### TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

**April 23, 2000:** In a 10-7 Yankees win at Toronto, Jorge Posada and Bernie Williams become the first pair of teammates in Major League history to each hit home runs from both sides of the plate in the same game.

**April 23, 1903:** The Highlanders record the first win in franchise history, a 7-2 victory at Washington. Harry Howell is the winning pitcher.

### TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

**April 24, 1923:** The Yankees record the first shutout in Original Yankee Stadium history, a 4-0 win over the Washington Senators. Sad Sam Jones tosses a complete-game shutout (9.0IP, 5H, 1BB, 4K) and Babe Ruth goes 3-for-3 with 1HR and 3RBI.

**April 24, 1917:** Yankees left-hander George Mogridge pitches the first no-hitter in franchise history in a 2-1 victory at Boston (3BB, 3K). It will mark the last time the Yankees have a lefty throw a no-hitter until Dave Righetti turns the trick on 7/4/83 vs. Boston.

**AT A GLANCE:** The Yankees will continue their seven-game homestand tonight with the second game of a four-game set vs. Oakland (0-1 thus far)...are 2-2 on the homestand after winning two-of-three games vs. Tampa Bay this weekend and dropping their series opener vs. Oakland on Monday... after this homestand, will embark on a seven-game road trip to Milwaukee (Fri.-Sun.) and Baltimore (4/29-5/2).

- Their 15-8 record (.652) is tied with Philadelphia for the fifth-best record in the Majors, trailing only Cleveland (16-6, .727), Atlanta (15-6, .714), Baltimore (15-7, .682) and Milwaukee (14-7, .667)...their 15 wins are tied for the second-most in the Majors, trailing only Cleveland (16).
- Marks just the fifth time in the last 21 years (since 2004) the Yankees have gone 15-8 or better to start a season (also went 17-6 in 2022, 16-7 in 2020 and 15-8 in 2010 and '17).
- *With a win tonight*, it would also mark just the fourth time in the last 21 years (since 2004) the Yankees went 16-8 or better to start a season (went 18-6 in 2022 and 16-8 in 2010 and '20).
- The Yankees are in the midst of a 17-day stretch without an off day (4/19-5/5)...are 2-2 so far.
- Seven of the Yankees' 15 wins are come-from-behind wins...have recorded four wins this season when trailing after six innings...recorded just six such wins in 2023.
- Have won six of their seven completed series this season.
- Are 5-2 following a loss this year.

**YESTERDAY'S NEWS:** The Yankees were shut out, 2-0, on Monday vs. Oakland...**LHP Carlos Rodón** (7.0IP, 1H, 0R, 2BB, 4K, 2HP) tossed 7.0 scoreless innings in a no-decision, his first scoreless start as a Yankee...**LF Alex Verdugo** (0-for-1, 2BB) was the only Yankee to reach base multiple times...**C Jose Trevino** (1-for-3) extended his hitting streak to seven games...**DH Giancarlo Stanton** (1-for-3) and **SS Anthony Volpe** (1-for-4) were the only other Yankees to record a hit...**LHP Victor González** (0.0IP, 2H, 2R/ER, 1BB, 1HR) took his first loss of the year after allowing a two-run HR to Zack Gelof in the ninth inning...**RHP Ian Hamilton** (1.0IP, 1H, 1BB, 2K) and **RHP Ron Marinaccio** (1.0IP, 2K) were both scoreless in relief.

**FOR STARTERS:** Yankees starters have posted a 2.84 ERA (123.2IP, 39ER) in 23 starts this year, the third-lowest ERA in the Majors, trailing only Boston (1.73) and Philadelphia (2.20)...have allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 20 of their 23 starts, 2ER-or-fewer in 16 starts and 1ER-or-fewer in 11 starts... have not allowed more than 4ER in any start this season.

- Also rank third in the Majors in opponents' SLG (.346), fourth in opponents' OPS (.658) and fifth in opponents' BA (.227).
- **Yankees starters have allowed just 4R/3ER over their last five starts (since 4/17), posting a 0.89 ERA (30.1IP, 3ER) with 31K.**

**BLANK SPACE:** Yankees batters were shut out for the fourth time this season on Monday vs. Oakland and for the second time in the last three games (also 0R on 4/2 at Arizona, 4/5 vs. Toronto and 4/20 vs. Tampa Bay)...in their other 19 games this year, have scored at least 4R in 15 of those games, at least 5R in 13 games and at least 6R in eight games.

- Are 3-0 in games following a shutout this year...have scored at least 5R in each of those games.

**MATCHING UP:** Since 2022, the Yankees are 10-4 in their last 14 games vs. Oakland...are 16-7 in their last 23 games vs. the A's (since 8/31/19)...have won or split each of their last seven completed series (5-0-2) against Oakland (since 8/30/19).

