AT A GLANCE: The Yankees continue their nine-game homestand tonight with the first game of a three-game set vs. Seattle (through Thurs.)...are 3-3 on the homestand after dropping two-of-three games vs. St. Louis and winning two-of-three games vs. Atlanta...following this homestand, will embark on a six-game road trip to Toronto (Fri.-Sun.) and Baltimore (8/18-20).

- **Their 66-52 (.559) record is the second-best in the American League and the sixth-best in the Majors**, trailing only Milwaukee (74-45, .622), Tampa Bay (72-46, .610), Atlanta (71-48, .597), Los Angeles-NL (71-48, .597) and Chicago-NL (69-50, .580).
- Are 12-8 in their last 20 games (since 7/19) and 16-10 in their last 26 games (since 7/9).
- Have had 19 of their last 25 games decided by 2R-or-fewer (since 7/10), going 13-6 in those games...are 33-26 (.559) in games decided by 2R-or-fewer this season...their 33 wins in those games are tied for the most in the AL and tied for the second-most in the Majors.
- Each of the Yankees' last two wins, nine of the Yankees' last 16 wins (since 7/9), 11 of their last 20 wins (since 6/23) and 17 of their last 31 wins (since 5/31) have been comeback wins.
- Have won or split seven of their last nine series since 7/6 (are 5-2-2 in those series).

WHERE WE LEFT OFF: The Yankees fell to the Braves, 2-1, in 10 innings on Sunday at Yankee Stadium...**RHP Cam Schittler** (7.0IP, 3H, 1R/ER, 0BB, 11K, 1HR) started and did not record a decision after allowing only 1R/ER in 7.0IP...**CF Trent Grisham** (2-for-4, 1R, 1 double, 1HR, 1RBI) drove in the Yankees' only run, hitting his 13th home run of the season with a game-tying solo shot in the eighth inning...**C Austin Wells** (1-for-3) and **2B Jazz Chisholm Jr.** (1-for-3, 1BB) were the only other Yankees to record hits...**RHP Kervin Castro** (1.0IP, 1K) tossed a perfect eighth inning...**RHP Paul Blackburn** (2.0IP, 1H, 1R/0ER, 2K) suffered his second loss of the season after allowing the extra-inning runner to score in the 10th inning.

RICE RICE BABY: C/INF Ben Rice is batting .257/.350/.545 (108-for-420) with 72R, 19 doubles, 3 triples, 32HR, 75RBI, 58BB/4IBB, 3HP, 2SF and 2SB in 113 games this season...has set career highs in home runs, RBI and walks...54 of his 108H this year have been XBH (19 doubles, 3 triples, 32HR).

- Has hit .348/.444/.609 (8-for-23) with 7R, 3 doubles, 1HR, 3RBI and 4BB over seven career games vs. the Mariners.

GEORGE OF THE CONCRETE JUNGLE: INF George Lombard Jr. has hit .294/.400/.647 (5-for-17) with 4R, 2HR, 2RBI and 3BB over his first five career games.

PUT TO BED: RHP David Bednar has converted each of his last 16 save opportunities (since 5/18), marking the fourth-longest streak of his career...also converted 19 straight save opportunities from 4/12-8/3/24, 18 from 4/18-8/1/23, 17 from 3/28-7/28/25 and 16 from 8/13(G1)-10/1/23...**marks the longest single-season streak by a Yankees pitcher since Aroldis Chapman converted 22 straight save opportunities from 5/8-7/31/18**.

- Has not allowed a run in 25 of his last 27 appearances (since 5/22), going 4-0 with 15 saves, a 0.88 ERA (30.2IP, 3ER) and 33K during that span...has held opponents to a .117/.188/.155 (12-for-103) slash line over that stretch.

WEATHERS REPORT: LHP Ryan Weathers will make his 23rd start of the season tonight vs. Seattle...**owns a career-high 17.2 scoreless inning streak since 7/25** (previous: 12.0IP from 5/14-20/24)...**has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in seven of his last nine starts (since 6/18), posting a 2.89 ERA (46.2IP, 15ER) with 51K during that span**.

McMAHON OF THE HOUR: INF Ryan McMahon is hitting .300/.400/.500 (6-for-20) with 3R, 1 double, 1HR, 2RBI, 4BB and 1SF over his last seven games (since 8/2).

PITCH PERFECT: Yankees pitchers have posted a Major League-best 3.30 ERA (1,054.2IP, 387ER) this season...have allowed 3R-or-fewer in 11 of their last 17 games (since 7/22-G2), including 2R-or-fewer in 10 of those games, posting a 2.64 ERA (157.0IP, 46ER) during that stretch.

