AT A GLANCE: The Yankees continue their final regular season homestand with the second game of a three-game set vs. Chicago-AL (1-0 thus far)...will also face Baltimore this weekend (Fri.-Sun.).

- **Their 89-68 (.567) record is the second-best in the AL and the fourth-best in the Majors**, trailing only Milwaukee (95-63, .601), Philadelphia (92-65, .586) and Toronto (90-67, .573).
- Have won 10 of their last 12 completed series (since 8/11).
- **Are 6-1 in their last seven games (since 9/16), 9-3 in their last 12 games (since 9/11), 20-8 in their last 28 games (since 8/24), 25-11 in their last 36 games (since 8/15) and a Major League-best 29-14 in their last 43 games (since 8/6).**
- Their +145 run differential is the highest in the AL and the second-highest in the Majors, trailing only Milwaukee (+173).
- **Are a season-high 21G over .500.**
- Are 45-31 at home this season...**marks their 34th straight winning season at home (since 1992)**...according to *Elias*, their streak is the second-longest in Major League history, trailing only their own 47-year streak from 1918-64.

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees clinched a postseason berth with a 3-2 "walk-off" win vs. the White Sox on Tuesday...**RHP Luis Gil** (6.0IP, 4H, 2R/ER, 2BB, 3K, 1HR, 1WP) started and did not record a decision despite allowing only 2R/ER over 6.0IP...**C Austin Wells** (2-for-4, 1 double, 1RBI) drove in the first run for the Yankees with a go-ahead RBI double in the second inning...**PR/3B José Caballero** (1-for-1, 1RBI) recorded his first career "walk-off" hit with a "walk-off" single in the ninth inning...**2B Jazz Chisholm Jr.** (3-for-3, 1R, 1BB, 1SB) and **1B Ben Rice** (3-for-4) each recorded three hits...**SS Anthony Volpe** (2-for-4, 1R) reached base twice and scored the game-tying run on a wild pitch in the ninth inning...**RF Aaron Judge** (0-for-2, 1R, 3BB/2IBB) recorded three walks and scored the game-winning run in the ninth inning...**RHP Fernando Cruz** (1.0IP, 1H), **LHP Tim Hill** (0.2IP, 1H, 1K) and **RHP Luke Weaver** (W, 1.1IP, 1H, 1K) combined to toss 3.0 scoreless innings of relief.

POSTSEASON BOUND: The Yankees **clinched their 60th playoff appearance in franchise history on Tuesday (123 seasons, 48.8%) with a 3-2 "walk-off" win vs. the White Sox...marks the Yankees' eighthth postseason appearance in the last nine seasons (since 2017) and 26th trip to the postseason in the last 31 years (since 1995)**...their 26 trips to the postseason since 1995 are the most in the Majors in that span, five more than the next highest team (Atlanta-21)...the next highest AL teams are Boston and Cleveland who entered this season with 14 trips over that span.

- The Yankees are one of only three teams to make the playoffs in at least eight of the last nine years (since 2017), joining the Dodgers (nine: 2017-25) and Astros (eight: 2017-24).
- **Manager Aaron Boone became the second manager in Major League history to reach the postseason in seven of his first eight seasons as manager** (credit: *Elias* - min. 2G manager per season), joining Dave Roberts (first 10 seasons with the Dodgers)...is the third manager to make the playoffs in seven of his first eight seasons with the Yankees, joining Joe Torre (each of his first 12) and Casey Stengel (nine of his first 10).

WINNING WAYS: The Yankees' **next win will mark their 90th win of the season...would mark the seventh time in the last eight 162-game seasons they have recorded at least 90 wins** (2017-19, '21-22, '24)...would be one of only two teams to record at least seven 90-win seasons over that span, joining the Los Angeles Dodgers (seven: 2017-19, '21-24)...would mark the 22nd time in their last 29 full seasons (since 1996) they have recorded at least 90 wins (1996-99, 2001-07, '09-12, '17-19, '21-22, '24), marking the most in the Majors over that span (next: Atlanta-16, Boston entered this season with 15).

- **The Yankees have clinched their 33rd consecutive winning season (since 1993), marking the second-longest streak in the four major sports (MLB/NFL/NBA/NHL),** behind only their 39 straight winning seasons from 1926-64.

