- The Reds' 40-player roster consists of 39 players.

TODAY'S GAME:

- Is Game 3 (0-2) of a 3-game series vs Jeff Levering's Brewers and the final game (2-3) of a 7-day, 6-game homestand that includes a 2-1 series victory over the Phillies (Mon-Wed).
- Thu's off day was Cin's first since 7/24...played 20 consecutive days without a rest...were scheduled off on 8/3 but instead finished the suspended Speedway Classic vs Atl in Bristol, TN.
- Following today's game, will hit the road for a 9-game trip at LAA (8/18-8/20), AZ (8/22-8/24) and LAD (8/25-8/27)...it will be their first of 2 consecutive trips out west (at Padres, A's, and Cardinals next month).

HARD TO SWALLOW: The Reds have lost 29 games this season in which they held a lead, including both games of this series vs Mil.

- Last night's 6-5 loss in 11 innings marked the fifth time this year that the Reds lost a game when leading after 8 innings.
- Dropped to 2-8 this season in extra-inning games (.200).
- Fri's 10-8 loss was the first time the Reds squandered a lead of at least 7 runs and lost since 9/23/23 vs Pit (up 9-0, lost 13-12).
- It was Cin's fourth loss when scoring 8 or more runs, matching AZ for the most such occurrences in the majors.
- Between singles from Noelvi Marte in Fri's 2nd inning and TJ Friedl in Sat's 4th inning, Reds batters went 32 consecutive plate apps without reaching base safely...it matched the team's longest-such streak in the expansion era (since 1961), also done from 5/29-5/31, 1985 (Elias).
- The Reds went 7 consecutive innings in Fri's game in which they didn't reach base vs relief pitchers...was the first time that's ever happened since at least 1901.

NO ROOM FOR THE BROOM: The Reds have not been swept in any of their last 40 series dating back to last year and including all 39 series in which they've completed this year.

- Haven't been swept in a series of at least 2 games since 9/24-9/25, 2024 at Cle (2g), a span of 40 straight series...per Elias, that ranks as the fourth-longest streak of sweepless series in team history (see below).
- This 39-series, in-season streak without being swept is the longest run in club history, eclipsing the 1970 National League championship team, which opened its season with 32 straight series without getting swept.
- Cin is the only Major League team not to have been swept this season.
- On 6 occasions during this streak, avoided being swept with a win in the final game of a series (4/23 at Mia, 5/15 vs CWS, 6/22 at StL, 7/2 at Bos, 7/23 at Wsh, 7/30 vs LAD).

NOELVI'S JUST RIGHT: RF Noelvi Marte made his first 2 apps in RF on 7/20 & 7/22 and has played exclusively at that position beginning 7/29 (16g, 14gs) .

- In 16 games beginning 7/29, is slashing .328/.328/.574 with 3 HR, 6 2B, 10 RBI and 20 times on base.
- Has hit safely in each of his last 7 games (13-for-30, .433, 2hr, 9rbi).
- His .594 SLG vs right-handed pitching this season ranks fourth among ML right-handed hitters (min. 100ab vs RHP).
- From 8/9-8/13 collected 5 doubles over 5 games to become the fifth Reds batter since 1900 to produce at least 5 doubles over any 5-game span at age 23 or younger...he joins George Foster (1971), Bobby Tolan (1969), Vada Pinson (several times from 1959-60), and Frank Robinson (1956) as the only Cin batters to accomplish that feat before turning 24 (courtesy Elias).

SERIES NOTES: The Brewers have won each of the last 13 series (including this one), 14 of the last 15 series, and 17 of the last 19 series vs Cin dating back to 2021.

- Since 7/16/21, Mil has won 44 of 60 meetings against Cin, including 26 of 35 contests against the Reds since the beginning of the 2023 season.
- The Reds have lost 44 of 78 games at American Family Field since 2016 and 17 of 25 there since 2022.
- The Reds have lost 33 of 44 games vs Mil at GABP since 9/24/19.

TOUGH ROAD AHEAD: The Reds are in the midst of a final 59-game stretch in which 32 games have been/will be played against opponents with records at or above .500 (3-0 vs TB, 1-2 vs LAD, 2-1 at Chc, 2-1 vs Phi, 0-2 vs Mil, 3g at LAD, 3g vs Tor, 3g vs NYM, 3g at SD, 4g at Chc, 3g at Mil).

- As of today, the Reds have the second-toughest remaining slate in the majors, based on opponents' winning percentage (.526; AZ, .530).
- NYM has the 12th-toughest remaining schedule (.507) while Chc (.477), SD (.464), and LAD (.461) have the easiest remaining schedules.

ANDREW ABBOTT LHP #41

2025 Record: 8-2, 2.34

Height/Weight: 6'0"/205 | Bats/Throws: L/L
Born: 6/1/99, Lynchburg, VA | Age: 25

LAST TIME OUT: Suffered the 4-1 loss on 8/11 vs Pit (7.2ip, 6h, 3r/3er, 0bb, 6k, 0hr, 104TP).

