METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Padres, 7-6, last night...The loss snapped a seven-game winning streak, which tied their longest of the season...The Mets continue their final west coast swing of the season, a six-game trip (3-1) against the Giants (3-0) and Padres (0-1)...Following this trip, the Mets are off on Thursday and then start a six-game homestand on Friday against the Giants and Guardians.

RETURN OF THE MARK: Mark Vientos is on a seven-game hitting streak, batting .333 (8-24) with one run, two doubles, one homer, seven RBI, one walk, a .360 OBP and a .542 SLG...Over the last 13 games, Vientos is batting .319 (15-47) with one run, four doubles, one triple, one homer, 10 RBI, one walk, a .333 OBP and a .511 SLG.

AIN'T IT GRAND?: Mark Vientos recorded his first career grand slam last night...It was the fifth grand slam by the Mets year...The 2024 team also hit five grand slams, as did the 2023 team...The 2006 team owns the franchise record with 10 grand slams in a single season...Mike Piazza is the franchise leader with six grand slam...He is followed by seven players who have each hit five slams, including Francisco Lindor.

GOT TO GO TO MO'S: Ronny Mauricio is on a four-game hitting streak, going .538 (7-13) in that span with three runs, two doubles, two homers, three RBI, one walk and a 1.725 OPS...In 16 games in July, Mauricio is batting .292/.358/.563 with 10 runs, four doubles, three homers, four RBI, five walks and one steal.

THE CENTER OF IT ALL: Jeff McNeil has appeared in 28 games at center field this year, he is batting .324/.410/.515 when fielding that position with nine runs, five doubles, one triple, two homers, nine RBI and 11 walks...McNeil has collected 240 multi-hit games in his career, which is 13th all-time...Howard Johnson is 12th with 247 multi-hit contests.

WELCOME BACK: Since returning from Triple-A on July 21, Francisco Alvarez is batting .316 (6-19) with six runs, two doubles, one triple, one homer, two RBI, five walks a .458 OBP and a .684 SLG.

MARTE PARTY: Starling Marte has collected multiple hits in six straight games, batting .591 (13-22) in that span with three runs, four doubles, one RBI, two walks, a .625 OBP and a .773 SLG...It is tied for the third-longest such streak in franchise history...Steve Henderson owns the franchise record with eight straight multi-hit games from July 12-21, 1979, followed by David Wright with seven such games from July 23-30, 2011...Jeff McNeil is the last Mets player to record six straight multi-hit games, doing so from September 27-October 4, 2022.

BLADES OF STEAL: The Mets have safely stolen 28 consecutive bases, the longest active streak in the majors...It's the longest single-season since Milwaukee recorded 29 consecutive steals from September 15-28, 2024...It's the longest single season for the Mets since they recorded 35 straight steals from May 14-June 29, 2023...They lead the majors with an 89.7% stolen base rate...This is the highest stolen base rate in franchise history...The previous high was set in 2023 (88.7%)...They have been caught stealing only 10 times this year, which is the fewest in the NL and second-fewest in the majors (Detroit, 10)...Juan Soto has stolen a career-high 15 bases this year...Brandon Nimmo has swiped 12 bases...His career-best is 15 which he accomplished in 2024.

DOMINATING DÍAZ: Díaz owns a 17.1 scoreless streak dating back to June 6...He has allowed just one earned run over his last 32 appearances, posting a 4-0 record with 17 saves and a 0.27 ERA since April 23...Over the longer span, has 49 strikeouts and a .136 (15-110) opponents' batting average.

PADRES-METS NOTES: The Mets are 27-42 at Petco Park since the ballpark opened in 2004.

LAST TIME OUT: Won his first game of the season after allowing one earned run over 5.0 innings and striking out five on July 23 against Los Angeles-AL...Has only allowed one run in all three of his appearances this season...Has recorded five or more strikeouts in each of his three appearances this season and he has struck out 18 batters over his first 12.1 innings this season...He has a 13.14 K/9 over those three appearances.

VS. PADRES/IN SAN DIEGO: Has pitched against San Diego nine times in his career (seven starts) and he has a 4-1 record with a 3.63 ERA (16 ER/39.2 IP) in those games...Has pitched in San Diego 16 times (14 times pitching for them) and he has a 3.32 ERA (31 ER/84.0 IP) and a 8-3 record at PETCO Park.

RIDE THE HOT HAND: In his last 21 games (20 starts) since June 26, 2024, is 9-4 with a 2.93 ERA (40 ER/122.2 IP), a .180 (79-438) opponents’ batting average and a 0.95 WHIP...Ranks second in the majors in opponents’ batting average and ninth in WHIP during that span (min. 400 batters faced)...The Mets are 16-5 in those games.

HERE COMES THE HEAT: So far this season, Manaea has thrown his four-seam fastball 69.0% of the time, and he has picked up 11 of his 18 strikeouts with his fastball...His fastball has generated a 32.4% whiff rate compared to his 25.8% whiff rate on his four-seamer last season.

REHAB STINT: Was originally placed on the 15-day IL on March 27 (retro. March 24) with a right oblique strain and then was transferred to the 60-day IL on April 29...This season, he has made six rehab appearances (five starts) for Brooklyn, Binghamton, and Syracuse...Over those appearances, he allowed 13 earned runs over 18.2 IP and recorded 23 strikeouts...He made his final rehab start on July 8 with Syracuse, and he allowed three runs over 3.2 IP and struck out five...He threw 73 pitches, 48 for strikes.

