RECENT REDBIRDS: The St. Louis Cardinals wrap up a six-game homestand with the finale of a three-game series against the defending National League Champion Arizona Diamondbacks this afternoon at Busch Stadium ... The Cardinals are 1-4 on their homestand against division rival Milwaukee (0-3) and Arizona (1-1) ... St. Louis today wraps up a stretch of playing 19 of their first 25 games against teams who made the 2023 Postseason.

FLIGHT PATTERN: The Cardinals open today in 5th place in the National League Central, 5.0 games behind first place Milwaukee (14-8) and 3.0 games behind Pittsburgh (13-11) for 4th place.

PATH TO THE 10TH TITLE: After an off day in New York City tomorrow, the Cardinals retrace their steps from 2006 by opening a six-game, seven-day road trip at the New York Mets (April 26-28) and Detroit Tigers (April 29-May 1) ... The 2006 Cardinals captured their 10th World Series title in franchise history after eliminating the Mets in seven games in the NLCS and then beating the Detroit Tigers in five games in the Fall Classic as closer **Adam Wainwright** recorded the final outs via strikeout in both series.

UPDATING THE ROSTER: Prior to today's game, the Cardinals optioned OF **Jordan Walker** and LHP **Zack Thompson** to Memphis (AAA) and recalled INF **José Fermín** and LHP **John King** from Memphis ... In 18 games with the Redbirds, Fermín ranked among International League leaders in batting (.350, 6th), OBP (.458, 6th), slugging (.650, 7th), and OPS (1.108, 4th) ... King was 1-0 with a 3.38 ERA (5.1 IP), two saves, and five strikeouts in six relief outings.

THE LAST ACT: The Cardinals have opened the season 0-7 in series finales ... This is the 3rd instance in franchise history that the club has dropped the final game of a series (more than one game) for their first seven series of the season, joining the Browns from 1898 (0-8) and 1892 (0-7). - *Elias*

IT'S WHACKING DAY: Since Arizona joined MLB as an expansion team in 1998, the Cardinals .610 win pct. (108-69) against the Diamondbacks is their best against any opponent, the highest in MLB vs. the Snakes among National League and common interleague opponents, and the highest by any team against the last four expansion teams (Rockies, Marlins, Rays, Diamondbacks) ... St. Louis' .627 home winning pct. (37-22) vs. the Diamondbacks is its 5th-best at Busch Stadium III (2006-present).

NOLAN KEEPS ROLLIN': Nolan Arenado has reached base safely in 22 consecutive games since March 30, tying the suspended **Noelvi Marte** for the 2nd-longest active on-base streak in Major League Baseball behind injured **Christian Yelich** (23).

- Arenado's 22-game on-base streak is his longest as a Cardinal & his 5th 20+ game OB streak of his career (30-straight in 2014).
- Arenado, who is the lone Cardinal to have played in all 24 games to begin the season, has reached base safely in 22 games (T-4th in MLB), has hits in 20 games (T-2nd in MLB), and leads the Cardinals in hits (27) and total bases (36).
- Arenado has hit 32 career dingers against Arizona, his 2nd-most against any opponent (San Francisco, 33).

THE NEW GUYS: Since April 9, free agent acquisitions **Sonny Gray**, **Lance Lynn**, and **Kyle Gibson** have combined for a 2.14 ERA (11 ER/46.1 IP) in their eight starts.

DAY TRIPPERS: The Cardinals are playing their 12th day game of the season today, making up 48% of their contests ... This season, St. Louis is 2-9 in the daytime, while the Dbacks are 4-4 ... The Cardinals are scheduled to play 29 home day games this season and 34 on the road.

WHIFF: Cardinals pitchers have struck out double-digit batters in three consecutive games for the first time since May 15-17, 2023 vs. Milwaukee (11 each game) ... The last time St. Louis fanned 10+ in four straight games was April 26-29, 2023 vs. LAD & SFG.

ARIZONA CONNECTIONS

Paul Goldschmidt was selected by Arizona in the 8th round of the 2009 MLB Draft...played eight seasons with the Dbacks (2011-18), hitting .297/.398/.532 with 209 home runs and 710 RBI...selected to six All-Star squads (2013-18)...won four Silver Sluggers (2013, '15, '17-18) and three Gold Gloves (2013, '15, '17)...acquired by St. Louis from Arizona for **Carson Kelly**, **Luke Weaver**, **Andrew Young**, and the 2019 Cardinals Compensation Round B selection (Dec. 5, 2018).

Nolan Arenado made his MLB debut vs. the Dbacks (April 28, 2013 at Chase Field)...Signed his letter of intent to play college baseball at Arizona State University before drafted by the Rockies.

Nolan Gorman was born in Phoenix...graduated from Sandra Day O'Connor High School in Glendale...signed his letter of intent to the University of Arizona before drafted by the Cardinals.

Dbacks First Base Coach **Dave McKay** served in the same position for the Cardinals for 16 seasons (1996-2011).

Dbacks Hitting Coach **Joe Mather** was selected by St. Louis in the 3rd round of the 2001 MLB Draft...played parts of two years in St. Louis (2008, '10).

Keynan Middleton pitched in 18 games for the Diamondbacks in 2022.

Daniel Descalso played two seasons for the Diamondbacks (2017-18)...served as a Special Assistant to Baseball Operations for Arizona in 2023.

Brandon Crawford resides in Scottsdale, Ari.

