RAY REPORT—The Rays conclude a brief three-game homestand against the Red Sox (2-0, one to play) today at Tropicana Field...following today's game, will embark on a six-game trip through Southern California against the Angels (June 12-14) and Dodgers (June 15-17)...have won back-to-back games for the first time since May 17-22 (5-0)...are 3-2 in their last five games, but have lost 10 of their last 15 (May 24-pres), on the heels of a 22-4 stretch (April 22-May 23)...with last night's win, improved to 10-3-1 in their last 14 series (April 24-pres), after starting 3-5-0...are 26-15 (.634) vs. clubs currently below .500, second in the AL to the Yankees (34-16/.680)...have owned at least a share of the AL's best record for each of the last 32 days (May 9-pres.), including eight consecutive days leading the majors from May 18-25...have the best winning pct. in the AL East (.609), slightly ahead of the Yankees (.606), and have spent 38 days leading the division, 25 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth...with a loss today and a Yankees win in Cleveland, the Rays could fall to second for the first time since May 8 (25-13).

- ★ The Rays went 9-for-16 (.563) and scored all four of their runs with two outs in last night's 4-3 win over the Red Sox...it marked their most two-out hits since June 18, 2025 vs. BAL (11-for-18) and tied their most in any game vs. Boston in club history, matching Sept. 6, 2021 at Tropicana Field (9-for-20)...their .247 (171-for-692) two-out average this season ranks third in the AL (ATH - .260; NYY - .257).
- ★ Boston plated the opening tally in the 3rd before the Rays pushed across four unanswered runs, earning their 16th comeback win, tied for fifth most in the AL but only two wins shy of the AL-leading Blue Jays (18)...they have come from behind in five of their last eight wins (May 19-pres.).
- ★ The Rays improved to an AL-best 32-7 (.821) when scoring four runs or more (19-3 at home), the sixth-best mark in the majors...they are 31-4 in their last 35 such games since starting 1-3.
- ★ The Rays staff has allowed 12 runs over the last five games (2.4 R/G) after permitting 72 runs across their previous nine contests (8.0 R/G, May 25-June 3)...they threw a season-low 92 pitches last night, their fewest since May 4, 2022 at OAK (90).
- ★ The Rays are an MLB-best 14-4 in games vs. left-handed starting pitchers (8-1 at home)...their .271 (100-for-369) average vs. southpaw starters is the best in the AL—this includes a .295 (26-for-88) clip with RISP...this will mark their second time facing lefty starters in three consecutive games or more this season, joining a four-game streak from May 6-10 (1G vs. TOR, 3G at BOS).
- ★ Rays batters have been hit by pitches in four consecutive games, their longest streak since June 19-22, 2025 (4G), with their last longer streak coming from Sept. 7-11, 2023 (5G)...they were plunked once in their previous 13 games entering this stretch (May 20-June 5).

WHAT'S AT STAKE

- ★ Become the fifth team in the divisional era (since 1969) to start 12-0 at home against division rivals (see table on the right).
- ★ Record their seventh series sweep, extending their MLB lead...tie a club record for most sweeps before the end of June (also: 2023, 2021, 2008).
- ★ Sweep an opponent at home for the MLB-high sixth time...it would match 2023 for their most sweeps at Tropicana Field before the calendar flips to July.
- ★ Sweep the Red Sox for the 21st time (12th at home), first since Sept. 26-27, 2023 at Fenway Park (2-0) and first in a set of three games or more since April 10-13, 2023 at Tropicana Field (4-0).
- ★ Tally their 40th win in their 65th game, the sixth-fewest games to the mark in franchise history behind 2023 (58th), 2020 (60th), 2010 (63rd), 2021 (64th), and 2019 (64th).

HOME SWEET HOME—The Rays MLB-leading 23-9 home record marks the second-best home start in franchise history behind only 2023 (26-6)...they have won 19 of their last 24 games at Tropicana Field, outscoring opponents, 121-87 (+34), in those contests...that stretch includes a 16-1 run from April 22-May 29, tied for the best 17-game, single-season span at home in franchise history (5x, last: April 22-May 26, 2008)...since May 13, the Rays are 9-5 at home (3rd in AL/T5th in MLB) compared to 2-7 in road affairs (15th in AL/30th in MLB)...on the year, they rank third in the majors in home RISP average (.283), fourth in batting average (.260) and on-base pct. (.343), and sixth in OPS (.754)...the Rays are in a stretch of 19 home games within a 28-game span from May 29-June 28, going 5-6 thus far.

