TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue the 10-game, 3-city road trip with the first of 3 games at the Chicago White Sox...Seattle is coming off a series sweep against the Sand Diego Padres (3-0) to open up the road trip and will face the Houston Astros (4 G, 5/22-25) to close out the trip following their current series in the Windy City...tonight's game will be televised live on **ROOT SPORTS** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Ryan Rowland-Smith** on the call and **Brad Adam** serving as sideline reporter...the game will be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** and Mariners.com with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.**

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners beat the Padres 6-1 yesterday to secure their 3rd sweep of the season and take a commanding 3-0 lead in the first official "**Vedder Cup**"...Seattle is 18-10 (.643) over its last 28 games and 22-11 (.667) over its last 33 games, tied for the best record in MLB since April 9 (also: Detroit, .667/24-12).

- Sweep Thoughts** - Seattle swept the Padres over the weekend to secure its third series sweep of the season...the Mariners have also swept a 3-game series vs. TEX (4/11-4/13) and 2-game series vs. LAA (4/29-4/30) this season.
- Series-ly Solid** - The Mariners own a 10-4-1 series record, 4-3-1 at home and 6-1 on the road...the Mariners won 9 consecutive series from April 7-May 7, the second-longest series winning streak in club history...since **Dan Wilson** took the helm on Aug. 23, 2024, Seattle owns a 17-6-3 series record.
- Home Runs Are Good** - Seattle is 24-11 (.686) in games with at least one home run...they are 2-8 (.200) in games when they do not homer.
- #44** - Over his last 17 contests (4/29-c), **Julio Rodríguez** is batting .296 (21x71) with 11 runs, 2 doubles, 3 home runs, 7 RBI and 2 walks...he has hit safely in 14 of those 17 contests.
- Switch Pitch** - Switch-handed pitcher **Jurrangelo Cijntje** was named Northwest League Pitcher of the Week today...in his lone start, Cijntje allowed just 1 hit over 6.0 scoreless innings with 5 strikeouts.

THE BEST CATCHER IN BASEBALL...in 44 games this year, catcher **Cal Raleigh** has a .943 OPS, hitting .247 (40x162) with 31 runs, 8 doubles, 15 homers, 32 RBI, 30 walks and 5 stolen bases, getting on base at a .369 clip and slugging .574...among MLB catchers (min. 100 PA), Cal leads the Majors in home runs, runs, RBI, stolen bases, extra-base hits (23), times on base (72), bWAR (2.4) and fWAR (2.6), while ranking among the leaders in OBP (4th), SLG (2nd), OPS (3rd) and OPS+ (2nd, 177)...Raleigh also recently joined Ken Griffey Jr. (4x, 1994, '97-'99), Alex Rodriguez (2x, 1998, 2000), Jay Buhner (1996), Edgar Martinez (2000) and Nelson Cruz (2015) as Mariners to hit 15 HR in his team's first 44 games of a season.

THE BEST CLOSER IN BASEBALL...right-hander **Andrés Muñoz** recorded his American League-leading 14th save of the season Saturday, tossing 1.1 scoreless innings for his first 4+ out save of the year...he had gone 19 consecutive outings of exactly 1.0 inning to start his season, tied for the 2nd-longest streak of exactly 1.0-inning outings to begin a season in Mariners history with Paul Sewald (2023), trailing only Eddie Guardado (44 G, 4/4-8/25/2005)...in 20 appearances this season, the reigning American League Reliever of the Month is 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (0 ER, 20.1 IP) with 7 hits allowed, 2 runs allowed (0 earned runs), 8 walks (2 intentional) and 27 strikeouts, sporting a 0.74 WHIP, while limiting opponents to a .106 batting average (7x66)... Muñoz leads MLB relief pitchers with 1.9 Wins Above Replacement (*Baseball-Reference*).

RANDYLAND IS A TRAVELING SHOW...**Randy Arozarena** was 1-for-5 with 2 runs scored and a home run in yesterday's game...so far this season, he is batting .242 (37x153) with 21 runs, 10 doubles, 6 home runs, 21 RBI and 9 stolen bases, getting on base at a .380 clip and slugging .425 (.805 OPS)...Arozarena has reached base safely in 38 of his last 39 games since March 31, which included a career-high, 34-game on-base streak from March 31-May 12.

ROAD DOGGS...the Mariners have won 6 consecutive road series since dropping their first one at San Francisco from April 4-6...since then, Seattle has captured series victories on the road at Cincinnati (2-1), Toronto (2-1), Boston (2-1), Texas (2-1), against the Athletics (2-1) and against the Padres (3-0)...the Mariners last won 6+ consecutive road series during the 2023 season, when they won 8 consecutive road series from July 3-Aug. 23.

GOING DOWN THE ONLY 'ROAD' I'VE EVER KNOWN...Mariners hitters are batting .264 (202x765) with 114 runs, 31 doubles, 32 home runs, 24 stolen bases, a .352 OBP, slugging .430 with a .782 OPS in 21 road games this season, averaging 5.4 runs-per-game...among MLB teams on the road, they rank 2nd in OBP, 4th in runs-per-game and 3rd in OPS...**Cal Raleigh** is tied for the MLB lead with 9 road home runs (also: Taylor Ward-LAA).

