METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets enjoyed a day off on Thursday...On Wednesday, the team fell to the Nationals, 3-2...New York begins a stretch of 17 straight games without an off-day...The Mets wrap up a five-game, six-day, road trip (11) against Washington (1-1) and Minnesota (three games)...Following this series, the Mets head home for the start of their penultimate homestand, a sevengame stand against Arizona (four games) and Cincinnati (three games).

NEVER FORGET: On Monday, September 11, the Mets will hold a special pregame ceremony to honor the memory and victims of those who perished on September 11, 2001 and from injuries sustained in responding to the crisis... Mike Piazza, whose game-winning home run against the Braves lifted the spirits of our city when baseball resumed after the $9 / 11$ attack, will hold a pregame press conference at time to be determined.

SENGA GENESIS: Kodai Senga has recorded 176 strikeouts... He moved into third all-time for most strikeouts by a Mets rookie pitcher passing Noah Syndergaard (166), Jon Matlack (169) and Tom Seaver (170)...He is now three strikeouts shy of passing Jerry Koosman for second all-time for most strikeouts by a Mets rookie...Last night marked the first time a Mets rookie pitcher recorded back-to-back double-digit strikeout games since Noah Syndergaard did the trick from September 25 - October 3, 2015...Is the first Japanese-born rookie to accomplish the feat since Masahiro Tanaka did so from June 11 - 17, 2014... Courtesy of Elias.

MAKE IT A DOZEN: Kodai Senga recorded a career-high-tying 12 strikeouts for the third time this season in his last start...He joined Dwight Gooden (six) as the only Mets rookie with three or more starts of 12 or more strikeouts...He also joined Hideo Nomo (five), Kerry Wood (five) and Spencer Strider (three) as the only rookies with three or more starts of 12 or more strikeouts in the Wild Card Era (Since 1995).

GOT TO GO TO MO'S: Ronny Mauricio is batting . 421 (8-19) with one run, one double, one RBI and three steals in his first five career games... He is one of five players in franchise history to record a hit in each of his first five career major league games...Only three players have recorded a longer streak...The franchise record is seven straight games with a hit, accomplished by Daniel Murphy in 2009 and Keith Miller in 1987.

30-FOR-30: Lindor has recorded 30 doubles and 26 home runs this season... He is looking to become the 12th player in franchise history to record a 30/30 season...The last player to accomplish that feat was Pete Alonso in $2019 . . \mathrm{He}$ has stolen 26 bases this year...He is looking to become the fourth player in franchise history to record 30 doubles, 30 home runs and 30 steals in a singleseason.

LINSANITY: Over his last 68 games, Francisco Lindor is batting . 293 (75-256) with 54 runs, 13 doubles, two triples, 14 home runs, 39 RBI, 30 walks, 20 steals with a . 375 OBP, a .523 SLG and an .899 OPS...Lindor has stolen a career-hightying 26 bases this season.

I DECLARE fWAR: Francisco Lindor ranks fifth in the majors and fourth in the National League with a 5.4 fWAR...Since he joined the Mets, Lindor has posted a 16.2 fWAR...Only Freddie Freeman (18.8) and Mookie Betts (18.3) have posted a higher mark in the Senior Circuit...His 16.3 fWAR since 2021 is fifth in the majors.

DINGERS!: The Mets have socked 185 home runs this season...That is the fourth-most in the National League...The 2022 Mets hit 171 home runs...The team's 185 home runs are tied with the 2004 team for the seventh-most in a single season in franchise history...Next up is the 1987 team which hit 192 in the season...Four teams in franchise history have cracked 200+ home runs in a single year 2019 (242), 2017 (224), 2016 (218) and 2006 (200).

DOING THE SPLITS: Nimmo is batting .292 with 41 runs, 12 doubles, three triples, nine home runs, 32 RBI, 35 walks with a .376 OBP and a .462 SLG in 68 games on the road this season...This compares to a .237/.340/.446 slashline in 65 games at Citi Field...Francisco Lindor has posted a .284/.355/.536 slashline with 53 runs, 21 doubles, two triples, 15 home runs and 26 walks in 71 games on the road in 2023...He has posted .214/.306/.387 slash in 66 games at Citi Field.