- ★ The Rays are 11-0 against the AL East at Tropicana Field, MLB's longest season-opening home winning streak over division rivals since the 2009 Dodgers won their first 12 home games vs. the NL West...among AL clubs, only the 2003 Royals (13-0) have had a longer streak...it marks the longest streak at any point in a season in franchise history.
- ★ **Junior Caminero** has hit safely in a career-high 13 straight home games (May 16-pres.), MLB's longest active home hitting streak and the third-longest streak by an AL batter this season behind NYY **Cody Bellinger** (16G, April 13-May 20) and HOU **Yordan Alvarez** (16G, March 27-May 4)...the last Ray with a longer single-season streak was **Avisail Garcia** (16G) from May 10-June 29, 2019.
- ★ Caminero is batting .413 (19-for-46) with 9 XBH, 11 RBI, 13 BB vs. 7 SO, and 11 R during the streak, reaching base safely in 32 of 59 PA (.542 OBP)...min. 50 PA, he leads MLB in home batting average and on-base pct. during that span while ranking second in OPS (1.282) to teammate **Yandy Diaz** (1.333).
- ★ Diaz has reached base safely in 15 straight home games (May 5-pres.), the AL's longest active streak.
- ★ **Kevin Kelly** has recorded 15 scoreless outings (16.2IP) at Tropicana Field, tied with **Joe Borowski** (15) in 2005 for the third-longest season-opening streak at home by a Rays reliever behind **Jake McGee** (19G) in 2012 and **Trevor Miller** (17G) in 2008...per Stats Perform, the 16.2-IP streak is the third-longest to begin the season in MLB this year, trailing MIA **Tyler Phillips** (18.1) and NYY **Brent Headrick** (17.0, active) and the second longest to open a campaign in Rays history (see table on the right).

YANDY MAN CAN—AL batting average leader **Yandy Diaz** (.325) is slashing .360/.431/.674 (32-for-89) with 7 2B, 7 HR (three leadoff HR), 21 RBI, 11 BB, 13 R, and a 1.106 OPS during a 23-game on-base streak, the longest active run in the majors, longest by a Ray since **Brandon Lowe** (23G) from June 9-July 5, 2025, and the third longest of his career...the last Ray with a longer streak was Diaz (27G) from May 26-June 28, 2025, a stretch that overlapped with his club-record-tying 20-game hitting streak (June 7-28, 2025)...the longest streak of his career was a 29-game run from May 26-June 28, 2024...it marks Diaz's fifth on-base streak of 20 games or more in his career, second most in franchise history to **Evan Longoria** (6)...it is also tied for the majors' eighth-longest streak this season and marks the AL's third longest, trailing runs by ATH **Nick Kurtz** (48G, April 3-May 25) and DET **Riley Greene** (26G, April 18-May 16)...since the streak began on May 12, he ranks second in the majors in average to LAD **Shohei Ohtani** (.411), third in slugging pct., fourth in OPS, and fifth in on-base pct.

BIG RIG—**Ryan Vilade** extended his career-best hitting streak to six games with a career-high-tying three-hit effort last night (4x, last: May 18 vs. BAL)...his four three-hit games are tied with **Jonathan Aranda** and **Chandler Simpson** for second most among Rays behind **Yandy Diaz** (7G)...the streak ties Diaz for the longest active run among Rays hitters...Vilade is 9-for-21 (.429) with 2 2B, 1 HR, and 5 RBI since the streak began on June 1...he is slashing .370/.436/.609 (17-for-46) with 6 XBH, 13 RBI, and a 1.045 OPS over his last 16 games (May 10-pres)...min. 50 PA, the only AL hitters with a better OPS in that timeframe are ATH **Nick Kurtz** (1.134) and HOU **Yordan Alvarez** (1.048).

