### On Turn

The Braves have used the same five starting pitchers for the past 44 games, and the rotation has compiled a NL-best 22-9 (.710) record and a 3.44 ERA.

The ERA is also the fourth best mark in baseball, trailing only St. Louis, Cleveland and New York (NL).

RHP Mike Foltynewicz is 6-0 with a 2.35 ERA (14 ER/53.2 IP) in this stretch, and the Braves have won all nine of his starts.

**TONIGHT'S GAME:** The Braves and Giants continue a three-game set tonight with the sixth of seven meetings between the clubs this season...The teams will not meet again until next April 17-19, when the Giants will return for three games here at SunTrust Park.

**A** The Braves took three-of-four games in San Francisco, May 20-23, outscoring the Giants 21-11...The Braves have won seven of the last eight games with the Giants after last night's 6-0 win...The victory also ensured the Braves the season set with San Francisco, and Atlanta has not lost the season series with the Giants for the last three seasons...They went 4-3 in 2017 and 3-3 last seasons.

**A** The Braves beat the Giants in Atlanta for the first time since 2017 last night...The Giants swept all three games in their last trip to SunTrust Park, May 4-6, 2018.

**A** LHP Max Fried is set to face the Giants for the third time in his career, for the second time as a starter and for the second time this season...He beat San Francisco at Oracle Park on May 22 of this season, tossing 6.0 innings and allowing two runs, earned, in a 9-2 win.

**A** RHP Johnny Cueto is 2-4 with a 3.45 ERA (22 ER/57.1 IP) in nine career games, all starts, against the Braves, and is set to face them for the first time since June of 2017...The righty went 7.0 innings and allowed two runs, earned, to take the loss in a 9-0 defeat.

**CLINCHED:** The Braves clinched the 19th division title in franchise history yesterday, beating San Francisco, 6-0...The 19 division titles are tied for the most in the major league history with the Yankees, who took the American League East on Thursday...This season also marks the franchise's 25th postseason berth in the modern era and its second straight.

**A** The Braves won a major league-record 14 consecutive division titles from 1991-2005, with the first three coming as NL West champs before moving into the NL East in the strike-shortened 1994 season...They also won the West in 1969 and 1982, and the East in 2013.

**A** The Braves also clinched home-field advantage in the National League Division Series last night, and will open the postseason on Thursday, October 3 at SunTrust Park...Game 2 will be on Friday, October 4, before travelling for Game 3 on Sunday...The opponent and the times for the games are still to be determined.

**A** The Braves have lost eight consecutive playoff rounds, dating to the 2001 League Championship Series against Arizona...That streak is the second longest in MLB history...The Braves last won a playoff round in 2001, sweeping Houston in the NLDS.

**100 RBI:** OF Ronald Acuña Jr. reached base four times last night, hitting a double, a home run and walking twice...With a two-run home run in the fifth inning, he drove in his 100th and 101st run of the season.

**A** At 21 years, 276 days old, Acuña Jr. became the 14th youngest in baseball history to reach 100 RBI in a season...Hall-of-Famers Al Kaline and Mel Ott each had two of these seasons...The only other active players ahead of Acuña on his list are Miguel Cabrera (2004), Albert Pujols (2001) and Juan Soto (2019).

**120 RBI:** 1B Freddie Freeman became the 13th Braves player in history to ever reach 120 RBI in a single season when he drove home OF Ronald Acuña Jr. with a first-inning sacrifice fly...OF Andruw Jones was the last Braves player to reach the mark, driving in 129 in 2006.

**A** Freeman has driven in Acuña Jr. 30 times this season, his highest total for scoring a teammate in his career...His previous high was 23 with Ozzie Albies last season.

**RUNS:** OF Ronald Acuña Jr. scored three times yesterday, giving him 126 runs this season and moving him within five of tying the franchise modern-era record for a single season...OF Dale Murphy had 131 in 1983.

**A** Acuña Jr. is currently tied for the fourth most with Gary Sheffield's total from 2003.

**A** Third place is Hank Aaron, who had 127 in 1962...Rafael Furcal is in second place with 130 in 2003.

**40-40?:** OF Ronald Acuña Jr. needs three steals to become the fifth player in baseball history to collect a 40-homer, 40-steal season.

**A** OF José Canseco was the first player to go 40-40, reaching 42 home runs and 40 steals in 1988...Barry Bonds then matched those numbers in 1996, while Alex Rodríguez had 42 homers and 46 steals in 1998...Alfonso Soriano then had 46 and 41 in 2006.

**A** Prior to Acuña Jr., those four players were the only ones to go 40/35...Bonds did it twice, going 40/37 in 1997, a year after his 42/40 season.

**FINISHING UP AT HOME:** The Braves will finish their regular season home schedule on Sunday, and with one more win this weekend, they will have their first 50-win season at home since 2013...They currently are 49-30 at SunTrust Park.

