RAY REPORT—The Rays continue their nine-game, 10-day road trip against the Rockies (3-0), Mariners (1-0, two to play), and Athletics (three to play) tonight at T-Mobile Park...have won 13 of their last 17 games on the heels of a season-high five-game losing streak (July 12-19)...lead the AL with a 69-46 record, third in the majors...have spent 83 days leading the AL East, 39 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth, including a season-high 42 consecutive days in first (June 27–pres.)...the 83 total days leading their division are fifth most in MLB to the Dodgers (130), Braves (128), Brewers (98), and Guardians (95)...have held the best record in the AL outright for 81 of those days, tied for the second most in team history with the 2021 club behind 2023 (106), per Stats Perform...have held a 4.5-game lead over the second-place Yankees each of the last three days, their largest lead since July 8 (5.0)...their 69-46 record is tied for the second best in team history through 115 games (also: 2023, 2010, 2008), one game behind the 2021 club (70-45).

- ✦ The Rays picked up the series opener in Seattle with a 2-1 victory...**Julio Rodriguez's** home run with two outs in the 9th inning ended a 24.2 scoreless inning streak by the Rays pitching staff dating back to Tues. at COL.
- ✦ **Jonathan Aranda** achieved a single-season career high with his 15th home run of the season...he became the ninth primary first baseman in Rays history to have 15 long balls in a season (last: **Yandy Diaz**, 2023 - 22HR).
- ✦ **Bryan Baker** converted his 22nd consecutive save opportunity (May 17–pres.), tying **Fernando Rodney's** franchise record (May 27–Aug. 13, 2012).
- ✦ After last night, Puyallap, Wash. native **Drew Rasmussen** owns a 0.42 ERA (21.2IP, 1ER) across five career appearances (four starts) at T-Mobile Park, the lowest in the ballpark's history (min. 20.0IP).
- ✦ They improved to a season-high 23 games above .500, their first time reaching the mark since the conclusion of the 2023 season (99-63).
- ✦ The Rays moved to 28-28 on the road, returning to .500 away from Tropicana Field for the first time since July 3 (21-21)...with a win tonight, they can go above .500 on the road for the first time since June 6 (16-15).
- ✦ With a win tonight, the Rays would earn their fifth series win in their last six sets (July 20–pres.) and improve to 9-3-2 over their last 14 series (June 19–pres.)...they would also earn their third straight road series win, matching their longest streak of the campaign (also: April 27–May 13).

HAPPY BIRTHDAY 2 YOU—Today is **Yandy Diaz's** 35th birthday...the two-time All-Star is a .500 (6-for-12) hitter lifetime on his birthday with 3 RBI, 2 R, and a .967 OPS...he became the third player in team history (**Carl Crawford**, Aug. 5, 2007 vs. BAL; **Randy Winn**, June 9, 2002 – both 4) to have a four-hit game on his birthday in 2023 vs. STL...he is one of 30 players in AL history to turn the trick.

- ✦ Only two players have had leadoff home runs on their birthday in team history: **Corey Dickerson** (May 22, 2017 vs. LAA) and **Winn** (June 9, 2002 vs. SD).

MORE BIRTHDAY WISHES—Today is also longtime Rays broadcaster **Dewayne Staats'** 74th birthday...he has been the play-by-play voice of televised Rays games since the club's inaugural season in 1998 and is in his 51st season broadcasting MLB games, having called over 7,000 major league games throughout his career.

ALL HEART. ALL HUSTLE—Yesterday, **Chandler Simpson** was named the Rays 2026 Heart & Hustle Award winner...the award is presented annually to an active player who demonstrates a passion for the game of baseball and best embodies the values, spirit, and traditions of the game.

- ✦ He swiped his 30th base of the season on Wed. at COL, tied for the third most in the majors with **NYJ Jazz Chisholm Jr.** and **CHC Pete Crow-Armstrong** behind **WSH Nasim Nuñez** (40) and **KC Bobby Witt Jr.** (31)...he is one of 18 players in the modern era (since 1900) to reach 30 stolen bases in each of his first two big-league seasons...he also became one of 13 players in the modern era with 100 hits and 30 stolen bases in each of his first two major league seasons (last: **Witt Jr.**, 2022-23).

