TODAY'S GAME: The Braves and Cardinals continue their National League Division Series tonight with Game 2 at SunTrust Park...The clubs met six times in the regular season, with the Braves winning four of the games while outscoring St. Louis, 29-27.

A The clubs have met four times previous in the postseason, with the Cardinals winning three of the matchups...St. Louis swept the 1982 LCS from Atlanta, before the Braves took the 1996 LCS in seven games...The Cardinals then swept the NLDS in 2000, before winning the 2012 Wildcard Game.

A In all, the Braves have lost 11 of 15 postseason games with St. Louis, including each of the last five after last night's 7-6 loss.

A The Braves won both of the series with the Cardinals in the regular season, taking two-of-three in Atlanta, May 14-16, before winning another two-of-three at Busch Stadium, May 24-26.

A RHP Mike Foltynewicz is 3-4 with a 7.64 ERA (28 ER/33.0 IP) in seven career starts against the Cardinals, but allowed just one unearned run over 6.0 innings in his last start against them on May 24 in St. Louis to win, 5-2...The righty is set for his third postseason start after he went 0-1 with a 7.50 ERA (5 ER/6.0 IP) in his playoff debut last season.

A RHP Jack Flaherty is 1-1 with a 4.32 ERA (8 ER/16.2 IP) in three career games, all starts, against Atlanta...The righty faced them twice in the regular season this year, and tossed 6.0 innings each time...He did not allow a run in his last start against them on May 26 at Busch Stadium...Flaherty has never pitched in the postseason.

LOSS: The Braves lost their ninth consecutive postseason series opener yesterday, dropping a 7-6 decision to St. Louis...They last won a Game 1 in 2001, when they swept Houston in the NLDS.

A That win over Houston was the last time the Braves won a playoff round.

A The Braves have lost nine consecutive playoff rounds (including the 2012 Wild Card game), dating to the 2001 League Championship Series against Arizona..That streak is the second longest in MLB history...Only Chicago (NL) owns a longer such skid, losing 10 consecutive rounds from 1910 through 1998.

A The Braves are 3-16 in postseason play when they drop Game 1...They last won a series when dropping Game 1 in 1999, when they lost 6-1 vs. Houston in the NLDS before going on to win the next three games.

A They also won the 1991 LCS over Pittsburgh after losing Game 1 and the 1957 World Series.

TEHERAN: MLB announced today that it has approved a roster substitution for the Atlanta Braves due to an injury sustained by pitcher Chris Martin... As a result, Martin will be replaced by right-handed pitcher Julio Teheran on Atlanta's Division Series roster.

GAME 2: The Braves are set to play their 35th Game 2 of a playoff round today, and they are 24-10 (.706) in these games...They have won eight of their last nine such games, with the last seven of those wins following a Game 1 loss.

A Overall, the Braves are 12-7 (.632) in Game 2 when dropping Game 1.

A The Braves are 1-9 in series when they drop Game 2...Their only victory came in the 1996 LCS, when they lost to St. Louis and rebounded to win the series in seven games.

THE BULLPEN: The Braves bullpen allowed six runs over the final two innings last night as St. Louis rallied for a 7-6 win.

A The bullpen has blown a save in each of the Braves last two games after it went 37 games from August 17-September 28 without giving up a lead.

A The bullpen went 11-for-11 in save chances with 26 holds over that 37-game span.

A The Braves gave up a 6-4, 11th-inning lead in their season finale, losing 7-6 to New York (NL).

FOLTYNEWICZ WINS: Atlanta won each of RHP Mike Foltynewicz's 12 starts from June 11 vs. Pittsburgh through September 20 vs. San Francisco, including each of his first nine turns after returning from his option to Gwinnett...Foltynewicz went 7-0 with a 3.54 ERA (27 ER/68.2 IP) during the stretch...The streak ended in his last start of the season, a 3-0 loss at New York (NL) on September 28.