- Have allowed 3R-or-fewer in 16 of their last 25 games (since 7/10), posting a 2.86 ERA (230.0IP, 73ER) with 255K during that span.
- Have recorded at least 10K in 17 of their last 22 games (since 7/17), posting a 10.33 K/9.0IP ratio over that span (233K/203.0IP)...their 233K mark their most strikeouts in a 22-game span in a single season since recording 234K in 22 games from 9/10-10/3/21.

FOR STARTERS: Yankees starting pitchers have allowed 2R-or-fewer in 10 of their last 12 starts (since 7/28), including 1R-or-fewer in nine of those starts, posting a 1.63 ERA (71.2IP, 13ER) during that span...have allowed 2R-or-fewer in 13 of their last 17 starts and 1R-or-fewer in 12 of those starts (since 7/22-G2), posting a 2.16 ERA (95.2IP, 23ER) with 117K during that span.

- **Have allowed 3R-or-fewer in 92 starts this season, tied for their most such starts through their first 118 games of a season in franchise history** (also recorded 92GS in 2022).
- Have allowed 3R-or-fewer in 24 of their last 27 starts (since 7/8), including 2R-or-fewer in 19 of those starts, posting a 2.72 ERA (145.2IP, 44ER) during that span.
- **Rank second in the Majors this season in ERA (3.42, second in AL)**, third in strikeouts (667, first in AL), strikeout rate (25.5%, first in AL), K/9.0IP (9.45, first in AL), opponents' SLG (.371, second in AL) and opponents' OPS (.660, second in AL), fourth in opponents' BA (.226, second in AL) and HR/9.0IP (1.02, second in AL), sixth in K/BB (3.42, third in AL), opponents' OBP (.289, fourth in AL) and WHIP (1.15, fourth in AL), seventh in BB/9.0IP (2.76, fourth in AL) and eighth in walk rate (7.4%, fourth in AL).

GOOD SCHLITT: RHP Cam Schittler allowed only 1R/ER over 7.0IP in a no-decision on Sunday vs. Atlanta (3H, 0BB, 11K, 1HR)...has gone 10-6 with a 2.21 ERA (146.2IP, 36ER) and 182K in 25 starts this season, holding opponents to a .196/.247/.325 (105-for-536) slash line...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 21 of his 25 starts this season...**has allowed 1ER-or-fewer in a Major League-best 17 starts this season, including 15 of his last 21 starts (since 4/17)**.

- Sunday marked his third career regular season double-digit strikeout game (also 13K on 6/19 vs. Cincinnati and 12K on 7/24 at Philadelphia)...also marked the third time he has recorded at least 10K and 0BB in a regular season game in his career...is one of only three pitchers in the Majors this season to record at least 10K and 0BB in at least three games, joining Milwaukee's Jacob Misorowski (five) and Cleveland's Gavin Williams (three).
- **Is one of only seven pitchers in franchise history to record at least 10K and 0BB in at least three games in a season**, joining Gerrit Cole (six in 2021), Mike Mussina (four in 2001), Luis Severino (three in 2018), Masahiro Tanaka (three in 2017), David Wells (three in 1998) and David Cone (three in 1998).

SEA-ING CLEARLY: The Yankees have won or split 16 of their last 18 series vs. the Mariners (since 8/22/16) and 19 of their last 22 series (since 6/10/14)...overall, are 40-17 in the last 57 matchups vs. the Mariners (since 8/23/16).

- Are 11-3 in their last 14 games vs. Seattle (since 5/22/24).
- Are 19-7 in their last 26 games vs. the Mariners at Yankee Stadium (since 8/26/17).

AUSTIN POWERS: C Austin Wells is batting .350/.435/.650 (7-for-20) with 2R, 3 doubles, 1HR, 3RBI, 2BB, 1HP and 1SB over his last nine games (since 7/30).

- Is hitting .306/.405/.556 (11-for-36) with 5R, 3 doubles, 2HR, 4RBI, 4BB, 2HP and 1SB over his last 15 games (since 7/20).
- Has posted a .935 OPS over his last 21 games (since 7/9).
- **Seven of his last 14H since 7/9 have been XBH (3 doubles, 4HR).**
- **His 2.93 catcher's ERA is the best in the Majors.**
- According to Baseball Savant, is tied for fourth in the Majors in catcher framing runs (five), tied for fifth in blocks above average (five) and tied for eighth in shadow strike pct. (49.5%)...is tied for fifth in the Majors in DRS among catchers (eight - FanGraphs).

