Only the 1986 (74-35) team posted a better record through the first 109 games of the season.

GIVE ME A BREAK: The Mets are 12-4 in the second-half...The team's 12 wins are the second-most in the majors, as is their .750 winning percentage...The team is batting .298/.364/.480 following the All-Star break...They lead the majors in average and are second in OBP and third in SLG following the All-Star Game...The Mets are outscoring opponents 86-58 following the break...Francisco Lindor is batting .400/.471/.633 after the break...He is tied for fourth in the majors in average...Alonso is batting .390/.486/.756 and leads the National League with 17 RBI following the All-Star break.

LET'S GO STREAKING!: Edwin Díaz has not allowed a run in his last 18 outings dating back to June 22, covering 18.0 innings, establishing a new career-high scoreless streak...37 of Díaz last 50 outs have been recorded via the strikeout...He was won back-to-back NL Reliver of the Month awards and since the start of June, Díaz has posted a 0.36 ERA (one earned runs/24.2 innings) with 11 hits, two walks and 53 strikeouts...He has converted all 15 saves in that period.

BRING OUT THE TRUMPETS: Díaz leads the major leagues among relievers with 91 strikeouts...That is 22 strikeouts more than the second place reliever...He has struck out 52.9% of batters faced (91/172), the highest strikeout rate by a relief pitcher through 45 appearances of a season in MLB history...His 18.07 strikeouts per nine innings is the best in the majors...No other reliever has a K/9 rate over 16.00...Overall, he is 2-1 with 26 saves, a 1.39 ERA (seven earned runs/45.1 innings), allowing 27 hits and 12 walks...The Mets are 40-5 when Díaz appears in a game this year.

30 FOR 20: Pete Alonso has hit 29 home runs this season...He is seeking to become the fifth player in Mets history to record multiple seasons with 30 or more home runs...Mike Piazza is the franchise leader, recording four such seasons...Howard Johnson, Darryl Strawberry and Dave Kingman have all recorded three seasons with at least 30 or more home runs...Alonso ranks seventh in team history with 135 home runs..

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Alonso is a on a six-game hitting streak, batting .391 (9-23) with six runs, a double, two home runs, nine RBI, four walks with a .481 OBP and a .696 SLG... In 16 games since the All-Star break, Pete Alonso is batting .390 (23-59) with 14 runs, six doubles, five home runs, 17 RBI, 10 walks with a .486 OBP and a .746 SLG...Alonso is second in the majors and leads the National League with 95 RBI...He is tied for fourth in the majors and third in the NL with a .551 SLG.

THE ROAD TO 100: Pete Alonso is seeking to record 100 RBI in a season for the second time in his career...Alonso recorded 120 RBI in 2019, his rookie year...He is seeking to become the eighth player in franchise history with multiple seasons with 100 or more RBI...He would be first Met to do so since Carlos Beltrán and Carlos Delgado accomplished the feat in 2007 and 2008.

20/20 VISION: Francisco Lindor has recorded 77 RBI in 108 games this season (75 as a shortstop)...That is the second-most RBI by a shortstop in Mets history...José Reyes owns the record, recording 81 RBI in 153 games in 2006...He has hit 19 home runs this season (18 as a shortstop)...Asdrúbal Cabrera set the franchise record with 22 home runs as a shortstop in 2016...He is seeking to become the first shortstop in Mets history to record 20 home runs in multiple seasons...Lindor blasted 20 home runs in 2021...He is tied for fifth in the majors and tied for third in the NL with 77 RBI...The Mets are the only team in the majors with two players with at least 75 RBI this year.

COOKIE'S KIDS: As part of the Cookie's Kids Program, Carlos Carrasco is partnering with Northwell Health to host pediatric cancer patients from Cohen Children's Medical Center once a month at Citi Field to share his inspiring story and his support with patients and their families...The third Citi Field visit of the season took place earlier today when Carlos hosted a group of patients who saw special sites around the stadium and received Mets swag, signed photos and tickets to a future Mets game.

YA GOTTA READ PREGAME CEREMONY: Ya Gotta Read! is an educational program designed to foster a love of reading in students...During the program, the participating students are challenged to read for 20 minutes every school night for six weeks, coinciding with the start and finish of Mets Spring Training...The more minutes students read, the further they advance around the bases and the more Mets prizes they can earn...Before today's game against the Reds, the top readers from each of this year's 11 participating schools were honored on field for their achievements...Each student received four field level tickets and a Citi Field gift card.

BASSITT NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Took the mound on August 3 at Nationals Park for the first time since his Mets debut in April...Tossed 7.0 innings, his fifth start of at least 7.0 innings this season...Struck out four batters and walked only one in his scoreless outing...Caused batters to ground into a career-high three double plays for the second time this season.