FAN-TASTIC: The Yankees **have drawn 3 million fans at home for their Major League-record 25th straight season when there was full attendance (also 1999-2019, '22-24).**

PEN PALS: Yankees relievers tossed 3.0 scoreless innings on Tuesday vs. Chicago-AL (3H, 2K)...**have not allowed a run in their last 10.2 innings (since 9/19) and have posted a 0.48 ERA (18.2IP, 1ER) and 22K over their last six games (since 9/17).**

BRONX BOMBERS: Yankees **batters have hit a Major League-leading 263HR this season, 29 more than the next highest team (Los Angeles-NL: 234HR)**...their 263HR this season are their third-most in a single season in franchise history and the eighth-most by any team in Major League history.

FAST AND FURIOUS: Yankees **baserunners have recorded 133SB this season, their most in a single season since 2011 (147SB)...marks only the third time in the last 24 years (since 2002) the Yankees have recorded as many stolen bases in a season** (also 147SB in 2011 and 139SB in 2006)...rank seventh in the Majors this season in stolen bases (fourth in AL) and 10th in stolen base percentage (78.7%, seventh in AL)...have recorded a Major League-leading 69SB over their last 55 games (since 7/25).

ALL RISE: OF Aaron Judge recorded three walks and scored the game-winning run in the ninth inning on Tuesday vs. Chicago-AL...has reached base multiple times in 11 of his last 12 games (since 9/11), including at least three times in seven of those games...has reached base in 33-of-57PA over that span (15H, 16BB, 2HP), batting .405/.579/.838 (15-for-37) with 16R, 1 double, 5HR, 7RBI, 16BB/4IBB, 2HP, 2SF and 1SB over that stretch.

- Was intentionally walked twice on Tuesday for the fifth time this year...**his Major League-leading 34IBB this season are tied with Ted Williams (34IBB in 1957) for the most in AL history (since 1955 when IBB were first tracked)**...marks the most by any Major League player in a single season since 2010 when St. Louis' Albert Pujols recorded 38IBB and San Diego's Adrián González recorded 35IBB.
- Needs 1HR to reach 50HR in a single season for the fourth time in his career (52HR in 2017, 62HR in 2022 and 58HR in 2024)...would tie the Major League record for most 50HR seasons by any player and would be only the fourth player — and second Yankee — to record four such seasons...would join Sammy Sosa (4x: 1998-2001), Mark McGwire (4x: 1996-99) and Babe Ruth (4x: 1920-21, '27-28).
- Has reached base safely in 131 of his 147 games this year, batting .325/.452/.669 (170-for-523) with 131R, 29 doubles, 2 triples, 49HR, 105RBI, 120BB/34IBB, 7HP, 7SF and 12SB...**leads the Majors in BA by seven points, OBP by 53 points, SLG by 52 points and OPS by 110 points...his 9.2 WAR (FanGraphs) is 0.4 higher than the next highest player (Seattle's Cal Raleigh: 8.8 WAR)...would be only the fifth player in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to lead the Majors in BA, OBP and SLG in a single season**...would join Miguel Cabrera in 2013, Barry Bonds in 2002, Larry Walker in 1999 and George Brett in 1980.
- **Is hitting .346/.522/.704 (28-for-81) with 29R, 2 doubles, 9HR, 12RBI, 29BB/5IBB, 3HP, 2SF and 4SB over his last 25 games (since 8/27).**
- Has reached base multiple times in a Major League-leading 97 games this season.
- Has hit .388/.547/.843 (47-for-121) with 40R, 7 doubles, 16HR, 36RBI, 45BB/8IBB, 1HP, 3SF and 2SB in 37 career games vs. the White Sox...has reached base in 35 of his 37G against Chicago-AL...has 12HR in his last 24G vs. the club (since 8/12/21).

ON A ROLL: INF/OF José Caballero recorded his first career "walk-off" hit with a "walk-off" single in the ninth inning on Tuesday vs. Chicago-AL...has hit safely in nine of his last 10 games with a PA (since 9/10), hitting .355/.429/.581 (11-for-31) with 6R, 4 doubles, 1HR, 3RBI, 4BB and 5SB in that span.

RICE RICE BABY: C/INF Ben Rice has recorded at least three hits in each of his last two games, marking the first time in his career he has recorded at least 3H in back-to-back games...has hit .459/.487/.730 (17-for-37) with 5R, 7 doubles, 1HR, 8RBI and 2BB over his last 11 games (since 9/11).