JoJo Romero played college baseball at Yavapai College in Prescott, Arizona.

Jordan Montgomery pitched parts of two seasons with St. Louis (2022-23).

Matthew Liberatore was born in Peoria, Ari...graduated from Mountain Ridge High School in Glendale...signed his letter of intent to the University of Arizona before drafted by the Rays.

Randal Grichuk played parts of his first four MLB seasons in St. Louis (2014-17)...originally joined the Cardinals via trade with the Angels, packaged with **Peter Bourjos** in exchange for **David Freese** and **Fernando Salas** (Nov. 22, 2013).

Turner Ward played two seasons (1999-2000) and spent eight years coaching in the Dbacks organization, serving as AA-Mobile Hitting Coach (2008-10) and Manager (2011-12), and Arizona Asst. Hitting Coach (2013) & Hitting Coach (2014-15)...Turner's son, **Tucker Ward**, was selected by Arizona in the 40th round of the 2015 MLB Draft and pitched three seasons in the Arizona organization (2015-17).

Brandon Allen played parts of three seasons (2009-11) with the Dbacks...made his MLB debut with Arizona (Aug. 22, 2009 at Minute Made)...singled off **Brian Moehler** for first career hit.

Zac Gallen was selected by St. Louis in the 3rd round of the 2016 MLB Draft...pitched two seasons in Cardinals minor league organization before traded to Miami as part of the package to acquire **Marcell Ozuna** (Dec. 14, 2017).

Dbacks Pitching Coach **Brent Strom** spent six seasons (2008-13) with the Cardinals organization as minor league pitching instructor (2008-11) and pitching coordinator (2012-13).

John Mozeliak attended the Univ. of Arizona before graduating from the Univ. of Colorado at Boulder.

Athletic reporter **Katie Woo** graduated from Arizona State University.

Dbacks Player & Media Relations Coordinator **Kat Ritter** previously worked as a Cardinals Communications Gameday Associate in 2019.

Dbacks Pitching Strategist **Dan Haren** was selected by St. Louis in the 2nd rd. of the 2001 MLB Draft...pitched two seasons with the Cardinals (2003-04).

TODAY'S GAME

- Making his 5th start as a member of the Cardinals and his 3rd home start.
- Tonight marks his 299th career start, one shy of becoming the 9th active pitcher with 300 or more games started. **Justin Verlander** leads the list with 510.
- Threw 6.0 innings in his last start vs. MIL (4/19) in a no decision becoming the first Cardinals pitcher to begin a season with four consecutive starts of 6.0 or more innings since Michael Wacha and Mike Leake in 2017.
- Is one of five pitchers this season with four starts of 6.0 or more innings (**Logan Webb**, SF; **Seth Lugo**, KC; **Jack Flaherty**, DET; **Jose Berrios**, TOR).
- Has received one run of support or less in each of his last three starts, all Cardinals losses.
- Earned his first win of the season in his first start at SD (4/1) firing 7.0 innings allowing two runs, both on solo home runs (Tatis, Jr. & Merrill).
- St. Louis area resident and University of Missouri Baseball alum signed with the Cardinals as a free agent last November.
- Is one of three free-agent starters (**Sonny Gray** & **Lance Lynn**) that the Cardinals signed this past off-season.
- Joins his fifth Major League team Twins (2013-19), Rangers (2020-21), Phillies (2021-22), Orioles (2023) and Cardinals (2024).

LAST TIME OUT

- Allowed one run on an RBI double to William Contreras, but didn't factor in the decision as the Cardinals rallied in the 9th to tie before losing in 10 innings 2-1.
- Pitched 6.0 or more innings for the 4th straight start, most to start a season for the Cardinals since Michael Wacha and Mike Leake in the 2017 season.

CAREER

- Since 2013, leads active Major League Baseball pitchers in ground into double plays (209).
- Has career marks of 105-103, one of 17 active pitchers with 100 or more wins. Ranks 10th among active pitchers with 105 wins, three behind **Carlos Carrasco** and **Wade Miley** (108) for 8th.
- Durable starting pitcher, has made 29 or more starts in eight of the last 10 seasons, the most by any MLB pitcher.
- Has posted eight 10-win seasons since his MLB debut in 2013, tied for 4th-most among over that period trailing only **Max Scherzer** (10), **Gerrit Cole** (9) & **Clayton Kershaw** (9).
- One of four pitchers since 2014 to record 100 or more strikeouts in 9-of-10 seasons with **Jacob deGrom**, **Clayton Kershaw** and **Max Scherzer**.

2024

- On April 7 vs. Miami, became the most recent Cardinal to allow six runs in the 1st inning and still pitch 6.0 or more innings since **Bob Tewksbury** at Chicago Cubs (June 29, 1991 - 6.0 IP, 6 R, 1 ER). The six 1st inning runs set a personal opening frame record and was the second time in his career (May 10, 2014 at Detroit, 2nd inning) in any inning.
- Made his Cardinals debut on April 1 at San Diego, earned a win while throwing a season-high 7.0 innings for a Cardinals pitcher in the 6-2 win at PETCO Park. Allowed home runs to Jackson Merrill and Fernando Tatis, Jr., as his only blemishes.
- Was 1-2 with a 7.80 ERA in four Grapefruit League starts this spring. Led the Cardinals pitching staff with 16 strikeouts, including nine in his final Spring start.
