NATIONALS NEWS

YESTERDAY IN WEST PALM BEACH

The Washington Nationals completed a comeback victory over the New York Mets yesterday afternoon, 3-1, courtesy of a **Joey Wiemer** walk-off, two-run homer in the ninth...Today, the Nationals are in Baltimore to play their first of two exhibition games against the Orioles with the latter contest taking place tomorrow afternoon at Nationals Park.

- The Nationals lead MLB with a 3.00 ERA this spring, by far the lowest total, ahead of second-place Houston (3.53) and third-place Atlanta (3.55)...They are in search of becoming the first team to post a sub-3.00 Spring Training ERA since the 2011 Atlanta Braves (2.75)...Washington last led MLB in Spring Training ERA in 2016 with a 3.37 mark, which served as a precursor to the regular season as the Nationals recorded a 3.51 ERA, second best in MLB, on their way to winning the National League East.
- Brady House** leads the Grapefruit League with six doubles this spring, while his nine extra-base hits are two shy of Toronto's **Daulton Varsho** (11) for the lead.

2026 SPRING TRAINING

The Nationals will play 30 games through March 23, including two exhibition matchups against the Baltimore Orioles (today at Camden Yards, tomorrow at Nationals Park), before heading to Wrigley Field to face the Chicago Cubs on Opening Day on March 26.

- On March 4, the Nationals defeated Team Venezuela, 5-1, in an exhibition game at CACTI Park of the Palm Beaches ahead of the 2026 World Baseball Classic.
- The Nationals will face eight opponents this spring, with games against the Houston Astros (6), Miami Marlins (6), St. Louis Cardinals (6), New York Mets (5), Baltimore Orioles (2), Philadelphia Phillies (2), New York Yankees (2) and Team Venezuela (1).

CATCHING UP ON A BUSY OFFSEASON

On October 1, 2025, the Washington Nationals named **Paul Toboni** as the club's President of Baseball Operations. Toboni, widely regarded as one of the best young minds in the sport, joins the organization after spending the previous 11 seasons (2015-25) with the Boston Red Sox, where he most recently held the title of Senior Vice President, Assistant General Manager. From 2022-23, he served as Boston's Vice President of Amateur Scouting and Player Development, during which he oversaw the selection and development of **Roman Anthony** and **Kyle Teel**, among others.

- Four weeks later, Toboni announced the hire of **Blake Butera** as the eighth manager in Nationals history...Butera, 33, was most recently the Senior Director of Player Development Operations for the Tampa Bay Rays, a position he had held since 2024. Prior to that, he served as the Rays' Minor League field coordinator in 2023 and as a manager in their Minor League system from 2018-22...He was named Carolina League Manager of the Year in 2021 and 2022 with the Charleston RiverDogs, winning the Carolina League Championship in both seasons, and in fact, the 2022 RiverDogs were named the Minor League Team of the Year by *Baseball America*.
- On December 18, Toboni named **Anirudh Kilambi** as the next General Manager of the club...Kilambi, a highly regarded front office executive with more than 10 years of experience, comes over from the Philadelphia Phillies organization, where he spent the previous five seasons (2021-25) as their Assistant General Manager under the leadership of their President of Baseball Operations, **Dave Dombrowski**... Before joining the Phillies, he spent seven years (2015-21) with the Tampa Bay Rays, serving in various different roles, elevating to the Director of Decision Science before departing for Philadelphia.
- Butera, Kilambi and Toboni spent the coming weeks finalizing the Major League coaching staff, which features Bench Coach **Michael Johns**, who spent the last 18 seasons (2008-25) in the Tampa Bay Rays' organization, including the last two as the first base coach on **Kevin Cash's** staff...Other coaches include Field Coordinator **Tyler Smarslok**, Hitting Coach **Matt Borgschulte**, Assistant Hitting Coach/Assistant Director of Hitting **Andrew Aydt**, Assistant Hitting Coach **Shawn O'Malley**, Pitching Coach **Simon Mathews**, Assistant Pitching Coach **Sean Doolittle**, Assistant Pitching/Bullpen Coach **Dustin Glant**, First Base/Outfield/Baserunning Coach **Corey Ray**, Third Base/Infield Coach **Victor Estevez**, Catching Coach/Run Game Coordinator **Bobby Wilson** and Bullpen Catcher/Development Coach **Grant Anders**.

