New York Mets (25-33)

Fifth Place, NL East, 14.5 GB

METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Marlins, 6-1, at Citi Field yesterday...The Mets recorded double-digit hits for the 17th time this season and they are 12-5 in those contests... They allowed one or zero runs for the seventh time this season...They are 6-1 in those games...The Mets are 15-12 over their last 27 games...The Mets finish a six-game homestand (3-2) against Cincinnati (1-2) followed by the Marlins (2-0)... Following the homestand, the Mets head to the West Coast for the final time this season, a seven-day, six-game trip against the Mariners (three games) and Padres (three games).

LET'S GET STREAKY: The Mets have won three straight after dropping five straight...The team has posted a 2.25 ERA (7 ER/28.0 IP) with 14 walks and 32 strikeouts over that span...They are hitting .258/.311/.485 during the winning streak, outscoring their opponents 19-10 in that span.

HOW SWEEP IT IS: The Mets are looking for their second sweep of the season and second sweep at home today...The Mets swept the Tigers early this year...The last time the Mets swept the Marlins was from July 29-31, 2022 in Miami...The last time they swept the Marlins at Citi Field was from August 31-September 2, 2021.

HOME COOKING: The Mets have won eight of their last 11 at Citi Field and improved to 14-15 at home this season...They have posted a 4.16 ERA, while batting .235/.301/.366 at Citi Field.

MAY FLOWERS: The Mets are 15-12 in May...The team has posted a 3.52 ERA (95 ER/243.0 IP) with 257 strikeouts...Their 257 strikeouts are the second-most in the majors this month... They are hitting .229/.2968/.371 in the month of May...Their .229 average is 23rd in the majors.

ROLLING NOLAN: Nolan McLean is set to make his 11th career start at Citi Field...He is 3-3 with a 2.97 ERA (19 ER/57.2 IP) with 19 walks and 73 strikeouts in his career at Citi Field...Today will mark his first career start against the Marlins.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are 5-7 against the NL East this season...They have posted a 4.44 ERA against the division, while batting .233/.293/.390.

FOREVER YOUNG: Jared Young went 2-4 with one home run, an RBI and a run...He launched a solo home run to right field in the sixth inning to push the Mets lead to 4-1...He also singled to center field in the fourth inning...Has reached base safely in all nine of his starts this season...Through 15 games this season he is batting .345 (10-29).

HOT SOTO: Juan Soto has safely reached base in 14 straight games since May 14...Over that span he is slashing .373/.467/.843 (19-51) with 14 RBI.

MARLINS-METS NOTES: The Mets are hosting the Marlins at Citi Field for the first time this year...They have dropped four of their last seven games to the Marlins at the ballpark...Overall, the Mets are 89-61 against the Marlins since the yard opened in 2009.

JUAN OF A KIND: Juan Soto has 256 career home runs...That is tied with Juan González for the 11th-most in Major League history prior to turning 28 (next: Frank Robinson, 256)...His 256 homers are 24th among active players...It is 21st all-time amongst players born in the Dominican Republic...George Bell is next with 256.

CARSON CONNECTS: Carson Benge singled in the first inning, doubled in the fifth and seventh innings yesterday... He recorded his fifth three-hit game of the season...He is tied for the eighth-most games in the NL...It was his 13th multi-hit performance of the season and his ninth in May...During the month he is batting .308 (32-104)...His 32 hits are tied for the third-most in the NL in May.

STRIKE THAT: Mets pitchers have tallied 546 strikeouts this season, the fourth-most in franchise history through the team's first 58 games of a season...Only the 2020 team (559), the 2021 team (556) and the 2018 team (550) had more...Their 546 strikeouts are the second-most in the majors.

A.J. STYLES: In 18 games so far into his Major League career, A.J. Ewing is batting .250 (15-60) with seven runs, one triple, one home run, six RBI, eight walks, four steals and a .338 OBP... He has safely reached base in 13 of his 18 games this year.

DREAM WEAVER: Luke Weaver as not allowed a run this month, tossing 12.2 scoreless innings and allowing nine hits, four walks and striking out 16...He is now 2-1 with a 2.92 ERA (8 ER/24.2 IP) this season with eight walks and 24 strikeouts...He has recorded five multi-inning appearances this season and each of those appearances have been scoreless.