BULLPEN BULLIES...Seattle relief pitchers combined to allow just 1 run over 9.1 innings during the series at San Diego, striking out 11 while walking just 2...in 5 appearances this season, **Matt Brash** has tossed 4.2 scoreless innings with 6 strikeouts...**Casey Legumina** is 3-1 with a 1.84 ERA (3 ER, 14.2 IP) with 14 strikeouts in 15 appearances this year and **Gabe Speier** is 2-0 with a 2.50 ERA (5 ER, 18.0 IP), 4 walks, 25 strikeouts and a 0.94 WHIP in 21 games).

CALIFORNIA KIDS...**Rowdy Tellez** (Sacramento) and **J.P. Crawford** (Long Beach) were both born in California and were both part of the 2013 MLB draft class with J.P. going in the first round (16th overall) to the Phillies and Tellez going in the 30th round to the Blue Jays...since starting the season with a 1-for-20, Tellez has a .889 OPS, hitting .241 (19x79), slugging .595 with 14 runs, 4 doubles, 8 home runs and 21 RBI over his last 30 games...Crawford is batting .308 (37x120) with 15 runs, 5 doubles, 4 home runs, 19 RBI, 1 stolen base, a .390 OBP and a .450 slugging percentage (.840 OPS) over his last 31 games since April 9.

NEXT HOMESTAND...following the current 10-game road trip, the Mariners return to T-Mobile Park for a 9-game homestand where they will host the Washington Nationals (3 G, 5/27-5/29), Minnesota Twins (3 G, 5/30-6/1) and Baltimore Orioles (3 G, 6/3-6/5)...the homestand is highlighted by **Randy Arozarena Bobblehead 3-Day Giveaway** from May 27-29, **K-Pop Fireworks Night** on May 30, **Little League Day** on June 1, **Pride Night** on June 4 and a pair of **Mariners Value Games** on June 3 and June 5, with tickets starting at \$11.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...the Mariners have gotten contributions this season up and down their lineup with 9 players having at least 50 plate appearances and an OPS+ of 100 or better, tied for the most in the Majors, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...that Seattle is tied for the MLB lead with 4 players who have an OPS+ of at least 140 (min. 100 PA)?...the Mariners are equaled only by the New York Yankees (Aaron Judge, Paul Goldschmidt, Ben Rice and Trent Grisham) and the Los Angeles Dodgers (Shohei Ohtani, Freddie Freeman, Will Smith and Teoscar Hernández)...**Jorge Polanco** (187 OPS+), **Cal Raleigh** (177), **Dylan Moore** (154) and **Randy Arozarena** (140) make up the four Mariners with at least a 140 OPS+, while **Leo Rivas** (136), **J.P. Crawford** (128), **Rowdy Tellez** (116), **Julio Rodríguez** (11) and **Luke Raley** (102) round out the 9 Seattle players with a 100 OPS+ or better this season.

ABOUT CASTILLO...

- The 32-year-old right-hander is set to make his 10th start of the season and his 1st against the White Sox...he is also making his 221st Major League start and his 4th career start against the White Sox.
- Has been named an All-Star in 2019 (CIN), 2022 (CIN) and 2023 (SEA).
- Originally signed as an international free agent by the San Francisco Giants on 12/23/11.
- Made MLB debut on 6/23/17 vs. Washington (w/ Cincinnati).
- Signed a 5-year contract extension with the Seattle Mariners on Sept. 24, 2022 after being acquired in a trade with Cincinnati on July 30, 2022.

LAST TIME OUT...ND on 5/14 vs. NYY, Castillo threw 6.0 innings, giving up 6 hits on 1 run with 2 walks and 6 strikeouts...Castillo has thrown 5.0+ innings in 8 of his first 9 starts this season.

FAMILIAR FACE...with his start against the Cincinnati Reds (4/15), Castillo has recorded a start against 29 of 30 MLB teams (ex: SEA).

STRETCHING IT OUT...in a Mariners uniform, Castillo has gone 5.0+ innings in 79 of his 83 starts, 6.0+ innings in 53 of 83, and 7.0+ innings in 17 of 83.

HOME COOKIN'...in 45 starts at T-Mobile Park, Castillo is 19-12 with a 2.85 ERA (85 ER, 267.2 IP), with 308 strikeouts, 65 walks and a 1.02 WHIP...he ranks 1st in SO, 3rd in ERA, and 5th in wins in a pitcher's first 45 home games in franchise history (min. 150.0 IP).

SEASONED TRAVELER...in 105 career road starts, he has thrown 5.0+ innings pitched in 88 starts, 6.0+ in 57 starts, and 7.0+ in 16 starts...his last 15 road starts (4/25/24 at TEX-c), Castillo has thrown at least 5.0+ innings pitched in 13 starts, and has 2-or-less walks in 9 of those contests...his 202 strikeouts on the road is 5th-most for a pitcher's first 38 road games in franchise history.

