AT A GLANCE: The Yankees continue their six-game homestand tonight with the first game of a three-game set vs. the Reds... are 2-1 on the homestand after winning two-of-three games against the White Sox earlier this week...following this homestand, will embark on a seven-game road trip to Detroit (Mon.-Wed.) and Boston (6/25-28).

- **Their 45-28 (.616) record is the best in the American League and the fourth-best record in the Majors.**
- Had their four-game winning streak snapped on Thursday (6/13-17)... **have still won eight of their last 10 games (since 6/7) and nine of their last 12 games (since 6/4)...are 15-6 in their last 21 games (since 5/24), 17-9 in their last 26 games (since 5/18) and 37-21 in their last 58 games (since 4/13).**
- Are 17 games over .500, 1 game shy of their season high mark (18 games at 45-27 on 6/18).
- Are in a stretch of playing 16 straight games without an off day (6/16-7/1).
- The Yankees' +118 run differential this season is the best in the AL and the second-best in the Majors...have outscored their opponents, 129-76, over their last 21 games (since 5/24).

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees fell to the White Sox, 5-1, on Thursday at Yankee Stadium... **LHP Ryan Weathers** (6.1IP, 3H, 1R/ER, 1BB, 8K, 1HR) started and did not record a decision despite allowing only 1R/ER in 6.1IP... **3B Ryan McMahon** (1-for-3, 1R, 1HR, 1RBI) drove in the Yankees' only run with a game-tying solo HR in the third inning... **PH/SS Anthony Volpe** (1-for-1, 1 double, 1BB) reached base twice... **RHP Fernando Cruz** (0.2IP, 1H, 1R/ER, 1K) suffered his second loss of the season... **RHP Camilo Doval** (1.2IP, 2H, 1R/ER, 1K, 1HR) surrendered a go-ahead grand slam to Andrew Benintendi in the eighth inning.

JUNE BOON: During **Manager Aaron Boone's** tenure (since 2018), the Yankees have gone 116-82 (.586) during the month of June, the second-best record in the AL and fourth-best in the Majors during the calendar month, trailing only Houston (126-74, .630), Los Angeles-NL (121-78, .608) and Atlanta (120-79, .603).

- The Yankees have gone 9-5 (.643) this month, the best record in the AL and second-best record in June, trailing only Miami (11-4, .733).

RICE RICE BABY: **C/INF Ben Rice** has reached base in 17 of his last 19 games (since 5/26), batting .325/.429/.597 (25-for-77) with 17R, 5 doubles, 2 triples, 4HR, 16RBI and 14BB over that span.

- Has hit .291/.388/.606 (73-for-251) with 53R, 15 doubles, 2 triples, 20HR, 49RBI, 39BB/31BB, 2HP, 2SF and 2SB in 68 games this season...has reached base safely in 53-of-64 starts.
- 37 of his 73H this year have been XBH (15 doubles, 2 triples, 20HR).

GOOD AS GOLD: **INF Paul Goldschmidt** singled in the ninth inning on Thursday vs. Chicago-AL to extend his season-high hitting streak to 10 games (since 6/7)...is hitting .395/.413/.674 (17-for-43) with 4R, 4HR, 13RBI, 2BB and 1SF over that stretch...marks his longest hitting streak since an 11-game streak from 8/24-9/4/24 with St. Louis.

- **Has hit safely in 19 of his last 20 games (since 5/25), batting .349/.374/.593 (30-for-86) with 11R, 3 doubles, 6HR, 22RBI, 4BB, 1SF and 1SB over that span.**
- Has recorded 13RBI in his last 10 games (since 6/7) and 22RBI in his last 18 games (since 5/27).
- Is batting .329/.381/.589 (48-for-146) with 21R, 6 doubles, 1 triple, 10HR, 33RBI, 11BB, 2HP, 1SF and 1SB over his last 39 games (since 4/26).
- **Has hit .412/.523/.735 (14-for-34) with 2 doubles, 3HR, 24RBI, 7BB, 1SF and 2HP with RISP this season...**as a Yankee (since 2025), has hit .336/.424/.476 (48-for-143) with 8 doubles, 4HR, 58RBI, 21BB/51BB, 3HP and 3SF with RISP.

