TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue the 3-game series against the New York Yankees (1-0)...Seattle also wrapped up a 4-game set against the Cleveland Guardians (2-2) to begin the season-opening homestand...tonight's game will be televised and streamed on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Ryan Rowland-Smith** on the call and **Angie Mentink** serving as field reporter...it will also be simulcast on **TBS** (out of network only) with **Brian Anderson**, **Jeff Francoeur** and **Ron Darlingon** the call...the game will be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.** on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners won last night's series opener against the Yankees by a 2-1 score in walk-off fashion, Seattle's first walk-off win of the season.

- **Walk-Off Wonder** - The Mariners have recorded 22 walk-off plate appearances since the start of the 2024 season, the most in the Majors during that span.

- **New Faces** - Five players have made their Mariners debut this season: RHP **Cooper Criswell**, RHP **Cole Wilcox**, INF **Brendan Donovan**, OF **Rob Refsnyder**, and LHP **José A Ferrer**...on the Mariners Opening Day roster this year, 22 of 26 players had suited up for Seattle in 2025...Wilcox was recalled from Triple-A Tacoma on March 27.

A STELLAR STARTING STAFF...in 5 games to begin the 2026 season, the Mariners starting pitching staff (**Logan Gilbert**, **George Kirby**, **Bryan Woo**, **Emerson Hancock** and **Luis Castillo**) has posted a combined 1.84 ERA (6 ER, 29.1 IP) with 38 strikeouts compared to 6 walks...among all MLB starting pitching staffs, their 38 strikeouts lead the Majors and their ERA ranks 3rd behind only the Yankees (4 G, 0.89 ERA) and Braves (4 G, 1.57 ERA)...they also rank 2nd in WHIP (0.65) and 2nd in opponent batting average (.133)...Hancock's performance on Sunday headlined the starters season debuts, after he became the first Mariners pitcher to toss 6.0+ innings and 9+ strikeouts without allowing a hit since Félix Hernández's Perfect Game on Aug. 15, 2012.

DONOVAN DELIVERS...**Brendan Donovan** has reached base safely 13 times and in all 5 games to begin the season, becoming 1 of 7 players to reach base 13+ times within their first 5 games with the Mariners and the first since Shawn O'Malley in 2015 (13 TOB)...Donovan has also tallied multiple hits in 4 games this season, including the last 3-consecutive games, which ties a career-high streak of multi-hit games (done 6x)...in 2026, Donovan is batting .444 (6x18) with 4 runs, 1 double, 2 home runs, 4 RBI, 3 walks and 1 stolen base...on Opening Day, Donovan homered in his first plate appearance, becoming the first player in Mariners history to hit a leadoff home run on Opening Day.

YOUNG & FUN...**Cole Young** last night went 3-for-4 with 1 double and 1 RBI, extending his hitting streak to 4 games (3/27-c) and capturing his 3rd career 3-hit game...in 19 plate appearances to begin the season, Young is batting .368 (6x18) with 2 doubles, 1 home run, 4 RBI and 1 walk...on Friday against the Guardians, Young broke open the scoring in the 4th inning with a 3-run home run.

HOME FIELD ADVANTAGE...the Mariners went 51-30 (.630) at their home ballpark, T-Mobile Park in 2025, the 6th-best home record in MLB and 2nd-best in the AL...Seattle was also an MLB-best 26-9 (.743) at home after the All-Star Break last year, which included a franchise-record tying 11-consecutive wins at home (Aug. 27-Sept. 25) matching the mark set from May 20-June 8, 2001.

HEAR IT FROM THE PLAYERS:

MARINERS TV...the Mariners announced that Mariners TV will bring Mariners Baseball to fans across television and streaming services throughout the region...in-market streaming will be available on Mariners TV for \$99.99/season or \$19.99/month...Mariners TV is available across major providers including Xfinity, DIRECTV, Fubo, Spectrum and more...fans can use the channel finder tool on [Mariners.com/Watch](https://mariners.com/watch) to find providers in their area.