- Had their eight-game home winning streak vs. the A's snapped on Monday (6/19/21-5/10/23)...are still 10-2 in their last 12 games vs. Oakland at Yankee Stadium (since 8/31/19) and 14-4 in their last 18 games against the A's in the Bronx (since 5/27/17).
- Have won each of their last six completed series vs. Oakland at Yankee Stadium (since 2017).

**ON A ROLL:** **C Jose Trevino** has hit safely in each of his last seven games, batting .409/.458/.545 (9-for-22) with 3R, 1HR, 6RBI and 2BB over that span (since 4/13).

**PITCH PERFECT:** Yankees pitchers have posted a **2.95 ERA (207.2IP, 68ER) this year, the third-lowest ERA in the Majors, trailing only Boston (2.52) and Detroit (2.85)**...their 2.95 ERA is their second-lowest through the Yankees' first 23 games of a season in the last 43 years since 1982 (2.69 ERA in 2022).

- Have held opponents to 3R-or-fewer in 14 of 23 games this year (are 10-4 in those games)...are 13-4 this season when holding their opponent to 4R-or-fewer.

**VERDAWGO:** **OF Alex Verdugo** was the only Yankee to reach base multiple times on Monday vs. Oakland...is hitting .349/.462/.558 (15-for-43) with 10R, 6 doubles, 1HR, 4RBI, 8BB, 1HP and 1SB over his last 13 games (since 4/8)... has reached base in 12 of those games.

**CLOSE CALLS:** The Yankees have had 15 of their 23 games decided by 2R-or-fewer (are 10-5 in those games)...their 15 such games are the most in the Majors...are 7-2 in one-run games...their nine one-run games are tied with Oakland for the second-most in the Majors (Detroit-10).

- The Yankees have had 18 of their 23 games decided by 3R-or-fewer...their 18 such games are tied with St. Louis for the most in the Majors.
- Each of their last eight games, nine of their last 10 games and 10 of their last 12 games have been decided by 2R-or-fewer.

**STRO SHOW:** **RHP Marcus Stroman** will make his fifth start of the season tonight vs. Oakland...is 1-1 with a 2.42 ERA (22.1IP, 6ER) and 19K in four starts this season... **has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in three of his four starts this year.**

- Is 1-1 with a 3.61 ERA (42.1IP, 38H, 18R/17ER, 17BB, 40K, 3HR) in seven career starts vs. Oakland...has allowed one-or-zero runs in four of his seven starts against the A's, including each of his last three starts...is 1-0 with a 0.43 ERA (21.0IP, 1ER) over his last three starts against the A's (since 2019).
- **Has not allowed a run in his last 20.0 innings vs. Oakland** (since 4/19/19).

**RODOMINANT:** **LHP Carlos Rodón** (7.0IP, 1H, 0R, 2BB, 4K, 2HP) did not record a decision on Monday vs. Oakland despite tossing 7.0 scoreless innings...marked his first scoreless start as a Yankee and first since 9/29/22 vs. Colorado with San Francisco (0R in 6.0IP)...marked his longest scoreless start since 7/31/22 vs. Chicago-NL with San Francisco (also 0R in 7.0IP).

- Marked his longest start of the season and longest since 8/23/22 at Detroit with San Francisco (also 7.0IP).
- Has allowed 3R-or-fewer in each of his five starts this season and 2R-or-fewer in four of those starts, posting a 2.70 ERA (26.2IP, 8ER) this year.

**THE GREAT JUAN:** **OF Juan Soto** has reached base safely in 20 of his 23 games this season, hitting .322/.439/.552 (28-for-87) with 14R, 5 doubles, 5HR, 20RBI, 19BB, 1SB and 1SF...has reached base multiple times in 14 of those games.

- Had his 14-game on-base streak snapped on Monday (4/6-21)...hit .360/.492/.680 (18-for-50) with 11R, 4 doubles, 4HR, 16RBI, 14BB, 1SB and 1SF in that span.
- **Is batting .529/.609/1.118 (9-for-17) with 1 double, 3HR, 17RBI, 5BB and 1SF with RISP this season**...with RISP, leads the Majors in SLG and OPS (1.726), ranks third in OBP (second in AL) and fourth in BA (second in AL).
- Ranks second in the Majors in OBP (.439, first in AL), second in WAR among position players (1.6 - FanGraphs, first in AL), tied for second in times on base (47, first in AL), third in walks (19, second in AL), tied for sixth in RBI (20, tied for fourth in AL), and tied for ninth in hits (28, tied for fourth in AL) and multi-hit games (nine, tied for seventh in AL)...also ranks fifth in the AL in OPS (.991) and ninth in BA (.322).