FOR STARTERS: Yankees **starting pitchers** have allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 23 of their last 28 starts (since 8/24), going 15-5 with a 2.72 ERA (159.0IP, 48ER) and 140K over that span...**have allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 36 of their last 44 starts (since 8/5), posting a Major League-best 2.89 ERA (245.2IP, 79ER) during that stretch** (next: Los Angeles-NL - 3.05).

TO THE LEFT, TO THE LEFT: Yankees **batters** have hit .258/.337/.454 (370-for-1,435) with 76 doubles, 5 triples, 65HR and 166BB vs. left-handed pitchers this year, ranking first in the Majors in SLG and OPS (.790), fourth in OBP (third in AL) and sixth in BA (fifth in AL)...the Yankees own three of the four highest OPS against left-handed pitching this season (**Judge** - first with 1.221, **Goldschmidt** - third with 1.020 and **Bellinger** - fourth with 1.018).

HIGH VOLTAGE: INF Anthony Volpe reached base twice and scored the game-tying run on a wild pitch in the ninth inning on Tuesday vs. Chicago-AL...is hitting .400/.455/.500 (8-for-20) with 5R, 2 doubles, 2RBI, 2BB and 2SB over his last six games (since 9/16).

LAND OF THE FRIED: LHP Max Fried is 18-5 with a 2.92 ERA (188.1IP, 61ER) in 31 starts this season...has set career highs in wins, starts, innings pitched and strikeouts...**has gone 5-0 with a 1.60 ERA (39.1IP, 7ER) over his last six starts (since 8/22).**

- In 10 career starts vs. the AL Central, has gone 9-0 with a 1.56 ERA (63.1IP, 11ER) and 78K...has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in nine of those 10 starts and 1ER-or-fewer in six of those starts.

ALL THAT JAZZ: INF Jazz Chisholm Jr. reached base a season-high-tying four times on Tuesday vs. Chicago-AL (also 4TOB on 8/12 vs. Minnesota), including a season-high-tying 3H (seventh time, first since 9/13 at Boston)...is hitting .333/.373/.542 (16-for-48) with 6R, 1 double, 3HR, 9RBI, 3BB/1IBB and 4SB over his last 12 games (since 9/11).

MATCHING UP: The Yankees are 9-2 in their last 11G vs. the White Sox (since 2024) and 11-4 in their last 15G (since 6/8/23-G2).

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: LHP MAX FRIED (18-5, 2.92 ERA)

LHP Max Fried will make his career-high 32nd start of the season and 200th career appearance (183rd start) tonight vs. Chicago-AL...the 31-year-old will pitch on extended five days' rest due to Monday's team off day...earned his Major League-leading and career-high 18th win of the season on Thursday at Baltimore after recording a career-high-tying 13K over 7.0 scoreless innings (3H, 1BB)...**is 18-5 with a 2.92 ERA (188.1IP, 61ER) in 31 starts this season...has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 21 of his 31 starts and 1ER-or-fewer in 14 of those starts...**the Yankees are 21-10 in his starts this season...leads the Majors in wins, ranks second in winning pct. (.783, first in AL) and pickoffs (eight, first in AL), sixth in HR/9.0IP ratio (0.67, second in AL), seventh in innings pitched (188.1IP, fifth in AL), eighth in groundball/flyball ratio (1.99, third in AL) and groundball percentage (52.8%, third in AL), ninth in opponents' SLG (.338, fourth in AL) and 10th in ERA (fourth in AL)...is also tied for fourth in games started, seventh in opponents' OPS (.621), and ninth in opponents' OBP (.283) and WHIP (1.11)...went 11-10 with two complete games (one shutout) and a 3.25 ERA (174.1IP, 146H, 71R/63ER, 57BB, 166K, 13HR) over 29 starts with the Atlanta Braves in 2024...over nine Major League seasons with the Atlanta Braves (2017-24) and Yankees (2025), has gone 91-41 with six complete games (four shutouts) and a 3.05 ERA (1,072.2IP, 943H, 404R/363ER, 295BB, 1,045K, 90HR) in 199 career games (182 starts)...among Major League pitchers since 2020 (min. 600.0IP), ranks first in ERA (2.84), winning pct. (.706) and pickoffs (26), is tied for first in wins (72) and shutouts (four), second in HR/9.0IP (0.67), third in opponents' SLG (.332), opponents' OPS (.614), and groundball percentage (54.1%), fourth in groundball/flyball ratio (2.20), tied for fifth in complete games (five) and 10th in WHIP (1.10)...his 89 wins since 2019 are the most in the Majors...the three-time All-Star (2022, '24 and '25) and three-time Gold Glove Award winner (2020-22) has finished in the top-five of Cy Young Award voting twice in his career (second in 2022 and fifth in 2020)...the Santa Monica, Calif., native was originally selected by San Diego in the first round (seventh overall) of the 2012 First-Year Player Draft...was acquired by Atlanta along with INF Jace Peterson, INF Dustin Peterson and OF Mallex Smith in exchange for OF Justin Upton and RHP Aaron Northcraft on 12/19/14...was signed by the Yankees to an eight-year contract extending through the 2032 season on 12/17/24.

