RECENT REDBIRDS: The St. Louis Cardinals and division-rival Milwaukee Brewers kick off a three-game weekend series tonight at Busch Stadium ... The Cardinals recently finished 1-6 on their road trip through the New York Mets (0-4) and Atlanta Braves (1-2), and were outscored by a total of just eight runs over those seven games (26-34).

FLIGHT PATTERN: The Cardinals enter today in 4th place in the National League Central Division, 5.5 games behind first place Chicago ... The Cardinals (+2), Reds (+31), and Rays (+8) are the only three MLB teams with losing records and positive run differentials ... The Cardinals are 0-4 in extra innings and the only MLB team that is winless in one-run games (0-5).

O'BRIEN RECALLED: Before tonight's homestand opener, the Cardinals recalled RHP **Riley O'Brien** from Memphis (AAA) and optioned RHP **Ryan Fernandez** to Memphis ... O'Brien has appeared in seven games with the Redbirds to open the season, recording a 3.86 ERA (7.0 IP), .192 average against (5-26) while striking out 14 of 30 batters faced.

HOMEWORK ASSIGNMENT: St. Louis has won eight of 12 at Busch Stadium this season, and with a win tonight, will have its best home start through the first 13 home games since 2019 (10-3, .769).

SIX IS A SERIOUS NUMBER: **Matthew Liberatore** is one of nine MLB pitchers this season to work 6.0 innings or more in each of his first four starts, longest season-opening streak by a Cardinal age 25 or younger since 25-year-old **Michael Wacha** in 2017 (first 7 starts) ... The last Cardinals left-hander to do so was 23-year-old **Jaime Garcia** in 2010 (first 7 starts).

TAKE CARE OF BUSINESS: Ten of the Cardinals next 13 games are against NL Central foes (3 vs. Brewers, 4 at Reds, 3 vs. Pirates) ... Tonight marks the Cardinals first home series against a divisional rival (Game No. 25), latest game to open a season in the divisional era (1994-present).

"THERE GOES THE PERFECT GAME...": **Lars Nootbaar** has drawn an MLB-leading eight walks as a leadoff hitter to open a game this season to "break up a perfect game", tying **Davey Lopes** (1975 Dodgers) for the MLB single-season record in the months of March/April.

MR. BASEBALL: At the conclusion of the 2nd inning tonight, the Cardinals will pay tribute to Brewers Hall of Fame broadcaster and former Cardinals World Series Champion **Bob Uecker**, who passed away at age 90 on January 16, 2025.

BEER WARS: The Cardinals own the most wins against the Brewers (244-197, .553) since St. Louis and Milwaukee began regular season play in 1997, and since the Seattle Pilots joined MLB as an expansion team in 1969, only the Minnesota Twins (255-242, .513) have more wins over Pilots/Brewers than St. Louis.

THAT'S A REDBIRDS WINNER!: The Cardinals organization would like to honor and celebrate broadcaster **John Rooney** on his 20th season broadcasting Cardinals games ... The "Voice of the Cardinals"joined the Cardinals in 2006, giving John the privilege of working with the World Champion team in back-to-back seasons, following the White Sox win in 2005 ... Rooney was inducted into the Missouri Broadcasters Association Hall of Fame in 2021, and recently received his MLB Lifetime Pass.

HAPPY ANNIVERSARY: Three year ago today, **Brendan Donovan** made his Major League debut on April 25, 2022 vs. the New York Mets as a pinch runner for **Yadier Molina** ... Two other notables celebrating MLB debut anniversaries today are RHP **Mitch Harris** (2015 at Milwaukee) and LHP **Joe Magrane** (1987 at New York Mets).

MILWAUKEE CONNECTIONS

Ryan Helsley (April 16, 2019) made his MLB debut at Milwaukee.

Trevor Megill was originally selected by St. Louis in the 3rd round of the 2014 MLB Draft, but did not sign to return to Loyola Marymount Univ.