LA MÁXIMA—**Junior Caminero** launched his 33rd home run of the season Wed. at COL...the blast tied him with **Randy Arozarena** (85) for the 10th-most long balls in franchise history...he is 14 homers behind **Fred McGriff** (99) for ninth on the list...he reached 83 career home runs in 318 career games, tied for the eighth-most home runs in the modern era (since 1900) within a player's first 318 games...he is the first player to reach the mark since within as few games since **SD Fernando Tatis Jr.** (March 28, 2019–June 11, 2023; 93HR).

- ✦ The homer marked his 78th between his age-21 and age-22 seasons (2025-26; age as of June 30), second most in the modern era (since 1900) behind **MLN Eddie Mathews** (87).
- ✦ He is pacing for 46 HR—if he were to reach that mark, he would become the first player in team history with multiple 40-HR seasons and join **Mathews** (1953-54) as the only players in the modern era with multiple such seasons before their age-23 campaign...he would also tie **Carlos Peña's** single-season franchise record (2007).

THE STAFF HAS THE STUFF—Since the beginning of their last homestand on July 24, the Rays pitching staff has turned in a 2.80 ERA (119.0IP, 37ER) in 13 games, with the team going 10-3 over that span...the staff has allowed three runs or fewer in eight of the 13 contests with five shutouts...their five shutout performances came over an 11-game stretch (July 25–Aug. 5), marking their most shutout victories over any 11-game span in team history...opponents have produced a .195/.252/.349 (84-for-430) slash line with a .600 OPS against Rays pitchers since July 24...their opp. AVG, opp. OBP, and opp. OPS all pace the majors over that stretch.

- ✦ Rays starters have turned in five quality starts in the 13 performances with three runs or fewer allowed in 11 of 13...starters over that span have produced more double-digit strikeout contests (2) than outings with three walks or more (1).
- ✦ The bullpen has converted each of its eight save opportunities during that timeframe and has held teams to a .175 (32-for-183) average, pacing the majors in both categories...they have allowed just 16.7 pct. (3/18) of inherited runners to cross the plate, including none of their last eight inherited runners.

LIVE BY THE LONG BALL—The Rays are an MLB-best 34-1 when out-homering their opponent, 19-10 when home runs are even, and 16-35 when being out-homered...per Stats Perform, the Rays .971 winning pct. when out-homering opponents is on pace to be the second best in the modern era (since 1900), trailing the undefeated 1903 New York Highlanders (16-0), and the best by any team with at least 30 such games, outpacing the 1994 Montreal Expos (34-27-947)...the Rays have won 21 consecutive games when out-homering the opposition since their lone loss on May 25 vs. BAL (13 inn.)...they have dropped 22 of 28 contests they have been out-homered in since May 25...on the season, they have not lost a nine-inning game in which they tallied more home runs than their opponent (32-0)...after going without a long ball in five of six games from July 22-28, the Rays have plated 19 of their 35 runs over the last nine games via 12 HR.

- ✦ They are 28-5 in multi-homer games, including seven straight wins (July 20–pres.), and 17-1 when recording multiple long balls at Tropicana Field, with the only loss coming on June 1 vs. DET (10-9).
- ✦ Over their last 37 games since June 25, the Rays pace the AL in multi-homer efforts (18) and are second behind the Tigers (57) for the AL lead in homers (55) over that span over that span.

BAKER THE SAVE MAKER—**Bryan Baker** converted his 22nd straight save opportunity last night to earn his MLB-best 33rd save, as many or more than 22 major league clubs have as a team this season...the 22-save streak is tied for the longest in franchise history (see table on the right) and is MLB's longest active streak...Baker has earned a save in seven of the Rays last nine wins and eight of their last 11 (July 22–pres.)...min. 25.0 IP, he leads the AL with a 0.67 ERA (27.0IP, 2ER) and 0.67 WHIP and ranks second in opp. average (.121/.11-for-91) since the 22-save streak began on May 17...he worked a season-high-tying 13 straight scoreless outings from June 27–Aug. 4 (also: May 17–June 21), the second longest by a Ray this season behind **Kevin Kelly's** 14-appearance span from April 22–May 22.

