TONIGHT'S GAME: The Braves and Royals open a two-game series tonight with the third of four meetings between the clubs this season...Kansas City took both games at SunTrust Park, July 23-24.

A Atlanta has played Kansas City 15 times, tied for the fewest games the Braves have played against any one franchise...They have also played Oakland, Los Angeles (AL), and Cleveland 15 times.

A The Braves have dropped their last three games and five of their last six with Kansas City following the Royals' sweep earlier this season.

A This series marks the Braves' third ever trip to Kauffman Stadium...They split a two-game series in 2013, before dropping two-of-three games in 2016.

A RHP Julio Teheran is set to face the Royals for the third time in his career and for the second time this season...He dropped a 2-0 decision on July 24 of this season, allowing two unearned runs over 6.0 innings...Teheran also lost a 5-1 decision to Kansas City on May 13, 2016, despite allowing two runs, one earned, over 7.0 innings.

A LHP Danny Duffy is scheduled to make his third career start against Atlanta, and the lefty is 0-0 with a 1.00 ERA (1 ER/9.0 IP) in his previous two turns against the Braves...Duffy earned a 5-4 win on July 23 of this season at SunTrust Park after going 6.0 innings and allowing one run, earned, with 11 strikeouts.

100 WINS?: The Braves won their 96th game of the season on Saturday, and need to go 4-1 or better over their final five games to reach triple-digit victories in a single season for the ninth time in franchise history and for the first time since 2003.

A The 2003 club went 101-61 on their way to a five-game NLDS loss to Chicago...It marked the team's second-consecutive season of 100 wins; the 2002 also won 101 games.

A The Braves won triple digits in three consecutive seasons from 1997-1999, while the '93 went 104-58.

A The other two 100-win seasons came prior to the modern era in 1892 (102-48) and 1898 (102-47).

A One more win would give the Braves their most single-season victories since that 2003 team won 101.

ON THE ROAD: The Braves begin their final road trip of the year tonight, and will finish the regular season on Sunday in New York...The Braves have the best road record in the National League at 46-30, and trail only Minnesota (50-25, .667) for the major league lead.

A The Braves finished 47-34 (.580) away from SunTrust Park last season, tied for the best road record in the National League with Los Angeles.

OZZIE HITS: 2B Ozzie Albies collected his 183rd hit of the season on Sunday to tie the single-season Atlanta-era record for most hits by a second baseman...Felix Millan also had that many in 1970.

A Albies' 183 hits are the second most in the NL, trailing Ketel Marte's 187...With Marte out for the remainder of the season, Albies is looking to become the fifth Atlanta-era player to lead the league in hits, joining Freddie Freeman (2018), Terry Pendleton (1991 and 1992), Ralph Garr (1974) and Felipe Alou (1966 and 1968).

A The Braves are looking to become the first National League team to have consecutive hit leaders since Chicago in 2005-2006...Derek Lee had 1999 in 2005 before Juan Pierre had 204 in 2006.

RUNS: OF Ronald Acuña Jr. enters tonight's game with 127 runs this season, and is within four of tying the franchise modern-era record for a single season...OF Dale Murphy scored 131 times in 1983.

A Acuña Jr. is tied for the third most runs in a single season in the franchise's modern era...Hank Aaron also had 127 in 1962.

A Rafael Furcal is in second place with 130 in 2003.

40-40?: OF Ronald Acuña Jr. needs three steals to become the fifth player in baseball history to collect a 40-homer, 40-steal season.

A OF José Canseco was the first player to go 40-40, reaching 42 home runs and 40 steals in 1988...Barry Bonds then matched those numbers in 1996, while Alex Rodríguez had 42 homers and 46 steals in 1998...Alfonso Soriano then had 46 and 41 in 2006.

A Prior to Acuña Jr., those four players were the only ones to go 40/35...Bonds did it twice, going 40/37 in 1997, a year after his 42/40 season.

INTERLEAGUE: The Braves are 12-6 against the American League this season, and will finish the year with their second-best interleague record of all time regardless of what happens in these two games.

A They went 15-3 in 2002 against the AL.

A This year marks the Braves' first winning season against the American League since going 11-9 in 2013...From 2014 to 2018, the Braves went 38-62 (.380) in interleague play, the third-worst record in the National League.

TEHERAN INNINGS: RHP Julio Teheran needs 2.2 more innings to reach 175.0 for the seventh consecutive season, and join RHP Mike Leake as the only two pitchers in baseball to have such a streak...Teheran's streak dates to 2013, his first full season in the majors.

A RHP Max Scherzer and LHP Jon Lester are also able to reach 175.0 innings for the seventh consecutive season this year.

A Teheran's 1,331.2 innings since 2013 are the ninth most in baseball.

