AT A GLANCE: The Yankees conclude their six-game road trip tonight with the final game of a three-game set at Baltimore (2-0 thus far)...are 3-2 on the road trip after dropping two-of-three games at Toronto this past weekend and winning their first two games at Baltimore...following this series, will return home for a 10-game homestand, featuring a three-game set vs. Toronto (Fri.-Sun.), a three-game series vs. Houston (8/25-27) and a four-game set vs. Boston (8/28-30).

- **Their 71-55 (.563) record is the second-best in the American League and the sixth-best in the Majors**, trailing only Milwaukee (78-49, .614), Tampa Bay (76-50, .603), Los Angeles-NL (77-51, .602), Atlanta (74-53, .583) and Chicago-NL (74-54, .578).
- Have won three straight games (since 8/16) after losing their previous three games (8/13-15)...have won five of their last eight games (since 8/11) and seven of their last 11 games (since 8/7)...**are 17-11 in their last 28 games (since 7/19) and 21-13 in their last 34 games (since 7/9).**
- **Including their current series, have won four of their last six series (since 7/31) and have won or split nine of their last 12 series (since 7/6 (are 7-3-2 in those series).**
- Have had 24 of their last 33 games decided by 2R-or-fewer (since 7/10), going 16-8 in those games...are 36-28 (.563) in games decided by 2R-or-fewer this season.

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees defeated the Orioles, 5-3, on Wednesday at Camden Yards...**RHP Will Warren** (4.0IP, 3H, 2R/ER, 2BB, 5K, 1HR, 1HP) started and did not record a decision...**3B Ryan McMahon** (1-for-3, 1RBI) hit a game-tying RBI single in the second inning...**SS George Lombard Jr.** (2-for-3, 2RBI, 1SF) hit a go-ahead sac fly in the second inning and a go-ahead RBI single in the eighth inning...**DH Ben Rice** (2-for-5, 1R, 1HR, 1RBI) hit his 34th HR of the season with a 447-foot solo home run in the third inning...**2B Jazz Chisholm Jr.** (1-for-2, 2R, 2BB, 1SB) reached base three times and scored a run in the eighth inning on a wild pitch...**Yankees relievers** allowed only 1R/ER in 5.0IP (3H, 1BB, 6K, 1HR)...**LHP Brent Headrick** (1.0IP, 1K) earned his seventh win of the season after tossing a scoreless seventh inning...**RHP David Bednar** (1.0IP, 1K) earned his 29th save of the year after tossing a scoreless ninth inning.

MERRY GRISHMAS: OF Trent Grisham reached base twice on Wednesday at Baltimore...**is batting .350/.381/.825 (14-for-40) with 7R, 4 doubles, 5HR, 11RBI and 2BB over his last 10 games (since 8/8).**

- 11 of his last 17 hits have been XBH (5 doubles, 6HR).
- **Has hit 5HR in his last nine games (since 8/9) and 6HR in his last 14 games (since 8/3).**
- Has hit .290/.425/.710 (9-for-31) with 9R, 4 doubles, 3HR, 10RBI, 8BB and 1SF in nine games vs. the Orioles this year.

PUT TO BED: RHP David Bednar earned his 29th save of the year on Wednesday at Baltimore after tossing a scoreless ninth inning (1K)...**has not allowed a run in 28 of his last 31 appearances (since 5/22), going 5-0 with 18 saves, a 0.76 ERA (35.1IP, 3ER) and 39K during that span**...opponents are batting .110/.178/.144 (13-for-118) over that stretch.

GEORGE OF THE CONCRETE JUNGLE: INF George Lombard Jr. recorded his second straight multi-hit game and drove in two runs on Wednesday at Baltimore, hitting a go-ahead sac fly in the second inning and a go-ahead RBI single in the eighth inning...has hit safely in 10 of his first 13 career games, batting .318/.380/.477 (14-for-44) with 8R, 1 double, 2HR, 5RBI, 5BB, 1SF and 1SB.
► According to FanGraphs, his seven defensive runs saved are tied for the fifth-most among shortstops this season.

ROAD WARRIORS: The Yankees are 40-28 (.588) on the road this year, the best record in the AL and the second-best in the Majors, trailing only Los Angeles-NL (40-25, .615)...are 13-6 in their last 19 road games (since 7/9) and 26-15 in their last 41 games on the road (since 5/25).

