TODAY’S STARTERS: SPENCER ARRIGHETTI (7-8, 4.82) vs. RHP RANDY DOBNAK (2-3, 2.65)

MISSED OPPORTUNITIES: The Royals suffered a 4-3 loss to the Blue Jays last night, a game that slipped away due to a few missed opportunities and self-inflicted wounds.

- + The Royals committed 2 errors, both of which resulted in a run for the Blue Jays, including the game’s deciding run in the 7th inning...on offense, the Royals had 2 on and no outs in the 1st but failed to add on, and they suffered the same result in the 8th with the go-ahead run on base.
- + **Seth Lugo** allowed 3 runs in 5.0 innings, but five relievers combined to allow just 1 unearned run in 4.0 innings.

FIRST THING’S FIRST: The Royals have allowed a 1st-inning run in each of the last 4 games, a stretch in which opponents have scored 9 runs in 4.0 innings...they’ve allowed a run in the 1st inning in 10 of their last 18 games dating back to Aug. 17—during which they own a 9.00 ERA (18 ER in 18.0 IP) in the 1st—though the Royals are 12-6 during that stretch.

- + For the season, the Royals 5.66 ERA (90 ER in 143.0 IP) in the 1st inning ranks 27th in the Majors and their -15 run differential in the 1st ranks 25th.
- + On offense, the Royals have scored a 1st-inning run in 3 of the last 4 games, during which they have 8 runs in 4.0 innings, but have lost 3 of those 4 games.
- + In 84 games since June 1, the Royals lead MLB in the 1st inning in runs (60), batting avg. (.290) and on-base pct. (.353) and rank 2nd in OPS (.863) and T-2nd in HR (20).

ERROR MESSAGE: The Royals committed 2 errors last night, both of which led to a run for the Blue Jays, which proved to be the difference in a 1-run game...the errors were the Royals 6th and 7th in their last 25 games, a stretch in which their .992 fielding pct. is tied for 3rd best in the Majors, trailing only these Blue Jays and the Braves (.994 each).

- + The Royals have been charged with 63 errors in 143 games, 2nd fewest in the American League to the Rangers (61) but 1 more than the 62 errors they had all of last season.

SWEEPSTAKES: After losing the 1st 2 games of the series, the Royals are hoping to win today to avoid what would be their 11th series sweep...if not, they would break a tie with the Rockies and A’s for the most times being swept this year.

- + Their 10 times being swept this season are already more than twice as many as the 4 sweeps they suffered in each of 2024 and 2025...they’re 6-10 when at risk of being swept, including a win Thursday night vs. the Marlins.
- + The Royals have not been swept by the Blue Jays since Sept. 8-10, 2023 in Toronto, and they were last swept by them in Kansas City from July 29-31, 2019.

SERIES SPEAKING: The Royals have lost the 1st 2 series on this homestand on the heels of a 5-series win streak, during which they went 13-3...this marks the first time they’ve lost consecutive sets since Aug. 7-12, when they dropped 2 of 3 at home to the Cubs and were swept at Dodger Stadium.

FINAL THOUGHTS: The Royals are 18-27 (.400) this season in series finales, which is tied for the 3rd-worst record in the Majors, ahead of the Giants (18-28) and Rockies (14-31).

- + They’ve won 5 of their last 6 series finales.

GOOD DAY, SUNSHINE: Today marks the 1st of 2 day games on this 9-game homestand, the 2nd of which will be played in tomorrow’s series-opening game vs. the Diamondbacks.

- + The Royals are 23-27 (.460) in day games but they have won 4 of their last 5 matinees and are 15-11 (.577) in day games since the start of June, which leads the American League and ranks 5th in the Majors.

HIT ME: Despite losing 5 of their last 6 games, the Royals are 14-7 in their last 21 games since the start of their series in Anaheim on Aug. 14, during which they have the best record in the American League and 2nd best in MLB to the Phillies.

- + In their last 21 games since Aug. 14, the Royals rank 1st in the American League leaders in runs per game (5.1), 2nd in slugging pct. (.449) and OPS (.790) and 3rd in batting average (.271), on-base pct. (.342) and run diff (+21).