- Was perfect before allowing J.T. Realmuto's leadoff double in the 5th inning...at 4.0 innings, was the longest perfect-game bid of his career.
- His 3rd-inning strikeout of Otto Kemp marked his 100th of the season...became the fourth Reds pitcher since 1893 to record 100 strikeouts in each of his first 3 seasons, joining teammate Hunter Greene (2022-24), Johnny Cueto (2008-10), and Noodles Hahn (1899-1901).
- Was his ninth quality start of the season, the 27th of his career.
- Opened the top of the 8th inning with 2 strikeouts (Harrison Bader & Otto Kemp) before allowing a single, RBI-double, and an RBI-single before he was replaced by Tony Santillan who gave up a 2-run homer to Kyle Schwarber.

AUGUST 6: Suffered the 6-1 loss on 8/6 at Chc (6.2ip, 7h, 4r/4er, 2bb, 3k, 2hr, 100TP).

- Was his first career loss to the Cubs (3-1) and the first time the Reds lost to Chicago when he pitched (5-1).
- Was the first time since 6/17 vs Min that he allowed multiple home runs in a game.
- Retired 9 straight until Seiya Suzuki led off the 6th inning with a home run.
- Allowed a leadoff homer in the 7th inning to Dansby Swanson, followed by a strikeout, flyout, and a double to the last batter he faced, Justin Turner...Luis Mey relieved Abbott and allowed Turner to score.

JULY 31: Did not factor in the decision in the 10-inning, 12-11 loss on 7/31 vs Atl (5.1ip, 5h, 3r/2er, 5bb, 1k, 96TP).

- Was just the third time in his career that he struck out as a few as 1 batter in a start (7/21/24 at Wsh & 9/27/23 at Cle).
- Matched his season high with 5 walks (4/25 at Col).
- Was replaced by Graham Ashcraft in the top of the 6th inning after a leadoff walk, single, walk, and a foul popout...2 of his runners scored in the inning after he left the game (E5).

JULY 26: Did not factor in the decision in the 6-2 win on 7/26 vs TB (6.0ip, 2h, 1r/1er, 3bb, 7k, 95TP).

- Was his third consecutive quality start.
- Was in line for a 2-1 victory but fell victim to RHP Graham Ashcraft's blown save in the 7th inning.
- Struck out all 3 batters he faced in the 5th inning...was the fifth time this season he fanned all 3 batters he faced in an inning (last: 5/13 vs CWS, 3rd inning).

JULY 20: Did not factor in the decision in the 3-2 loss on 7/20 at NYM (6.0ip, 6h, 2r/2er, 1bb, 5k, 95TP).

- Was his seventh quality start of the season and the 25th of his career.
- Was in line for a 2-1 loss when he exited the game after the 6th inning...the Reds tied the game in the 8th.

LAST TIME OUT: Earned the 6-1 win vs Phi on 8/12 (6.0ip, 3h, 0r, 0bb, 6k, 71TP).

- Was perfect before allowing a leadoff single in the 5th inning to Nick Castellanos...at 4.0ip, marked the second-longest perfect game bid of his career (4.2ip, 8/14/23 vs Sea).
- Matched his career high with his 10th win (also 10w in 2022).
- Is the first Reds pitcher with 10 wins through his first 24 games with the team since Mat Latos (10, 2012).

ALL-STAR: Was named to the National League All-Star team as a replacement for LAD's Yoshinobu Yamamoto...was his first career All-Star selection.

- Pitched a perfect 6th inning in the NL's 7-6 victory (Jazz Chisholm Jr. lineout, Riley Greene flyout, Randy Arozarena groundout; 13 total pitches).

2.41 ERA : His 2.41 ERA (123ip, 39r/33er) through his first 21 starts of the season is the lowest since Johnny Cueto posted a 2.18 ERA over his first 21 starts in 2014...is the best mark by a Cin LHP through his first 21 starts of a season since Jim O'Toole's 2.37 ERA in 1964.

- His 2.41 ERA is the best among Major League left-handed pitchers with at least 100 innings and the third-best mark among all pitchers with at least 100 innings.

HE EARNED IT: His 3.33 ERA through his first 66 career starts is the lowest by a Reds starting pitcher in that span since RHP Mario Soto (3.20, 1977-82).

IN HIS MAY ERA: His 0.55 ERA in May was the lowest among qualified Major League pitchers...is his lowest ERA in a month since pitching to a 1.21 mark in June 2023 (5gs, 4qs, 29.2ip, 4er, 16h, 12bb, 30k, 3hr).

- Was the first Reds pitcher to post a 0.55 ERA over a 6-start, single-season span (min. 30ip) since RHP Hunter Greene's 0.48 ERA last year from 6/30-8/3.
- Was the first Reds starting pitcher to open a season with a 1.55 ERA or lower over his 9 starts since RHP Johnny Cueto pitched to a 1.25 ERA over his first 9 starts in 2014.

PERSONAL: Graduated from Halifax County High School (South Boston, VA), the same school attended by All Elite Wrestling champion “Hangman” Adam Page and Major League pitcher Jeremy Jeffress...was named 2017 Gatorade Virginia Player of the Year...was a 4-year member of the Halifax swim team...at the University of Virginia became only the second pitcher in school history to record at least 300 strikeouts.