Saves/Opp: 1/1 **Holds:** 16 **1st Batter/Retired:** 41/29 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 19/6

- Is 1-2 with a 3.86 ERA (16 ER/37.1 IP) in 41 appearances with the Braves, and 3-4 with a 4.24 ERA (24 ER/51.0 IP) over 56 games on the season...Atlanta acquired him from the Seattle Mariners, 5/20, in exchange for LHP Jesse Biddle and RHP Arodys Vizcaino.
- Since returning from the injured list on 7/12, is 1-2 with a 6.75 ERA (15 ER/20.0 IP) in 24 games...In 17 games with Atlanta prior to the stint, had a 0.52 ERA (1 ER/17.1 IP).
- Is a perfect 16-for-16 in hold chances with Atlanta, and has converted his only save opportunity.
- Thirty-two of his 41 outings since joining the Braves have been scoreless.
- Had a 17.0-inning scoreless streak that dated to 5/31, and was the longest scoreless stretch in the majors at the time...Was also the longest scoreless streak of his career.

- Is 2-1 with a 3.82 ERA (32 ER/75.1 IP) in 49 games this season...Recorded his first career save, 6/9 at MIA.
- Pitched a career-most 5.0 innings of relief, 8/15 vs. NYM...Threw 67 pitches.
- Has walked seven batters in 75.1 innings for a 0.84 BB/9.0 IP mark, the second best in the majors (min 50 IP).
- His 75.1 innings pitched are tied for fourth most among National League relievers...Has gone at least 2.0 innings in 21 of 49 his appearances.
- Allowed just three of 25 inherited runners to score (12.0%), fourth best in the majors (min. 20 inherited runners).

Touki Toussaint • RHP • 6-3 • 215 • 22 yrs • #62

- Recalled, 9/13, for his today for his fourth stint with Atlanta...Is 4-0 with a 5.62 ERA (26 ER/41.2 IP) in 24 games with Atlanta this season, including one start.
- Has a 4.24 ERA (19 ER/40.1 IP) in 23 appearances out of the bullpen this season...Opponents are hitting .248 (38-for-153) against him in relief.
- Holding right-handed batters to a .202 (21-for-104) average and .250 slugging percentage...Lefties are 23-for-59 (.390) with a .712 slugging percentage (7 2B, 4 HR).
- Was recalled, 5/15, for his third stint with Atlanta...Was also up from 4/13-20, and on 5/3.

- Was recalled, 9/1, for his third stint with Atlanta this season...Is 0-0 with a 1.93 ERA (2 ER/9.1 IP) in six appearances with the Braves...Pitched 1.2 innings of one-run relief in his last game, 9/15 at WSH.
- Atlanta selected his contract, 7/24, from Triple-A Gwinnett and his first appearance marked his major league debut...Is rated by MLB.com as Atlanta's No. 27 prospect.
- Is 3-7 with a 2.88 ERA (26 ER/81.1 IP) in 32 games between Double-A Mississippi and Triple-A Gwinnett this season, with 82 strikeouts and seven saves...In six games since his last option from Atlanta, pitched to a 1.86 ERA (2 ER/9.2 IP).
- Was selected by Atlanta in the fifth round of the 2016 First-Year Player Draft out of Gardner-Webb University...Is a native of Forsythe County, NC.

Ronald Acuña Jr. • OF • 6-0 • 205 • 21 yrs • #13

SF Series: .400 (2-5, HR) **Last HR:** 9/20/19 vs. SF (Beede)

Homestand: .375 (6-16, 2 HR) **Current Streak:** 0-3

Season Long Streak: 10 games, twice, last: 7/31-8/9 (18-47, .383, 7 HR)

- Needs three steals in the final five games to record the fifth 40-homer, 40-steal season in baseball history...The others: J. Canseco (1988), B. Bonds (1996), A. Rodríguez (1998) and A. Soriano (2006)...Acuña currently has a team-most 41 homers and a NL-most 37 steals.
- Leads the National League in runs scored (127)...Is four away from matching the franchise modern-era record in that category...Dale Murphy scored 131 runs in 1983...Murphy was also the last Brave to lead the NL in runs, when he scored 118 runs in 1985.
- Hit his 40th home run of the season on Thursday to become just the third player in baseball history to hit 40 homers in a single season prior to his 22nd birthday...Eddie Mathews hit 47 in 1953 as a 21-year-old and Mel Ott hit 42 in 1929 as a 20-year-old.
- Hit 50th career home run on 7/21 vs. WSH...At 21 years, 215 days old, became fourth youngest player to reach the 50-homer milestone (M. Ott, T. Conigliaro and A. Jones).
- Agreed to terms, 4/2, on an eight-year, \$100 million contract extension with Atlanta.

Ozzie Albies • INF • 5-8 • 165 • 22 yrs • #1

Homestand: .333 (6-18) **Current Streak:** 5 games (6-18, .333)

Season Long Streak: 8 games, 8/3-10 (19-38, .500, 3 HR)

- Had his fourth career pinch hit on Sunday...Was his 183rd hit this season, tying the single-season Atlanta record for a second baseman...Felix Millan also had that many in 1970.
- Albies' 183 hits are the second most in the NL, trailing Ketel Marte's 187...Albies is looking to become the fifth Atlanta-era player to lead the league in hits, joining F. Freeman (2018), T. Pendleton (1991 and 1992), R. Garr (1974) and F. Alou (1966 and 1968).
- Is third in the NL with 54 multi-hit games, 17 of which he got at least three hits.
- Hit his 40th double of the season on 9/12 at Philadelphia...Also has 23 home runs...Last season had 24 home runs and 40 doubles...Is the 11th player in baseball history to have 40 doubles and 20 homers in each of his first two full major league seasons...The list includes T. Williams, A. Rodríguez and A. Pujols...R. Zimmerman was the last to do so (2006-07).
- Signed a seven-year, \$35 million contract extension with Atlanta on 4/11.

