YESTERDAY'S GAME: The D-backs won, 14-1, @ Cardinals with a 4-run third inning, 6-run fifth and 4-run sixth.

- **◆ Tommy Henry** got the win with a quality start (1 ER in 6.0 IP, 5 H, 1 BB, 6 K) and Logan Allen got his first career save with 3.0 scoreless frames (1 H, 1 BB, 2 K).
- ♦ Pavin Smith had 6 RBI on a 2-run double in the fifth inning and a grand slam in the sixth inning.
- Second career grand slam, also @ Cardinals on April 17 last season, and is 1 of 2 players to hit 2 grand slams @ current Busch Stadium (also: Ryan Howard/PHI - Sept. 17, 2007; May 4, 2009) [source: STATS LLC].
- ◆ Christian Walker hit a 3-run home run in the third inning and Kevin Newman hit a 2-run homer in the second inning.
- ◆ Randal Grichuk got his 1,000th career hit with a fifth-inning single.

A LITTLE MORE ABOUT LAST NIGHT: The D-backs scored 4+ runs in an inning 3 times last night and their 12 innings with 4+ runs are the most in the Majors [source: STATS LLC].

- ♦ The offense scored a franchise-record 13 runs with 2 outs.
- ♦ The offense was 7-for-12 with runners in scoring position.
- ♦ The D-backs have set a franchise record with 3 wins by 13+ runs (thru just 25 games)...the 3 wins by 13+ runs also lead the Majors (no other team has 1 such game)...the most wins by 13+ runs in a season since 1998 are the 1999 Phillies' 6 wins [source: STATS LLC].

LAST 11 STARTS: D-backs starting pitchers, over their last 11 games (6-5) since April 13, are 5-2 with a 3.45 ERA and opponent .247 AVG/.699 OPS...their 6 quality starts during that span are tied for fourth in the Majors with the Blue Jays, Giants and Twins behind 8 for the Tigers and Mariners and 7 for the Phillies.

TONS OF RUNS: The D-backs' 148 runs in their first 25 games are tied for the most in franchise history (also: 2001 and '08).

• Among all teams since 2017, thru the first 25 games, the D-backs' 148 runs are the sixth most behind the 2017 Nationals (170), 2019 Mariners (160), 2023 Rays (157), 2023 Rangers (156) and 2019 Yankees (150).

MILESTONE WATCH: Eugenio Suárez has 248 career homers, Lourdes Gurriel Jr. has 97 career homers, Ketel Marte has played in 993 career games and Joc Pederson has 490 career RBI.

STOPPING THE RUNNING GAME: D-back backstops 5 stolen bases are the fewest in the Majors and their 10 attempts are tied with Rangers for the fewest in the Majors.

◆ Gabriel Moreno's 57.1 caught-stealing pct. (4-for-7) leads the Majors this season...leads active catchers since 2022 with a 40.7 caught-stealing pct. (33-for-81).

THE NL CHAMPS: Last season, the D-backs captured their | MARTE AMONG NL LEADERS: Ketel Marte, among NL leaders, is tied for second with 13 extra-base hits, third with 33 hits, tied for third with 8 doubles, fourth with 56 total bases, seventh with a .549 SLG, eighth with a .324 AVG and ninth with a .925 OPS.

> GURRIEL'S ROAD STREAK: Lourdes Gurriel Jr. has hit safely in all 10 road games at a .391 clip (18-for-46)/.873 OPS with 3 doubles, 6 RBI and 2 walks.

- Dating back to last postseason, since Oct. 23, has hit safely in 14 straight road games (.387 AVG/.899 OPS).
- Dating back to last regular season, since Sept. 26, has hit safely in 12 straight road games (.391 AVG/.876 OPS).

PIKE MOVING UP CLUB RECORDS: Ketel Marte's fifth-inning double last night was his 192nd double as a D-back, passing David Peralta for sole possession of fourth on the club's all-time list...next/third is Chris Young (198).