HOMESTAND OF HEAT: The game-time temperatures for the 1st 5 games of this homestand have been 97°F, 98°F, 97°F, 97°F and 97°F, a 5-game run of 97°F or warmer, the longest such streak in Royals history, and the longest stretch by any team since the Rangers played 7 consecutive such games in their old, outdoor ballpark from July 20-26, 2018.

- + High temperatures are expected in the mid-90s again for the Royals 1:10 p.m. starts today and tomorrow.

LEADING OFF: **Carter Jensen** has 6 leadoff home runs in 65 games from the leadoff spot, which are tied for the 2nd-most leadoff HR in the American League, 1 shy of **Joc Pederson** (7).

- + Jensen’s most recent leadoff homer on Wednesday night broke a tie with **Johnny Damon** (1998) and **Alex Gordon** (2011) for the single-season franchise record...Jensen’s 6 leadoff HR (all as a catcher), are the most in a season by a player at the position since 1900, according to *Elias*.
- + Jensen now has hit 3 home runs in his last 4 games and has 5 home runs in his last 9 games, giving him 22 HR this year, matching **Carlos Beltrán** (1999) and **Bo Jackson** (1987) for the 2nd-most home runs in a season by Royals rookie, only 2 shy of **Bob Hamelin** (24) in 1994.
- + Jensen’s 22 HR are the 2nd most by a rookie left-handed-hitting catcher, trailing Detroit’s **Matt Nokes** (32) in 1987.
- + Jensen leads AL rookies with 52 extra-base hits and each of his last 7 hits have gone for extra bases, tied for the 2nd-longest such streak by a catcher in Royals history.

AMERICA’S SHORTSTOP: Since returning from the Injured List on Aug. 4, **Bobby Witt Jr.** leads the American League with 29 runs in 30 games and ranks 2nd in Major League Baseball, trailing only **Pete Crow-Armstrong** (30).

- + Friday night, Witt Jr. hit his 17th home run of the season, a solo shot in the 1st inning...he’s on pace to finish the season with 19 HR, but if he does reach the 20-HR mark, he would extend his record as the first player in Major League history to record at least 20 HR and 30 steals in each of his first five MLB seasons, as no other player has done so in more than three seasons to begin a career.
- + Witt Jr., who has won the American League *Rawlings* Gold Glove at shortstop each of the last two seasons and won the American League Platinum Glove last year, ranks 2nd among Major League players at all positions with 23 Outs Above Average, trailing only Crow-Armstrong (24).
- + He leads the AL in fWAR (6.4) and is 3rd in the Majors behind Crow-Armstrong (9.5) and **Shohei Ohtani** (6.8).

HOME: The Royals today continue their penultimate stay of the season, a 9-game homestand vs. the Marlins (1-2), Blue Jays (0-2) and Diamondbacks...Tuesday night began a stretch in which they are playing 15 of their last 24 games at Kauffman Stadium, where they are 37-34 (.521), which is tied with Seattle for the 6th-best home record in the AL.

- + The Royals are 1-4 on this homestand on the heels of a 17-4 stretch at home from July 5-Aug. 23, which included a 7-0 record on the last homestand vs. the A’s and Tigers.
- + The Royals are 5-3-3 on 11 completed homestands.
- + The Royals rank among the American League leaders in many offensive categories at home, including 2nd in on-base pct. (.332), slugging pct. (.437) and OPS (.768) and 3rd in batting average (.265) and runs per game (4.86).

CLOSE CALLS: The Royals last night played their 41st 1-run game of the season, tied for the 3rd most in the American League, trailing the White Sox (44) and Mariners (43)...they’re just 18-23 (.439) in 1-run games, which ranks 22nd in MLB.

- + The Royals have played 18 1-run games since the All-Star break, which leads the American League and ranks 3rd in the Majors to the Dodgers (22) and Braves (19).

OUTS FROM THE OUTFIELD: The Royals have 32 outfield assists this season, tied with the Red Sox for the Majors lead, and their most since 2023, when they led the American League and ranked 2nd in the Majors with 37 outfield assists.

- + **Isaac Collins** ranks tied with **Steven Kwan** for 2nd in the American League with 10 outfield assists, 2 shy of leader **Wilyer Abreu** (12), and all 10 of Collins’ assists have come from left field, which leads the Majors at that position and are the most by a Royal since **MJ Melendez** in 2023 (11).