Willson Contreras's younger brother, **William**, is also a catcher for the Brewers.

Caleb Durbin played college baseball at Washington University in St. Louis (2019-21).

Late Brewers broadcaster **Bob Uecker** played two seasons (1964-65) with St. Louis...won the 1964 World Series...traded by the Milwaukee Braves to St. Louis for **Jimmie Coker** & **Gary Kolb** (Apr. 9, 1964).

Connor Thomas was selected by St. Louis in the 5th round of the 2019 MLB Draft...pitched five seasons in the Cardinals minor league organization (2019-24)...selected by Milwaukee in the 2024 Rule 5 Draft (Dec. 11, 2024).

José Quintana made one postseason and 12 regular season starts for the Cardinals in 2022...acquired at the 2022 MLB Trade Deadline with **Chris Stratton** from Pittsburgh in exchange for **Johan Oviedo** and **Malcom Nuñez**.

Hall of Famer **Ted Simmons** played five seasons with Milwaukee (1981-85), where he was a two-time AL All-Star and faced off against St. Louis in the 1982 World Series...traded to Milwaukee with **Rollie Fingers** & **Pete Vuckovich** for **David Green**, **Sixto Lezcano**, **Dave LaPoint** & **Lary Sorensen**.

Ricky Horton made five starts for the Denver Zephyrs (AAA) in the Brewers organization in 1990.

Brewers Media Relations Intern **Owen Buescher** previously work as a 2024 Cardinals Communications Gameday Associate...graduated from Belleville (Ill.) West High School and the University of Missouri (2020-24).

KMOX broadcaster **Matt Pauley** hosted Brewers pre- and postgame shows for parts of six seasons (2017-22)...was radio play-by-play voice of the Univ. of Wisconsin-Green Bay women's basketball team.

Steve Dillard, father of Brewers broadcaster **Tim Dillard**, was hitting coach for the Single-A Quad Cities Swing/River Bandits from 2006-07 and hitting coach for the High-A Palm Beach Cardinals in 2007...later piloted Quad Cities in 2008-09, where he managed infielder **Oliver Marmol**.

Brewers broadcaster **Jeff Levering** previously worked three seasons (2010-12) as broadcaster for the Springfield Cardinals (AA).

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Jim Edmonds** played in 73 games for Milwaukee in 2010.

Cardinals Dir. of Medical Ops/Head Athletic Trainer **Adam Olsen** is a native of Green Bay...graduated from the University of Wisconsin-Madison.

TONIGHT'S GAME:

- Left-hander is making his 5th start of the season (29th career) as he faces the Brewers for the 10th time in his career, but for just his 3rd start.
- Last started a game vs. MIL on 5/17/23 at Busch Stadium and posted identical totals to his 1st career start (5/28/22) against the Brewers; owns a 2-0 mark with 0.00 ERA (10.0 IP) in his two starts against MIL with 5.0 IP, 3 H, 3 BB, 6 SO in each of the two starts - both at Busch Stadium.**
- Has allowed only 2 ER in 17.2 career IP vs. MIL (1.02 ERA), allowing runs in just one of his 9 career meetings (2 runs allowed in relief on 5/10/24 at MIL).
- Has worked 6.0 innings or more in each of his 1st four starts this season, holding the opposition to a 1.00 WHIP in 25.0 IP.
- Allowed just four hits to a left-handed batters (4-for-21, .190 BA) to begin the season and holds a career Opponent BA of .215 vs. LH batters.
- Has issued just two walks and **owns the majors 2nd-best walks/9 IP ratio (0.72)** among qualifying pitchers; **Nathan Eovaldi-TEX** (0.59; 2 BB in 30.2 IP).
- Has held the opponent's clean-up batters (4th place in order) hitless to begin the season (0-11, 1 BB).**
- Is 5-4 career in 12 career starts at Busch Stadium and has a 3.72 ERA; Libby won each of this 1st three career starts at Busch Stadium, but has only two wins, four losses and four no-decisions in his last 10 starts at home.
- Is a career 6-11 with a 5.41 ERA in 28 career starts opposed to 3-3 with a 3.89 ERA in 67 relief appearances.