NEW YORK 'PEN STATION: Yankees relievers allowed only 1R/ER in 5.0 innings on Wednesday at Baltimore (3H, 1BB, 6K, 1HR)...**have posted a Major League-best 2.49 ERA (249.1IP, 69ER) over their last 66 games (since 6/3)**, holding opponents to a .199 (179-for-899) BA during that stretch.
► **Own the best inherited runners scored percentage in the Majors this season (21.5%) and the second-best bullpen ERA (3.02, second in AL)**...also rank second in the Majors in opponents' OPS (.648, second in AL) and WHIP (1.20, second in AL), third in opponents' BA (.220, first in AL), opponents' SLG (.347, second in AL) and opponents' OBP (.301, second in AL), fifth in HR/9.0IP (0.92, second in AL) and ninth in K/BB (2.49, fifth in AL).
► **Have three relievers in the top-seven for the lowest inherited runners scored percentage in the Majors this season** - Tim Hill (6.7%, first), Brent Headrick (10.3%, fifth) and Fernando Cruz (13.6%, seventh).

COLE TRAIN: RHP Gerrit Cole will make his 16th start of the season in tonight's series finale at Baltimore...has gone 6-6 with a 3.22 ERA (86.2IP, 31ER) and 92K in 15 starts this season...**has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 12 of his 15 starts, including 2R-or-fewer in 10 of those starts.**

- **Has posted a 2.57 ERA (49.0IP, 14ER) over his last eight starts (since 7/3)**...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in each of those starts, including 2R-or-fewer in six starts.
- **Has allowed 2R-or-fewer in each of his last four starts (since 7/28) and 1ER-or-fewer in three of those starts, going 3-1 with a 1.46 ERA (24.2IP, 4ER) and 26K during that span.**
- Has tossed at least 6.0IP in six of his last seven starts (since 7/8) and nine of his 15 starts this season.
- Has not allowed a HR in each of his last four starts (since 7/28).
- Is 7-3 with a 2.39 ERA (94.1IP, 25ER) and 110K in 15 career starts vs. the Orioles...has allowed 1ER-or-fewer in nine of his 15 career starts vs. the Orioles and 2ER-or-fewer in 11 of those starts...has gone 4-2 with a 2.17 ERA (49.2IP, 12ER) and 51K in eight career starts at Camden Yards...has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in six of those starts and 1ER-or-fewer in five of them.
- **Needs 7K to tie Roger Clemens (1,014K) for 12th place on the Yankees' all-time strikeout list.**

FOR STARTERS: Yankees starting pitchers have allowed 2R-or-fewer in 17 of their last 20 starts (since 7/28), including 1R-or-fewer in 14 of those starts, posting a 2.07 ERA (113.0IP, 26ER) during that span...have allowed 2R-or-fewer in 20 of their last 25 starts and 1R-or-fewer in 17 of those starts (since 7/22-G2), posting a 2.36 ERA (137.0IP, 36ER) with 153K during that span.

- **Have allowed 1ER-or-fewer in five of their last six starts (since 8/13) and seven of their last nine starts (since 8/9).**
- **Have allowed 3R-or-fewer in 99 starts this season, their most such starts through their first 126 games of a season in franchise history** (previous: 98GS in 2021 and 2022)...have allowed 2R-or-fewer in 75 games this season, their second-most starts through their first 126 games of a season in franchise history, trailing only their 79 starts in 2022.
- Have allowed 3R-or-fewer in 31 of their last 35 starts (since 7/8), including 2R-or-fewer in 26 of those starts, posting a 2.74 ERA (187.0IP, 57ER) during that span.
- **Yankees starters own the best ERA in the Majors (3.38)**, rank third in strikeouts (703, first in AL), strikeout rate (25.2%, first in AL), K/9.0IP (9.35, first in AL), opponents' BA (.226, first in AL) and opponents' OPS (.663, second in AL), fourth in opponents' SLG (.373, third in AL), fifth in HR/9.0IP (1.05, third in AL) and opponents' OBP (.291, third in AL), sixth in K/BB (3.29, third in AL) and WHIP (1.16, fourth in AL), and eighth in BB/9.0IP (2.85, fourth in AL).