THE BAKE SHOW—**Bryan Baker** worked a perfect 9th inning on 13 pitches to earn his second save in as many games last night, marking his 11th save of 15 pitches or fewer, tied with AZ **Paul Sewald** for second most in the majors to STL **Riley O'Brien** (12)...it marked Baker's 18th save overall, matching SD **Mason Miller** for second most in the majors behind **CLE Cade Smith** (21)...Baker has converted seven straight and 14 of his last 15 save opportunities—the seven-save streak is tied for the fourth-longest active run in the AL...he has worked a season-high-tying nine consecutive scoreless outings (also: April 24-May 11) since yielding runs in back-to-back appearances from May 13-16, tied for the seventh-longest active streak by an AL reliever...Baker is on pace for 45 saves, which would tie **Rafael Soriano** (45) in 2010 for third most in club history behind **Fernando Rodney** (48) in 2012 and **Alex Colomé** (47) in 2017...he needs four saves over the Rays next 18 games to tie Rodney (22, 2012) for the most before the end of June in team history.

SOX TALK—The Rays have won four of their first five meetings with the Red Sox for the sixth time, joining 2023, 2020, 2014, 2010, and 2009 (all 4-1)...they started 5-1 against the Sox in three of the previous five such seasons: 2023, 2020, 2014...dating back to last season, the Rays have won five of the last six meetings on the heels of an eight-game losing streak (June 10-Sept. 20, 2025), which was the third longest vs. Boston in club history...they lost 10 of 13 games overall against the Red Sox in 2025, their first season series loss since 2018 (8-11)...dating back to September 2019, the Rays are 10-1-3 in their last 14 sets with the Red Sox at Tropicana Field.

- ★ The Rays bullpen has thrown 14.2 consecutive scoreless frames against the Red Sox and owns a 0.48 ERA (8.2IP, 1ER) with 16 SO and 1 BB in five matchups with Boston...min. 15.0 IP, the only bullpens with lower ERAs against a single opponent this season are the Mets' pen vs. STL (0.00) and the Dodgers against the Giants (0.43)...the club record for relief ERA vs. an AL East rival in a season is 1.82 (49.1IP, 10ER) vs. BAL in 2000, and the Rays lowest ERA against Boston in a season is 2.58 (45.1IP, 13ER), accomplished in 2024.
- ★ Min. 400 PA, **Yandy Diaz's** career .916 OPS against Boston is third highest in the Wild Card era (since 1995) behind **Frank Thomas** (1.050) and **Jim Thome** (.942)...he has reached safely in 19 straight games vs. the Sox (Sept. 28, 2024-pres.), the third-longest streak in franchise history behind **Akinori Iwamura** (26G, 2007-09) and **Carlos Peña** (21G, 2007-08).

TODAY'S START—Drew Rasmussen will toe the rubber tonight for his 13th start of the campaign and 143rd career appearance (94th start)...Rasmussen will tie **Matt Garza** (94GS) and **Matt Moore** (94GS) today for the ninth-most starts in franchise history... needs eight strikeouts to reach 500 for his career... min. 50.0 IP, ranks highly among AL arms in opp. on-base pct. (2nd, .240), WHIP (2nd, 0.92) strikeout-to-walk ratio (5th, 5.33), and opp. average (5th, .201).

★ With a quality start today, Rasmussen would tie **Nick Martinez** (7QS) for most on the club this season and tie for second most among Rays arms (27QS) since the start of 2021 alongside **Zack Littell** and behind **Shane McClanahan** (37).

★ Through his first 12 starts of the season, Rasmussen has posted a 3.00 ERA (66.0IP, 22ER), becoming one of three Rays starters to log a sub-3.00 ERA this season through their first 12 outings alongside **Martinez** (2.29ERA/70.2IP, 18ER) and **McClanahan** (2.85/60.0IP, 19ER)...it marks the third time in franchise history three traditional starters or more have turned the trick along with **Yonny Chirinos** (2.89), **Tyler Glasnow** (1.78), and **Charlie Morton** (2.53) in 2019 and **Chris Archer** (2.65), **Alex Cobb** (2.95), and **Matt Moore** (2.95) in 2013.

LAST TIME OUT—Rasmussen picked up his fifth win of the season after firing a season-high-tying 7.0 scoreless innings and recording a season-high nine strikeouts on June 5 at MIA (W, 7.0IP, H, OR, 9SO)...his lone hit allowed came on a one-out single to **Javier Sanoja** in the 2nd inning before retiring his final 17 batters faced...delivered first-pitch strikes to 17 of 22 batters faced.