LAST TIME OUT: Worked a season-high 6.2 IP (100 pitches) last Sat. (4/19) at NYM, and fell to 0-2 in road games in a 3-0 loss to the Mets. The Mets plated 2 runs in their 3rd inning, the lone runs Libby would allow, and St. Louis managed just three hits (two by Thomas Saggese).

2025/CAREER NOTES:

- Blanked the Phillies on just 3 hits over his 6.0 IP (88 pitches) on 4/13 at Busch Stadium and was credited with his 1st win of 2025 (7-0).
- In his 1st road start of the 2025 season, logged a then season high 6.1 IP and 89 pitches in brisk conditions in 4/9 start at PIT, retiring 12 of his last 17 batters faced after allowing 3 runs in the 2nd inning.
- Pitched 6.0 innings allowing three runs for a quality start in his first start of the 2025 season vs. LAA (4/1); surrendered all his runs in the 3rd inning vs. LAA after retiring the first eight batters of the game.
- Spent the entire 2024 season on the Major League roster, his first season on the Opening Day roster and first full season in the majors.
- Appeared in a career-high 60 games in 2024 making six starts.
- Set Major League career-highs in innings pitched (86.1), strikeouts (76), and tied with three wins in 2024.
- Pitched a season-high 6.0 scoreless innings of two-hit ball in a start vs. ATL (6/26/24-Game 2), striking out a career-high eight batters in a 4-1 win.
- He was notified that he was starting on the day of game in two of his starts: at MIA (6/19/14) and vs. ATL (6/26/24-Game 2).
- Led the Cardinals and ranked 7th in the N.L. with 25 appearances after the trade deadline (8/1/24).
- Went nine consecutive appearances (4/4-5/5) without allowing a hit against a left-handed batter (0-for-19, one walk).
- Ranked T-2nd among Cardinals relievers with John King with 33 inherited runners in 2024, trailing only JoJo Romero (34).
- Graduated from Mountain Ridge High School in Glendale, Arizona.
- Was a childhood teammate and friend of Cardinals infielder Nolan Gorman; both Liberatore and Gorman played in the American Youth Baseball Hall of Fame tournament at Cooperstown Dreams Park in 2012 and on the same World Cup team in 2017, winning the Gold Medal in Canada.
- Ranked by Baseball America as the No. 2 overall player in the 2018 Major League Baseball Draft.
- Selected by the Tampa Bay Rays in the first round (16th overall) of the 2018 MLB Draft, making him the highest drafted high school player in Rays franchise history.
- Acquired by the Cardinals from the Tampa Bay Rays with C Edgardo Rodriguez and Rays Compensation draft pick B (RHP Tink Hence) in exchange for OF José Martínez, OF Randy Arozarena and Cardinals Compensation draft pick A (INF Alika Williams), January 9, 2020.

LIBERATORE vs. MILWAUKEE:

- Is facing the Brewers for the 10th time in his career, but for just his 3rd start.
- Last started a game vs. MIL on 5/17/23 at Busch Stadium and posted identical totals to his 1st career start (5/28/22) against the Brewers; owns a 2-0 mark with 0.00 ERA (10.0 IP) in his two starts against MIL with 5.0 IP, 3 H, 3 BB, 6 SO in each of the two starts - both at Busch Stadium.**
- Has allowed only 2 ER in 17.2 career IP vs. MIL (1.02 ERA), allowing runs in just one of his 9 career meetings (2 runs allowed on 5/10/24 at MIL).
- His 1st career MLB win came in the 5/28/23 start against Milwaukee.
- Is 4-4 career vs. NL Central clubs in 33 games/9 starts with 2 of those wins coming against the Brewers.
