The Mariners face the Astros for the 3rd of 4 series matchups this season... Seattle, who has already clinched the season series against the Astros, will also host Houston for a 2-game set during the final homestand of the year, from Sept. 22-23.

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TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue the 9-game road trip with the second of 3 games against the Houston Astros (0-1)...Seattle faced the New York Yankees (1-2) on the road trip and will also travel to Milwaukee to face the Brewers (3 G, 8/18-8/20) on the trip...tonight's game will be televised and streamed live on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith**, Mariners Hall of Famer **Jay Buhner** and **Dave Valle** on the call and **Brad Adam** serving as field reporter...the game will be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Gary Hill Jr.** and **Ryan Rowland-Smith** on the call.

ODDS & ENDS...the Mariners fell in last night's series opener to the Astros by a 10-7 score in 10 innings... Seattle trailed 5-2 and fought back to tie it, even taking a 7-5 lead in the 10th inning.

- **Remarkable Consistency** - Tonight's starter **Emerson Hancock** carries a 3.63 ERA (21 ER, 52.0 IP) in 10 road starts, and a 3.13 ERA (24 ER, 69.0 IP) in 12 home starts this season.
- **Julio, Though!** - **Julio Rodríguez** has reached base safely in 13 consecutive games (7/31-c), batting .304 (14x46) with 3 homers, 6 RBI, 10 walks and 3 stolen bases, getting on base at a .429 clip, slugging .522 with a .951 OPS across 56 plate appearances during that stretch.

IF YOU SMELL WHAT THE BROCK IS COOKING...infielder **Brock Rodden** (#90) made his Major League debut last night, starting at shortstop and batting ninth...Rodden had a debut to remember, supplying the game-tying, automatic double in the 8th inning, becoming the first player in franchise history with a game-tying (or go-ahead) extra-base hit in the 8th inning or later of his Major League debut...Brock also added a sacrifice fly in the 10th...in a corresponding move, infielder **Colt Emerson** was placed on the 10-day Injured List with left wrist inflammation.

FOURTEEN YEARS AGO TODAY WAS PERFECT...fourteen years ago on August 15, 2012, right-hander **Félix Hernández** threw the 23rd perfect game in Major League history...the 1-0 victory over the Tampa Bay Rays came at T-Mobile Park on a Wednesday afternoon..."King Félix" went 27 up, 27 down with 12 strikeouts on 113 pitches...the late Jesús Montero drove in the game's lone run in the third inning.

- **Hall of Fame Trajectory** - In his second year of eligibility on the BBWAA Hall of Fame ballot, **Hernández** saw a historic rise in vote percentage -- going from 20.6% of the vote on his first ballot to 46.1% on his second ballot...the 25.56% increase was the highest from Year 1 to Year 2 in BBWAA voting history (1967-c)...everyone to receive at least 43%-or-higher on their second ballot has eventually been elected to the National Baseball Hall of Fame.

SUNDAY PROGRAMMING ALERT...tomorrow's **Sunday Night Baseball** series finale against the Astros will be televised exclusively on **NBC/Peacock** with **Jason Benetti**, **Ryan Rowland-Smith** and **Geoff Blum** on the call, with **Anthony Rizzo** as pregame and field analyst...the game will also air on **ESPN Radio** (in addition to **Seattle Sports 710 AM**), with **Sean Kelley** and **Doug Glanville** on the call for ESPN.

AGAINST THE ASTROS...despite last night's loss, the Mariners are 7-2 against the Astros this season and are 12-3 against them since July 18, 2025...Seattle is also 6-2 over its last 8 games at Daikin Park since Sept. 19, 2025.

RANDY (YOU'RE A FINE GUY)...Randy Arozarena went 2-for-4 with a double and hit-by-pitch last night...the 2025 and '26 All-Star is batting .278 (118x424) with 77 runs, 25 doubles, 1 triple, 16 homers, 52 RBI, 47 walks and 20 stolen bases in 115 games...since his breakout season in 2021, Randy has hit 126 home runs and stolen 145 bases, one of 6 players in the Majors to record 125+ homers and 125+ stolen bases during that span along with Shohei Ohtani-LAA/LAD, José Ramírez-CLE, teammate **Julio Rodríguez**, Trea Turner-3Tms, and Fernando Tatis Jr.-SD.

GREAT APPROACHES...the Mariners scored 7+ runs without a home run last night for the second time this season (other: 6/30 vs. LAA, W 8-3)...Seattle had won 5 consecutive times when scoring 7+ runs with no homers, with last night's loss being the first of its kind since Sept. 25, 2022 at Kansas City...since the start of 2020, Seattle is 13-3 (.813) when scoring 7+ runs with no home runs.