MERRY GRISHMAS: OF Trent Grisham drove in the Yankees' only run on Sunday vs. Atlanta, hitting his 13th home run of the season with a game-tying solo shot in the eighth inning...**six of his 13HR this year have either tied the game (four) or given the Yankees the lead (two)...as a Yankee, 30 of his 56HR have either tied the game (11) or given the Yankees the lead (19)**.

- Five of his last six hits have been XBH (3 doubles, 2HR).

NEW KID ON THE BLOCK: INF Luis García Jr. has hit .279/.311/.551 (105-for-376) with 50R, 20 doubles, 5 triples, 24HR, 78RBI, 18BB and 4SB in 109 games this season, setting career highs in home runs and RBI...**ranks second in the Majors in SLG, tied for fourth in multi-HR games (four) and seventh in RBI**.

- Has hit .327/.350/.551 (32-for-98) with 7 doubles, 5HR, 49RBI, 4BB and 1SF with RISP this year.
- Has batted .294/.325/.589 (93-for-316) with 20 doubles, 5 triples, 21HR and 15BB vs. right-handed pitchers this season.
- Over his last 75 games (since 5/9), has batted .299/.333/.638 (80-for-268) with 36R, 14 doubles, 4 triples, 23HR, 62RBI, 14BB and 2SB...during that stretch, leads the Majors in RBI and SLG, ranks third in HR and XBH (41), and fourth in OPS (.971).

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: LHP RYAN WEATHERS (5-7, 3.79 ERA)

LHP Ryan Weathers will make his 23rd start of the season in tonight's series opener vs. Seattle...the 26 year-old will make the start on extended six days' rest due to Thursday and Monday's team off days...made his 22nd start of the season on 8/4 vs. St. Louis, earning his fifth win of the year after tossing 6.0 scoreless innings (4H, 1BB, 6K)...**owns a career-high 17.2 scoreless inning streak since 7/25 at Philadelphia**...marking the fifth-longest active streak in the Majors this season...has gone 5-7 with a 3.79 ERA (121.0IP, 114H, 57R/51ER, 34BB, 132K, 17HR) in a career-high 22 starts this season...has allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 15 of his 22 starts, 2ER-or-fewer in 14 of his starts and 1ER-or-fewer in 11 of his starts...has set career highs in strikeouts, innings pitched, and starts this season...also tied his career high in wins (also 5W in 2024 with Miami)...**is 2-0 with a 2.20 ERA (28.2IP, 7ER) and 28K over his last five starts (since 7/10)**...has allowed 1R-or-fewer in four of those starts...went 2-2 with a 3.99 ERA (38.1IP, 37H, 20R/17ER, 12BB, 37K, 7HR) in eight starts with the Miami Marlins in 2025...allowed 3ER-or-fewer in six of his eight starts and 1ER-or-fewer in four of his starts...missed the majority of the season due to two injured list stints (3/24-5/14, 6/9-9/11)...over the last three seasons (2024-26), has gone 12-15 with a 3.77 ERA (246.0IP, 229H, 116R/103ER, 70BB, 249K, 35HR) in 46 starts...during that stretch, has allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 34 of those 46 starts...since 2021, his 19 pickoffs are tied for fifth-most in the Majors...has pitched in over parts of six Major League seasons with the San Diego Padres (2021-23), Miami Marlins (2023-25) and the Yankees (2026)...has made four career Opening Day rosters (2021 and '23 with San Diego, '24 with Miami and '26 with the Yankees)...began the 2025 season on the injured list...is the son of David Weathers, who pitched in parts of 19 seasons in the Majors (1991-2009), including two seasons with the Yankees from 1996-97, where he won the World Series with the club in '96...became the fifth father/son duo in Yankees history to both play for the club, joining Clay Bellinger and Cody Bellinger, Mark Leiter and Mark Leiter Jr., Ron Davis and Ike Davis, and Yogi Berra and Dale Berra...was originally selected by the San Diego Padres in the first round (seventh overall) of the 2018 First-Year Player Draft...was acquired by Miami from San Diego in exchange for INF Garrett Cooper, RHP Sean Reynolds and cash considerations on 8/1/23...was acquired by the Yankees from Miami in exchange for OF Dillon Lewis, OF Brendan Jones, INF Dylan Jasso and INF Juan Matheus on 1/13/26.

LAST TIME OUT: Made his 22nd start of the season on 8/4 vs. St. Louis, earning his fifth win of the year after tossing 6.0 scoreless innings (4H, 1BB, 6K)...retired 12 of his first 14BF (2H).
★ Has tossed back-to-back starts of at least 5.0 scoreless innings for the first time in his career.