VS. BLUE JAYS: The Royals have lost 2 of 3 to the Blue Jays entering today’s finale, already clinching their 1st series loss to them since Sept. 8-10, 2023 in Toronto, where they were swept in 3 games...the Royals won 5 straight series vs. the Blue Jays in between, during which they went 11-5.

- + With a win today, the Royals would salvage a 3-3 split of the season series with Toronto, after going 5-2 in 2024 and 4-2 in 2025...they have not lost the season series to the Blue Jays since 2023 (1-6), which was the last of five straight season series losses from 2018-23.
- + The Royals are 5-22 (.185) vs. American League East teams this season and have been outscored 167-86 (-81) in 27 games, though 2 of the 5 wins have come vs. Toronto.

RANDY DOBNAK is making his 31st career start (51st appearance) this afternoon in the series finale of this 3-game set here at Kauffman Stadium vs. the Blue Jays, who he is facing for the second time in his career, joining Aug. 26 in Toronto...he was acquired by the Royals from the Mariners on June 17 in exchange for cash considerations.

- + Across 13 starts with Triple-A Tacoma to begin the season, Dobnak went 5-5 with a 4.24 ERA (33 ER in 70.0 IP), and at the time of the deal on June 17, his 6 quality starts ranked 3rd in Minor League Baseball...as part of the trade, Randy had his contract selected, but was optioned to Triple-A Omaha, where he made 2 starts (June 19 and June 25) before being recalled on July 1.
- + On July 18 vs. the Padres, Dobnak joined the Royals rotation, filling the void of **Stephen Kolek**, who was placed on the Injured List with a right flexor strain...the outing marked his 1st MLB start since Sept. 3, 2021, with 1,779 days in between.

LAST TIME OUT: Dobnak suffered his 2nd consecutive loss and his 3rd straight losing decision in the Royals 6-3 defeat last Tuesday night vs. Miami after surrendering a season-high 6 runs on 7 hits over 6.0 innings, plus 3 batters...worked around a 2-out walk in the 1st inning before **Graham Pauley** tagged him for a 2-run HR in the 2nd...faced the minimum in the 3rd and went 1-2-3 in the 4th...recorded the 1st 2 outs in the 5th, after which **Kyle Stowers** hit a solo HR...retired the side in the 6th, and was in line for his 2nd QS in as many outings, but he came back out for the 7th, and allowed 3 straight batters to reach to begin the frame, including a 2-run triple to Pauley, after which he was lifted for **Anthony Gose**, who allowed the inherited runner to score.

- + Randy pitched into the 7th inning for the second time this season, while completing at least 6.0 innings in back-to-back starts for just the second time in his Major League career, joining May 21-28, 2021 as a member of the Twins...he has never tossed at least 6.0 innings in 3 consecutive starts.
- + Dobnak recorded a season-high-tying 6 strikeouts for the second time in his last 4 starts and he has tallied at least 4 strikeouts in a career-best 5 straight games.
- + He received no run support for the second time in as many starts and third in his last 4 games...his 3.56 run support since his July 2nd debut ranks 11th lowest in MLB.
- + After posting a 36.0-inning homerless streak, including 6 straight homerless starts from July 23-Aug. 20, he's yielded home runs in back-to-back starts (3 total HR) for the third time in his career and first since June 2-19, 2021 (3 straight).

STORY OF THE SEASON: After each of Dobnak's 1st 15 appearances to open this season came in Triple-A with Tacoma (13) and Omaha (2), he was recalled by Kansas City on July 1, and he initially pitched out of the bullpen, making 2 bulk relief appearances on July 2 vs. the Rays and July 8 at the Mets...across 11 games (9 starts) with the Royals, Randy's 2.65 ERA (17 ER in 57.2 IP) since his club debut on July 2 is the 8th-best mark in the AL to **Cy Young** Award candidate **Dylan Cease**, whose 1.36 ERA leads.

- + Despite not joining the Royals rotation until the 2nd half of the year, Randy is set to make his 10th start this afternoon, which will match a career high, joining 2020.
- + Dobnak has recorded 5 outings of at least 4.0 scoreless innings since making his Royals debut on July 2, which are tied with Cease for most such games in that span.

