BIRD WATCHING: The St. Louis Cardinals wrap up their home slate at Busch Stadium today with the finale of a three-game series against the Washington Nationals ... The Cardinals are 3-5 on their season-long nine-game homestand against the White Sox (2-1), Giants (1-2), and Nationals (0-2), and looking to snap a four-game losing skid while avoiding their first series sweep to the Nationals since April 29-May 1, 2016 at Busch Stadium ... St. Louis enters today in 4th place in the National League Central and is eliminated from the postseason ... Following today's game, the Cardinals embark on a season-ending six-game road trip through Pittsburgh and Milwaukee, beginning with a scheduled open date in the Steel City tomorrow.

HOMEWORK ASSIGNMENT: Today's home finale on September 20 marks the earliest St. Louis has wrapped up a home schedule since Sept. 19, 1954 at Sportsman's Park ... The Cardinals are 12-8 in regular season home finales since Busch Stadium III opened in 2006.

GAMES THAT MATTER: Since 2011 Opening Day, the Cardinals have played 2,455 out of a possible 2,488 regular season games (98.7%) during which they still maintained playoff aspirations and had not yet been eliminated.

AN ERA OF EXCELLENCE: St. Louis needs to go 6-1 to finish with a .500 record and avoid consecutive losing campaigns in full seasons (78-84 in 2025) for the first time since **1958** (72-82) and **1959** (71-83) ... The **67 years** represents the 2nd-longest timespan all-time by any franchise of the four major North American sports leagues (MLB, NBA, NFL, & NHL). - excludes those shortened by war, work stoppages, or COVID)

• The **NHL's Montréal Canadiens** hold the record of **80 years** between consecutive full losing seasons occurring from 1938-39 to 1941-42 (4 seasons), and then again during the 2021-22 and 2022-23 seasons.

• The **Los Angeles Dodgers** have the 2nd-longest active streak, last experiencing losing seasons **39 years** ago from 1986-87.

YOUNGRY: The three youngest active MLB rosters include the **Nationals** (25.8 yrs), **Giants** (26.1), and **Cardinals** (26.5) ... Washington (1,864) and St. Louis (1,820) lead MLB this season in combined games by players age 27 or younger ... The 1,820 games by Cardinals are a single-season franchise record, surpassing the **1977** Redbirds (1,727), while the 1993 Expos hold the MLB record of 2,039 games played by age 27 and younger.

OUCH: **Ivan Herrera's** MLB-high 30 hit-by-pitches are 2nd-most in Cardinals single-season history behind only **Steve Evans** (31 in 1910) ... St. Louis has been plunked 93 times this season, 4th in MLB this season and most in franchise single-season history.

FLY IT BACK: The Springfield Cardinals (AA) continue their quest to repeat as Texas League champions for the first time in franchise history when they travel to the Texas Panhandle for the first game of the best-of-3 Texas League Championship vs. the Amarillo Sod Poodles (AA-Diamondbacks) ... RHP **Tanner Franklin** starts Game 1 tonight at 6:05 p.m. at Hodgetown Stadium ... Game 2 and Game 3 (if necessary) of the Texas League Championship will be at Route 66 Stadium on Tuesday, Sept. 22 and Wednesday, Sept. 23.

THIS DATE IN CARDINALS HISTORY (September 20, 1986): **Ricky Horton** allows one run in a complete game victory as the Cardinals top the Expos at Montréal's Olympic Stadium ... **Andy Van Slyke** and **Tom Herr** both provided RBI doubles in the 3-1 win.

Drew Milas was born in Swansea, Ill., graduated from Belleville East (Ill.) High School...played college baseball at Missouri State Univ. (2017-19).

Nationals hitting coach **Matt Borgschulte** was a coach for the 2017 Florida State League co-champion Palm Beach Cardinals...played college baseball at Drury Univ. in Springfield, Mo. (2012-13).

Cardinals broadcaster **Ricky Horton** played college baseball at the Univ. of Virginia (1978-80).

Nationals Asst. Hitting Coach/Asst. Director of Hitting **Andrew Aydt** played baseball at McKendree University in Lebanon, Ill., from 2017-19.

Cardinals President of Baseball Operations **Chaim Bloom** worked with Nationals President of Baseball Operations **Paul Toboni**, as well as Nationals Assistant GMs **Justin Horowitz** and **Devin Pearson**, and Special Assistant to the President of Baseball Operations **Andrew Wright**, in the Boston Red Sox front office while Bloom was the Chief Baseball Officer for four seasons from 2020-23... Toboni served as director of amateur scouting, and VP of amateur scouting and player development (2020-23)...Horowitz was a special assistant in amateur scouting...Pearson was assistant director of amateur scouting (2020-22) and director of amateur scouting (2022-23), and Wright was the minor league field coordinator (2023).

Nationals Social Media Marketing Director **Matt Turer** previously worked for the Springfield Cardinals (AA).

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Vince Coleman** made his Major League debut vs. Montreal (Apr. 18, 1985 at Busch II).

Nationals broadcaster **Charlie Slowes** worked three years at KMOX in St. Louis (1984-86).

