**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets fell to the Reds, 5-0, yesterday... It was the seventh time the Mets were blanked this season... New York has dropped four of their last five games and 13 of their last 17 contests... New York continues a seven-game road trip (1-2) to Cincinnati (1-2) and Washington D.C. (four games)... Following this series, the Mets head home for a six-game homestand against Tampa Bay (three games) and Cleveland (three games).

**FIRST THINGS FIRST:** The Mets have been outscored 34-9 in the first inning this year... The Mets are 5-18 when their opponent scores first... On the other hand, the Mets are 13-2 when scoring first this season... Their .867 winning percentage when scoring first ranks second in the majors.

**WASHINGTON D.C., IT'S PARADISE TO ME:** Pete Alonso is a lifetime .341 (45-132) hitter with 24 runs, nine doubles, a triple, 12 home runs, 29 RBI, 16 walks with a .417 OBP a .697 SLG in 35 career games in Washington D.C... Mark Canha has hit .429 (12-28) with six runs, a home run, five RBI and three walks in seven games at the ballpark... Jeff McNeil has slashed .328/.390/.508 with 16 runs, six doubles, two triples, four home runs, 20 RBI and 12 walks in 33 contests in the district... Brandon Nimmo has slashed .303/.425/.408 with 23 runs, seven doubles, a triple, two home runs, seven RBI and 29 walks in 43 games at the home of the Nationals.

**STARTING PITCHING:** Mets starting pitchers have tossed 185.2 innings this year, tied for the fourth-fewest innings in the majors... They have surrendered 37 homers, the fourth-most in the majors... New York starters have issued 92 walks, the most in the majors... They are 12-16 with a 5.38 ERA (111 earned runs/185.2 innings).

**THE EAST IS A BEAST:** The Mets are 7-6 against the division this year... The team went 50-26 against the East in 2022... Their .658 winning percentage against the East was the best mark in club history.

**23 AND ME:** The Mets have used 23 pitchers so far this season... That is tied for the most in the National League with the Miami Marlins... Only the Oakland Athletics (23) have used as many or more pitchers this season.

**DOCTOR ROBERT-SON:** David Robertson has appeared in 14 games and has allowed one run in 15.1 innings of work, good for a 0.59 ERA... He has allowed eight hits, five walks while striking out 20 in that span... He is holding left-handed hitters to a .148 (4-27) batting average this season... He has converted all eight save opportunities he's had this season... Overall, he has recorded 164 saves in his career... That is the seventh-most among active players.

**CLOSING TIME:** New York's bullpen has three blown saves this year, tied for the second-fewest in the majors... The pen is 6-4 with a 3.88 ERA (61 earned runs/141.1 innings).

**BRIGHAM OUT, BRIGHAM OUT:** Jeff Brigham has not allowed a run in eight of his 10 appearances this season, posting a 3.27 ERA (4 ER/11.0 IP)... He has struck out 14 and allowed five hits and four walks in 11.0 innings this year.

**NATIONALS-METS NOTES:** The Mets have won the season series against the Nationals in four of the last five years.

**ON THE ROAD AGAIN:** New York will play their 24th road game today, tied for the second-most in the majors... New York is 11-12 on the road this season... They are 3-3-1 in road series in 2023.

**INVADER NIM:** Brandon Nimmo ranks sixth in the National League with a .312 batting average, is eighth with a .409 OBP and is ninth with 43 hits... Over the last 25 games, Nimmo is batting .337 (34-101) with 15 runs, six doubles, one triple, three home runs, 10 RBI, eight walks with a .903 OPS... He ranks 10th in the majors and fifth in the NL with a 1.7 fWAR.

**GUESS WHO'S BACH?:** Over his last 21 games, Daniel Vogelbach is 16-55 (.291) with four runs, three doubles, two home runs, 10 RBI, nine walks with a .391 OBP and a .455 SLG... He has posted a .389 OBP in 31 games this season, which is second on the team.

**AND THEY'RE OFF:** Starling Marte is tied for 13th in the majors and tied for seventh in the NL with nine steals... He ranks third among active players with 323 career steals... Only Elvis Andrus (340) and Billy Hamilton (326) have more... The Mets are fifth in the National League with a 81.3% success rate in steals this season... The Mets are seventh the NL with 26 steals this season.

**JEFF McHITS:** Jeff McNeil is batting .305 (25-82) with 10 runs, two doubles, a triple, two home runs, seven RBI, six walks with a .374 OBP and an .800 OPS over his last 23 games... Overall, he is batting .269/.368/.373 in 38 games this season.

**MULTIPLICITY:** McNeil has recorded 10 multi-hit games this season... He has 173 multi-hit games in his career, which places him 19th on the Mets all-time list... He has 63 multi-hit games since the start of last season, which is tied for the third-most during that span behind Bo Bichette (70) and Freddie Freeman (69).

**A HIT'S A HIT:** The Mets have collected 41 infield hits this season, which is the fifth-most in the majors... Last year, the Mets collected 186 infield hits, the fifth-most in franchise history and the third-most in MLB in 2022.

**OUCH:** The Mets have been plunked 23 times this season... That is tied for the second-most in the majors and the most in the National League... Since the start of last season, the Mets have been plunked 135 times, the most in the majors.