SECOND-HALF SURGE: Randy joined the Royals rotation to begin the 2nd half of the season, and has been one of the best pitchers in the American League since, posting a 2.81 ERA (15 ER in 48.0 IP), which ranks 13th in the AL to leader **Reid Detmers** (1.52).

- + Through his 1st 7 starts, Dobnak owned a 1.50 starter ERA (6 ER in 36.0 IP), which was the lowest mark through a pitcher's 1st 7 starts with the club in Royals history, but in 2 starts since, he has yielded 9 runs in 12.0 innings (6.75 ERA).
- + Dobnak has allowed 1 run or fewer in 6 of his 9 starts since joining the Royals rotation, tied for the 3rd-most such starts in the Majors since the All-Star break, just 1 shy of the leaders, **Cam Schlichtler** and Demters (7 each).

WALK THIS WAY: In 11 Major League appearances (9 starts) this season, Dobnak has struggled at times with his command, issuing 23 walks over 57.2 innings (3.6 BB/9), including a career-high-tying 4 walks in his start on July 18 vs. San Diego and on Aug. 20 vs. the A's...this year's rate is more than 1 walk higher than his 2.4 BB/9 rate that he posted over 39 career appearances (21 starts) prior to the start of the season...across his 15 Triple-A starts this year, he yielded just 25 walks in 80.2 innings, recording a 2.8 BB/9 rate, which is much more in line with what he has posted in his career.

- + Dobnak has yielded a walk in a career-high 12 straight appearances since the start of last season, which includes all 11 appearances (9 starts) this year.
- + Despite surrendering 23 walks, none of them have scored, and in fact, 4 of them have been stranded as inherited runners thanks to Kansas City's bullpen.

HOME SWEET HOME: In 21 lifetime appearances (12 starts) in his home ballpark, Randy has gone 5-6 with a 5.15 ERA (46 ER in 80.1 IP), more than a full run higher than his 3.58 ERA (47 ER in 118.0 IP) across 29 road outings (18 starts)...this afternoon, he is making his 8th career appearance (7th start) here at Kauffman Stadium, where he owns a 2-2 record and a 4.32 ERA (16 ER in 33.1 IP).

- + Over 6 outings (5 starts) at The K this year, Dobnak has posted a 4.45 ERA (14 ER in 28.1 IP) with a .313 opponents' average (36-for-115), while he's owns a 0.92 ERA (3 ER in 29.1 IP) with a .198 opponents' average (21-for-106) in 5 road games (4 starts).
- + Despite Randy's strong splits, the Royals are 1-4 when he pitches on the road, compared to their 3-3 record in his 6 outings (5 starts) here at Kauffman Stadium.

HOME RUN REPORT: Nine of the 17 runs that Randy has surrendered this season (52.9%) have come on 5 home runs, including a season-high 2 home runs in his start last Tuesday night vs. Miami to **Graham Pauley** (2-run) and **Kyle Stowers** (solo)...in 39 games over his first five Major League seasons, he yielded 17 home runs, which accounted for 26 of his 81 runs allowed (32.1%).

- + After yielding a solo home run to **Fernando Tatis Jr.** in the 3rd inning on July 18 vs. the Padres, Dobnak rode a season-high 36.0-inning homerless streak that he carried into the 4th inning of his start on Aug. 26 before **Nathan Lukes** connected on a 3-run HR...despite home runs accounting for a high percentage of his runs allowed, his 0.8 HR/9 rate since his Royals debut on July 2 ranks T-8th in American League, trailing leader **José Soriano** of these Blue Jays (0.3).

TOMORROW’S STARTER: LHP NOAH CAMERON (9-8, 4.08)

- + **Noah Cameron** will make his 27th start of the season and the 51st of his career (52nd appearance) in tomorrow’s series opener vs. the Diamondbacks.