Nationals.TV reporter **Alexa Datt** covered the Cardinals as a studio host and reporter for Bally/FanDuel Sports Midwest from 2022-25.

Nationals Communications Manager **Daniel Kurish** was born in St. Louis.

Cardinals Communications Gameday Associate **Sean Rocca** was born and raised in Norfolk, Va., and often attended Cardinals-Nationals games at Nationals Park.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER:

- Southern California native makes his 8th career Major League start today and first career start against an N.L. East opponent.
- Currently ranked as the No. 11 prospect in the Cardinals organization by *Baseball America*.
- Is 2-0 with a 1.46 ERA in 2 starts at Busch Stadium and 0-3 with a 4.68 ERA in 5 road starts.
- Has received 3 runs of support or fewer in all 7 of his Major League starts.
- The Cardinals 4th round draft pick out of Stanford University in 2023. Originally selected by the Rays in the 19th round in the 2022 MLB Draft.
- 2024 Cardinals and Baseball America Minor League Pitcher of the Year.
- Led the 2026 International League in strikeouts (111) and opponent BA (.170); and ranked in the Top 10 in ERA (3.13, 2nd), games started (19, 2nd), innings pitched (92.0, 5th) and WHIP (1.14, 4th) when he was first called up (Aug. 1).
- Since the beginning of 2024, ranks 2nd in all of Minor League Baseball with 437 strikeouts, trailing only the Mets **Jonah Tong** (472). Ranks 4th in qualifying ERA (3.19) at recent recall.
- Led all of Minor League Baseball in 2024 with 202 strikeouts, T-7th most in a single-season by any Cardinals minor league pitcher (since 1962).

LAST TIME OUT (September 14 at Busch Stadium vs. SF): W, 2-1; 6.2 IP, 4 H, 1 R, 1 ER, 2 BB, 8 SO - 99 pitches

- Pitched a career-high 6.2 innings in a 2-1 win over San Francisco in his 2nd career start at Busch Stadium.
- Struck out a career-high 8 batters.
- Received 2 runs of support, marking his 7th straight start getting 3 runs of support or less.

2026 SEASON:

RE-DEFINING SCORING POSITION: Has allowed one hit over his last 3 starts covering 16 batters (1-12, 4 walks).

MEET ME IN ST. LOUIS: Made his first career start at Busch Stadium on Aug. 28 and earned his 1st career with career-high 5.2 innings, most innings by a Cardinals rookie left hander since **Matthew Liberatore** (8.0 IP on Aug. 10, 2023 at Tampa Bay) ... Quinn's 102 pitches were a professional high (2024-26) and most is most thrown since his 156-pitch complete game in the Stanford Super Regional win against Texas on June 11, 2023 (16 SO) ... Became the first Cardinal w/ 7+ strikeouts in his first career start at Busch Stadium since **Luke Weaver** (7K vs. OAK on 8/26/16).

THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE HOME: Became the first Cardinals pitcher (6th all-time) to make his first three starts of the road. Previous was **Howie Pollet** in 1941 (Aug. 20-28). - *Elias Sports Bureau*

OH, CANADA!: Was the first Cards starting pitcher to make his Major League debut in Canada since **Rick Ankiel** on August 23, 1999 at Montreal's Olympic Stadium vs. the Expos.

HATCHED: Is one 13 Cardinals (8 pitchers) to make their Major League debuts this season.

WALKING IN MEMPHIS: Began the season in the Memphis (AAA) rotation and held his opposition to three hits or fewer in 15-of-21 Triple-A starts.

BULL-YING DURHAM: Struck out a season-high 10 over 7.0 IP in a 7-3 Redbirds win vs. Durham (7/24) on the start before his MLB debut.

SUMMER LOVING: Over his final 12 starts with Memphis (AAA) from May 28-August 12, went 4-1 with a 1.99 ERA and 76 strikeouts over 63.1 innings pitched (10.8 K/9 IP) including a 1.01 WHIP.

SIX FOR THE FIX: Made four scoreless starts with three of them 6.0 innings or more with a season-high 7.0 IP, two-hitter at Gwinnett (Braves).

PERSONAL (More info on Cardinals Media Guide Pages 145-148):

- Threw a 156-pitch complete game in the Stanford Super Regional win against Texas on June 11, 2023, striking out 16 batters.
- Has a strong interest in cryptocurrency and before baseball wanted to pursue a career as an investment banker.
- Boasts that he's the best player at any board game and is often seen playing pub trivia at Cardinals Spring Training.
- His older sister, Remy, played soccer at Rice University (2017-18).

MATHEWS vs. WASHINGTON:

- Making his first career start against the Nationals and also his first National League East Division opponent.
- Has faced Jose Tena (2-3, K) and Yohandy Morales (1-3, RBI, 2 K) in his lone start vs. Rochester last season (9/5/25) at Autozone Park.
- Allowed his lone hit in a 2.0 inning scoreless app., to Andres Chaparro (1-1, single) while facing the Florida Complex Nationals (5/19/25) in Jupiter.