**THREE'S COMPANY:** The Yankees are 15-2 (.882) this season when scoring at least 3R, the best such record in the Majors.

**BATTERS' EYE:** Yankees batters lead the Majors with a 4.13 pitches per plate appearance ratio.

- Lead the Majors with 102BB and an 8.55 PA/BB ratio (872PA/102BB).

## TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP MARCUS STROMAN (1-1, 2.42 ERA)

**RHP Marcus Stroman** will make his fifth start of the season tonight vs. Oakland...the 32-year-old will pitch on extended five days' rest due to Thursday's team off day...last pitched on Wednesday at Toronto and did not record a decision in the Yankees' 6-4 win despite allowing only 2ER in 5.1IP (6H, 2BB, 2K, 1HR)...was 10-9 with a 3.95 ERA (136.2IP, 120H, 68R/60ER, 52BB, 119K, 9HR) in 27 games (25 starts/1SHO) with the Cubs in 2023...among Major League pitchers with at least 100.0 innings pitched in 2023, ranked second in groundball percentage (58.4) and home runs allowed per 9.0 innings (0.59), eighth in opponents' slugging percentage (.335) and 12th in opponents' OPS (.640)...is a two-time All-Star (2019 with Toronto and 2023 with Chicago-NL) and a Gold Glove Award winner (2017 with Toronto)...over parts of 10 seasons with the Toronto Blue Jays (2014-19), New York Mets (2019, '21), Chicago Cubs (2022-23) and Yankees (2024), has gone 78-77 with four complete games (two shutouts) and a 3.63 ERA (1,326.0IP, 1,274H, 600R/535ER, 385BB, 1,110K, 122HR) in 235 career games (227 starts)...since making his Major League debut in 2014, ranks second in the Majors in groundball percentage (57.6) and fourth in home runs allowed per 9.0 innings (0.83)...has made eight career Opening Day rosters (2016-19 with Toronto, 2021 with New York-NL, 2022-23 with Chicago-NL and 2024 with the Yankees)...was selected by the Toronto Blue Jays in the first round (22nd overall) of the 2012 First-Year Player Draft out of Duke University...was signed by the Yankees to a two-year Major League contract extending through the 2025 season with a conditional player option for the 2026 season on 1/17/24.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Did not record a decision in the Yankees' 6-4 win on Wednesday at Toronto (5.1IP, 6H, 2R/ER, 2BB, 2K, 1HR)...allowed his only runs on a two-run HR to Daulton Varsho in the second inning...retired 11 of his final 13BF.

**2024:** Is 1-1 with a 2.42 ERA (22.1IP, 6ER) and 19K in four starts this season...has held opponents to a .210/.297/.346 (17-for-81, 2HR) slash line this year.

- ✦ **Has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in three of his four starts.**
- ✦ Has just one run of support over his last three starts.
- ✦ His 60.7 groundball percentage is the highest in the AL and tied for the third-highest in the Majors (min. 20.0IP).
- ✦ **Was just the third Yankee in the last 57 years (since 1968) to toss at least 6.0IP and not allow an earned run in each of his first two starts of a season,** joining Freddy García (first 2GS in 2011) and Ramiro Mendoza (first 2GS in 1999).
- ✦ Made his Yankees debut on 3/30 at Houston and earned the win in the Yankees' 5-3 victory (6.0IP, 4H, 3R/0ER, 2BB, 4K, 0HR, 1HP)...allowed two unearned runs in the second inning and one unearned run in the fifth inning.
- ✦ Tossed 6.0 scoreless innings and did not record a decision in his first start in the Bronx as a Yankee on 4/5 vs. Toronto (6.0IP, 3H, 0R, 1BB, 6K)...according to *Elias*, was the seventh New York-born pitcher in franchise history to start the Yankees' home opener, joining Dave LaPoint (1990), John Candelaria (1989), Whitey Ford (1955-58, '60-64, '66-67), Ed Lopat (1949), Waite Hoyt (1927) and George Mogridge (1919)...started his club's home opener for the fourth time in his career.
- ✦ Took his first loss of the year in the Yankees' 5-2 loss on 4/10 vs. Miami (5.0IP, 4H, 4R/ER, 4BB, 7K, 1HR)...allowed 4ER after not surrendering an earned run over his first two starts...allowed an RBI single to Luis Arraez and a three-run HR to Jake Burger in the third inning.

**161ST STREET STATION:** Will make his third home start of the year...is 0-1 with a 3.27 ERA (11.0IP, 4ER) and 13K in two starts in the Bronx this year.

- ✦ Has allowed 3ER-or-fewer in nine of his 13 career starts in the Bronx.