TAKE A WALK ON THE WILD SIDE...the Mariners pitching staff has the lowest walk rate (6.8%) and fewest walks-per-9 innings rate (2.56) in the Majors this season, narrowly ranking 2nd in fewest walks overall (309 BB) to the Rays (308 BB)...Seattle pitchers also lead MLB in strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.38).

JOSHIN' AROUND...over his last 24 games since the All-Star Break (7/17-c), first baseman **Josh Naylor** is batting .322 (28x87) with 10 runs, 6 doubles, 2 home runs, 8 RBI, 9 walks, 5 stolen bases, a .388 OBP and slugging .460 for an .848 OPS...he has reached base safely in 23 of those 24 games and in 30 of his last 32 games (7/4-c).

DOM-INANT...Dominic Canzone, who logged his 1,000th career at-bat in the Majors last night, is on the verge of his first career 20+ homer campaign...the left-handed hitting outfielder has 19 homers and 51 RBI with an .822 OPS and 134 OPS+ in 108 games and 362 plate appearances this season.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...in his Major League debut last night, shortstop **Brock Rodden** recorded 2 RBI, a game-tying double in the 8th inning and a sacrifice fly in the 10th inning, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...Rodden became just the 10th player in Mariners history to record multiple RBI in his debut?...interestingly, all of the first 5 instances came in home games: Jamie Nelson (7/21/1983 vs. BOS), Al Chambers (4 RBI, 7/23/1983 vs. BOS), Alvin Davis (3 RBI, 4/11/1984 vs. BOS), Marc Newfield (7/6/1993 vs. NYY) and Shane Monahan (7/9/1998 vs. ANA), while all 5 of the most recent instances have come in road games: Vladimir Balentien (9/4/2007 at NYY), Abraham Almonte (8/30/2013 at HOU), Dillon Thomas (6/9/2021 at DET), Rhylan Thomas (5/2/2025 at TEX) and **Brock Rodden** (8/14/2026 at HOU).

ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - AUGUST 15

- **1995** - The Minnesota Twins score five unearned runs in the ninth inning to down the Mariners 7-6. The good news was the return of Ken Griffey Jr. to the lineup from his wrist injury (May 26) and the acquisition of the speedy Vince Coleman for a PTBNL (Jim Converse, RHP).
- **1997** - In game one of a doubleheader at Baltimore, Randy Johnson strikes out 15 giving him a two-game total of 32 K's, a new ML record. In game two, Ken Cloude earns his first ML victory in front of 125 family and friends.
- **2005** - **Félix Hernández** becomes the first teenager to strike out at least 10 batters since Dwight 'Doc' Gooden accomplished the feat with the Mets in May of 1984. The 18-year old Mariners rookie righty K's 11 batters in his third career start as the Mariners maul the Royals, 11-3.
- **2012** - **Félix Hernández** threw the 23rd perfect game in Major League Baseball history in a 1-0 win over the Tampa Bay Rays. Felix retired all 27 batters he faced on 113 pitches, recording 12 strikeouts. He had only three 3-ball counts all game. Jesus Montero knocked in the game's only run with a 2-out, RBI single in the 3rd inning to score Brendan Ryan. It was the third no-hitter in 2012 at Safeco Field, the most in one venue in a season since 1917.
- **2025** - The Mariners set a franchise record with 9 doubles in the 11-9 win over the New York Mets.

ABOUT EMERSON HANCOCK...

- The 27-year-old right-handed pitcher is scheduled to make his 22nd start of the season and the 54th of his career...this will be his 60th career appearance, including the 6 relief appearances he made throughout the 2025 regular season...it will mark his 2nd start of the season and 4th career start against the Astros.
- Selected by Seattle in the 1st round (6th overall) of the 2020 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Scott Hunter on June 25, 2020.
- Spent 3 seasons at the University of Georgia, 2018-20... in 2020, was named Vince Dooley Athlete of the Year as the top male student-athlete at the University of Georgia.
- Was named to CoSIDA Academic All-America First Team in 2020.

LAST TIME OUT...on August 9 vs. Tampa Bay, tossed 4.2 innings with 2 runs allowed (2 ER) on 9 hits and 1 walk while striking out 3 batters...threw 96 pitches and 61 strikes.

OUT OF THIS WORLD STUFF...will be making his 4th start against the Astros and his 3rd in Houston...in his first appearance against the team on Aug. 20, 2023, tossed 2.0 scoreless innings with just 2 hits and 2 strikeouts...in each of his last 2 starts against the Astros has allowed 3-or-fewer runs over 5.0+ IP, working a quality start with no walks in his last start at Houston on May 23, 2025...Hancock is 2-0 over his 3 starts while the Mariners are 3-0 when he starts against the Astros.