NEW NATS IN TOWN

The Washington Nationals acquired 12 players since the end of the 2025 season...**Miles Mikolas** and **Zack Littell** arrive at camp, helping to anchor the Nationals' rotation after agreeing to terms with the team on Feb. 11 and March 10, respectively...Top 100 prospect **Harry Ford** comes to Washington after being acquired as part of a trade that sent **Jose A. Ferrer** to the Seattle Mariners...Other acquisitions include **Luis Perales**, **Foster Griffin**, **Joey Wiemer**, **Paxton Schultz**, **Gus Varland**, **Abimelec Ortiz**, **Ken Waldichuk** and **Andre Granillo**... **Griff McGarry** rounds out the list of new acquisitions as a Rule 5 draft selection from Philadelphia.

- Two-time All-Star **Miles Mikolas** joined the Nationals this offseason, providing a veteran presence to Washington's rotation...His 4.4 BB% since signing with the Cardinals in 2018 is the best in MLB (min. 750.0 IP), while his 1161.0 innings consumed are the ninth most...In seven lifetime appearances (6 starts) at Nationals Park, Mikolas has gone 5-2 with a 2.79 ERA (12 ER/38.2 IP), the best mark in any stadium in his career (min. 5 GS).
- Right hander **Zack Littell** signed with Washington in Spring Training on a one-year Major League contract with a mutual option for the 2027 season...Littell, 30, is one of just 12 pitchers in MLB to make 60 starts and maintain an ERA under 3.75 since the beginning of 2024...He led MLB last season with .042 walks per batter faced and was second with 1.54 walks per 9.0 innings.
- Former first-round pick **Foster Griffin** returns to Major League Baseball after spending the previous three seasons with the Yomiuri Giants of Nippon Professional Baseball. In 17 starts last season, he went 6-1 with a 1.52 ERA (15 ER/89.0 IP), yielding just one home run en route to being named an NPB Central League All-Star. In that time, he went 18-10 with a 2.57 ERA (90 ER/315.2 IP) across 54 starts.
- Griff McGarry** was selected by the Nationals in the Rule 5 draft in December, coming over from Philadelphia. A former top prospect in the Phillies organization, McGarry made 21 starts in 2025, going 2-5 with a 3.44 ERA (32 ER/83.2 IP) across three different levels, after pitching exclusively out of the bullpen a year prior. He finished last season making his Triple-A debut, throwing 5.0 innings of 1-run, 1-hit ball on September 18 vs. Syracuse.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER - MITCHELL PARKER - L/L - 6'4"/252

Tall left hander was the 27th pitcher drafted or signed and developed to start a game for Washington since 2005 when he made his debut in 2024.

- Opened his second Major League season in 2025 in strong fashion by going 3-1 with a 1.39 ERA (5 ER/32.1 IP) and a .167 opponents' average (19-for-114) and just three extra-base hits (2B, 3B, HR).
- His best start of the season came on April 22 at Baltimore in which he tossed a career-high 8.0 innings of one-hit, shutout ball in Washington's 7-0 win.
- Tied with **Jake Irvin** in 2025 for the most wins among Nationals pitchers (9).
- Recorded the longest save in Nationals history (3.2 IP), preserving a one-run lead to defeat the Mets in his first career relief appearance on Sept. 21.

PAUL TOBONI

Washington Nationals President of Baseball Operations **Paul Toboni** enters his first season as the head of the club's baseball operations and 14th season in professional baseball...On Oct. 1, Toboni was hired by the organization after spending the previous 11 years with the Boston Red Sox, where he most recently held the title Senior Vice President, Assistant General Manager...From 2022-23, he served as the club's Vice President of Amateur Scouting and Player Development...He rose through the ranks in Boston, having joined the organization as a baseball operations intern in 2015.

BLAKE BUTERA

First-year manager **Blake Butera** was named the eighth skipper in Nationals history on Oct. 31, 2025...Butera joins the Nationals from the Rays' organization, where he spent the previous two seasons as the Senior Director of Player Development...He served as the Rays' Minor League Field Coordinator in 2023 following four seasons (2018-22) as a manager in their Minor League system...At Single-A Charleston, Butera was named Carolina League Manager of the Year in 2021 and 2022...At 33 years old, he enters the 2026 season as the youngest manager in MLB.