★ Along with April 12 vs. NYY (6.0IP, R), he has gone 5.0 innings or more with one or zero baserunners allowed twice this season...he became the 17th pitcher in the modern era (since 1900) to turn the trick twice in a single season, and no pitcher has done so three times in a single campaign...since the right-hander debuted for the Rays on June 19, 2021 at SEA, he has five such starts, most in MLB over that timeframe and two ahead of the next closest arms (**Max Scherzer**, **Logan Gilbert**, **Nick Pivetta**)...it marked the fifth start of 7.0 innings or more with one or zero baserunners allowed in team history, and Rasmussen became the only one to accomplish the feat multiple times.

★ His nine strikeouts matched the second-highest total of his career and were his most in a game since generating a career-high 10 strikeouts on Sept. 9, 2022 at NYY...recorded the punchouts on four of his six offerings: changeup (3SO), cutter (3SO), two-seam fastball (2SO), and four-seam fastball (1SO).

★ Marked his sixth quality start of the season and is 3 QS shy of tying his career high of nine set in 2022...was the seventh time in his career he has pitched 7.0 innings or more and the fifth time he has done so without allowing a run.

ROCK THE SOX—Across 10 career appearances (six starts) against the Red Sox, Rasmussen has posted a 1-1 record with a 3.30 ERA (30.0IP, 11ER) and 26 strikeouts...his last start against them came on Sept. 19, 2025 at Tropicana Field, when he allowed two runs on four hits and a walk while striking out two over 3.0 innings in a no-decision and 11-7 loss...is seeking his first win against Boston at home, where he is 0-1 with a 4.24 ERA (17.0IP, 8ER) and 17 strikeouts in six appearances (three starts).

★ He is 10-7 with a 2.41 ERA (179.1IP, 48ER) over 42 career outings (32 starts) vs. AL East competition, logging a 2.52 ERA (161.0IP, 45ER) in the 32 starts... is 24-14 with a 2.73 ERA (340.0IP, 103ER) in 69 career starts against AL opponents.

TROP NOTCH—Rasmussen is making his sixth start at home this season...is 3-1 with a 3.62 ERA (27.1IP, 11ER), with four times as many SO (24) than walks (6)...joins teammates **Nick Martinez** (4-1) and **Shane McClanahan** (5-0) as Rays arms with three wins or more at the Trop this season.

★ Rasmussen boasts a career 2.80 ERA (157.1IP, 49ER) at Tropicana Field, the second-lowest ERA in the venue's history (min. 150.0IP) behind **Blake Snell** (2.70ERA/276.1IP, 83ER).

★ Since 2021, Rasmussen's 15 career home wins with the Rays are second most behind **McClanahan's** 26 wins at home...min. 100.0 IP, his .577 (15-11) winning pct. at home as a Ray is the eighth-best in franchise history.

OL' RELIABLE—Rasmussen's outing on May 30 vs. LAA (L, 4.0IP, 4H, 5R, 2BB, 4SO, HR) snapped a streak of allowing four earned runs or fewer in 48 straight regular-season starts (April 30–May 24, 2026), the longest run in franchise history by a traditional starter, ahead of **Shane McClanahan's** 44-start run from April 29, 2021–July 26, 2022...he is one of seven pitchers in the modern era (since 1900) to turn the trick and the first since **Jacob deGrom's** 59-start streak between May 22, 2019–Sept. 18, 2022...finished eight starts behind opener **Ryne Stanek** (56GS from May 26, 2018–July 16, 2019) for the longest streak by any starter in franchise history.

★ Rasmussen has fashioned a 2.82 ERA (511.1IP, 160ER) since the start of 2021, ranking second in the majors (min. 500.0IP) behind LAD **Shohei Ohtani** (2.60ER/536.1IP, 155ER)...his 1.03 WHIP under the same parameters ranks fourth behind PHI **Zack Wheeler** (1.00), DET **Tarik Skubal** (1.01), and Ohtani (1.02), while his .215 (404-for-1882) opp. average is eighth.

RIGHT ON—Right-handed hitters are batting .129 (12-for-93) with 23 SO and 3 BB against Rasmussen, the lowest mark in the majors (min. 50.0IP)...right-handed batters are hitting .110 (3-for-28) against his cutter, 1-for-15 (.067) off his four-seamer, and 6-for-41 (.146) against his sinker.

★ Min. 100.0 IP, his .179 (61-for-340) opp. average vs. right-handed batters since the start of 2025 is second lowest in the majors, behind LAD **Tyler Glasnow** (.169).