THE ROAD SO FAR...has recorded 3-or-fewer runs over 5.0+ IP in 7 of his 10 road starts this season, with 5+ strikeouts in 4 of those 7 outings...has recorded 4 starts of 6.0+ innings with 2-or-fewer runs allowed and 6 starts of 5.0+ IP with 2-or-fewer runs allowed...owns a 2.92 ERA (4 ER, 12.1 IP) over his last 3 starts on the road while the Mariners are 5-3 over his last 8 road starts.

THIS SUMMER SURE IS HOT...has allowed 3-or-fewer earned runs over 5.0+ IP in 3 of his last 4 starts...in 5 of his last 7 starts, extending back to June 28, Hancock has allowed 3-or-fewer runs over 5.0+ IP, recording 5+ strikeouts in 4 of the 5...over 7 starts since June 28, owns a 2.75 ERA (11 ER, 36.0 IP) with 30 strikeouts and 11 walks.

QUALITY CONTROL...in his first start of the month on Aug. 8 vs. Detroit, recorded his 11th quality start of the season and his 3rd over his last 6 outings since the start of July...owns 7 quality starts with 1-or-fewer walks, tied for 12th most such starts in the AL (also: 3 others)...has recorded a quality start with 5+ strikeouts and 1-or-fewer walks in 6 starts this season, tied for 9th most in the AL (also: 3 others)...the Mariners are 10-6 when Hancock logs a quality start since the start of 2025.

TRAFFIC CONTROL...his 142 base runners allowed over 121.0 innings in his first 22 starts, is tied for the 7th fewest among pitchers in 2026 through their first 22 games, matching Shota Imanaga-CHC (min. 120.0 IP)...is 1-of-5 Mariners pitchers to record 142-or-fewer base runners over 120.0+ IP through their first 22 starts of the season, joining the rest of the Mariners current pitching staff in **Bryan Woo** (2024, 2025), **Logan Gilbert** (2024, 2026), **Bryce Miller** (2024), and **George Kirby** (2024)...owns a baserunners-per-9 of 10.41, tied for 13th-lowest in the AL in 2026 (min. 100.0 IP)...is 1-of-13 pitchers, along with **Woo** (9 G) and **Gilbert** (10 G), to log 9+ starts with 6-or-fewer base runners allowed over 6.0+ IP this season (last: 7/22 vs. CIN).

CAN'T TOUCH THIS...allowed only 2 hits over 7.0 innings of work on July 5 vs. Blue Jays for his 4th start with 2-or-fewer hits allowed over 6.0+ IP this season...is 1-of-13 pitchers in 2026 with 4+ such starts...is 1-of-14 Mariners pitchers to record 4+ such starts in a single season...has thrown 6.0+ innings with 1-or-fewer hits in 2 starts this season (5/26 at ATH and 3/29 vs. CLE)...is 1 of 10 AL pitchers with multiple such starts this season, joining teammates **Bryan Woo** (5/6 vs. ATL and 4/3 at LAA) and **Logan Gilbert** (5/10 at CWS and 7/4 vs. TOR)...the Mariners have combined for 7 such starts this season, tied for most in MLB.

CHECKING IN...With his start in today's game, Hancock will eclipse his career-high in games pitched in a single season (22 G, 2025)...has already surpassed his 16 starts recorded in 2025...through 21 outings this season has surpassed his previous career highs in IP (116.1) and strikeouts (108) while posting career-high marks in strikeout rate (22.7) and whiff rate (23.2), and owning a 2026 WHIP of 1.116, sitting .217 points lower than his previous career-best WHIP of 1.333 recorded in 2023.

THAT'S RIGHT...owns a 1.033 WHIP against right-handed batters, ranking 10th best in the AL (min. 50.0 IP) while ranking 10th in K/BB (4.78)...has thrown 197 sweepers against right-handed batters, owning a .119 (5x42) opponent batting average on the pitch to rank 8th lowest among pitchers with at least 100 sweepers thrown to righty batters...his K% (45.5) ranks 5th best (min. 100 sweepers)...his 45.5 K% on his sweeper against RHB also ranks 16th-highest among any pitch thrown by a starting pitcher against RHB (min. 100 pitches).

NO FREE PASSES...has allowed 3-or-fewer walks over 5.0 IP in 19-of-22 appearances this season, tied for 10th most in the AL...owns a 2.23 BB/9 is 10th best in the AL (min. 100.0 IP)...has contributed 11 starts with 6.0+ IP and 2-or-fewer walks (last: 8/4 vs. DET) to a Mariners pitching staff that has the 2nd-most such games (61) in 2026.
