The Mariners and Rangers are set to square off 13 times during the 2026 regular season, 7 times in Arlington, Texas and 6 times at T-Mobile Park... Seattle has dominated the season series in each of the last 2 years:

TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue their first road trip of 2026 with the first of 3 games against the Texas Rangers, with Seattle coming off a 3-game series against the Los Angeles Angels (1-2)...tonight's game will be televised and streamed on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith**, **Angie Mentink** and Mariners Hall of Famer **Jay Buhner** on the call, with **Brad Adam** serving as field reporter...the game will be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.** on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners fell 8-7 in 11 innings in yesterday's series finale in Anaheim...through 10 games this season, the Mariners have gone to extra innings 3 times, going 1-2 in those contests.

- **Long Division** - The Mariners today are playing their fourth of 10 consecutive divisional games...from April 3-22, Seattle is playing an AL West Division opponent in 16 of 19 games.

- **Double Action In Double-A** - Mariners top pitching prospects **Kade Anderson** (Friday) and **Ryan Sloan** (Saturday) impressed in their season debuts with Double-A Arkansas...Anderson tossed 4.0 scoreless innings with 6 strikeouts...Sloan struck out 4 over 4.0 IP allowing 3 ER.

MAD HATTERS...tonight's matchup features a pair of former Stetson University (FL) Hatters on the mound in **Logan Gilbert** and Rangers starter Jacob deGrom...it will mark the first time Gilbert faces a fellow Hatter on the mound in the Major Leagues...there have been 12 Major Leaguers all-time from Stetson, most notably pitchers Gilbert, deGrom, and Corey Kluber...the school has produced 4 Cy Young Awards: deGrom twice (2018-19 with the New York Mets) and Kluber twice (2014, '17 with Cleveland).

BAD TO THE BONE...Mariners Hall of Famer **Jay Buhner** will join **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Angie Mentink** in the broadcast booth for the current series against the Rangers.

WATCH THEM WHIP...**Bryan Woo** ranks 3rd in the Majors in WHIP (0.54), while rotation-mate **Emerson Hancock** ranks 4th (0.55)...additionally, Woo ranks 7th in MLB in lowest opponent batting average (.116) through his first 2 starts of 2026.

PITCH DOCTORS...the Mariners pitching staff has a 2.72 ERA (28 ER, 92.2 IP), ranking 4th in the big leagues behind the Braves (1.82), Yankees (2.35), and Mets (2.53)...the Mariners pitching staff has held opponents to a .204 batting average...Seattle's 0.94 WHIP **leads the American League**, ranking 2nd in MLB to Atlanta (0.88)...the Mariners also **lead the Majors** in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.95) and fewest walks-per-9 innings (2.04) in the early-going...Seattle ranks 3rd in MLB in fewest hits-per-9 innings (6.41).

BRENDAN MAKING A STRONG FIRST IMPRESSION...**Brendan Donovan** appeared in his 500th career game on Friday...he is batting .370 (10x27) with 4 runs, 2 doubles, 2 home runs, 4 RBI, 1 stolen base, a .485 OBP and slugging .667 (1.152 OPS) with a 239 OPS+ in 8 games this season...among MLB hitters so far in 2026 he ranks 7th in OBP.

"THE CAL RALEIGH SHOW" RETURNS..."The Cal Raleigh Show" presented by the Puyallup Tribe returns for a second season on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)**...the show, hosted by Mariners insider **Shannon Drayer**, features in-depth conversations with Mariners star catcher, **Cal Raleigh**...the program will air every Thursday, usually at 5:00 p.m. PT, moving into an earlier slot when the Mariners play in different timezones...'catch' all of the episodes on SeattleSports.com or on the Seattle Sports app.

HOME IS WHERE THE HEART IS...during the Mariners opening homestand, they drew 239,504 total fans as of the morning of April 6, **highest total in the American League** and 4th-highest total in the big leagues so far behind only the Dodgers, Giants, and Padres...an average of 34,214 fans watched the Mariners at T-Mobile Park through 7 games.

MARINERS IN THE MEDIA...approximately 450 interviews and media sessions with Mariners players, coaches, and front office personnel were facilitated at 2026 Spring Training, in over 50 unique local, national, and international media outlets that visited Mariners camp in Peoria, Arizona.

MARINERS TV...Mariners TV brings Mariners Baseball to fans across television and streaming services throughout the region...in-market streaming will be available on Mariners.TV for \$99.99/season or \$19.99/month...Mariners TV is available across major providers including Xfinity, DIRECTV, Fubo, Spectrum and more...fans can use the channel finder tool on Mariners.com/Watch to find providers in their area.