FOR STARTERS: **Yankees starters** have posted a 3.27 ERA (401.1IP, 146ER) and 391K in 73 starts this season...have allowed 3R-or-fewer in 60 starts this season, the most in the AL and tied for the most in the Majors (also Milwaukee)...marks their third-most in franchise history through their first 73 games of a season, trailing only their 61 starts in 2022 and 2024.

- Lead the Majors in opponents' SLG (.345), rank second in ERA (3.27, first in AL), opponents' OPS (.631, first in AL) and HR/9.0IP (0.94, first in AL), third in opponents' BA (.217, first in AL), WHIP (1.13, second in AL) and opponents' OBP (.286, second in AL), seventh in strikeout rate (23.8%, third in AL), and eighth in K/BB (2.94, fourth in AL) and K/9.0IP (8.77, fourth in AL).

ON A ROLL: **OF Spencer Jones** has hit .346/.433/.654 (9-for-26) with 4R, 2 doubles, 2HR, 5RBI, 4BB and 1SB over his last eight starts (since 5/21).

2026 HOPE WEEK: This week, the Yankees are celebrating the 17th edition of **HOPE Week (Helping Others Persevere & Excel)**, an ambitious, week-long, multifaceted community outreach program undertaken by players, coaches and employees within the organization...the initiative is rooted in the belief that acts of goodwill provide hope and encouragement to more than just the recipient of the gesture...over each of the five days of HOPE Week, the Yankees will reach out to an individual, family or organization worthy of recognition and support, providing honorees with a day celebrating their accomplishments...this year's outreach will take place in the community and at Yankee Stadium.



- Earlier today, the Yankees honored **Bronx Legends Boxing Academy**, a free program for young people who are struggling — often for reasons well beyond their control — with academics, family instability and personal loss...it fosters a culture of mentorship where coaches take time to understand each athlete's personal challenges...Bronx Legends Boxing has produced Golden Gloves champions and national competitors, however its greatest achievement is in tapping the leadership potential of young people who would otherwise be headed down a much different path...Yankees **Manager Aaron Boone**, players **Cody Bellinger**, **José Caballero** and **Max Schuemann** along with **Yankees Bench Coach Brad Ausmus** toured the facility at Bronx Legends Gym, participated in chi gong meditation/light boxing exercises and learned more about the organization.
- Since the start of HOPE Week in 2009, the Yankees have gone 46-29 (.613) during the event...the Yankees have gone .500-or-better in 11 of their first 16 years of HOPE Week and have gone undefeated during HOPE Week four times (5-0 in 2009, 4-0 in 2014, 5-0 in 2016 and 5-0 in 2019)...are 33-21 in their last 54 HOPE Week games (since 7/10/13).

GOOD SCHLIT: **RHP Cam Schittler** will make his 16th start of the year tonight...has gone 7-3 with a 1.82 ERA (89.0IP, 18ER) and 96K in 15 starts this season, holding opponents to a .195/.238/.294 (63-for-323) slash line.

- **His 1.82 ERA is the lowest ERA by a Yankees pitcher through his first 15 starts of a season in the last 42 years (since 1985) and the seventh-lowest in the last 82 years (since 1945),** trailing only Allie Reynolds (1.47 ERA in 1952), Ron Guidry (1.50 ERA in 1978), Whitey Ford (2x: 1.53 ERA in 1964 and 1.66 ERA in 1958), Phil Niekro (1.71 ERA in 1984) and Spud Chandler (a lower 1.82 ERA in 1946).

- **Has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 14 of his 15 starts this season,** the most in the AL and the second-most in the Majors.
- **Has allowed 1ER-or-fewer in 11 of his starts this season, including nine of his last 11 starts (since 4/17)...his 11 starts of 1ER-or-fewer are the most in the Majors.**
- The Yankees are 11-4 in his starts...his 11 team wins are tied for the second-most in the Majors this season (tied for second in AL).
- Has tossed at least 6.0IP in nine of his last 14 starts (since 4/1), including eight of his last 11 starts (since 4/17).
- According to *Elias*, **his 2.33 career ERA is the third-lowest by a Yankees pitcher through their first 29 career starts** (ignoring relief appearances and excluding openers), trailing only Stan Bahnsen (2.09 ERA from 1966-68) and Bill Stafford (2.20 ERA from 1960-61)...**also marks the lowest ERA by a Yankees pitcher whose first 29 career appearances were all starts and the third-lowest by any Major League pitcher since 1913 (when ER became an official stat),** trailing only Pittsburgh's Paul Skenes (2.06 ERA) and Miami's José Fernández (2.17 ERA).

