A LITTLE SOMETHING EXTRA: The Detroit Tigers last night erased an early 3-0 deficit, forced extra innings and picked up a 4-3, 11-inning win in the series opener of this four-game series at the Minnesota Twins ... the Tigers are now 3-1 through the first four games of this seven-game road trip that began with a series win at the White Sox (2-1) ... the Tigers have gone 11-6 (.647) in their last 17 games after dropping 12 of their previous 13 games into this current stretch.

- The Tigers last night improved to 19-8 (.704) in one-run games, the best one-run record in baseball ... the Tigers also improved to 29-11 in series openers this season, tops in the majors.
- The Tigers last night surpassed the halfway point of their 13-games-in-13-days without a day off stretch from August 8 through next Wednesday (5-2 through the first seven games) ... after this stretch concludes, the Tigers are not scheduled to play more than six games in a row without a day off throughout the entirety of their final 33 games of the season.
- The Tigers have 15 games remaining in August, 12 of them against teams that have a record below .500 ... the Tigers are in the midst of a stretch during which they play 13-straight games vs. sub-.500 teams through this Sunday.
- After this weekend, the Tigers return to Detroit for a six-game homestand vs. Houston (three games, Monday-Wednesday) and Kansas City (three games, August 22-24).

HE'S WORTH HIS SALT: In his last start on August 9 vs. the Angels, Charlie Morton recorded his first 10-strikeout game with the Tigers and the 30th double-digit strikeout game of his career ... he became the first Tigers pitcher, aged 37 years or older (let alone 41!), in franchise history to strike out 10 or more batters in a game (regular season or postseason) ... thanks to Elias.

- Morton makes his third start for the Tigers tonight since being acquired from Baltimore at the trade deadline ... he is the first member of the Tigers rotation aged 41-years-or-older since Kenny Rogers spent three years as a Tigers starter from 2006-08 at the ages of 41, 42 and 43 ... when he earns his first Tigers victory, Morton will be the first Tigers pitcher to pick up a win at 41-years-or-older since Rogers (at 43-years-old) on August 18, 2008 at Texas.
- Morton has gone 7-3 with a 4.20 ERA (33 ER/70.2 IP) with 77 strikeouts in his last 13 starts since Memorial Day, better than one strikeout per inning ... he has allowed three earned runs or less in 10 of those 13 outings (2.45 ERA in those 10 starts), with 17 of his 33 earned runs in this 13-start stretch taking place in those other three starts.
- In his Tigers debut August 3 in Philadelphia, Morton became only the fourth active pitcher to reach 400 career starts, joining Justin Verlander, Max Scherzer, and Clayton Kershaw.

IT'S NOT EASY BEING GREENE: Riley Greene joins Pete Alonso and Taylor Ward as the only three players in the majors to reach 26 doubles, 28 homers and 89 RBI this season ... Greene has those totals through 123 team games, which puts him on pace for 34 doubles, 37 homers and 117 RBI in a 162-game season, shattering previous career bests.

SPENCER'S GIFTS: Spencer Torkelson enters tonight's game with 26 homers, reaching the mark for the second time in the last three years (he had a career-best 31 homers in 2023) ... Torkelson is the first Tiger to record a pair of 26-homer seasons in a three-year span since Victor Martinez reached the mark in 2014 and 2016.

- Torkelson has now hit 67 homers since the start of the 2023 season, the best three-year total by any Tiger player since Nick Castellanos also totaled 67 homers from 2016-18.

21 HOME-RUN SALUTE: Kerry Carpenter has set a new single-season best with 21 homers, surpassing his 20 from 2023, and boasts a .595 slugging percentage vs. right-handed pitching since the start of the 2024 campaign, the third-highest mark in all of baseball behind only Shohei Ohtani (.697) and Aaron Judge (.676) ... minimum 500 plate appearances vs. righthanders.

- Carpenter has seven-career home runs vs. the Twins, his second-most against any one club (he has eight homers vs. the White Sox).

CENTRAL CASTING: Starting with this road trip, the Tigers were scheduled to play 13 of their final 19 games this month against American League Central competition ... Detroit has a 22-12 (.647) record within its division this season, the second-best intradivision mark in the majors.

- The Tigers have a 6.5-game lead in the A.L. Central over Cleveland, the second-largest lead in any of the divisions this year, but Detroit's edge is down from the 11.5-game lead the club had on the Twins and the 12.0-game lead on the Guardians/Royals at the All-Star Break.

WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE?: The Tigers have the second-best record in the A.L. on the strength of a +77 overall run differential, trailing the Red Sox (+93) and Yankees (+90) for the best mark in the A.L. ... in the A.L. Central, the Tigers have a +99 edge on the second-place Guardians (-22), are +90 on the third-place Royals (-14) and are +111 on the fourth-place Twins (-34).

AND FINALLY: The Tigers boast a 2.87 ERA (98 ER/307.1 IP) against A.L. Central foes this year, the best intradivision ERA of any team in all of baseball.

- Did not allow a run in seven straight outings from July 19 to Aug. 6...tossed two or more innings in four of the seven games, topping out at 3.1 frames on July 29 against Arizona.
- Allowed 13 runs (six earned) over nine games in June, giving up 16 hits and eight walks while striking out 12...did not record an out in his final two outings of the month.
- Made his Major League debut on Aug. 4, 2024, vs. Kansas City, throwing 3.0 scoreless innings and giving up two hits with three strikeouts...became the first Tigers reliever to throw 3.0-or-more shutout innings in his debut since Sandy B  ez did so on June 4, 2018, vs. New York (AL).

- Pitched in 34 games from the start of the season through June 30 and was one of the best relievers in baseball, pitching to a 1.77 ERA (7 ER/35.2 IP), allowing nine walks to 31 strikeouts...held a 19.64 ERA (16 ER/7.1 IP), walking seven batters compared to five strikeouts in 11 July games.

- Earned a win on Aug. 14 with 1.1 perfect innings against the Minnesota Twins...struck out two batters while completing the extra-inning victory.
- Acquired by Detroit on July 30 for minor league infielder Jim Jarvis...allowed two earned runs on two hits and a walk in his first inning with the Tigers on Aug. 5 against the Twins.
- Combined between the Astros and Braves this season, has limited all foes to a .657 OPS and .211 batting average, including a .197 batting average and .631 OPS to left-handed hitters...overall, he has gone 0-1 with a 5.40 ERA (23 ER/38.1 IP) in 39 relief appearances and, with 39 strikeouts, is averaging just better than a strikeout per inning pitched (9.2 K/9.0 IP).
- Combined to go 1-0 with a 2.51 ERA (4 ER/14.1 IP) in 15 playoff appearances with the Houston Astros in 2022 (World Series champion) and 2023.

- Threw a perfect ninth inning on Aug. 13 against the White Sox to earn his team-leading 18th save of the year.
- Tied his career high, walking a season-high three batters in his blown save against Seattle on the last day of the first-half.
- Started his postseason career by retiring 15 consecutive batters...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, Vest's streak tied Jeremy Bonderman for the longest by a Tigers pitcher to start his postseason career and was the longest by an MLB pitcher to begin his playoff career since Trevor Stephan retired 16 straight from Oct. 8-18, 2022.

- Became the 31st active player to have 5,000 career plate appearances on Aug. 2 against Philadelphia...in that game, he went 2-for-4 with a triple, home run and four runs batted in.
- Named a starting outfielder for the All-Star game, becoming the first player to start an All-Star game as a shortstop, second baseman and outfielder.
