**RECENT REDBIRDS:** The Cardinals continue their six-day, eight-game homestand by welcoming the San Francisco Giants to Busch Stadium in the opener of a four-game series...St. Louis began its homestand by taking three of four from Cincinnati over back-to-back doubleheaders this weekend...this afternoon's 1:15 p.m. first pitch is St. Louis' fifth over a 49-hour span over Labor Day weekend, which began with Saturday's 12:15 p.m. homestand opener.

**TIME TO FLY:** Winners of 12 of 15, and 18 of their last 23, the Cardinals sport the best record (18-5, .783) across MLB since August 9 and the National League (32-16, .667) since the All-Star break. St. Louis enters today in first place in the NL Central, 3.0 games ahead of Chicago & 6.0 in front of Milwaukee.

**LABOR DAY:** The Cardinals are 90-103-3 all-time on Labor Day, including a 51-29-2 mark at home (2-3 at Busch Stadium III). The Cardinals are 2-3 vs. the Giants all-time on Labor Day, with the two teams last facing off 60 years ago on **September 7, 1959** at Seals Stadium in San Francisco in a 4-2 Cardinals loss started by 23-year-old rookie **Bob Gibson** (17-year-old **Tim McCarver** made his MLB debut with St. Louis three days later on Sept. 10, 1959 at Milwaukee). St. Louis previously played a pair of Labor Day doubleheaders against the New York Giants at the Polo Grounds, first being swept as the "Browns" in **1897** before changing their name to the "Cardinals" and sweeping the Giants in **1902**.

**SOSA JOINS ST. LOUIS:** Prior to today's series opener with the Giants, infielder **Edmundo Sosa** was recalled from Memphis (AAA) to become the 34th active player on the Cardinals roster. Sosa, who made his Major League debut last season vs. San Francisco (Sept. 23 at Busch Stadium) previously appeared in three games for St. Louis this July.

**MONDAY FUNDAY:** The Cardinals (11-2) and New York Yankees (11-3) are the only two teams in the Majors with 11 wins on Mondays.

**THREE'S COMPANY:** The Cardinals are 71-25 (.740) when scoring three runs or more in a game this season, including a 30-3 mark since the All-Star Break.

**LAND OF THE GIANTS:** At 6 feet, 7 inches tall, outfielder **José Martínez** is the tallest position player in Cardinals franchise history according to Baseball-Reference records. Also listed at 6 feet, 7 inches, **Adam Wainwright** and **Andrew Miller** tie for the 3rd-tallest pitchers in franchise history, one inch shorter than southpaw **Lee Guetterman** (1993) and righty **Mike Naymick** (1944).

**HOME SWEET HOME:** The Cardinals and Houston are both 13-2 at home since August 1, tying for MLB's highest home win pct (.867). Overall this season, St. Louis is 43-25 at Busch Stadium with a .632 home win pct. (3rd in NL)...this four-game series with the Giants ends a stretch of the Cardinals playing 15 of 18 games at home since August 19.

**JOHNSON CITY ADVANCES:** The Rookie-Advanced Johnson City Cardinals advanced to the best-of-three Appalachian League Championship series last night after defeating the Bristol Pirates, 7-5. Game 1 against the Burlington Royals is scheduled for 5:30 p.m. CT tonight in Johnson City. 2019 marks the Cardinals' first trip to the postseason since winning the 2016 Appy League Championship.

**THIS DATE IN CARDINALS HISTORY (September 2, 1996):** 37-year-old **Willie McGee** and 41-year-old **Ozzie Smith** combine for seven hits, four runs, and six RBI in an come-from-behind, walk-off 8-7 win over Houston in 10 innings on Labor Day at Busch Stadium II. McGee's game-winning RBI single scored Smith, who tied his career high by scoring four runs, one of them on the final home run of his 19-year Hall of Fame career (off **Darryl Kile** in the 4th inning).

#### SAN FRANCISCO CONNECTIONS

**Tommy Edman** played college baseball at Stanford University (2014-16).

**Tyler Webb** (2010-13) and **Sam Dyson** (2008-10) were teammates at the Univ. of South Carolina, where they won the 2010 College World Series.

**Jack Flaherty** made his MLB debut (Sept. 1, 2017) at San Francisco...became the 15th youngest Cardinal to make MLB debut in a start at 21 years and 321 days old.

**Paul Goldschmidt** and **Andrew Miller** were teammates with **Buster Posey** and **Brandon Crawford** on the gold-winning United States squad in the 2017 World Baseball Classic.

**Paul Goldschmidt** made his MLB debut at Oracle Park in San Francisco while with Arizona (Aug. 1, 2011)...singled in first career plate appearance off **Matt Cain** (Aug. 1, 2011)...homered off **Tim Lincecum** for first MLB home run (Aug. 2, 2011).

**Dexter Fowler** made his MLB debut vs. San Francisco while with Colorado (Sept. 2, 2008) as a pinch runner (caught stealing second base).

**Harrison Bader** hit his first MLB homerun on Sept. 1, 2017 at San Francisco, a two-run blast off **Johnny Cueto**. **Bader** and Giants pitcher **Shaun Anderson** were teammates at the University of Florida for two seasons (2014-15).

**Willie McGee** played four seasons (1991-95) with the Giants...was born in San Francisco...graduated from Harry Ells High School in Richmond, Calif...played college baseball at Diablo Valley College in Pleasant Hill, Calif...resides in Hercules, Calif...worked as an assistant coach for Contra Costa College in San Pablo, Calif.