HOME SWEET HOME: In 13 starts at Yankee Stadium this season, has gone 3-5 with a 4.11 ERA (70.0IP, 71H, 37R/32ER, 19BB, 77K, 11HR)...has allowed 3ER-or-fewer in eight of his 13 starts.
★ Has recorded at least 7K in five of his 13 starts at home.
★ Over the last two seasons (2025-26), has gone 4-6 with a 3.87 ERA (86.0IP, 86H, 42R/37ER, 22BB, 92K, 13HR) in 16 home starts.

2026: Is 5-7 with a 3.79 ERA (121.0IP, 114H, 57R/51ER, 34BB, 132K, 17HR) in 22 starts this season...has allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 15 of his 22 starts, 2ER-or-fewer in 14 of his starts and 1ER-or-fewer in 11 of his starts...has set career highs in strikeouts, innings pitched, and starts this season...also tied his career high in wins (also 5W in 2024 with Miami).
★ Among American League pitchers this season, ranks fifth in groundball percentage (47.3%), ninth in K/BB (3.88) and 10th in K/9.0IP (9.82).
★ His 43 called strikeouts are the sixth-most in the Majors this season (fourth in AL).
★ **Is just the fifth left-handed pitcher to record at least 132K through their first 22 starts with the Yankees**, joining James Paxton (141K in 2019), Randy Johnson (142K in 2005), Ron Gidry (140K from 1975-77) and Al Downing (160K from 1961-63) - confirmed by *Elias*.
★ **Owns a career-high 17.2 scoreless inning streak since 7/25 at Philadelphia** (previous: 12.0IP from 5/14-20/24)...marking the fifth-longest active streak in the Majors this season.
★ Is 2-0 with a 2.20 ERA (28.2IP, 7ER) and 28K over his last five starts (since 7/10)...has allowed 1R-or-fewer in four of those starts...has allowed just 1HR over that span, posting a 0.31 HR/9.0IP (28.2IP, 1HR) in that stretch.
★ Has recorded at least 7K in nine of his starts this season.
★ Has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in seven of his last nine starts (since 6/18), posting a 2.89 ERA (46.2IP, 15ER) with 51K during that span.
★ Has received 2R-or-fewer of run support in 15 of his 22 starts this season, including 0R of support in eight starts...his 3.42 run support average this year ranks fifth-lowest in the Majors and in the AL.
★ Has allowed one-or-zero HR in 17 of his 22 starts, including 13 starts without allowing a HR...has surrendered one-or-zero HR in 14 of his last 18 starts (since 4/19)...has allowed just 6HR over his last 11 starts (since 6/5) after surrendering 11HR in his first 11 starts this season from 3/30-5/30.
★ Did not allow a home run in four consecutive starts from 6/24-7/10, marking his longest streak of consecutive starts without surrendering a home run.
★ Has tossed at least 7.0 innings in four starts this season (7.0IP on 7/30 at Chicago-AL, 5/24 vs. Tampa Bay, 8.0IP on 4/9 vs. the Athletics and 7.1IP on 4/19 vs. Kansas City)...prior to this year, had tossed at least 7.0IP only twice in his first 55 career starts over his first five seasons (2021-25).
★ Went 2-0 with a 2.48 ERA (36.1IP, 26H, 12R/10ER, 9BB, 37K, 4HR) over six starts from 4/19-5/24...allowed 2ER-or-fewer in five of those six starts...held opposing batters to a .198/.250/.313 (26-for-131) slash line in that stretch.
★ Made his Yankees debut on 3/30 at Seattle, allowing only 1R/ER over 4.1IP without recording a decision (4H, 2BB, 7K, 0HR).
★ Allowed 2R/ER over 6.1IP and did not record a decision on 5/11 at Baltimore (1H, 3BB, 9K, 0HR)...did not allow a hit to his first 20BF before surrendering a single to Adley Rustchman to lead off the seventh inning...became the first Yankees left-hander to not allow a hit through their first 20BF in a game since Nestor Cortes did not allow a hit to his first 26BF on 5/9/22 vs. Texas.

VS. SEATTLE: In two career starts vs. the Mariners, has posted a 2.16 ERA (8.1IP, 2ER) with 9K without recording a decision.
★ Made his last start earlier this season on 3/30 at T-Mobile Park, allowing only 1R/ER over 4.1IP without recording a decision (4H, 2BB, 7K, 0HR).

2025: Went 2-2 with a 3.99 ERA (38.1IP, 37H, 20R/17ER, 12BB, 37K, 7HR) in eight starts with the Marlins...missed the majority of the season due to two injured list stints (3/24-5/14, 6/9-9/11)...allowed 3ER-or-fewer in six of his eight starts and 1ER-or-fewer in four of his starts.