HIGH VOLTAGE: **INF Anthony Volpe** reached base twice on Thursday vs. Chicago-AL...has hit .471/.550/.706 (8-for-17) with 5R, 2 doubles, 1 triple, 4RBI and 3BB over his last six games (since 6/10).

- Is batting .333/.462/.333 (7-for-21) with 9RBI and 5BB with RISP this year.

McMAHON OF THE HOUR: **INF Ryan McMahon** hit his eighth HR of the season on Thursday vs. Chicago-AL with a game-tying solo HR in the third inning...five of his 8HR this year have either tied the game (three) or gave the Yankees the lead (two).

- Is hitting .286/.322/.571 (16-for-56) with 7R, 1 double, 5HR, 10RBI, 3BB and 1SB over his last 17 starts (since 5/19).

SAVED BY THE BELL: **INF/OF Cody Bellinger** is hitting .297/.380/.539 (49-for-165) with 27R, 12 doubles, 2 triples, 8HR, 35RBI, 24BB, 5SB and 3SF over his last 45 games (since 4/28).

MONDAY: The Yankees kicked off 2026 HOPE Week on Monday by honoring **Jatee Kearsley** and her Bed-Stuy bakery, **Je T'aime Pâtisserie**, which brings affordable, finely crafted food within reach of families in challenging financial circumstances — like she had growing up. At the present, Kearsley is struggling to keep her bakery afloat, resisting suggestions such as moving to Manhattan, raising prices or eliminating her acceptance of EBT and SNAP. While these changes would ease her financial burden, she would forfeit everything she believes in.

HOPE Week Event: Yankees players **Carlos Rodón, Cam Schlittler, Will Warren, J.C. Escarra, Spencer Jones, and Ryan Yarbrough** along with **Pitching Coach Matt Blake** and **Legends Global Yankee Stadium Executive Chef Robert Flowers** joined Kearsley, a small group of her friends and family for a day of baking at Je T'aime Pâtisserie. Given that the Yankees did not have a game on Monday, Kearsley, her family and friends were guests of the team on Tuesday at Yankee Stadium.

TUESDAY: The team honored **Dunia Sibomana-Rodriguez** and the organization **Smile Rescue Fund for Kids**, which brought Dunia to the United States and performed over a dozen surgeries on him to repair severe facial and limb trauma that was caused by a childhood chimpanzee attack in his original home in the Democratic Republic of the Congo. Now a graduating high school senior and wrestling star, Dunia is heading off to the University of North Carolina on scholarship this fall.

HOPE Week Event: **Aaron Judge, Giancarlo Stanton, Paul Goldschmidt, Ben Rice, Anthony Volpe, David Bednar** and **Assistant Pitching Coach Preston Claiborne** joined Dunia's family and friends — along with other children from the Smile Rescue Fund for Kids — for a surprise graduation / bon voyage party in Yankee Stadium's Delta Sky360 Suite.

WEDNESDAY: The Yankees showcased Bronx-based organization **First Tee Metropolitan New York**, a youth development organization which uses the game of golf as a vehicle to teach life skills, shape character and prepare students for long-term success both on and off the course. While its roots are in sport, its branches extend into education, leadership and college readiness through its "Path to College" program, which is designed to equip middle and high school students with the practical tools and emotional readiness required to pursue higher education through the college application process and beyond. First Tee stands as a testament to the power of holistic youth development. Through their model, a generation of young people are learning that the skills they build on the golf course can help them unlock a lifetime of possibilities far away from the fairway.

It also fosters a culture of mentorship, integrating academic support, tutoring and SAT preparation into its holistic mission. The philosophy is simple — discipline learned in the ring must carry over into the classroom.

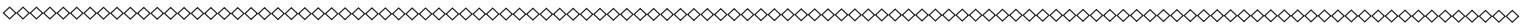