THE COACHING STAFF...manager **Dan Wilson** enters his second full season as Mariners skipper...returning to the Mariners coaching staff in the same roles are Bench Coach **Manny Acta**, Major League Coach and Director of Pitching Strategy **Trent Blank**, Assistant Pitching Coach and Major League Pitching Strategist **Danny Farquhar**, Infield Coach **Perry Hill**, Asst. Hitting Coach **Bobby Magallanes**, Senior Director of Hitting Strategy **Edgar Martinez**, Hitting Coach **Kevin Seitzer**, Pitching Coach **Pete Woodworth** and First Base Coach **Eric Young Jr.**...joining the staff this season are Third Base Coach **Carlos Cardoza**, Major League Field Coordinator **Jake McKinley** and Bullpen Coach **Austin Nola**... **Fleming Báez** and **Justin Novak** both return as Bullpen Catchers.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...**Cole Young** has gotten off to an excellent start this season...in 10 games, he's batting .278 (10x36) with 7 runs, 2 doubles, 1 triple, 2 home runs and 8 RBI, slugging .556 with an .889 OPS, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...Young has the highest OPS (.889) by a Mariners player age 22-or-younger through the team's first 10 games of the season since Alex Rodriguez (.988) in 1997?...the only other Mariners player age 22-or-younger to post an OPS that high through the team's first 10 games of the season is Ken Griffey Jr. (.918) in 1990.

ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - APRIL 6

- **1977** - The **first game in Mariners history**: an Opening Night record crowd of 57,762 attends the Mariners first game in franchise history, a 7-0 loss to the California Angels at the Kingdome.
- **2001** - **Ichiro Suzuki** blasts his first Major League home run to beat the Rangers, 9-7 in 10-innings. Suzuki becomes the first Mariner to hit his first homer in extra innings.
- **2015** - **Félix Hernández** struck out 10 and allowed just 1 run and 2 hits in 7.0 innings to lead the Mariners to a 4-1 win over the Angels on Opening Day.

ABOUT LOGAN GILBERT...

- Gilbert, 28, is making his 3rd start of the 2026 season and 1st against the Texas Rangers... Selected by Seattle in the 1st round (14th overall) of the 2018 MLB First-Year Player Draft...

LAST TIME OUT...On March 31 vs. Yankees, completed 5.1 innings of work and allowed 5 runs (5 ER) on 7 hits while striking out 6 batters and walking 3 in the process... he threw 95 pitches (54 strikes).

BRING ON APRIL...Will make his first start in the month of April today against Texas...April is Gilbert's highest performing month of the season with a career 2.45 ERA, .195 opponent batting average, and a 0.93 WHIP...

A FAMILIAR FOE...Has faced the Rangers more than any opponent in his career (96.1 IP)...of active pitchers, Gilbert will be tied for 3rd in starts after tonight, and is 6th in strikeouts (97), and 5th in innings pitched (96.1) against the Rangers...

A LITTLE R&R...With the off day on April 2, Gilbert will be entering tonight's game on 5 days of rest...he owns a 3.35 ERA (148 ER, 410.1 IP), 5.35 K/BB, 1.021 WHIP, and .262 opponent batting average (339x1539) when pitching after 5 days compared to 4 days of rest where he has a 4.50 ERA, 4.06 K/B, 1.191 WHIP and a .245 opponent batting average.

FORECAST SAYS HIGH CHANCE OF K'S...Posted a career-high strikeout rate (32.3) and K/9 (11.9) in 2025 and continues to follow the trend early in the 2026 season, logging a strikeout rate of 29.5 and a K/9 of 11.0 through 2 starts, both 2nd best in his career...

FAR FROM HOME...Will make is first away start of the season tonight at Globe Life Field...is 29-16 (.644) with a 3.85 ERA on the road in his career...ranks 6th in strikeouts in away games with 432 among Mariners starting pitchers...

WHERE IT RANKS...His 11.9 SO/9 last season is the 4th-best mark among starters in a single season in Mariners history (trailing Randy Johnson's 1995, '97, '98 seasons) while his 9.543 career SO/9 ratio is tied for the 3rd-best in franchise history (min. 500 IP)...

TRIO OF SORTS...Was 1 of 3 Mariners to toss 13+ strikeouts with 1-or-fewer walks in a game last season, joining Bryan Woo (13 SO and 1 BB, 9/13 vs. LAA) and George Kirby (2x, last: 14 SO, 0 BB, 7/14 vs. LAA)...

PLENTY OF PUNCHES...Tossed 7+ strikeouts in 15 of his 25 starts last season, doing so in 5 consecutive starts to begin the season (3/27-4/19)...also tossed 10+ strikeouts in 4 games last season (last: 8/24 vs. ATH)...

AMONG THE GREATS...His 3.62 career ERA (340 ER, 846.0 IP) is 7th-best among starters in Mariners history (min. 500 IP), trailing Randy Johnson, Félix Hernández, Hisashi Iwakuma, and James Paxton who each hold a 3.42 career ERA...

AMONG THE LEAGUE...His 897 strikeouts since 2021 lead the American League while his 846.0 innings pitched are 3rd most and his 148 starts are 2nd in the AL across that span.

2025 TOTALS...In 25 regular season starts, went 6-6 with a 3.44 ERA (50 ER, 131.0 IP) with 173 strikeouts and 31 walks, posting a 1.031 WHIP...led the Majors in strikeouts-per-nine innings (11.89), and ranked 2nd in strikeout rate (32.3%) during the regular season (min. 100.0 IP).
