**TONIGHT'S GAME:** The Braves and Mets open a four-game series tonight with the 13th of 19 meetings between the clubs this season...Following these four games, the teams will not meet again until the penultimate series of the year, September 30-October 2, here in Atlanta.

*A* The Braves and Mets played five games August 4-7 at Citi Field, and New York won four times...The Braves were outscored in the series 31-22, and they struck out 57 times in the five games.

*A* The Mets have won six of the last eight games between the clubs, and took two-of-three in the only series between the teams in Atlanta so far this season, July 11-13.

*A* The Braves went 10-9 against the Mets last season, taking the season set from their NL East rivals for the fourth consecutive season...They went 7-3 in 2020, 11-8 in 2019 and 13-6 in 2018...The Braves need to go 6-1 over the final seven games between the teams to avoid losing the season series.

*A* Braves starting pitchers are 2-8 against the Mets this season with a 5.17 ERA (36 ER/62.2 IP)...New York has worked 31 walks against the Atlanta rotation, and struck out more than six times only once in the 12 games.

*A* RHP Spencer Strider is 1-1 with a 5.59 ERA (6 ER/9.2 IP) in four career games, two starts, against the Mets...Both of the 23-year-old's starts have come against the Mets this season, and he is 0-1 with a 6.14 ERA (5 ER/7.1 IP)...Strider last pitched when he faced New York on August 7 at Citi Field...He went 2.2 innings and allowed four runs, earned, to take a 5-2 loss.

*A* RHP Carlos Carrasco has beaten the Braves in both of his starts against them this season, compiling a 1.93 ERA (3 ER/14.0 IP) in those wins...The 35-year-old righty faced them on August 4 in New York, tossing 6.0 innings and allowing three runs, earned, in a 6-4 win...In his only start at Truist Park, Carrasco allowed five runs, earned, over 5.0 innings last October 2 in a 6-5 loss.

**WIN:** The Braves extended their winning streak to six games yesterday after they completed a four-game sweep of Miami with a 3-1 come-from-behind victory...The Braves winning streak is the longest active run in the majors and moved them a season-best 24 games over .500 at 70-46.

*A* The Braves trailed 1-0 heading to the ninth inning yesterday, but scored three runs off Miami closer Tanner Scott to earn their second win of the year when behind after eight...The club's other such win this season came on June 22 vs. San Francisco, when they rallied from a 3-1 deficit in the bottom of the ninth to win, 4-3.

*A* The win was just the Braves' 22nd comeback win this season...That total is tied for the ninth fewest in baseball, although the Braves have 48 games this season where they never trailed, third most in the majors.

**RARE HOMER:** OF Michael Harris drove a 99 mph fastball from LHP Tanner Scott out to left-center field yesterday in the ninth inning to tie the game at 1...Harris' drive was his fifth this season that either tied the game or put the Braves ahead.

*A* Since 2008, only one other left-handed hitter homered the opposite way against a pitch as hard from a lefty...Rafael Devers drove a 102.8 mph fastball from Aroldis Chapman out to left-center field at Yankee Stadium on August 13, 2017.

*A* In that same time frame, only three other lefties homered against a pitch as hard from a lefty to any part of the stadium. (Yonder Alonso vs. Chapman, August 25, 2017; Gavin Lux vs. Scott, September 10, 2019; Jazz Chisholm Jr vs. José Alvarado, May 18, 2021).

*A* Since 2008, there have been 2,507 pitches at 99 mph or harder from a lefty pitcher to a lefty hitter.

**STREAKING:** The Braves have won six consecutive games after losing five of six to Philadelphia and New York last week.

*A* The six-game winning streak is the second longest run for the Braves this season...It trails only a 14-game streak, June 1-15.

*A* This current streak began on Tuesday in Boston, and Atlanta has outscored the opposition 35-19 (+16).

*A* The winning streak came entirely on the road during a season-long 11-game trip to New York, Boston and Miami...After beginning the trip 1-4, the Braves finished the swing 7-4...They have the fourth-best road record in the majors at 33-24 (.579).

**RUNS:** INF Vaughn Grissom scored again yesterday, and has now scored a run in his first five major league games.

*A* Since the formation of the two different leagues in 1901, Grissom is the first Braves player to score in his first five major league games.

*A* Only one other player in this time frame started his Braves career with a longer run-scoring streak...Fred McGriff holds the record, scoring in his first eight games with the Braves after the club acquired him from San Diego in 1993.

*A* Alex Trevino (1984) and Brian Jordan (1999) also scored in their first five games after joining the Braves...Atlanta acquired Trevino in a trade with Cincinnati, while the Braves signed Jordan as a free agent.

**STARTERS:** Over this six-game winning streak, the Braves starting pitchers have gone six or more innings four times, and have 33 strikeouts to eight walks.

*A* During a stretch where the Braves lost five of six to Philadelphia and New York, Atlanta starting pitchers went 0-4 with a 5.28 ERA (18 ER/30.2 IP)...They allowed 35 hits and 13 walks in these six games.