**A** The Braves went 56-25 that season, tying the single-season record for most home wins...They also won 56 games in 1996, 1998, and 1999.

**HITS:** 2B Ozzie Albies collected two hits last night, and now has a team-leading 182 this season...He is one shy of the Atlanta single-season record for a second baseman.

**A** Felix Millan had 183 base hits for the 1970 club.

**A** The franchise moder-era record for a second baseman is 204 by Bill Sweeney in 1912.

#### Tonight's Game

- A* Set for his 30th start and 32nd appearance of the season...Makes his 38th career start and his 54th career appearance.
- A* His 16 wins are most in the National League by a left-hander, and tied for second most in the majors among lefties...BOS's Eduardo Rodríguez has won 18 games.
  - A* Fried's 16 wins are most by an Atlanta left-hander since 2002, when Hall-of-Famer Tom Glavine won 18 games.
  - A* No Atlanta pitcher has won 17 games since Tim Hudson in 2010.
  - A* Atlanta is 21-8 in his starts as a team, including 14-4 in his last 18 turns.
- A* Makes his second career start against San Francisco, and his third appearance...Is 1-0 with a 3.38 ERA (3 ER/8.0 IP) in his first two games.
  - A* Pitched against them once earlier this season, May 22 at Oracle Park...Allowed four hits and two runs over 6.0 innings to earn the win.
- A* Has lost each of his last two starts, the first time this season he has lost consecutive decisions and just the second time Atlanta has lost back-to-back games he has started.
  - A* Atlanta also lost consecutive games started by Fried on June 30 and July 6.
  - A* Fried is 0-2 with a 12.27 ERA during the spell, allowing 10 earned runs in 7.1 innings...Opponents are batting .406 (13-for-32).
- A* Makes his 15th start at SunTrust Park, and is 8-3 with a 3.42 ERA (31 ER/81.2 IP) here...Atlanta is 10-4 in his starts here, and has won five straight.
  - A* Last started here on September 5 vs. Washington, and stuck out nine over 7.0 one-hit, shutout innings.
  - A* In 17 games on the road, is 8-3 with a 5.16 ERA (43 ER/75.0 IP).

#### 2019 Recap

- A* Lost, 9/10 at PHI, to snap a career-best seven-game winning streak that dated to July 15 at Milwaukee.
  - A* Went 7-0 with a 3.02 ERA (17 ER/50.2 IP) during the run, with wins over Milwaukee, Philadelphia, Cincinnati, Minnesota, the Mets, the White Sox and Washington.
  - A* The stretch spanned nine total starts, and Atlanta won all nine...Atlanta had not won more consecutive starts by a left-hander since 1993, when the Braves won 13 straight games started by Steve Avery.
- A* Struck out a career high-tying 11 batters, 8/30 vs. CWS, to earn his 15th win of the season...Allowed four hits and four runs in 6.0 innings.
  - A* Also won both of his starts against the Cubs this season, becoming just the second Atlanta pitcher to beat both the Cubs and White Sox in a single season...Tim Hudson earned victories over both Chicago clubs in 2013...Dallas Keuchel also did so this season, beating the White Sox the day after Fried.
- A* Started against the Dodgers, 8/18 at SunTrust Park, and allowed eight hits and three runs in 5.0 innings...Did not factor in the decision.
  - A* Surrendered all three runs in the first inning and allowed the first two hitters to reach in the second, before retiring 11 of the next 13 hitters, including the final eight he faced.
  - A* Picked A.J. Pollock off first base in the opening inning, his fifth pickoff of the season...His five pickoffs are tied for second most in the majors.
- A* Won five consecutive starts from July 15-August 13, becoming the first Atlanta pitcher to win five consecutive starts since Mike Minor won five in a row between the 2012 and 2013 seasons.
- A* Missed nine games with a blister on his left index finger, July 16-July 27.
  - A* Was his second career stint on the Braves' injured list due to a blister...Missed from July 6 to July 29 of last season with a blister on his left third finger.
- A* Appeared in 20 games before the All-Star break, and set full-season career highs in wins (9), games (20), starts (18), innings (98.2) and strikeouts (97).
  - A* Went 9-4 with a 4.29 ERA (47 ER/98.2 IP) before the break...His nine wins were the most by a Braves lefty before the All-Star break since 2013, when both Paul Maholm and Mike Minor had nine...No Braves left-hander has won more since Tom Glavine had 11 wins at the break in 2002.
  - A* His nine wins were second most by a left-hander in the National League... Only the Dodgers' Hyun-Jin Ryu won more (10 wins).
- A* Allowed seven hits and two runs over 6.0 innings, 4/16 vs. ARI...Walked one and struck out three.
  - A* Opened the season with 16.2 innings without allowing an earned run, before Arizona scored twice in the fourth...It was the longest streak without an earned run to open the season by a Braves pitcher since 2013 (Paul Maholm, 25.1 IP).