CITY OF LA PIEDRA...in 3 career starts against the White Sox, Castillo has 23 strikeouts and 1 walk in 19.1 innings pitched...he is 1 of 3 pitchers (Cole Hamels-PHI/TEX and Nestor Cortes-NYY) in MLB history to throw 20-or-more strikeouts and 1-or-less walks in their first 3 games against the White Sox.

AGAINST THE AL...in 86 career starts against the American League, Castillo is 27-31, with a 3.66 ERA (202 ER, 497.0 IP), 1.20 WHIP, recording 514 strikeouts and 149 walks...since his Mariners debut (8/3/22 at NYY), against the American League, he has logged 65 starts, with a 23-22 record, and holds a 3.59 ERA (153 ER, 338.2 IP), 387 strikeouts and 108 walks.

STEERING THE SHIP...since his Mariners debut (8/3/22 at NYY), Castillo has led the team in SO/9, (10.6 in 2022, and 10.0 in 2023), ERA (3.17 in 2022), innings pitched (197.0 in 2023), and games started (33 in 2023)...he is 1st in SO (510), and 6th in ERA (3.46) for a pitcher's first 83 games in franchise history (min. 250.0 IP).

FOR CLUB & COUNTRY...ranks among the Dominican Republic-born All-Time leaders (min. 1,100.0 IP) in SO/9 (2nd, 9.64), SO/BB (3rd, 3.21), WHIP (3rd, 1.18), Opp. AVG (4th, .228), H/9 (4th, 7.60), ERA (5th, 3.56)...trails only Hall of Famer Pedro Martinez in SO/9 (10.04)...Castillo was born in Bani, Dominican Republic).

TOP CHARTS...since his MLB debut (6/23/17 vs. WSH), Castillo ranks 5th in QS (121), 6th in innings pitched (1279.1 IP), SO (1370), AVG against (.226), 7th in WAR (24.6), ERA (3.56), 8th in K/9 (9.64) 9th in WHIP (1.18) and K/BB% (17.8) among starting pitchers (min. 1,000 IP).

TOP OF CLASS...currently holds a 3.65 ERA and recorded his 6th consecutive season with a sub-4.00 ERA in 2024, including 5 qualified seasons (2019-21, 2023-24)...his 5 qualified seasons since 2019 is tied the most in the Majors during that span (also: Gerrit Cole-HOU/NYY and Zack Wheeler-PHI).

LUIS, LUIS...since making his Mariners debut (8/3/22 at NYY), Castillo is 32-26 with a 3.46 ERA (187 ER, 487.0 IP), 140 walks, 510 strikeouts, and a 1.15 WHIP while holding opponents to a .228 AVG against...among qualified pitchers during that span, he ranks 6th in QS (47), 7th in SO (510), 9th in AVG against (.228), innings pitched (487.0 IP), runs allowed (200), and 10th wins (32), ERA (3.46), K/BB% (18.5), and K/9 (9.43).

THE CASTILLO-10...in his last 10 starts (9/8-c), Castillo is 3-3, with 4 QS and holding a 3.78 ERA (22 ER, 52.1 IP) with 42 SO and 21 BB...he has thrown 5.0+ innings in 9 of his last 10, and has walked 2-or-less hitters in 9 of his last 10 starts.

EFFICIENT OUTINGS...Castillo is 1 of 3 pitchers (Dylan Cease-CHW/SDP, and Nick Pivetta-BOS/SDP) to have 4 starts of 6.0+ scoreless innings pitched, giving up 1-or-less hits and 2-or-less walks since his Mariners debut (8/3/22 at NYY)...in those starts, Castillo is 3-0 with 27 SO and 5 BB.

CAREER...will be making his 221st career start and is 1 of 27 active pitchers to with 220-or-more carer starts in the MLB...has pitched in parts of 9 Major League seasons with Cincinnati (2017-22) and Seattle (2022-c)...has been named an All-Star 3 times (2019, 2022 w/CIN and 2023 w/SEA)...finished 5th in 2023 AL Cy Young Award voting...has made 4 Opening Day starts in his career: 2019 and 2021 with Cincinnati and 2023-24 with Seattle.

POSTSEASON PEDIGREE...has made 3 career postseason starts, going 1-2 with a 1.83 ERA (4 ER, 19.2 IP), 19 strikeouts and 1 walk (intentional)...earned the win in Game 1 of the 2022 AL Wild Card Series at Toronto...tossed 7.1 scoreless innings with 5 strikeouts, setting a franchise record for most innings pitched in a scoreless postseason start...was tagged with the loss on 10/13/22 at HOU in G2 of the ALDS...allowed 3 runs on 5 hits (2 HR) with 7 strikeouts.

FIELDING HIS POSITION...has only committed 3 errors in 220 games, and has the 3rd best fielding percentage (.986) among active pitchers around the league since his MLB debut.