**ATTABOY ÁLVAREZ:** Over the last 16 games, Francisco Álvarez is hitting .304 (14-46) with seven runs, three doubles, three home runs, five RBI, four walks with a .360 OBP and a .565 SLG... He is now slashing .246/.292/.443 in 21 games this season.

**D-FENCE:** The Mets have committed 12 errors in 38 games this season... That is tied for the second-fewest in the major leagues... The Padres lead the big leagues, committing only 10 errors this year... New York's .991 fielding percentage is fourth in the majors and third in the National League.

#### MEGILL NEWS & NOTES

**LAST TIME OUT:** Threw 4.2 innings and allowed three runs on six hits, three walks and four strikeouts in the Mets 5-2 loss against the Rockies on May 6 at Citi Field...Suffered the loss.

**BIG DRIP VS. THE NATIONALS:** Megill has faced the Washington Nationals five times in his career...He is 2-2 with a 6.52 ERA (14 ER/19.1 IP)...His last appearance against the Nationals came in relief in an 8-0 shutout victory on October 4, 2022...Threw 2.0 innings, allowing two hits and no runs.

**ON THE ROAD AGAIN:** This season, Megill is 1-1 with a 5.79 ERA (9 ER/14.0 IP) in three road starts this season...In four home starts this season, Megill is 2-1 with a 3.38 ERA (8 ER/21.1 IP)...In 20 career road games (16 starts), Megill is 5-6 with a 5.04 ERA (45 ER/80.1 IP) and in 20 career home games (18 starts), Megill is 6-4 with a 4.30 ERA (44 ER/92.0 IP).

**THE FRANCHISE HAS COMPANY:** On April 7, the Mets home opener vs. Miami, Megill threw 6.0 scoreless innings and allowed three hits...Megill joined Tom Seaver (April 5, 1983) as the only other pitcher in franchise history to throw 6.0 shutout innings and allow three hits or fewer in a home opener...Courtesy of Elias.

**DOIN' THE SPLITS:** This season, righties are hitting just .235 (16-68) against Megill...On the contrast, left-handers have batted .288 (19-66) against Megill, the 22nd-highest mark in the majors among starting pitchers (Min. 50 LHB faced)...For his career, Megill owns a .208 (69-331) opponent's average against right-handed batters since his major league debut on June 23, 2021, the 16th-best mark among starting pitchers during that span (Min. 300 RHB faced)...During that same time frame, left-handed batters have a .303 (100-330) average against Megill, the third-highest mark among starting pitchers (min. 300 LHB faced).

**COMBINED NO-NO:** Megill threw the first 5.0 innings of MLB's first no-hitter of the season on April 29 at Citi Field...It was the second no-hitter in team history (also, Johan Santana, June 1, 2012 vs. St. Louis)...The Mets combine no-hitter against the Phillies marked the 17th time a team has thrown a combined no-hitter and the 10th time in the Wild Card Era...Drew Smith (1.1 IP, BB, 4 K), Joely Rodriguez (1.0 IP, 2 BB), Seth Lugo (0.2 IP) and Edwin Díaz (1.0 IP, 3 K) finished the job with 4.0 hitless innings out of the bullpen.

**2022 RECAP:** Was the Mets Opening Day starter and earned the victory after tossing 5.0 scoreless innings against the Nationals...Did not allow a run over 5.1 innings and earned the victory in his following start against the Phillies on April 12...Started the Mets combined no-hitter against the Phillies on April 29 and threw 5.0 innings with three walks and five strikeouts...Struck out a season-high nine batters in his following start against the Braves on May 4...Was on the 15-Day Injured List with right biceps inflammation from May 12 - June 10...Made two starts in his return from the IL before beginning another stint on the Injured List with a right shoulder strain on June 17...Was transferred to the 60-day IL on June 27 and returned to action on September 19...Made his final six appearances of the season in relief and allowed four earned runs over 6.0 innings in those appearances.

**OPENOR:** Last year, Tylor Megill was named the Mets Opening Day Starter...With 89.2 career innings pitched entering the 2022 season, Megill had the fewest major league innings of any Mets Opening Day starting pitcher in franchise history...Became the 28th different Opening Day starting pitcher in Mets history.

**RUNS IN THE FAMILY:** His brother, Trevor, is a pitcher in the Minnesota Twins organization...They both made their MLB debut in 2021...According to *Elias*, they are the fourth pair of brothers to make their major league debut in the same season since 2000 (2019, Scott & Tyler Heineman, 2017, Joe & A.J. Jimenez and 2012, Donovan & Jhonatan Solano).

#### TOMORROW'S STARTER: LHP JOEY LUCCHESI (1-0, 4.43)

**LAST TIME OUT:** Lucchesi threw 4.0 innings on May 7 at Citi Field against Colorado, allowing three earned runs on four hits...Fanned five Rockies batters in the Mets' 13-6 loss.

**CAN'T WAIT TO GET ON THE ROAD AGAIN:** In two away games this season, Lucchesi has pitched to a 3.27 ERA (4 ER/11.0 IP) and earned his one win on the year thus far in San Francisco on April 21...In two home games this season, Lucchesi has pitched to a 5.79 ERA (6 ER/9.1 IP).