THIS DAY IN 1986: The Mets had their winning streak snapped with a 7-3 loss to the Giants...The Giants jumped out to a 4-0 lead in the first, but the Mets cut it in half...San Francisco added two more in the third and another in the fourth to earn the win...Bobby Ojeda took the loss allowing all seven runs, while Mookie Wilson collected two hits and homered...This season, the Mets will celebrate the 40th anniversary of the 1986 World Series Champions...The Mets will also host a 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration to celebrate the 1986 title on Saturday, August 1 prior to the 4:10 p.m. game against the Miami Marlins...Additional information for the 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration is available at [Mets.com/1986](https://mets.com/1986).

LAST TIME OUT: Suffered his second consecutive loss after a career-low 3.1 innings while allowing a career-high seven earned runs on May 25 vs. Cincinnati (3.1 IP, 5 H, 7 ER, 2 HR, 2 BB, 2 HB)...Has allowed seven+ runs in each of his last two starts....Has allowed 16 runs over his last two starts after only allowing 32 over his first 17 career starts...Is now 2-4 with a 4.40 ERA (30 ER/61.1 IP), 75 strikeouts and is holding his opponents to a .212 (48-226) batting average over 11 starts.

AHEAD OF THE PACK: Among qualified NL pitchers, he is tied for fifth in strikeouts, ninth in opposing batting average and 10th in WHIP (1.09)...Among all qualified rookies in the majors, he ranks first in strikeouts, third in innings pitched, fifth in batting average against and WHIP, and ninth in ERA.

SPIN THAT THING: This season, he has thrown his curveball 12.1% of the time and he is generating an average of 3,286 RPM on the pitch...That is the highest average RPM on any qualified pitch in the majors this season...He is posting a 42.6% whiff rate on his curveball...It is the 14th-highest whiff rate on a curveball this season (min. 100 pitches)...Batters are hitting just .061 (2-33) in at-bats ending with his curveball, which is the fourth-lowest opponents' batting average in at-bats ending with a curveball in the majors (min. 100 pitches)...Over his first 19 career starts, opposing batters are hitting .066 (4-60) in at-bats ending with McLean's curveball, and he has recorded a career 46.3% whiff rate on the pitch.

NEW FISH: Will face off against the Marlins for the first time in his career...Over five career starts against division opponents, he is 2-2 with a 2.90 ERA (10 ER/31.0 IP) and 29 strikeouts.

SINK SINK BABY: McLean has thrown his sinker 36.0% of the time this season, up from 27.9% last season...His sinker has produced a nine-run value, which is tied for the fifth-highest run value on any pitch in the Majors this season and is the highest mark on any sinker this season...Batters are hitting just .191 (18-94) in at-bats ending with his sinker.

RECORD BOOKS: Through 19 career starts, McLean is 7-5 with a 3.38 ERA (41 ER/109.1 IP) and 132 strikeouts...His 132 strikeouts are the third-most in franchise history through a pitcher's first 19 career starts, only trailing Dwight Gooden's 154 and Matt Harvey's 138...Per *Elias*...He is one of seven pitchers in Major League history to strikeout 132+ batters and allow 41 or fewer earned runs through their first 19 starts.

IN THE CITI: Over 10 starts at Citi Field he has posted a 2.97 ERA (19 ER/57.2 IP)...He has struck out at least six batters in all 10 of his home starts, and he is only the second player in Major League history to accomplish the feat (also: Kerry Wood, 6 K's in each of his first 11 career home starts in 1998 with CHC)...His first three home starts were scoreless and he became the first Met pitcher to not allow a run in their first three career starts at home and the seventh pitcher in Major League history not to allow a run in each of their first three home starts (min. 15.0 IP)...His 19.1 inning scoreless streak at home is the longest to start a career since Robert Suarez didn't allow a run through all 24.0 innings he threw at home during the 2022 season...Per *Elias*.

PERFECT FIVE: He has retired each of his first 15 batters faced twice this season (4/21 vs. MIN and 4/3 at SF) ...He is the third pitcher in franchise history to be perfect through 5.0 innings multiple times in a season (also: Steve Trachsel, 2002 and Rick Reed, 1998)...His is the first pitcher in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to retire each of his first 15 batters multiple times in his first 13 career starts...Per *Elias*...When he was perfect through 5.0 innings on April 3 he became the first Mets pitcher to retire each of their first 15 batters faced since Sean Manaea retired each of the first 17 batters he faced on August 21, 2024, vs. Baltimore.