**VS. OAKLAND:** Is 1-1 with a 3.61 ERA (42.1IP, 38H, 18R/17ER, 17BB, 40K, 3HR) in seven career starts vs. Oakland...has allowed one-or-zero runs in four of his seven starts against the A's, including each of his last three starts.

- ✦ **Has not allowed a run in his last 20.0 innings vs. Oakland** (since 4/19/19)...is 1-0 with a 0.43 ERA (21.0IP, 1ER) over his last three starts against the A's.
- ✦ Made one start vs. the A's last season with the Cubs, tossing 6.0 scoreless innings in a no-decision at the Coliseum (2H, 2BB, 5K).
- ✦ Has allowed 3R-or-fewer in five of his seven starts against Oakland.

**HOMETOWN HERO:** Is just the sixth New York-born pitcher to start a game for the Yankees in the last 34 seasons (since 1991), joining Michael King (19GS from 2020-21, '23), Brian Gordon (2GS in 2011), Dellin Betances (1GS in 2011), Tim Lincecum (1GS in 2005) and Mike Jerzembek (2GS in 1998).

**2023:** Went 10-9 with a 3.95 ERA (136.2IP, 120H, 68R/60ER, 52BB, 119K, 9HR) in 27 games (25 starts/1SHO) with the Cubs in 2023...was an All-Star for the second time in his career...opponents batted .231/.304/.335 (120-for-519, 9HR); LH .194/.293/.282 (53-for-273, 4HR); RH .272/.318/.394 (67-for-246, 5HR).

- ✦ Among Major League pitchers with at least 100.0 innings pitched, ranked second in groundball percentage (58.4) and home runs allowed per 9.0 innings (0.59), eighth in opponents' slugging percentage (.335) and 12th in opponents' OPS (.640).
- ✦ Allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 18 of his 25 starts and 2ER-or-fewer in 16 of those starts.
- ✦ Went 9-4 with a 2.28 ERA (98.2IP, 25ER) in his first 16 starts from 3/30-6/20 before going 1-5 with an 8.29 ERA (38.0IP, 35ER) in his final 11 games (nine starts) from 6/25-9/28.
- ✦ Did not allow a HR over 52.2IP from 5/24-7/6...did not surrender a HR in seven straight starts from 5/29-7/1, the second-longest streak of his career (8G from 9/3/18-5/1/19).
- ✦ Was placed on the 15-day injured list with right hip inflammation on 8/2 (retroactive to 8/1)...while on the injured list, also missed time due to a right rib cartilage fracture...missed 41 team games...was reinstated from the injured list on 9/15.

**STRO SHOW:** Over parts of 10 seasons with the Toronto Blue Jays (2014-19), New York Mets (2019, '21), Chicago Cubs (2022-23) and Yankees (2024), has gone 78-77 with four complete games (two shutouts) and a 3.63 ERA (1,326.0IP, 1,274H, 600R/535ER, 385BB, 1,110K, 122HR) in 235 career games (227 starts)...is a two-time All-Star (2019 with Toronto and 2023 with Chicago-NL) and a Gold Glove Award winner (2017 with Toronto).

- ✦ Since making his Major League debut in 2014, ranks second in the Majors in groundball percentage (57.6) and fourth in home runs allowed per 9.0 innings (0.83).
- ✦ Was one of only 11 pitchers to make 25-or-more starts in at least six of the seven non-shortened seasons from 2016-23.
- ✦ His 1,168.1 innings since the start of 2016 are the 12th-most among Major League pitchers.
- ✦ Has made at least 30 starts in four seasons since 2016, tied for the eighth-most in the Majors over that span (32GS in 2016, 33GS in 2017, 32GS in 2019 and 33GS in 2021)...his four such seasons from 2016-21 matched the most by a Major League pitcher over that span.
- ✦ Has reached double-digit wins five times (2014, '17, '19, '21 and '23).

**BIGGER THAN BASEBALL:** Prior to the Yankees' 4/8 game vs. Miami, Stroman spent some time with players and staff from The Eagle Academy for Young Men (Bronx) baseball team in the Yankee Stadium Press Conference Room...the event marked the first of a series of meet-and-greets with the Long Island native, as Stroman will host a different community groups at Yankee Stadium throughout season.

- ✦ In March, the **Marcus Stroman Height Doesn't Measure Heart Foundation**, in collaboration with the educational platform Bold.org, announced the launch of the Marcus Stroman Scholarship...the initiative aims to empower high school seniors, offering them a chance to pursue higher education without the burden of financial constraints...the scholarship has committed \$250,000 over the next five years...this year, two deserving students attending high schools in the Bronx will each receive a \$25,000 scholarship to cover their freshman year college expenses for the academic year 2024-2025.