THE COACHING STAFF...manager **Dan Wilson** enters his second full season as Mariners skipper...returning to the Mariners coaching staff in the same roles are Bench Coach **Manny Acta**, Major League Coach and Director of Pitching Strategy **Trent Blank**, Assistant Pitching Coach and Major League Pitching Strategist **Danny Farquhar**, Infield Coach **Perry Hill**, Asst. Hitting Coach **Bobby Magallanes**, Senior Director of Hitting Strategy **Edgar Martinez**, Hitting Coach **Kevin Seitzer**, Pitching Coach **Pete Woodworth** and First Base Coach **Eric Young Jr.**...joining the staff this season are Third Base Coach **Carlos Cardoza**, Major League Field Coordinator **Jake McKinley** and Bullpen Coach **Austin Nola**...**Fleming Báez** and **Justin Novak** both return as Bullpen Catchers.

NAYL'D IT...first baseman **Josh Naylor** signed a 5-year contract through the 2030 season on Nov. 17, 2025 to remain in Seattle...Naylor was originally acquired by the Mariners from the Diamondbacks prior to the trade deadline on July 24, 2025...in 54 regular season games after the trade, Naylor hit .299 (58x194) with 32 runs, 10 doubles, 9 home runs, 33 RBI and went 19-for-19 in stolen base attempts, getting on base at a .341 clip and slugging .490 (.831 OPS).

AS YOU MAY KNOW...**Cal Raleigh** gave the Mariners the 2-1 win last night over the Yankees after recording a walk-off single in the bottom of the 9th inning, his 5th career walk-off plate appearance, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...that since 2022, Raleigh has recorded 20 go-ahead hits in the 7th inning or later, which ranks 2nd in the Majors...he trails only teammate **Josh Naylor**, who was tallied 24 go-ahead hits in the 7th inning or later during that span...Seattle batters have also recorded 124 such hits during that timeframe, tied for 2nd most in MLB (also: Toronto Blue Jays) behind only the Cleveland Guardians (125 H).

ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - MARCH 31

- **1996** - Alex Rodriguez' single in the 12th inning gave the Mariners a 3-2 Opening Day win vs. White Sox before a national audience on ESPN.

- **2014** - Félix Hernández struck out 11 batters in 6.0 innings in his club-record 7th Opening Day start leading the Mariners to a 10-3 on Opening Day win over the Angels...it was the eighth straight Opening Day win for the Mariners...Justin Smoak went 2-for-4 with a 3-run home run and a double to lead the offense...the Mariners set an Opening Day club record with 7 extra base hits.

- **2018** - Ichiro Suzuki recorded his 3,801st and 3,802nd career hits, passing Hall-of-Famer Cap Anson 21st-most all-time, in a 5-6 Mariners loss to Cleveland.

ABOUT LOGAN GILBERT...

- Gilbert, 28, is making his second start of the 2026 season and first against the New York Yankees... it is the 148th start and of his career and 8th against the Yankees.
- Selected by Seattle in the 1st round (14th overall) of the 2018 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Rob Mummau on June 16, 2018.
- Spent 3 seasons at Stetson (FL) University, 2016-18...in 2017, was ASUN Pitcher of the Year and ASUN 1st-Team All-Conference.
- Named the 2022 and the 2024 Mariners Most Valuable Pitcher by the Seattle Chapter of the BBWAA.
- Named to his 1st All-Star team in 2024.

LAST TIME OUT...On March 26 vs. Cleveland, made his second consecutive Opening Day start and allowed 3 runs on 5 hits (1 HR) over 5.1 innings pitched with 7 strikeouts and no walks allowed...became the only pitcher in Mariners history to strike out 7+ while issuing no walks on Opening Day, having done so in back-to-back seasons.

KING WORTHY OPENING DAY...became the third Mariner in franchise history with 7+ strikeouts in multiple Opening Day starts, joining Félix Hernández (done 4x: 2007, 2013, 2014, 2015) and Hall of Famer Randy Johnson (done 4x: 1993, 1995, 1996, 1998).

WORK THROUGH 5...his March 26 outing vs. Cleveland was his only career start where he has struck out 7 batters and walked none through 5.1 or fewer innings...he is the 15th Mariners starting pitcher to do so.