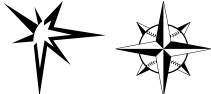
- ✦ Baker is attempting to join **Alex Colomé** (2017, 47) as the only Rays pitchers to lead the majors in saves over a full season...he's already the fifth Ray to hold the outright MLB lead in saves at any point from Aug. 1 on, joining **Colomé**, **Fernando Rodney** (2012, latest date: Sept. 18), **Rafael Soriano** (2010, latest date: Sept. 21), and **Roberto Hernandez** (1999, latest date: Sept. 4), according to Stats Perform.
- ✦ The Rays have won each of the last 20 games Baker has pitched in, the fourth-longest streak in a pitcher's outings in team history, trailing **Emilio Pagan** (25G, 2019), **Soriano** (24G, 2010), and **Percival** (24G, 2008)...across the season, the Rays are 42-5 when he pitches.
- ✦ Collectively, the Rays have recorded an MLB-leading 46 saves, their second most through 115 games in club history (2015, 47SV)...that's good for a pace of 65 saves over a 162-game season, which would establish a team record and mark the third-highest total by any club since saves became an official statistic in 1969, trailing the 1990 White Sox (68) and 2008 Angels (66).
- ✦ The Rays own the majors' best winning pct. in games decided by three runs or fewer (.657/.44-23).

SLEEPLESS IN SEATTLE—The Rays continue their stay in the PNW for a three-game set this weekend against the Mariners...the Rays have won each of their last two sets opposite the Mariners, winning five of their last six contests since being swept in Seattle between Aug. 8-10, 2025...they can win their first series at T-Mobile Park since May 5-8, 2022 (3-1) tonight...since 2016, they have lost seven of their last nine sets (2-7-0) at the ballpark (clubs did not meet in 2020).

TONIGHT’S START—Griffin Jax will toe the rubber tonight for his 19th start and 30th appearance of the year, including his ninth start and 17th outing on the road...marks his 19th straight start after pitching out of the bullpen in each of his first 11 appearances...is the 35th start of his major league career...acquired from the Twins for **RHP Taj Bradley** on July 31, 2025.

- With runners in scoring position and two outs this season, Jax has held opponents to a .121 (4-for-33) average, the ninth-lowest mark in the AL (min. 30BF)...the Rays are the only AL club with three starting pitchers to hold opponents under a .125 average under the same parameters: Jax, **Drew Rasmussen** (.118/4-for-34), and **Nick Martinez** (.109/5-for-46).
- Min. 300 changeups thrown in 2026, Jax’s 41.3 pct. whiff rate on the pitch is the fourth-best mark in the majors, behind DET/LAD **Tarik Skubal** (50.7%), **PHI Christopher Sánchez** (46.4%), and **CHC Jacob Webb** (42.7%).
- Has logged a 3.16 ERA (82.2IP, 29ER) in 18 starts compared to an 8.00 ERA (9.0IP, 8ER) in 11 relief outings this year.

LAST TIME OUT—Was dealt his second consecutive loss after spinning 5.0 innings and allowing three runs (one earned) in a 9-1 loss on Aug. 2 vs. CWS (L, 5.0IP, 4H, 3R-1ER, 8SO, HR)...his two runs allowed in the 1st frame were unearned, the first coming on his own fielding error and the latter on a wild pitch...retired six of his next seven batters through the 3rd inning, setting down five of those via the strikeout...surrendered a first-pitch solo home run to **Andrew Benintendi** to start the 4th, the fourth home run he has allowed on his sweepster this year...retired six of his final seven batters before handing the ball to **Craig Kimbrel** to start the 6th inning.