- Marte's 337 extra-base hits tied with Steve Finley (337) for fifth...next/ tied for third are David Peralta (347) and Chris Young (347).
- Marte's 36 triples are 1 shy of Tony Womack (37) for third...next/second is David Peralta at 46 triples.

OFFENSE OFF STARTERS: Among all offenses vs. starting pitchers, the D-backs are first in AVG (.296), OBP (.360), OPS (.827), runs (82), hits (147), total bases (232) and fourth in SLG (.467).

◆ D-backs hitters, vs. opposing starters are batting .296 (147-for-497)/.827 OPS with 82 runs, 31 doubles, 18 homers and 46 walks.

FIRST-INNING STRIKERS: The D-backs' 12 games this season with 1+ runs scored in the first inning is tied for the most in the Majors (also: Dodgers).

WHEN SCORING FIRST: The D-backs are 11-7 when scoring first and their 18 times scoring first are tied for the most in the Majors (also: Red Sox).

RUN DIFFERENTIAL: The D-backs' +39 run differential is third in the Majors, behind the Guardians (+55), Braves (+43) and ahead of the Royals (+37) and Brewers (+32).

RISP-Y BUSINESS: Among teams with runners in scoring position, the D-backs are first with 127 runs, a .925 OPS and 28 extra-base hits, second with a .409 OBP and .517 SLG and third with a .317 AVG.

ON DECK - SEATTLE MARINERS: The D-backs are headed to Seattle for the sixth time (1999, 2001, '09, '15, '21).

♦ Are 5-1 in last 6 games @ Mariners.

NEXT STARTER: RHP ZAC GALLEN (3-1, 3.00)

- ♦ Making his sixth start...dropped his previous start, 7-3, @ Giants on April 20 (5 R-5 ER in 5.0 IP).
- ♦ Has 1 career start vs. Mariners on Sept. 12, 2020 at Chase Field (7 ER in 5.0 IP).
- His lone career start at T-Mobile Park was as the NL's starting pitcher last summer at the All-Star Game (1.0 IP, 1 H, 0 R-0 ER, 0 BB, 1 K).

- Member of 2023 World Series Champion Texas Rangers (defeated D-backs 4-games-to-1).
- 2023 All-MLB Second Team with Cardinals and Rangers.
- Has played parts of 8 seasons with Yankees (2017-22), Cardinals (2022-23), Rangers (2023) and D-backs (2024).

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW: Second start and first road start of 2024.

 In his last 5 regular-season starts since Sept. 13, 2023, is 3-0 with a 0.82 ERA (3 ER in 33.0 IP), .193 opponent average (23-for-119), 0.85 WHIP, 5 walks and 25 strikeouts.

LAST START: Won his D-backs debut, 17-1, on April 19 @ Giants (6.0 IP, 1 R, 4 H, 0 BB, 3 K).

VS. CARDINALS: First career start vs. Cardinals.

- Played parts of the previous 2 seasons with the Cardinals (2022-23)...in 32 starts, went 12-12 with a 3.31 ERA (78 R-68 ER in 184.2 IP) and 169 strikeouts.
- On Aug. 2, 2022, acquired by the Cardinals for CF Harrison Bader and, in 11 starts, went 6-3 with a 3.11 ERA.
- In 2023 for the Cardinals, in 21 starts, went 6-9 with a 3.42 ERA.

VS. NL CENTRAL: In 20 starts vs. the NL Central, is 9-9 with a 3.02 ERA (48 R-40 ER in 119.1 IP) and 108 strikeouts.

ROAD WARRIOR: In his last 5 regular season road games dating back to Aug. 21, 2023, is 2-0 with a 1.39 ERA (5 ER in 32.1 IP, 21 K).

• Last season, his 2.73 road ERA (27 ER in 89.0 IP) was third in the Majors to Blake Snell/SD (1.99) and Gerrit Cole/NYY (2.34).

LIMITING LEFTIES: In his career, has held lefties (in 525 PA) to a .220/.260/.317 slash with 11 homers, 20 walks and 123 strikeouts.