+ In his most recent start last Wednesday night vs. Miami, Cameron did not factor into the decision of the Royals 9-6 loss after allowing 4 runs on 5 hits and 1 walk in 5.0 innings, with 7 strikeouts...he allowed each of the 1st 3 batters to reach base, with **Heriberto Hernández** (HBP) and **Otto Lopez** (3B) coming around to score, before retiring 12 of the next 13 hitters, only getting bit by a solo HR from **Kyle Stowers** in the 3rd...in the 5th, a double from Hernández tacked on another run, but he struck out each of his final 3 batters before exiting in favor of **Jose Cuas**.

+ Was named the American League Pitcher of the Month for August after posting a 1.87 ERA (7 ER in 33.2 IP) across 5 starts, which was the 4th-best mark in the AL during that span...his 0.80 WHIP led the American League (min. 5 starts).
- + Since he began calling his own pitches on July 24 in Detroit, he is 4-0 with a 1.84 ERA (11 ER in 53.2 IP) and 4 quality starts in 8 games (7 starts)...he leads MLB in innings pitched in that span and ranks 6th in pitches thrown (768).

+ Noah has yet to face the Diamondbacks, but in 4 career starts vs. the National League West, he is 0-3 with an 8.10 ERA (18 ER in 20.0 IP) and 9 strikeouts...his last game vs. an NL West foe came at Dodger Stadium on Aug. 10, where he did not factor into the decision after allowing 4 runs on 6 hits and 2 walks in 5.2 innings, with 2 strikeouts, as the Royals lost 6-5.

+ In 14 starts at The K this season, Cameron is 6-3 with a 4.95 ERA (40 ER in 72.2 IP) and 64 strikeouts...his ERA is nearly a full run higher than his FIP at home (4.11).

MANAGER MATT QUATRARO (kwuh-TRAIR-roe)

- + **Matt Quatraro** is in his fourth season as Royals Manager...in January, he agreed to an extension that runs through 2029 and includes a club option for 2030...the option would represent his eighth season, which would mark the 2nd-longest tenure in franchise history, trailing only **Ned Yost’s** 10 seasons as Manager.

+ His 287 wins are tied with Royals Hall of Famer **John Wathan** for the 5th most in club history...he’s 13 wins shy of becoming the fifth Royals Manager to reach 300 wins (Yost 746, **Whitey Herzog** 410, **Dick Howser** 404, **Tony Muser** 317).

+ Quatraro led the Royals to back-to-back winning seasons in 2024-25 for the first time since 2013-15...the Royals under Q are the eighth team in the Wild Card Era, according to *Eliás*, to have back-to-back winning seasons after a 100-loss campaign.
- + Quatraro led the 2024 Royals to an 86-76 record in his second season as Manager.

+ Q finished runner-up in the 2024 American League Manager of the Year voting.

+ The 2024 Royals were the sixth team in the 162-game Era (since 1961), according to Eliás, to have a 30-win improvement from one season to the next (excluding shortened seasons)...they were the third team to make the postseason following a 100-loss season, following the 2017 Minnesota Twins and 2020 Miami Marlins.

+ Before joining the Royals, he spent five years on **Kevin Cash’s** staff in Tampa Bay and four seasons on **Terry Francona’s** staff in Cleveland...during his 12 full seasons on a big league staff, his teams have reached the postseason seven times.

REPLAY SPECIALIST BILL DUPLISSEA

- + **Bill Duplissea** is in his 21st season with the Royals and has served as the Replay Coordinator since Instant Replay was instituted in 2014...during that time, the Royals 65.4% success rate is 1st in the Majors, ahead of the 2nd-place Yankees (64.0%).

+ Duplissea has overturned 22 of 30 challenges this season (73.3%), which is the best rate in the Majors according to the latest update sent from MLB on Friday.

+ In 12 full seasons of Instant Replay, the Royals have finished in the top 5 in success rate eight times and have finished in the top 10 in all 12 seasons.
- + Duper started with the Royals as a Bullpen Catcher in 2006, then added advance scouting duties in 2012...in his current role, he works closely with the coaching staff in scouting upcoming opponents, in addition to his in-game replay role.

+ Prior to joining the Royals, he spent 2004-05 as an Assistant Coach at the College of San Mateo, helping lead the Bulldogs to conference titles in both seasons.

+ Duplissea was a catcher for five seasons in the Los Angeles Dodgers organization, reaching Triple-A Albuquerque in 2000.