- Has tossed a career-high 11 consecutive outings of 5.0 IP or more and has allowed three earned runs or fewer in 10 of those appearances.
- Reached 500 career strikeouts after he punched out **Drew Romo** on four pitches in the 2nd inning...has hit the 100-strikeout mark in a season for the first time in his career (100), surpassing his previous season-best 99 punchouts in 2025.
- He has struck out eight batters or more three times this year and four times in his career (last: 10SO - July 28 vs. TEX)...has 42 strikeouts across his last six starts (July 6-pres.), the most by a Rays pitcher in a six-start span since **Ryan Pepiot** (45SO) between June 5–July 2, 2025.
- Generated 13 whiffs, with seven coming on his four-seam fastball...has recorded double-digit whiffs in 10 of his 18 starts this season.

SEA YOU THERE!—Jax has made 16 career appearances (one start) opposite the Mariners...has posted a 3-2 record with a 6.23 ERA (21.2IP, 15ER) against Seattle, including a 1-0 mark with a 1.80 ERA (5.0IP, 1ER), 3 SO, and a .250 (4-for-16) opp. average as a starter...Mariners batters have slashed .282/.366/.494 (24-for-85) with a .860 OPS against Jax.

- Jax has a career 7-6 record with a 3.03 ERA (77.1IP, 26ER) across 61 outings (four starts) against AL West foes...as a starter against the division, he is 2-2 lifetime with a 1.29 ERA (21.0IP, 3ER) and 18 strikeouts...three of those starts have come in 2026, pitching to a 1.15 ERA (15.2IP, 2ER) with 18 strikeouts.

THE QUEST OUT WEST—In 16 appearances (eight starts) on the road this year, Jax has fashioned a 3-5 record with a 4.06 ERA (44.1IP, 20ER) and 36 strikeouts...as a starter, he boasts a 2-3 record with a 3.32 ERA (38.0IP, 14ER) and 32 strikeouts...the Rays are 7-9 when he pitches away from Tropicana Field and 2-3 in his starts.

- He has yielded three runs or less in seven of eight road starts this season.

HOW SWEEP IT IS—Jax throws his sweeper 25.1 pct. of the time, the fifth-highest mark among AL hurlers (min. 1250 pitches)...despite this, his usage rate has dropped 18.9 pct. on the pitch from 2025 (44.0 pct.)...in 2026, he has limited opponents to a .203 (13-for-64) average on the pitch, seventh lowest in the AL (min. 60AB)...under the same parameters, his 37.0 pct. whiff rate on sweepers ranks ninth in the AL.

- Across 29 appearances this season, Jax has given up six extra-base hits on sweepers...five of them have come within his last 11 starts since June 1.

GET JAX UP AND MOVING—This marks the first time Jax has been a regular starter since his 2021 rookie season with the Twins, when he made his final 14 appearances as a member of the Twins rotation after his first four came in relief...he started two games for the Rays last season, working as an opener for **Ian Seymour** on Sept. 5 vs. CLE before starting a bullpen game on Sept. 10, 2025 at CWS...both starts lasted 1.0 scoreless frames...for his career, he is 8-11 with a 4.53 ERA (149.0IP, 75ER) in 33 starts compared to 21-28 with a 3.70 ERA (294.1IP, 121ER) in 294 relief appearances.

- Jax spent his first five professional seasons (2016-19, 2021) as a starter...he first transitioned to a full-time relief role in 2022...from 2016-21, 50 of his 55 minor league appearances were starts.

CAPTAIN JAX—Jax is currently a Captain in the U.S. Air Force Reserve, earning the promotion in June 2021, and remains the only Air Force Academy graduate to play in the majors...after his graduation from the Academy in 2017, he made five starts with Class-A Cedar Rapids and Rookie-level Elizabethton during his 60-day leave ahead of his first active duty assignment, departing on July 22 to begin his role as an acquisitions officer working with civilian contractors such as SpaceX and Boeing...the following year, he was accepted into the Air Force World Class Athlete Program, which allows soldiers to train for the upcoming Olympic Games as their active duty job responsibility for a two-year period, allowing him to continue his baseball career while completing his active duty requirement...became eligible for the program when baseball was readmitted for the scheduled 2020 Tokyo Olympics.

- He completed his active duty requirement and was admitted to the Air Force Reserve in November 2019...was notified of his promotion to Captain on June 5, 2021, the same day he was selected to the Twins major league roster ahead of his MLB debut three days later.