ROOKIE SENSATION: McLean was called up to the Majors on August 16, 2025, and he finished the season with the big-league club...Last season he made eight starts for the Mets, and he finished 5-1 with a 2.06 ERA (11 ER/48.0 IP) and 57 strikeouts...The Mets went 6-2 as a team in games started by McLean...His ERA is the third-best in franchise history through a player's first eight career starts, only trailing Terry Leach's 1.68 ERA and Rick Aguilera's 1.92 ERA...His 57 strikeouts are the third-most in franchise history through a pitcher's first eight career games, only trailing Nolan Ryan's 64 and Dwight Gooden's 59...He became the first pitcher in Major League history to throw at least 5.0 innings, strikeout five or more, and allow two or fewer earned runs in each of his first seven career starts...He is one of four players in Major League history to record 57 or more strikeouts and allow 11 or fewer earned runs through their first eight career games...He joins Nolan Ryan, Stephen Strasburg, and Paul Skenes as the only other pitchers to do so...Because McLean threw less than 50.0 innings last season, he is still considered a rookie under MLB's eligibility criteria...He entered the season as the No. 6 prospect in all of baseball, the No. 1 pitching prospect in baseball, and the No. 1 prospect in the Mets system according to *MLBPipeline.com*.

MC-USA: He represented the USA in the WBC...He made two starts and he finished with a 5.87 ERA (5 ER/7.2 IP) with eight strikeouts...He held opposing batters to a .222 (6-27) batting average during the event....He got the ball in the championship game vs. Venezuela on March 17

and he tossed 4.2 innings and allowed two earned runs while striking out four.

DAZZLING DEBUT: Made his Major League debut on August 16 vs. Seattle...Earned his first Major League win after tossing 5.1 scoreless innings and striking out eight...He joined Matt Harvey as the only pitchers in Mets history to earn a win, strike out eight or more batters, and allow zero runs in their Major League Debut...His eight strikeouts are tied for the third-most by a Met in their Major League debut (also: Tom Seaver, Bill Denehy, and Kodai Senga)...The only Mets who have recorded more strikeouts in their Major League debut are Harvey (11) and Collin McHugh (9)...Became the second pitcher in franchise history to throw at least 5.0 scoreless innings, allow two or fewer hits and strike out eight or more batters in their Major League debut (also: McHugh).

MINOR LEAGUE RECAP: Last season, he appeared in 21 games between Double-A Binghamton and Triple-A Syracuse and posted a 2.45 ERA (31 ER/113.2 IP)...He recorded 127 strikeouts over those 113.2 innings, good for a K/9 of 10.06...His 127 strikeouts were the second-most among Mets minor leaguers and the 18th among all minor leaguers at the time of his callup...He only surrendered two or more earned runs in one of his last 14 appearances prior to being called up...Overall from 2023-2025, he made 48 minor league appearances (44 starts) and finished 12-15 with a 3.10 ERA (78 ER/226.2 IP) and 245 strikeouts.

TWO-WAY COWBOY: The Willow Spring, North Carolina native, was a two-way player during his time at Oklahoma State and during the beginning of his professional career...During his final collegiate season he pitched in 14 games and posted a 3.30 ERA (11 ER/30.0 IP) while batting .250 (31-124) and having a .911 OPS...Overall he finished he career at Oklahoma State with a career .957 OPS and 36 home runs...Was originally drafted by Baltimore in the third round of the 2022 First-Year Player Draft but decided to return to school and was drafted by the Mets in the third round of the 2023 First-Year Player Draft...He hit in his first two professional seasons and overall he finished as a .185 (27-146) hitter with nine home runs and 24 RBI.

- Threw a scoreless seventh inning and struck out the side on May 30 vs. Miami (1.0 IP, 3 K)...Marked his second three-strikeout game of the season (also: 4/11 vs. ATH).
- Allowed one earned run over 1.0 inning in relief on March 29 vs. Miami (1.0 IP, H, ER, BB)...Allowed an earned run for the first time since May 10, he didn't allow an earned run in each of his prior six appearances (8.1 IP).
- Made his fourth start of the season on May 27 vs. Cincinnati (1.0 IP, H, 2 K, BB) and he tossed a scoreless inning...Over seven career appearances as an opener, he has allowed two earned runs and one hit over 8.1 innings.
- His 1.86 ERA (6 ER/29.0 IP) this season is the 12th-best mark in the NL among all pitchers (min. 25.0 IP)...Has held opposing batters to a .160 batting average (16-100), which is the 10th-best mark in the majors (min. 25.0 IP).
- Over 10 career appearances against Miami he has pitched to a 2.70 ERA (3 ER/10.0 IP) and has one career save against the Marlins.
- He hasn't surrendered an earned run in 20 of 25 appearances this season.
