METSELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Braves, 1-0, on Opening Day yesterday...The Mets are looking to secure their first series victory of the season today...The Mets have now won four straight against Atlanta dating back to the final three games of the 2019 season.

YO-PENING DAY: The Mets improved to 39-20 all-time on Opening Day, the best record in major league history with a 1-0 win yesterday... New York has won 39 of their last 51 openers...New York improved to 6-1 on Opening Day at Citi Field and 23-3 in their last 26 Opening Days at home overall.

A SHOW ABOUT NOTHING: The Mets recorded their 10th shutout on Opening Day yesterday and their second in a row (blanked the Nationals on Opening Day in 2019)...The Mets have tossed a shutout on consecutive Opening Days once before in franchise history, in 1972 (4-0 vs. Pittsburgh) and 1973 (3-0 vs. Philadelphia)...It marked the club's third-ever 1-0 win on Opening Day (also, 2012 vs. Atlanta and 1998 vs. Philadelphia)...New York allowed only three hits on Opening Day, which is tied for fewest in Mets history (also 2015 and 2009).

NOTES ON 1-0 GAMES: Yesterday marked the Mets' first-ever 1-0 win on Opening Day in which the lone run came on a homer...It's just the eighth such Opening Day game since at least 1901...The last team to win its opener 1-0 with just a solo blast was San Francisco, who beat the Dodgers 1-0 on a Joe Panik homer on Opening Day in 2018...The Mets have won 31 games overall by a score of 1-0 with the only run coming on a solo homer...The last before today was May 2, 2019 (Noah Syndergaard homered and pitched a shutout).

YO-LO: Yoenis Céspedes belted a solo shot to give the Mets a 1-0 lead in the seventh inning yesterday...It was his first hit, homer and RBI since his last major league game on July 20, 2018 at Yankee Stadium...He has homered in each of his last three major league games: yesterday, July 20, 2018 and May 13, 2018 at Philadelphia...This is the fifth time in his career he's homered in three straight games...He became the Mets' first DH in a home game in franchise history...He is the first DH in major league history to homer in a game between two NL teams.

MIND THE GAP: According to STATS, Inc., Céspedes is the fourth player in the modern era to homer in consecutive games for the same team with a gap of more than two years between home runs, joining Hank Greenberg (1941-1945), Joe DiMaggio (1942-1946) and Harry Chiti (1952-1955), all of whom missed at least two seasons to serve in a war.

QUINCEAÑERA: The Mets recorded 15 strikeouts as a team yesterday... The 2019 Mets set a franchise record with 13 games with 15 or more strikeouts...Yesterday marked the third time the team fanned 15 batters $\,$ on Opening Day (also, 2018 vs. St. Louis and 2005 at Cincinnati).

MEET THE NEW BOSS: Luis Rojas became the 11th manager in team history to win his first game as the Mets skipper...Rojas enters his first campaign as a major league manager after spending 2019 as the Mets' quality control coach...He spent the previous eight seasons managing at various levels of the Mets' minor league system...He was named the 23rd manager in club history on January 24, 2020.

BASEBALL'S IN HIS BLOOD: Rojas is the sixth Dominican-born manager in major league history...His father, Felipe Alou, became the first when he helmed the Montreal Expos from 1992-2001...Luis and Felipe are the fifth father-son duo to both serve as major league managers, joining Buddy and David Bell, Aaron and Bob Boone, George and Dick Sisler and Bob and Joel Skinner.

WE FOUND NIMMO: Brandon Nimmo recorded his first multi-hit game of the season yesterday...In his final 26 games of the 2019 season, Nimmo hit .261/.430/.565 with 14 runs, a triple, five home runs, 20 walks and two steals.

BRAVES-METS NOTES: The Mets ended the 2020 season with a 7-6, extrainning, walk-off win against the Braves...It was the team's first sweep of the Braves since the swept a three-game series was April 22-24, 2016 in Atlanta and their first against the Braves at home was from April 21-23, 2015.

WELCOME TO THE SHOW: Andrés Giménez made his major league debut yesterday...He entered the season as the third-best Mets prospect and the No. 84 overall prospect in the majors, per ${\it MLB}$ Pipeline...After spending the 2019 season with Binghamton (AA), the Venezuelan shortstop led the Arizona Fall League with a .371 (26-70) average and .999 OPS.