**Adam Wainwright** homered on the first pitch of his first career at-bat (May 24, 2006) at Oracle Park, a solo blast off **Noah Lowry**.

**Donovan Solano** played seven minor league seasons in the Cardinals organization (2005-11).

Giants Coach & Video Replay Analyst **Shawon Dunston** played parts of two seasons with St. Louis (1999-2000)...signed with the Cardinals as a free agent twice, sandwiched around being traded to the Mets for **Craig Paquette** (July 31, 1999).

**Kyle Barraclough** was selected by the Cardinals in the 7th round of the 2012 MLB Draft...pitched parts of four seasons in the Cardinals minor league system (2012-15)...traded by St. Louis to Miami for pitcher **Steve Cishek** (July 24, 2015).

Giants Outfield & Baserunning Coord. & Cardinals Hall of Famer **Vince Coleman** played six seasons in St. Louis (1985-90)...was two-time NL All-Star (1988-89) and 1985 Rookie of the Year...led the NL in stolen bases in all six seasons...selected by St. Louis in the 10th round of the 1982 MLB Draft.

Giants Community Ambassador and Hall of Famer **Orlando Cepeda** played parts of three seasons with St. Louis (1966-68)...in 1967 with St. Louis, started at first base for the NL in the All-Star Game, recognized as the NL MVP and won the World Series...traded by the Cardinals to Atlanta for catcher/infielder **Joe Torre** (March 17, 1969).

Sacramento River Cats (AAA) Pitching Coach **Steve Kline** pitched four seasons in St. Louis (2001-04).

Giants Special Assistant **Will Clark** played part of his final professional season (2000) with St. Louis...slashed .345/.441/.621 in eight Postseason games with St. Louis...became a Cardinal via trade with Baltimore with cash in exchange for infielder **José León** (July 31, 2000).

Giants Minor League Pitching Instructor and 2019 Hall of Fame Inductee **Lee Smith** pitched for the Cardinals for parts of four seasons (1990-93)...was two-time NL All-Star (1991-92)...became all-time career saves leader with St. Louis (April 13, 1993)...became a Cardinal via trade with the Red Sox for outfielder **Tom Brunansky** (May 4, 1990)...later traded to the Yankees for pitcher **Rich Batchelor** (Aug. 31, 1993).

Cardenales broadcaster **Bengie Molina** played parts of four seasons with the Giants (2007-10).

Giants broadcaster **Duane Kuiper** is a graduate of Southern Illinois University in Carbondale, Ill.

**TODAY'S GAME**

- Makes his 26th start of the season (311th career start) and his 378th career appearance today, facing the Giants for the first time this season.
- Needs one win for his 10th career double-digit win season which would tie Bob Forsch for 3rd all-time among Cardinals and make him lone active pitcher to do so in the N.L.
- He and Yadier Molina have been a starting battery for 259 games, 8th-most all-time in Major League history (since 1908).
- Ranks 9th among active pitchers with a 3.40 ERA (min. 1,500 IP) and 15th in starts.
- Has reached the 100 inning threshold in a season for first time since 2017 (123.1) and 100 strikeouts for first time since 2016 (161).
- Has a 62-35 (.639) career mark in post All-Star break games with a 3.44 ERA. He ranks 5th among active NL pitchers in career post All-Star winning pct.
- Passed Bill Sherdel (1918-30, '32) for 4th all-time in wins (154) in franchise history in his 7/14 start vs. ARI. Is just six wins back of Bob Forsch (163) for 3rd all-time.
- Is one of five Cardinal pitchers to make 300 or more career starts, joining Bob Gibson (482), Bob Forsch (401), Jesse Haines (387), and Bill Doak (320).
- Since 2016, St. Louis sports a 54-35 record (.607 win pct) in his games pitched.

**LAST TIME OUT**

- Allowed two runs on six hits in 3.2 innings for a no-decision in St. Louis' 12-2 win over the Brewers at Miller Park in last Monday's series opener.
- Exited with two outs and runners on first and second with the Cardinals leading 7-2.

- Has thrown his curve ball 34.0% of his total pitches (785 of 2,307) this season, with the opposition batting .261 (46-176 with three home runs and 59 strikeouts). Only Yankees RHP Domingo German (36.7%) & Rays RHP Charlie Morton (36.8%) throw a higher pct. of curve balls in MLB (min. 2,000 total pitches) (Statcast).
- 8.2% of his curve balls (189) have been called for strikes, highest in MLB (minimum 2,000 total pitches), matching Boston's Matt Barnes. (Statcast)
- Is 6-3, 2.67 ERA in 12 home starts, sporting the T8th-best (with Jack Flaherty) home ERA in the National League. He's 3-6, 6.54 ERA in 13 road starts.

- In his last appearance vs. SF (9/22/18), came away with a no-decision in STL's come-from-behind 5-4 win in 10 inn. at Busch Std, throwing season-high 104 pitches.
- Is lifetime 38-22 in 78 games (63 starts) against the NL West. His 38 wins rank 1st all-time among all active pitchers who have never pitched for an NL West team.
- Earned the win May 24, 2006 at SF and homered on the first pitch of his first career at-bat, joining Hoyt Wilhelm (NY Giants, 1952) and John Montefusco (SF Giants, 1974) as only relievers to hit their first home run and gain win in the same game.
- Two of his 22 career complete games have been against SF: July 1, 2009 in a 2-1 win in which he struck out 12 and June 1, 2013 in a 7-1 win when he fanned 10.
- Has faced the Giants three times in the Postseason: 1-1 with a 2.41 ERA in 3 starts.