100: Pete Alonso became the fourth player in Mets history to record three or more seasons with 100 or more RBI...He has previously recorded two seasons with 100 RBI (120 in 2019 and 131 in 2022)...David Wright is the franchise leader with five such seasons...Carlos Beltran and Darryl Strawberry also recorded three seasons each...Alonso's 482 RBI since he entered the league in 2019 are the most in the major leagues... He is second in the majors and in the NL with 102 RBI.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Pete Alonso has recorded his third season with 40 or more home runs... He became the fifth player in major league history with three or more seasons of 40 or more homers in their first five years, joining Ralph Kiner (four), Ryan Howard (three), Albert Pujols (three) and Eddie Mathews (three)... He is the only player in franchise history with multiple seasons of 40 or more home runs... He is third in the majors and second in the National League with 42 home runs...Alonso's 188 home runs since he entered the league in 2019 are the most in the major leagues.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets are on their penultimate road trip of the season...New York has nine road games remaining in the 2023 campaign...New York has posted a 29-42 record on the road this year.

I DON'T WANT TO ROCK, DJ: Over his last 16 games, DJ Stewart is batting . 333 (19-57) with 10 runs, three doubles, nine home runs, 18 RBI and a 1.247 OPS... In 39 games this year, Stewart is batting .265 (26-98) with 13 runs, five doubles, 10 home runs, 21 RBI, 10 walks, a .348 OBP and a .622 SLG...Stewart recorded a career-high 12 home runs in 100 games with Baltimore in 2021.

THIS DAY IN METS HISTORY: On this day in 196, Todd Hundley set a then franchise record with his 40th home run of the year...New York defeated the Braves, 6-2, at Atlanta-Fulton County Stadium...He finished the 1996 season batting .259/.356/.550 with 41 home runs and 112 RBI, earning an All-Star nod as well...The backstop spent nine years with the Mets and hit .240/.323/.438 with 124 home runs and 397 RBI.

DOWN ON THE FARM: The Binghamton Rumble Ponies split a doubleheader with the Hartford Yard Goats yesterday...RHP Joander Suarez threw a seveninning no-hitter in the first game of the twin bill...He allowed only one walk and struck out four in the outing...In two starts at Double-A, Suarez is $2-0$ and has yet to allow a hit, surrendering two walks and striking out 10 in 13.0 innings... OF Drew Gilbert socked two homers for the Rumble Ponies in game two He finished 3-4 with two runs, two home runs and recorded three RBI...In 29 games with the Mets, the lefty is hitting .317 (33-104) with 17 runs, four doubles, one triple, six home runs, 19 RBI, 14 walks with a .956 OPS.

## SENGA NEWS \& NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Threw 7.0 innings, allowing one run on five hits with 12 strikeouts and two walks...Tied a career-high 12 strikeouts for the third time this season...Joins Dwight Gooden (six) as the only Mets rookie with three or more starts of 12 or more strikeouts...Joins Hideo Nomo (five), Kerry Wood (five) and Spencer Strider (three) as the only rookies with three or more starts with 12 -plus strikeouts in the Wild Card Era (Since 1995)...Was the first Mets rookie pitcher to have back-to-back double-digit strikeout games since Noah Synderagaard did the trick from September 25 - October 3, 2015...Is the first Japanese-born rookie to accomplish the feat since Masahiro Tanaka did so from June 11-17, 2014...Courtesy of Elias.
METS ROOKIE MILESTONE WATCH: On August 19 at St. Louis, Senga became the seventh Mets rookie pitcher ever to reach the 150 -strikeout mark...Senga finished his start reaching 154 strikeouts, tied with Gary Gentry for sixth all-time among Mets rookie hurlers...The righthander also earned his 10 th win of the season in his last start, becoming the 11th rookie in franchise history to reach double-digit wins in a season...Senga became the first Mets rookie to reach double-digit wins since Dillon Gee won 13 games as a rookie in 2011...Senga has 176 strikeouts, ranking third all-time for most strikeouts by a Mets rookie pitcher passing Noah Syndergaard (166), Jon Matlack (169) and Tom Seaver (170)... He is three strikeouts shy of passing Jerry Koosman for second all-time for most strikeouts by a Mets rookie.
HARD TO HIT: This season, Senga has three starts of 7.0 or more innings and two or fewer hits allowed, tied for the second-most such starts in the majors this season and tied with Dwight Gooden for the most such starts by a Mets rookie in a single season...Only Nolan Ryan $(4,1970)$ and Jacob deGrom $(5,2015)$ have had more such starts in a single season in franchise history.
SENGA GENESIS: Senga has recorded 176 strikeouts through his first 25 career major league games, the third-most by a Mets pitcher in franchise history...Only Dwight Gooden (202) and Matt Harvey (185) have recorded more during that span...His 176 strikeouts are the third-most by a Japanese born pitcher through 25 career games...He trails only Hideo Nomo (223) and Yu Darvish (188)...Senga's 3.08 ERA is the sixth-lowest mark by a Mets pitcher through their first 25 career major league games (Min. 100.0 IP).