CAN'T TOUCH THIS... threw his 4-seam 29 times in his Opening Day start for 33.7% of his pitch total, his most used pitch in the start...allowed no hits on the pitch...the only contact made was on 6 foul balls and a pop out caught in foul territory...this is only the 8th time in his career he has recorded a 0% hard hit rate on his 4-seamer.

HOT START... is 7-2 with a 2.44 career ERA (34 ER, 125.2 IP) and 151 strikeouts across 22 starts in March/April...his 151 strikeouts in the opening month of the season ranks 5th-most in Mariners history...his 2.44 career ERA through March/April also ranks 5th-best among Mariners in these months (min. 1 GS).

HOME SWEET HOME...his 2.24 home ERA (17 ER, 68.1 IP) across 13 starts last season ranks 5th-best in Mariners history (min. 13 GS) while his 0.761 WHIP ranked best in franchise history and his 13.30 strikeouts-per-nine innings was second to Randy Johnson's 13.66 SO/9 mark in 1997.

KEEPING IT IN THE PARK...Over a combined 39 plate appearances against the Yankees top power hitters in Aaron Judge, Giancarlo Stanton, and Cody Bellinger, Gilbert has only allowed one home run to the trio of sluggers.

MOVING ON UP...he will make his 148th Mariners start tonight to move up the Mariners all-time starts leader board from T-9 to T-7 (also: Marco Gonzales, Joel Piñeiro)...with a win tonight, his Mariners win-loss % will move from .566 to .571, surpassing John Halama's .569, ranking at no. 9 in the Mariners Win-Loss % rankings and falling in just behind **George Kirby** at rank 8 (.575).

WHERE IT RANKS...his 11.9 SO/9 last season is the 4th-best mark among starters in a single season in Mariners history (trailing Randy Johnson's 1995, '97, '98 seasons) while his 9.539 career SO/9 ratio is tied for the 3rd-best in franchise history (min. 500 IP), trailing Jam Paxton's 9.545 and Randy Johnson's 10.585 career SO/9 mark.

TRIO OF SORTS...was 1 of 3 Mariners to toss 13+ strikeouts with 1-or-fewer walks in a game last season, joining **Bryan Woo** (13 SO and 1 BB, 9/13 vs. LAA) and **George Kirby** (2x, last: 14 SO, 0 BB, 7/14 vs. LAA)...they are the first trio to do so in Mariners history and are also the first team in MLB to have 3 different players toss 13+ strikeouts with 1-or-fewer walks in a game since the 2018 Astros.

PLENTY OF PUNCHIES...tossed 7+ strikeouts in 15 of his 25 starts last season, doing so in 5 consecutive starts to begin the season (3/27-4/19)...also tossed 10+ strikeouts in 4 games last season (last: 8/24 vs. ATH)...his 9 career games with 10+ strikeouts are tied with Mike Moore for the 5th-most such games in Mariners history, trailing James Paxton (11), Mark Langston (28), Félix Hernández (35), Randy Johnson (94).

AMONG THE GREATS...his 3.59 career ERA (335 ER, 840.2 IP) is 7th-best among starters in Mariners history (min. 500 IP), trailing Randy Johnson, Félix Hernández, Hisashi Iwakuma, and James Paxton who each hold a 3.42 career ERA, **Luis Castillo** (3.46), and **George Kirby** (3.57)...his 891 career strikeouts are 6th-most in Mariners history.

AMONG THE LEAGUE...his 891 strikeouts since 2021 lead the American League while his 840.2 innings pitched are 3rd most in the AL across that span.

2025 TOTALS...in 25 regular season starts, went 6-6 with a 3.44 ERA (50 ER, 131.0 IP) with 173 strikeouts and 31 walks, posting a 1.031 WHIP...led the Majors in strikeouts-per-nine innings (11.89), and ranked 2nd in strikeout rate (32.3%) during the regular season (min. 100.0 IP).

2025 POSTSEASON...went 1-1 with a 4.20 ERA (7 ER, 15.0 IP), striking out 14 batters and allowing 19 hits (2 HR) and 3 walks... tossed 2.0 innings of scoreless relief in Game 5 of the ALDS against the Tigers at T-Mobile Park, in the 3-2 win that lasted 15 innings...marked Gilbert's first career professional relief appearance.
