RECENT REDBIRDS: The Cardinals continue their six-game homestand with tonight's opener of a three-game series against the visiting Washington Nationals. St. Louis opened its homestand by dropping two of three to the division-rival Milwaukee Brewers. With 13 games remaining, St. Louis enters today in first place in the National League Central, 2.0 games ahead of Chicago (vs. Reds) and 3.0 games in front of Milwaukee (vs. Padres).

TIME TO FLY: After a five-game losing streak on a West Coast trip to Oakland and Los Angeles-NL (August 3-7), the Cardinals are 25-11 since August 9, tied with Atlanta for most wins in the Majors while boasting a MLB-best 2.92 ERA.
THE HUNT FOR A RED OCTOBER: The Cardinals have 13 games remaining against opponents with winning records in contention for playoff positions (.535 combined win pct.), and sport a $34-37$ record (.479) this season when facing opponents with winning records (6th-best in the NL). After its current series with Washington, seven of St. Louis' remaining 10 games are against the Cubs: Sept. $19-22$ at Wrigley Field (4G) and Sept. 27-29 at Busch Stadium (3G).
NATIONAL NEWS: Since Busch Stadium III opened in 2006, the Cardinals' . 725 home winning percentage (29-11) against the visiting Washington Nationals is their 2nd-best against any opponent, trailing only the Colorado Rockies (.745, 38-13). St. Louis has won the home series vs. the Nationals in 11 of 13 visits.
CASE OF THE MONDAYS: The Cardinals (12-2) and Yankees (12-4) co-lead Major League Baseball in wins this season on Monday, with St. Louis going a perfect 7-0 at Busch Stadium. One of their 12 Monday wins came on April 29 at Washington, a 6-3 win in the opener of a four-game series at Nationals Park.
DAK ATTACK: Dakota Hudson, who celebrated his 25th birthday yesterday, is 13-4 over his last 21 starts dating back May 18, trailing only Stephen Strasburg (14-3) for most wins in the Majors in that time span. Hudson (L, 6.0 IP, 4 H, 2 R, $1 \mathrm{ER}, 7 \mathrm{~K}$ ) and Strasburg ( $\mathrm{W}, 6.2 \mathrm{IP}, 6 \mathrm{H}, 1 \mathrm{R}, 9 \mathrm{~K}$ ) faced off in a pitchers duel earlier this season during a 2-1 loss on May 2 in Washington. Overall, Hudson leads Major League rookies with his team-leading 15 wins, making him the first Cardinals rookie to lead the club in that category since Matt Morris (12, 1997). The last Cardinals rookie to win 16 games was Dick Hughes (1967).
RUNNIN' REDBIRDS: The Cardinals (105-for-131) lead the National League in stolen bases this season, two more than 2nd place Washington (103). Their $80.2 \%$ SB success rate ranks 4th in the NL and currently stands as the highest all-time in franchise history since 1951 (STATS LLC)... 19 different Cardinals have stolen at least one base this season, most in MLB and T5th-most in franchise history (record held by 1906 club with 21 Cardinals).
WE'RE GOING STREAKING: Matt Carpenter has reached base safely in 15 consecutive games against Washington (April 10, 2017-present), 2nd-Iongest among active Major Leaguers behind Mark Trumbo. Harrison Bader (.351/.432/.595) has reached base safely in all 11 career games vs. Washington (August 13, 2018-present), 7th-longest among active Major Leaguers.
A WINNING TRADITION: The Cardinals have posted their 12th consecutive winning season (2008-19), something they'd done just once previously in franchise history when they compiled 15 consecutive winning seasons from 1939-53. Only the Yankees ( 27 seasons) sport a longer active consecutive winning season streak in Major League Baseball.
THIS DATE IN CARDINALS HISTORY (September 16, 1997): Hours after signing a three-year contract extension with St. Louis, recently acquired Mark McGwire hits a home run off of the left field scoreboard in his first at-bat. McGwire's 517 -foot first-inning blast, the longest ever measured at Busch Stadium II at the time, is his 52nd of the season that ties Seattle's Ken Griffey, Jr. for the Major League lead.
