## CHICAGO CUBS (17-12) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (11-18)

April 29, 2025 - PNC Park - Pittsburgh, PA - 6:40 EDT - Game #30/Home #14

LHP Shota Imanaga (2-1, 3.18 ERA) vs. LHP Andrew Heaney (2-1, 1.72 ERA)

**THE PIRATES:** will begin a six-game homestand vs. Chicago-NL (Tuesday-Thursday) and San Diego (Friday-Sunday) following yesterday's off day...Went 3-3 on their recent six-game road trip to Anaheim (2-1) and Los Angeles (1-2) from April 22-27...Are beginning a stretch where nine of their next 12 games will be played right here at PNC Park.

**SHUT 'EM DOWN:** Andrew Heaney enters today with a career-high scoreless streak of 16.1 innings (since April 12 at Cincinnati)... It's the longest scoreless streak by any Pirates starter since Bailey Falter's 19.2-inning streak from May 12-24, 2024...Heaney enters today ranked second among qualified Major League pitchers in WHIP (0.77), tied for fourth in batting average against (.165) and sixth in ERA (1.72)...The 1.72 ERA is the second-lowest among qualified left-handed pitchers, behind the Yankees' Max Fried (1.43).

**IN THE BEGINNING:** In the first inning on Sunday, Andrew McCutchen and Enmanuel Valdez connected for back-to-back home runs, Pittsburgh's first set of back-to-back homers since September 27, 2024 at Yankee Stadium (Nick Gonzales and Bryan Reynolds)...The Pirates have hit seven home runs in the first inning in 2025, tied for sixth-most in all of MLB.

**KE'S TO THE GAME:** With his single on Sunday, Ke'Bryan Hayes extended his hitting streak to eight straight games (since April 19 vs. Cleveland)... He's 10-for-31 (.323) with a double and four RBI during the streak...Hayes is a .312 (43-for-138) career hitter against Chicago, including six multi-hit games against the Cubs in 2023 (did not face Chicago at all last season).

**CORE FOUR:** Andrew McCutchen went 4-for-4 in Sunday's series finale at Dodger Stadium, marking his 23rd career four-hit game and first since May 4, 2022 vs. Cincinnati (while he was with Milwaukee)... It was his first four-hit game with Pittsburgh since September 26, 2017 vs. Baltimore...McCutchen has hit safely in seven of his last eight games (since April 18 vs. Cleveland), going 11-for-33 (.333) and raising his season average from .233 to .276 during that span.

**FEELS LIKE HOME:** Andrew Heaney has struck out 14 batters and allowed just one run in 14.1 innings through two home starts, joining Marty O'Toole (1912) and Nick Maddox (1907) as the only Pirates since 1901 to do that in a season, according to OptaStats.

**CUTCH AGAINST THE CUBS:** In 196 career games against the Cubs, Andrew McCutchen has 201 hits, 108 RBI and 106 walks... According to OptaStats, he is one of only three players to have 200-plus hits, 100-plus RBI and 100-plus walks against Chicago this century (also Albert Pujols and Joey Votto)...McCutchen went deep three times in eight games against the Cubs last season.

**UP GOES FRAZIER:** Adam Frazier went 2-for-4 on Sunday, extending his hitting streak to 11 games (since April 16 vs. Washington)... It's Frazier's longest hitting streak since hitting safely in 13 straight games from May 27-June 10, 2021 (first stint with Pittsburgh).

**HYPED FOR HUNTER:** On Monday, Double-A Altoona's Hunter Barco was named the Eastern League's Pitcher of the Week for the week of April 21-27...In two starts for the Curve at Chesapeake, Barco allowed just three hits and two walks while striking out 16 batters in 7.2 total innings...Barco, who is rated as one of Pittsburgh's top prospects (No. 7 per MLB Pipeline / No. 10 per Baseball America), is one of two qualified pitchers at the Double-A level with a 0.00 ERA.

**SOUTHPAW SIGHTING:** The Cubs' Shota Imanaga will be the seventh left-handed starting pitcher to oppose the Pirates in a game in 2025...The only one of that group who didn't allow a homer to Pittsburgh hitters was Cleveland's Logan Allen on April 20...Tonight will also be the Pirates' third lefty-vs-lefty matchup in 2025...Bailey Falter opposed Washington's Mitchell Parker on April 16, and Andrew Heaney opposed Cincinnati's Andrew Abbott on April 12.