KODAI THE FRIENDLY GHOST: Senga's 10 wins are tied for the most among all major league rookies this season and his 176 strikeouts also lead all major league rookies... Among qualified National League pitchers, Senga is fifth in the in opponent's average (.210), fifth in SO/9 (11.05) and third in ERA (3.08)...Senga ranks fifth in the majors in opponent's average against left-handed batters with a . 197 (49-249) clip (Min. 200 LHB faced).

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR: On July 8, Major League Baseball announced that Kodai Senga was added to the National League All-Star team, which took place on July 11 at T-Mobile Park in Seattle...Senga joined Pete Alonso (2019), Dwight Gooden (1984), Jerry Koosman (1968) and Tom Seaver as the only Mets rookies selected to an All-Star Game...He is the eighth Japanese-Born rookie ever to be selected to an All-Star Game joining Masahiro Tanaka (2014), Yu Darvish (2012), Kosuke Fukudome (2008), Hideki Okajima (2007), Hideki Matsui (2003), Ichiro Suzuki (2001) and Hideo Nomo (1995).

PUTTING THE K IN FORK: Senga's "ghost fork" has accounted for 96 of his 176 strikeouts through 25 starts...The pitch has a 60.2 percent whiff rate and a 29.0 percent putaway rate... Opponents have managed just 16 hits in 144 at-bats ending with the forkball, a 113 batting average.

MLB DEBUT NOTES: Senga became the 64th pitcher whose major league debut came in a start for the Mets...New York has had one pitcher make his MLB debut as a starter in each of the previous three seasons: José Butto in 2022, Tylor Megill in 2021 and David Peterson in 2020 (the Mets won each of those three games)...Senga allowed one run over 5.1 innings on three hits, three walks and eight strikeouts in his major league debut... His eight strikeouts were tied for the fourth-most by a Japanese-born pitcher in their major league debut and tied for the third-most by a Mets pitcher in their major league debut.

METS-JAPAN CONNECTION: Senga is the 14th Japanese-born player to appear in at least one game for the Mets, the most by any major league team...Prior to Senga, the last Japanese-born player to appear in a game for the Mets was OF Norichika Aoki in 2017.

NPB CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Prior to joining the Mets, Senga spent 11 seasons in Japan's NPB with the Fukuoka Softbank Hawks...During his NPB career he posted a 87-44 record with a 2.59 ERA ( $313 \mathrm{ER} / 1,089.0 \mathrm{IP}$ ) and 1,252 strikeouts ( $10.3 \mathrm{~K} / 9.0$ )... He was also a three-time NPB 2020) and a two-time Mitsui Golden Glove Award winner (2019 and 2020).

## TOMORROW'S STARTER: LHP DAVID PETERSON (3-7, 5.40)

LAST TIME OUT: Recorded a no decision, pitching 4.0 innings against the Mariners on Sept. 2...Allowed four runs on seven hits with four strikeouts...Marked just the second time this season Peterson has allowed four runs at home.

LETHAL LEFTY: Peterson has limited lefties to a .243 (66-272) average in his career...He whiffed 32 of the 96 left-handed batters he faced last year, a 33 percent strikeout rate that ranked fourth among all left-handed pitchers to face a minimum of 90 LHB in 2022.