RICE RICE BABY: C/INF Ben Rice hit his 34th home run of the season with a 447-foot solo home run in the third inning on Wednesday at Baltimore...according Baseball Savant, marked the longest HR of his career...has hit 2HR in his last three games...has hit a career-high 34HR in 121 games this year after hitting 26HR in 138 games in 2025.

- 57 of his 113H this year have been extra-base hits (20 doubles, 3 triples, 34HR).
- **Has hit .362/.429/.913 (25-for-69) with 17R, 3 doubles, 1 triple, 11HR, 21RBI, 6BB, 2HP and 1SB in his last 18 games vs. Baltimore (since 7/14/24)...his 11 career home runs against the Orioles are his most HR against a single opponent in his career.**

PITCH PERFECT: Yankees pitchers have posted a Major League-best 3.24 ERA (1,125.2IP, 405ER) this season (next: Milwaukee-3.46)...have allowed 3R-or-fewer in 17 of their last 25 games (since 7/22-G2), including 2R-or-fewer in 13 of those games, posting a 2.53 ERA (228.0IP, 64ER) during that stretch.

- Have allowed 3R-or-fewer in 22 of their last 33 games (since 7/10), posting a 2.72 ERA (301.0IP, 91ER) with 323K during that span.
- Their 470R allowed this season are their second-fewest through their first 126 games of a season in the last 48 162-game seasons (since 1977), trailing only their 439R allowed in 2022 (excludes the 60-game season in 2020 and the strike-shortened 1981 season).

ON A ROLL: RHP Paul Blackburn tossed a scoreless eighth inning on Wednesday at Baltimore (1H, 1BB, 1K)...**has not allowed an earned run in 25 of his last 27 appearances (one start) since 6/21, going 2-1 with one save, a 0.72 ERA (37.1IP, 3ER) and 34K during that stretch...has held opponents to a .116/.213/.198 (14-for-121) slash line during that span.**
► Has not allowed an ER in his last 10 games (11.1IP) since 7/31.
► Has gone 4-2 with one save, a 1.80 ERA (70.0IP, 14ER) and 57K in 48 games (two starts) this season, holding opponents to a .191/.274/.285 (47-for-246) slash line.

RHP Gerrit Cole will make his 16th start of the season in tonight's series finale at Baltimore...the 35-year-old will pitch on extended five days' rest due to Monday's team off day...last pitched on Friday at Toronto and suffered his sixth loss of the season in the Yankees' 3-1 defeat despite allowing only 2R/1ER in 6.0 innings (5H, 2BB, 5K, 0HR)...**has allowed 2R-or-fewer in each of his last four starts (since 7/28) and 1ER-or-fewer in three of those starts, going 3-1 with a 1.46 ERA (24.2IP, 4ER) with 26K during that span**...missed the entire 2025 season and the first 51 games of this season recovering from "Tommy John" surgery...the six-time All-Star (2015, '18-19, '21-23) was unanimously named the 2023 American League Cy Young Award winner and has finished in the top-five of Cy Young Award voting three times (first in 2023, second in 2019 and 2021, fourth in 2015 and 2020, and fifth in 2018)...his career 10.33 K/9.0IP ratio (2,343K/2,040.2IP) is the seventh-highest in Major League history (min. 1,500.0IP)...in 140 starts with the Yankees, is 65-34 with a 3.13 ERA (845.2IP, 294ER) and 1,007K...since 2018, is tied for first in the Majors in shutouts (five), ranks second in wins (100), WHIP (1.01) and opponents' OBP (.261), third in strikeouts (1,609), strikeout rate (32.3%), winning percentage (.694, min. 70 decisions), opponents' SLG (.206), complete games (seven) and WAR among pitchers (32.5 – FanGraphs), fourth in ERA (2.98), K/9.0IP (11.51) and opponents' OPS (.619), fifth in K/BB (5.09) and eighth in opponents' SLG (.358)...is the first Yankee in franchise history to record at least 200K in three different seasons...owns two of the Yankees' top three single-season strikeout records and three of the top-eight records (his 257K in 2022 are the most in franchise history, his 243K in 2021 are the third-most in franchise history and his 222K in 2023 are tied for the seventh-most in Yankees history)...was originally selected by the Yankees in the first round (28th overall) of the 2008 First-Year Player Draft but did not sign and went on to play at UCLA for three seasons (2009-11)...was the first overall pick of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft, the 15th pitcher (and 11th right-hander) to be chosen first...is the fifth player selected first overall to play for the Yankees, joining Alex Rodriguez, Darryl Strawberry, Tim Lincecum and Ron Blomberg...signed a nine-year contract extending through the 2028 season with a player opt-out following the 2024 season on 12/18/19.