Francisco Cervelli • C • 6-1 • 210 • 33 yrs • #45

SF Series: .250 (1-4, HR) **Last HR:** 9/21/19 vs. SF (Rodríguez)

Homestand: .200 (1-5, HR) **Current Streak:** 0-2

Season Long Streak: 5 games, 4/3-7 (5-17, .294)

- Signed a major league contract with Atlanta on 8/24...Appeared in 34 games with the Pirates this season, batting .193/.279/.248 (21-109) with one homer and five RBI.
- Had multiple extra-base hits in each of his first two games with ATL, including four hits, three RBI in his debut on 8/24...With Pittsburgh this year, did not have any games with multiple extra-base hits...In fact, only had three multi-hit games in 34 total games.
- Since 2015, when he joined the Pirates, has a .363 on-base percentage, the second-best among major league catchers in that time (Buster Posey, .366).

Josh Donaldson • INF • 6-1 • 210 • 33 yrs • #20

SF Series: .000 (0-6) **Last HR:** 9/9/19 at PHI (Pivetta)

Homestand: .000 (0-14) **Current Streak:** 0-18

Season Long Streak: 11 games, 7/29-8/8 (13-39, .333, 3 HR)

- Is hitless in a season-long five consecutive games, dating to 9/15...Has gone 0-for-18 with two walks and five strikeouts in this stretch.
- Has 98 walks this season, fifth most in the National League...Seeking to become the seventh Brave to draw 100 walks in a season in the Atlanta-era of team history (since 1966)...Chipper Jones was the last to do so, drawing 101 walks in 2009.
- With his next home run, would match Chipper Jones for the third most home runs by a third baseman in single-season Atlanta franchise history...Jones hit 38 in 2001, and he set this record in 1999, by hitting 45 home runs...Darrell Evans is second, with 41 in 1973.
- Has not hit a home run since 9/9 at Philadelphia, a 10-game homerless drought...Despite that, still has 29 home runs since 6/11, a stretch of 89 games, tied for second in the majors in that time...Eugenio Suárez has the most with 34...Hit his 200th career home run 7/7 vs. Miami...Thirty-eight other active players have hit at least that many.
- Has a .399 on-base percentage against left-handers, higher than his .370 mark against right-handers, despite hitting 46 points higher against righties (.265; .219 against lefties).

Adam Duvall • OF • 6-1 • 215 • 31 yrs • #23

SF Series: .400 (2-5, HR) **Last HR:** 9/21/19 vs. SF (Coonrod)

Homestand: .364 (4-11, 2 HR) **Current Streak:** 3 games (3-9, .333, HR)

Season Long Streak: 6 games, 7/27-8/1 (12-25, .480, 5 HR)

- Is hitting .333/.417/.810 (7-21) with three home runs and six RBI in 11 games since being recalled from Triple-A Gwinnett on 9/5, his third recall of the season.
- Called up for the first time on 7/27...Hit five home runs in his first six games...Homered in a career high-tying three straight games from 7/30 to 8/1.
- Hit a single-season franchise-record 32 home runs in 101 games with Gwinnett this season.
- Was acquired by the Braves on 7/30 of last season...In 33 games with Atlanta in 2018, hit .132/.193/.151 with one extra-base hit (a double) and no RBI...From 2014-2018, hit 87 home runs, including posting back-to-back 30-homer seasons in 2016 and 2017.

Tyler Flowers • C • 6-4 • 260 • 33 yrs • #25

SF Series: .333 (1-3) **Last HR:** 9/11/19 at PHI (Eflin)

Homestand: .300 (3-10) **Current Streak:** 3 games (3-10, .300)

Season Long Streak: 6 games, 6/9-22 (9-21, .429, 2 HR)

- In his last 18 games, dating to 8/21, is hitting .280/.422/.500 with two home runs and 12 RBI...Atlanta is 13-5 (.722) in those games...This stretch included him hitting a three-run homer on 9/11 at Philadelphia, providing all the team's runs in a 3-1 victory.
- Since the start of August, the Braves have gone 15-6 (.714) in his 21 starts.
- Hit his 10th home run of the season on 8/30 for his fourth double-digit homer season of his career...Also: 2013 (10) and 2014 (15) with Chicago (AL) and 2017 (12) with Atlanta.
- Has been hit by a pitch twice in nine games this month...Since joining Atlanta in 2016, has been hit by 45 pitches, the fifth most in the Atlanta era of Braves history (since 1966).