2024 A CAREER YEAR: Recorded a career-high in innings (181.2), tied a career-high in wins (12) and starts (32), while his 184 strikeouts were the second-most in his career and were the ninth-most in the NL last season...The southpaw finished with the lowest full-season ERA of his career (3.47), and he was one of eight pitchers who made 32 or more starts and posted an ERA below 3.50...He held right-handed batters to a .190 average, tied for the fourth-lowest mark in the majors...From July 1 until the end of the season, Manaea was first in the majors in innings (105.1), second in quality starts (12) as well as sixth in strikeouts (108) and WHIP (0.93)...Made four Postseason starts, going 2-1 with a 4.74 ERA (10 ER/19.0 IP), eight walks and 19 strikeouts...He earned wins in Game 3 of the NLDS vs. Philadelphia and Game 2 of the NLCS at Los Angeles.

SEVENTH HEAVEN: Last season, Manaea completed at least 7.0 innings in nine of his 32 starts this season and that was tied for the sixth-most such outings in the National League...Manaea recorded back-to-back starts of 7.0 scoreless innings and 10 or more strikeouts on 7/30/24 against Minnesota and 8/5/24 at St.Louis...Manaea joined Tyler Glasnow and Spence Schwellenbach as the only pitchers in the majors last season with consecutive starts of 7.0 or more innings and double-digit strikeouts...Manaea was the only one of three to not allow a run in both of those starts...He became the first Mets pitcher to throw 7.0 or more innings and record 10 or more strikeouts in consecutive starts since Max Scherzer (4/19/22 (2) - 4/25/22)...The southpaw joins Dwight Gooden (Two Separate Occasions) and Tom Seaver (Three Separate Occasions) as the only pitchers in franchise history to post back-to-back starts of 7.0 or more scoreless innings and double-digit strikeouts...He is just the 10th left-handed pitcher in major league history with back-to-back starts of 7.0 or more scoreless innings and 10 or more strikeouts (Last: Chris Sale, 6/24/18-6/30/18).

RIGHTY DOMINATION: So far this season righties are batting .158 (6-38) compared to left-handers who are batting .286 (2-7)...Last season he held right-handed hitters to a .190 batting average, compared to his career average to right-handed hitters being at .250...It was the lowest batting average he's held right handers to in his career (in a season where he appeared in more than five games).

SINK OR SWIM: Last season, Manaea threw his sinker 44.7% of the time, the highest usage rate of any of his six pitches in his arsenal...The southpaw had a run value of 15 with his sinker, which was the fifth-best mark in the majors... He also had 71 strikeouts via the sinker, which was the highest mark in the majors.

SPECTACULAR DOWN THE STRETCH: From July on last season, Manaea was second in the majors in quality starts (12), first in innings (105.1), sixth in strikeouts (108) and sixth in WHIP (0.93)...Since June 14, Manaea had allowed three or fewer runs 17 times, which was tied for most in the majors during that span with Chris Sale (17).

CAREER: Over the course of 10 Major League Seasons with the Athletics, Padres, Giants, and Mets he has a 78-63 record, a 3.99 ERA (530 ER/1196.2 IP), and 1127 strikeouts in 231 games and 200 starts...His 1127 career strikeouts are tied for the 14th-most among active left-handers...He resigned with the Mets this offseason on a three-year contract in December 2024.

- Threw a scoreless sixth inning on July 27 at San Francisco (1.0 IP, K) and earned his third win of the season...It was his first win since April 20 vs. St. Louis...His nine wins as a reliever are the tied for the fourth-most in the majors since he was recalled on July 2, 2024.
- Allowed two earned run on three hits on July 23 against Los Angeles-AL (0.2 IP, 3 H, 2 ER)...Was the only the sixth time this season he has thrown less than 1.0 inning in an outing...Was the fifth time he's allowed two or more earned runs in an outing and the first time since May 27 vs. Chicago-AL.
- Was placed on the 15-day injured list on July 4 (retro. July 1) with an illness and was activated prior to their July 23 game against Los Angeles-AL...Threw 3.0 scoreless innings over three rehab assignments with Triple-A Syracuse and FCL Mets.

- Had his career-high 12.2 scoreless inning streak (dating back to June 7) come to an end on July 23... Had not allowed an earned run in each of his last 11 appearances prior to ending up on the IL (14.1 IP)...His 11 games without allowing an earned run was the longest such stretch of his career as a reliever.
- Over his last 38 games against National League teams (since 7/2/24), has gone 9-1, with two saves and a 1.46 ERA (9 ER/55.1 IP), 21 walks, 58 strikeouts and a .149 opponents' BA (26-175)...The Mets are 28-10 in those games...Currently has a 11.2 scoreless inning streak against NL opponents and has not allowed an earned run in each of his last 11 outings against NL opponents (13.1 IP).
- In 14 career games (two starts) against NL West opponents, he has a 5-1 record, with one save and 2.36 ERA (7 ER/26.2 IP)...He is holding opposing batters to a .180 average (16-89) over that span.
- Over his last 14 outings (since May 26), has stranded 16 of his 19 inherited runners, posted a 1.93 ERA (4 ER/18.2 IP) and a .190 opponents' BA (12-63)...Over his last 23 games dating back to April 29, has allowed just seven earned runs over 30.1 innings, posting a 2.08 ERA.
- With the bases loaded this season, has not allowed a hit or walk to each of his seven batters faced in that scenario (1 SF).
- In 56 games since being recalled from Syracuse (AAA) on July 2, 2024, has gone 9-1 with four saves, six holds and a 2.43 ERA (22 ER/81.1 IP)...Has allowed one or zero runs in 49 of those outings...The Mets are 39-17 in those games.