A The run of team wins in his starts was the longest such streak of his career, and the longest by any Atlanta pitcher since the Braves won an MLB-record 23 straight starts by Kris Medlen from 2010 to 2012.

A Foltynewicz's 12-game run was the longest by a starter in the National League this season...Houston won each of Gerrit Cole's final 13 starts of the season.

A Foltynewicz went 7-0 during the stretch, which was the longest winning streak of his career...He had previously won six straight from June 7 to July 25, 2017.

FREEMAN IN THE POSTSEASON: 1B Freddie Freeman went 2-for-4 with his second career postseason home run last night, and for his career, the first baseman has hit in nine of the 10 playoff games.

A Freeman is a .350 (14-for-40) hitter in the postseason, with a .409 on-base and .550 slugging percentage (.959 OPS).

RISP: The Braves went 1-for-11 with runners in scoring position last night...Over their last four games, all losses, Atlanta is 4-for-33 (.121) with no extra-base hits in these situations.

Today's Game

A Makes his third career postseason start...Is 0-1 with a 7.50 ERA (5 ER/6.0 IP) in his first two turns.

A Started Games 1 and 4 of the 2018 NLDS vs. Los Angeles...Allowed three hits and four runs over 2.0 innings to take the loss in Game 1, before allowing just two hits and one run over 4.0 innings in a no-decision in Game 4.

A Made 21 starts on the season for Atlanta and went 8-6 with a 4.54 ERA (59 ER/117.0 IP).

A Went just 2-5 and pitched to a 6.37 ERA (42 ER/59.1 IP) in 11 starts to open the season...Allowed a career high-tying eight runs on June 22 at Washington and was optioned to Triple-A Gwinnett following the game.

A Returned to Atlanta on August 5 and started the next night at Minnesota and proceeded to go 6-1 with a 2.65 ERA (17 ER/57.2 IP) over his final 10 starts of the season.

A Since his return from Gwinnett on August 5, his 2.65 ERA was seventh lowest in the National League.

A Atlanta won each of his 12 starts from June 11 vs. Pittsburgh through September 20 vs. San Francisco, including each of his first nine turns since returning from his option to Gwinnett...Foltyniewicz went 7-0 with a 3.54 ERA (27 ER/68.2 IP) during the stretch.

A The run of team wins in his starts was the longest such streak of his career, and the longest by any Atlanta pitcher since the Braves won an MLB-record 23 straight starts by Kris Medlen from 2010 to 2012.

A Foltyniewicz's 12-game run was the longest by a starter in the National League this season...Houston won each of Gerrit Cole's final 13 starts of the season.

A Foltyniewicz went 7-0 during the stretch, which was the longest winning streak of his career...He had previously won six straight from June 7 to July 25, 2017.

A Set for his eighth career start against St. Louis, and his third this season...Is 3-4 with a 7.64 ERA (28 ER/33.0 IP) in his first seven starts.

A In two turns this season, went 1-1 and allowed eight earned runs over 10.2 innings (6.75 ERA).

A Last faced them on May 24 at Busch Stadium, and allowed just one unearned run over 6.0 innings to earn the win.

2019 Recap

A Was recalled by Atlanta, 8/5, and started at Minnesota the following day...Allowed five hits (two homers) and three runs in 5.1 innings.

A Proceeded to go 6-1 with a 2.65 ERA (17 ER/57.2 IP) in 10 starts after his recall...His ERA in that span was seventh best in the NL.

A Made six starts with the Stripers following his option on 6/22, and went 4-0 with a 2.67 ERA (10 ER/33.2 IP) and 31 strikeouts...Opponents batted .254/.299/.325 against him.

A Pitched to a 1.13 ERA (2 ER/16.0 IP) over his last three turns, and allowed opponents to hit just .179.

A Started for Atlanta in Washington, 6/22, and allowed a career high-tying eight runs over 4.0 innings...Was optioned to Gwinnett postgame.

A In his previous six starts, had gone 2-2 with a 3.97 ERA.