#### Tonight's Game

- A Set for his 14th start of the season, and his 25th appearance... Tonight is his 27th career game.
- A Has made two career starts and four total appearances against the Mets, and is 1-1 with a 5.59 ERA (6 ER/2.2 IP) and 13 strikeouts versus New York.
  - A Pitched against them in his last turn, August 7 at Citi Field, and allowed six hits and four runs over just 2.2 innings in the loss...Walked two and fanned five...The outing was the shortest start of his career after moving into the rotation on May 30.
  - A Made his major league debut against New York in the final series of last year, appearing in two games out of Atlanta's bullpen and allowing one run over 2.1 combined innings.
- A Started against the Mets in his last turn, and pitched against the Phillies in his two starts before that... Tonight marks the second time in his career he has faced the same opponent in back-to-back starts.
  - A In his first start against Philadelphia, allowed three hits and one run over 6.0 innings, fanning six...In his next start six days later, allowed three hits and one run over 6.2 innings, fanning a career-most 13.
  - A His last start versus New York was eight days ago, August 7...Strider has made two starts this season with at least six days of rest, and is 2-0 with a 1.42 ERA (2 ER/12.2 IP) and a .174 average against him in these turns...In 11 starts with five days of rest of fewer, is 3-3 with a 3.93 ERA (23 ER/52.2 IP) and a .203 average against him.
- A Fanned five in his last start against New York, and has 138 strikeouts on the season in just 89.2 innings pitched.
  - A His 13.9 strikeouts per 9.0 innings is the highest by a rookie pitcher in MLB history (min. 12 starts)...Chicago's Kerry Wood held the previous mark with 12.6 K/9.0 IP.
  - A No pitcher in Braves franchise history has pitched at least 100 innings in a season and fanned even 11.0 batters per 9.0 innings...In fact, just two pitchers, Brandon Beachy with 10.7 in 2011 and Charlie Morton with 10.5 last year, have been above 10.0.
  - A His 133 strikeouts are tied for 15th most in the majors, and each of the 104 pitchers above him have pitched at least 105 innings...Among pitchers with at least 50 innings this season, Strider's rate of 13.85 strikeouts per 9.0 innings is easily most in the majors, over a full strikeout more than any one (Ohtani, 12.73).

#### 2022 Recap

- A Was named NL Rookie of the Month for July...Went 2-1 with a 2.70 ERA (8 ER/26.2 IP) over five starts in the month.
  - A Five of the eight runs came in one start, July 17 at Washington...In his other four turns, went 2-0 and pitched to a 1.19 ERA (3 ER/22.2 IP) with 37 strikeouts.
  - A Becomes the second consecutive Braves player to win Rookie of the Month, after Michael Harris II earned the honor for June...Is the first Atlanta pitcher to win the award since Craig Kimbrel won it twice in 2011.
- A On July 7 vs. St. Louis, allowed just two hits over 6.0 scoreless innings, walking two and striking out a career-most 12 batters.
  - A Recorded his first nine outs via strikeout...Since at least 1961, Strider is the only Braves pitcher with nine strikeouts through the first three innings of a game...Only two other pitchers have done it since the start of the 2020 season: Pablo López (MIA; July 11, 2021) and Aaron Nola (PHI; June 25, 2021).
  - A He became the only pitcher in Braves history to have three games of at least 10 strikeouts within his first eight starts...League-wide, the last pitcher with at least three double-digit strikeout performances in his first eight career starts was Masahiro Tanaka, who did it for New York (AL) in 2014.
  - A Research via the Elias Sports Bureau.
    - A He allowed one hit and fanned 11 in his previous start at Cincinnati, and became the first rookie in MLB's modern era (since 1900) with 11+ strikeouts and two-or-fewer hits in consecutive starts.
- A Started on July 2 at Cincinnati and allowed just one hits and one run over 6.0 innings, walking one and striking out a career high-tying 11.
  - A Also allowed just one hit with 11 strikeouts on June 15 at Washington, and is one of just three pitchers in the majors with multiple such starts this season...The White Sox' Dylan Cease and the Astros' Cristian Javier each have two as well.
  - A Per research from Stats, Inc., Strider became the only rookie pitcher in baseball's modern era (since 1920) to have two games with 11+ strikeouts and no more than one hit allowed.

#### Career Recap

- A Drafted by the Atlanta Braves in the fourth round of the 2020 MLB June Amateur Draft.
- A In three seasons with Clemson, went 5-2 with a 4.71 ERA (33 ER/63.0 IP) in 26 appearances, 10 starts.

### Ronald Acuña Jr. • OF • 6-0 • 205 • 24 yrs • #13

**MIA Series:** .308 (4-13, HR, 2 R) **Last HR:** 8/13/22 at MIA [2] (Nance)

**Road Trip:** .381 (16-42, 2 HR, 5 RBI, 8 R) **Current Streak:** 2 games (4-9, HR, 2 R)

**Season Long Streak:** 8 games (5/2 - 5/17, 10-for-29, 2 2B, 2 HR, 4 RBI, 5 R)

- **MLB Ranks:** Stolen bases (3rd, 25)
- Has hit in 10 of 11 games played against the Mets this season, posting a .342 (14-for-41) batting average with a home run, four doubles and five RBI.
- On August 13 hit his third leadoff homer this year and the 26th of his career...He already owned the Braves' franchise record entering play...Since his MLB debut in 2018, Acuña has the second-most leadoff homers in baseball, trailing Toronto's George Springer (33).
- Batting .354/.415/.521 (17-for-48) in 13 August games with six RBI, nine runs and four walks...Has a .936 OPS and five multi-hit games in that time.
- Since his season debut on 4/28, his 25 stolen bases rank second in Major League Baseball.
- On 8/5 became the 13th player in MLB history with at least 500 hits, 100 home runs and 100 stolen bases before turning 25 (500/114/101)...Mike Trout (LAA, 2017) and Mookie Betts (BOS, 2018) were the last major leaguers to accomplish it.
- Went 1-for-3 with a double in the All-Star Game on July 19...Acuña is the first player since Albert Pujols (2009-10) to lead his league in voting in consecutive years...Also participated in the Home Run Derby.
- On 5/23 snapped his 29-game on-base streak, which was longest in MLB...The streak was the second-longest of his career, behind a 32-game stretch from 6/19 to 7/28/19.
- On 4/28 made first appearance since July 10, 2021...He was placed on the 60-day Injured List on July 11 last season with a torn ACL in his right knee.