SIXTY-GAME SPRINT: Over the final 60 games of the 2019 season, the Mets' 39-21 mark tied for the second-best in the majors and coled the NL...Only one team, the Astros (42-18), had a better record in the season's last 60 games...The Rays, Twins, Dodgers and A's all also ended last year on a 39-21 run...See the chart below for the Mets' best 60-game starts to a season:

STEVEN MATZ: Went 8-2 with a 2.31 ERA (23 earnde runs/89.2 innings) in 17 games (15 starts) at Citi Field last year...His 2.31 home ERA was the third-best in the majors...Matz is 6-2 with a 2.94 ERA (23 earned runs/70.1 innings) in his 13 career starts against the Braves...His six wins vs. Atlanta are his most vs. any opponent...Mats set a careerhigh with 11 wins last season

LUGOOS: Seth Lugo recorded his first win of the season yesterday... Lugo struck out a career-high 104 in 80.0 innings last season, which placed third in the NL and sixth in the majors in strikeouts as a reliever... He also ranked fourth in the NL among relievers in innings pitched, had the fifth-lowest WHIP (0.90) in the NL among relievers and tied for $\,$ sixth in the NL in wins...He posted a 1.56 ERA (seven earned runs/40.1 innings) with six walks and 57 strikeouts in 31 appearances at home this season...Overall, Lugo owns a 10-5 record with a 1.94 ERA (36 earned runs/166.2 innings) in 71 career appearances at Citi Field.

JEFF McHITS: McNeil doubled in the first game of the season...Last year, McNeil ranked among NL leaders in average (fourth, .318), OBP (eighth, .384), OPS (.916, 14th), doubles (tied for fifth, 38) and HBP (tied for fifth, 21)...His 38 doubles tied for the 16th-most in Mets history.

ROSIE OUTLOOK: Amed Rosario went 1-3 in the opener...In the last quarter of the 2019 season (final 42 games), Rosario batted .318, while making just three errors in the field...His 55 hits from August 14 through the end of the season were two off the NL lead while his .318 average was the league's eighth-best mark.

LAST TIME OUT: Matz today will make his first start of the 2020 season...In his last regular season start, September 28, 2019, Matz threw 6.0 scoreless innings against the Braves at Citi Fleld...Earned the win in the Mets' 3-0 victory over Atlanta...Gave up just two hits...Struck out seven batters and walked five.

HOME COOKING: In 15 home starts in 2019, Matz went 8-2, held a 2.31 ERA and maintained a 9.23 K/9...His 2.31 home ERA was the third-best mark in the majors...The Mets went 11-4 in his 15 Citi Field starts, the best of any Mets starter in 2019...His eight wins at home were a career high and were tied for eighth in the NL...Has thrown 11 quality starts in his last 14 home starts.

VS. ATLANTA: Today will be Matz' 14th career start against the Braves...At home, he owns a 1.63 ERA in five starts against the club...He has pitched 6.0 innings, allowed two hits and either one or no runs in each of his last three starts vs. Atlanta...All told, he is 6-2 with a 2.94 ERA (23 earned runs/70.1 innings) in 13 career starts against Atlanta...Went 2-2 with a 3.19 ERA (11 earned runs/31.0 innings) in six starts against the Braves last season...Earned the win in his first start and last start versus Atlanta this year.

REMATZTERED: Matz carried a 4.95 ERA into July in 2019...After the All-Star break, he posted a 3.52 ERA (31 earned runs/79.1 innings) in 14 second-half starts...His peripherals also changed dramatically for the better...See the below chart for his statistics as a starter in the first half and second half:

SETTLING IN: Twenty of Matz' 75 earned runs allowed came in the first inning... Did not allow a first-inning run in 13 of his last 14 starts after the All-Star break... Owned a 6.21 ERA (20 earned runs/29.0 innings) in the first inning...Owned a 3.77 ERA (55 earned runs/131.1 innings) in all following innings.

HITS ARE SCARCE: Matz allowed six hits or fewer in 23 of his 30 starts this season, but gave up a career-high 10 hits twice (May 23 vs. Washington and June 23 at Philadelphia)...Since the start of 2018, Matz has held his opponent to three hits or fewer in 20 starts, tied for the ninth-most in the majors.

SPRING TRAINING: Matz went 0-0 with a 1.50 ERA (one earned run/6.0 innings pitched) in three Spring Training starts this year...Gave up two hits and a home run across all three starts...Stuck out five batters and walked none in the shortened spring.

MATZDUX: Matz tossed the best start of his career just under one year ago, when he needed just 99 pitches to shut out the Pirates on July 27 at Citi Fleld last season...The last Met to throw a shutout with fewer than 100 pitches was Johan Santana on May 26, 2012 vs. San Diego...Noah Syndergaard was the last Met to throw a complete game without issuing a walk (September 30 last year vs. Miami).