**BUCS ON THE BASES:** Pittsburgh has 35 steals in 2025, tied with Seattle for third-most in Major League Baseball, behind Chicago-NL (44) and Milwaukee (37)...The Pirates are one of eight Major League teams to have two or more players with six-plus steals (Oneil Cruz with 12, Isiah Kiner-Falefa with six).

### ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

April 29, 1990: Barry Bonds scored four times, while also knocking in three runs, as the Pirates defeated the Padres, 10-1, at San Diego's Jack Murphy Stadium. Doug Drabek improved to 4-1 on the season after allowing one run on seven hits in his 6.0 innings of work. The win was Pittsburgh's sixth consecutive victory and 10th in 11 games, improving the team's overall record to 14-6.

HOW ACQUIRED: Signed as a free agent (one-year contract) on February 22, 2025.

**STARTING OFF:** The 33-year-old southpaw is in his 12th Major League season...He signed a one-year contract with the Pirates on February 22 after spending each of the previous two years with the Texas Rangers...Was the Angels’ nominee in both 2018 and 2019 for the distinguished Roberto Clemente Award for his community involvement.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Heaney allowed one hit over 6.0 innings (struck out nine) while earning the win in the team’s 3-0 shutout in Anaheim against the Angels on April 23 (struck out each of the first six batters he faced)...He became the first Pirates lefthander to throw 6.0-plus scoreless innings with nine-plus strikeouts since Francisco Liriano on April 3, 2016 vs. St. Louis (10 strikeouts)...Heaney also became the first Pirates left-handed pitcher to throw 6.0-plus scoreless innings in consecutive starts since Jose Quintana from May 9-15, 2022...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, Heaney became the first Pirates southpaw in club history to throw 6.0-plus scoreless innings with nine-plus strikeouts while allowing one hit or fewer and issuing zero walks in an outing...He brings a career-high scoreless streak of 16.1 innings (since April 12) into tonight’s start.

**AND THE WHIFF:** Heaney struck out each of the first six batters he faced in his last start in Anaheim on April 23, becoming the first Pirates left-handed pitcher to strike out six-plus consecutive batters since Francisco Liriano on June 1, 2013 vs. Cincinnati (seven straight)...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Heaney and Paul Skenes (May 17, 2024 at Wrigley Field against the Cubs) are the only two Pittsburgh pitchers in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to strike out six or more consecutive batters to begin a game.

**AGAINST THE CUBS:** Heaney will make just his second career appearance/start against the Cubs...In his only other outing against Chicago, he allowed four runs over 6.0 innings and lost a 6-1 decision on April 5, 2016, while pitching for the Angels.

**RESPECTED VETERAN:** Prior to his start on April 17, Heaney was honored by his coaches and teammates for reaching 10 years of Major League service...He is one of two Pirates with 10-plus years of service time (10 years, 12 days), along with Andrew McCutchen (15 years, 157 days)...Tommy Pham ranks third (nine years, 126 days).

**CASHING IN AT PNC:** This is Heaney’s third start of the season at PNC Park (had never pitched here before joining the Pirates)...He has posted a 0.63 ERA (14.1ip/1er) in his first two outings along the banks of the Allegheny River...In his last start here on April 17 against the Nationals, he scattered five hits over 7.1 innings in the team’s 1-0 win.

**PESKY LEFTIES:** According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Bailey Falter (7.0ip/0r) on April 16) and Heaney (7.1ip/0r on April 17) became the first pair of Pirates left-handed teammates to pitch 7.0-plus scoreless innings in consecutive team games since John Candelaria (9.0ip) and Larry McWilliams (7.0ip) did so on July 25 and July 27, 1982.

**RIGHT AT HOME:** In his start on April 6 vs. New York (AL), Heaney made the first appearance of his career at PNC Park...He struck out 10 Yankees and allowed only one run over 7.0 innings (his 21st career game with 10-plus strikeouts)...With that start, he became the first Pirates left-handed pitcher to toss 7.0-plus innings and strikeout 10-plus batters while allowing one run or fewer since Francisco Liriano struck out 12 batters and didn’t allow a run across 8.0 innings on June 15, 2015 vs. Chicago (AL).

**FOUR YOUR INFO:** Heaney is one of four Major League left-handed pitchers to record 150-plus strikeouts in each of the last two seasons, along with Yusei Kikuchi, Framber Valdez and MacKenzie Gore...He is also one of five lefties to throw 145.0-plus innings in each of the last two years, along with Valdez, Kikuchi, Patrick Corbin and JP Sears.