HOME FIELD ADVANTAGE: Bassitt has made 10 starts at Citi Field, going 2-5 with a 3.06 ERA (22 earned runs/64.2 innings) with 68 strikeouts and 14 walks...Across his last five starts at Citi Field, Bassitt owns a 2.14 ERA (eight earned runs/33.2 innings) with 37 strikeouts and six walks...In 59 career home games (53 starts), he is 15-19 with a 2.67 ERA (101 earned runs/340.1 innings), 324 punchouts and 85 walks...That is the fifth-best home ERA among active pitchers (min. 50 starts) behind Jacob deGrom (2.11), Clayton Kershaw (2.22), Walker Buehler (2.62) and Blake Snell (2.62).

SEEING RED: For the first time since 2019, Bassitt will take the mound against the Cincinnati Reds...In his only career start against the Reds on May 9, 2019, Bassitt suffered the loss on home turf after 7.2 innings of three-run ball...He struck out nine batters and walked only one in the start.

LET'S GET THIS (B)RE(A)D: Bassitt has two starts this season where he went 7.0 innings or longer and did not allow a run...His most games in a single season with 7.0 scoreless innings is three, a feat he accomplished last year...The only pitchers on the Mets staff with more games of 7.0 scoreless innings or longer is Taijuan Walker who has done it four times and Max Scherzer who has done it three times.

CRAZY EIGHTS: In his last eight starts dating back to June 14, Bassitt is 4-3 with a 2.52 ERA (15 earned runs/53.2 innings)...Fanned 47 batters and walked 10 in that span...Bassitt's sub-3.00 ERA is his best across any eight-game span this season and is the fourth-lowest ERA in his career through eight games (min. 50 IP).

UNDER PRESSURE: The Mets are 12-8 this season when Bassitt takes the mound... Of his 20 starts this season, 11 games have been decided by three or fewer runs... Five of those 11 games were decided by one run.

21 AND OVER: Through his first 20 starts, Bassitt has pitched 122.0 innings and has recorded 121 strikeouts...With 35.2 more innings logged and 38 punchouts Bassitt will surpass career-highs in both categories set in 2021 with 157.1 innings pitched and 159 strikeouts.

HOUND ON THE MOUND: Has gone 6.0 innings or longer in 16 of his 20 starts this year, including each of his last eight starts...His eight straight starts going 6.0 innings or more is a career-high...Bassitt has struck out six or more batters in 13 of his 20 starts.

QUALITY OVER QUANTITY: Across his eight seasons in the majors, the most quality starts Bassitt has had in a season is 16 in 2021...Currently, Bassitt has 13 quality starts on the season.

BRINGING THE HEAT: Bassitt's fastball has produced 41 strikeouts this season, which is his most with any pitch...His strikeout percentage on his fastball is 42.7 percent 41 Ks in 96 plate appearances...Opposing hitters are batting .193 against Bassitt's fastball this season.

LIVIN' IT UP IN THE CITI: His 1.12 WHIP are the sixth in franchise history among starters through their first 20 games as a Met...Bassitt's 121 strikeouts are the ninth-most in franchise history among starters through their first 20 games as a Met.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP CARLOS CARRASCO (12–4, 3.82 ERA)

LAST TIME OUT: Faced the Atlanta Braves in the first of their five-game series going 6.0 innings....With only three earned runs allowed Carrasco earned his 12th win of the season and eighth quality start of the season...He recorded six strikeouts and walked one.

VS. CINCINNATI: In eight games, seven starts against the Reds, Carrasco has gone 4-0 with a 3.32 career ERA (16 earned runs/43.1 innings)...He has 46 strikeouts and 15 walks with a .215 opponent batting average...The last time Carrasco took the mound against the Reds was July 30, 2021 at Citi Field when he went 4.0 innings allowing one run on three hits with four strikeouts and one walk.

Hitting .390 (23-59) with six doubles, five homers, 17 RBI, 14 runs and a 1.231 OPS since the All-Star break...He ranks third in MLB in OPS since the break. Tied for fourth in MLB and tied for second in the NL with 29 homers...Leads the NL and is second in MLB with 95 RBI...Tied for 15th in the NL with 64 runs. Ranks seventh in MLB and third in the NL with a .551 SLG...Is eighth in the majors and fifth in the NL with a .912 OPS...Is 11th in the NL in OBP (.361). Has seven homers and 26 RBI in his last 25 games since he ended a career-high 10-game RBI drought and an 11-game home run dry spell on July 9 vs. Miami. Owns the MLB lead in games with at least four RBI (eight) and is third in games with multiple RBI (24) this season. Named an All-Star for the second time...Drew a walk in his lone plate appearance in the Midsummer Classic...Reached the semifinals of the Home Run Derby. Broke David Wright's franchise record for first-half RBI, driving in 78 before the break...Wright drove in 74 before the break in 2006.