LAST TIME OUT: Earned his Major League-leading and career-high 18th win of the season on Thursday at Baltimore after recording a career-high-tying 13K over 7.0 scoreless innings (3H, 1BB)...marked his sixth scoreless start of the season...also had 13K on 6/4/24 at Boston with Atlanta...his 13K marked the most strikeouts by a Yankee this season and the most since Luis Gil's 14K on 5/18/24 vs. Chicago-AL...was only the third Yankees left-hander (fifth time) in the last 37 years (since 1989) to record at least 13K in a game, joining CC Sabathia (2x: 13K on 6/30/11 vs. Milwaukee and 14K on 7/26/11 vs. Seattle) and David Wells (2x: 16K on 7/30/97 vs. Oakland and 13K on 9/1/98 vs. Oakland).

- ★ Was only the fourth Yankee in the last 51 years (since 1975) to strike out 13 batters on the road, joining Gerrit Cole (15K on 9/1/21 at Los Angeles-AL), Mike Mussina (13K on 9/2/01 at Boston) and David Cone (16K on 6/23/97 at Detroit).

2025: Is 18-5 with a 2.92 ERA (188.1IP, 61ER) in 31 starts this season...has set career highs in wins, starts, innings pitched and strikeouts...leads the Majors in wins, ranks second in winning pct. (.783, first in AL) and pickoffs (eight, first in AL), sixth in HR/9.0IP ratio (0.67, second in AL), seventh in innings pitched (188.1IP, fifth in AL), eighth in groundball/flyball ratio (1.99, third in AL) and groundball percentage (52.8%, third in AL), ninth in opponents' SLG (.338, fourth in AL) and 10th in ERA (fourth in AL)...is also tied for fourth in games started, seventh in opponents' OPS (.621), and ninth in opponents' OBP (.283) and WHIP (1.11).

- ★ Was named to his third career All-Star team (also 2022 and '24 with Atlanta)...did not pitch in the AL's 7-6, Home Run Derby swing-off loss.
- ★ **Has gone 5-0 with a 1.60 ERA (39.1IP, 7ER) over his last six starts (since 8/22) after going 3-3 with a 6.80 ERA (41.0IP, 31ER) over his previous eight starts from 7/1-8/16...**has allowed 2R-or-fewer in five of his last six starts and has won each of his last five starts (since 8/27).
- ★ **Has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 21 of his 31 starts and 1ER-or-fewer in 14 of those starts...**was the first pitcher in franchise history (excluding openers) to allow 2ER-or-fewer in each of his first 11 starts of a season (since ER became an official stat in 1913)...Chad Green did so in his first 11 starts as an opener in 2019.
- ★ His eight pickoffs this year are the most by a Yankee in a single season in the last 17 years (since 2009) and the most since Andy Pettitte recorded 10 in 2008.
- ★ Has allowed 2BB-or-fewer in 26 of his 31 starts...was one of only eight pitchers in franchise history to allow 2BB-or-fewer in each of his first 19 starts of a season, joining Michael Pineda (each of his 27GS in 2015), Mike Mussina (each of his 34GS in 2008), Jon Lieber (each of his 27GS in 2004), Jeff Johnson (first 20GS in 1991), Scott Sanderson (first 22GS in 1991), John Candelaria (each of his 24GS in 1988) and Tommy John (first 22GS in 1988).
- ★ Has allowed only 14HR to 774BF, posting a 0.67 HR/9.0IP ratio this season.
- ★ **Did not allow an ER in 27.1IP from 4/15-5/7...at the time, was the longest single-season streak by a Yankees starting pitcher in the last 51 years (since 1975)**...the last Yankees starter to record a longer single-season streak without an ER was Rudy May's 30.2 inning streak from 7/10-8/18/74...Clarke Schmidt recorded a 28.1IP scoreless streak later in the season from 6/4-28.
- ★ Has left only five of his 31 starts trailing this year.