A Earned his first win of the season, 5/24 at STL, after allowing five hits and one unearned run over 6.0 innings.

A The win stopped a seven-game losing streak for the Braves in Foltyniewicz's starts, dating to his final regular-season start of 2018...Atlanta lost each of Foltyniewicz's two playoff starts last season, and his first five turns this year.

A Started, 5/14 vs. STL, for his 100th career start, all of which have come for Atlanta.

A Became the 20th pitcher to make 100 starts for the Braves since the team moved to Atlanta in 1966...Of the 20 pitchers to make 100 such starts, Foltyniewicz's 8.61 SO/9.0 IP at the time were most, and he stood as one of just two starters to strike out at least eight batters per 9.0 innings for Atlanta.

A Took his second loss of the season, 5/8 at LAD, after allowing five hits and five runs over 6.0 innings of work...Struck out just two.

A Made his second start of the season, 5/2 vs. SD, and allowed six runs over 4.2 innings to take his first loss of 2019.

A Just two of the six runs were earned, and his four unearned runs match the most he has allowed in a single start during his career...Also had four unearned runs on 8/25/15 vs. COL.

A Was activated off the 10-day injured list, 4/27, and made his first major league start of the season...Missed Atlanta's first 25 games.

A Placed on the injured list with a right elbow bone spur on March 28, retroactive to March 25.

A Acquired by the Atlanta Braves along with RHP Andrew Thurman and INF Rio Ruiz from the Houston Astros in exchange for C/OF Evan Gattis and RHP James Hoyt on 1/14/15.

- Retired the only three hitters he faced with two strikeouts and groundout for a clean seventh inning yesterday.
- Went 17-6 with a 4.02 ERA (74 ER/165.2 IP) in 33 appearances for Atlanta during the season, including 30 starts...In his three relief appearances, did not allow a run over 5.1 innings, walking three and fanning five.
- Appeared in relief in all four games of the 2018 NLDS, allowing one run and one hit in 2.1 innings.
- Pitched out of the bullpen in his last appearance, 9/28 at NYM...Struck out five in 3.2 scoreless innings.

Shane Greene • RHP • 6-4 • 200 • 30 yrs • #19

- Made his first postseason appearance yesterday, gave up a leadoff double to OF Marcell Ozuna but went on to strand him after retiring the next three hitters he faced to close the sixth.
- Went 0-1 with a 4.01 ERA (11 ER/24.2 IP) in 27 games with the Braves, and 0-3 with a 2.30 ERA (16 ER/62.2 IP) in 65 games on the season...He has converted 23 of 28 save opportunities.
- Pitched to a 14.54 ERA (7 ER/4.1 IP) over his first six games with Atlanta...Pitched to a 1.77 ERA (4 ER/20.1 IP) in his final 21 appearances and converted his only save chance and all nine holds.
- Snapped a streak of 13 consecutive scoreless appearances on 9/7 vs. Washington...Held opponents to just four hits while striking out 14 through 13.0 innings during the streak...Logged his first save with Atlanta, 9/6 vs. WSH.
- Acquired from Detroit on 7/31 in exchange for LHP Joey Wentz and OF Travis Demeritte...At the time ranked fourth in the AL with his 22 saves, while his 1.18 ERA was the second lowest in baseball among qualifying relievers.
- Was 0-2 with 22 saves and a 1.18 ERA (5 ER/38.0 IP) with 43 strikeouts and 12 walks in 38 games out of the bullpen for the Tigers this season.

- Allowed two runs in 0.2 innings during his postseason debut...Went 9-2 with a 3.84 ERA (31 ER/72.2 IP) in 70 games this season...Converted 18 of his 25 save chances after logging just one career save prior to 2019.
- Had nine wins out of the bullpen, the most by a Braves reliever since Mike Remlinger had 10 in 1999...His nine wins tied for fifth most by a Braves reliever since 1913.
- Left-handers had just 17 hits in 108 at-bats (.157) against him...Righties batted .331 (59-for-178).