2026: Has gone 6-6 with a 3.22 ERA (86.2IP, 31ER) and 92K in 15 starts this season...**has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 12 of his 15 starts, including 2R-or-fewer in 10 of those starts...**
has also tossed three scoreless starts...has tossed at least 6.0IP in six of his last seven starts (since 7/8) and nine of his 15 starts this season.

- IN PINSTRIPE:** In 140 starts with the Yankees, is 65-34 with a 3.13 ERA (845.2IP, 294ER) and 1,007K...has allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 110-of-140 starts, the eighth-most in the AL in that span...has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 96 starts as a Yankee, the fifth-most in the AL since 2020...has recorded 27 scoreless starts as a Yankee, the fourth-most scoreless starts by any AL pitcher in that span.
- ✦ Since 2020, ranks second in the Majors in opponents' OBP (.265, second in AL) and K/9.0IP (10.72, second in AL), third in K/BB (4.94, third in AL), fourth in WHIP (1.03, second in AL), fifth in opponents' BA (.213, first in AL), ERA (3.13, second in AL) and opponents' OPS (.632, second in AL), ninth in winning percentage (.657, third in AL, min. 60 decisions) and 10th in opponents' SLG (.367, fourth in AL).
 - ✦ Was unanimously named the American League Cy Young Award winner in 2023...became the sixth player in Yankees history to win the award, joining Roger Clemens (2001), Ron Guidry (1978), Sparky Lyle (1977), Whitey Ford (1961) and Bob Turley (1958)...was the seventh American League pitcher (11th time) to win the Cy Young Award unanimously...joined Guidry as the only two Yankees to win the award unanimously...has finished in the top-five of Cy Young Award voting in three of his first five seasons he has pitched in pinstripes (first in 2023, second in 2021, fourth in 2020).
 - ✦ **His 29 double-digit strikeout games with the Yankees are the most by a pitcher in franchise history (next: Ron Guidry-23G)**...has 29 such games in 140 starts with the Yankees while Guidry recorded 23 double-digit strikeout games in 368 games/323 starts with the Yankees...his eight games with at least 12K are the second-most in franchise history (Al Downing-10G).
 - ✦ Since 2023, has started after a Yankees' loss 32 times...the Yankees are 21-11 in those games with Cole going 16-9 with a 3.20 ERA (194.0IP, 69ER).
 - ✦ With 243K in 2021, 257K in 2022 and 222K in 2023, is the first Yankee in franchise history to record at least 200K in three different seasons.
 - ✦ Surpassed Masahiro Tanaka (991K) for 13th place on the Yankees' all-time strikeout list on 8/2 at the Cubs...**needs 7K to tie Roger Clemens (1,014K) for 12th place on the Yankees' all-time strikeout list.**

- ✦ Has gone 4-2 with a 2.17 ERA (49.2IP, 12ER) and 51K in eight career starts at Camden Yards...has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in six of those starts and 1ER-or-fewer in five of them.
- ✦ Last faced Baltimore on 9/26/24 at Yankee Stadium and earned the win after tossing 6.2 scoreless innings (2H, 1BB, 5K).

COLE TRAIN: In 332 starts across 13 Major League seasons with the Pittsburgh Pirates (2013-17), Houston Astros (2018-19) and New York Yankees (2020-24, '26), is 159-86 with a 3.18 ERA (2,040.2IP, 1,702H, 772R/721ER, 519BB, 2,343K, 228HR)...the six-time All-Star (2015, '18-19, '21-23) was unanimously named the 2023 American League Cy Young Award winner and has finished in the top-five of Cy Young Award voting six times (first in 2023, second in 2019 and 2021, fourth in 2015 and 2020, and fifth in 2018).

★ His 2,343 career strikeouts rank 55th on the all-time strikeout list...needs 14K to tie Robin Roberts (2,357K) for 54th place on the all-time strikeout list.
