**IT TAKES TWO TO MAKE A THING GO RIGHT:** The Detroit Tigers and Pittsburgh Pirates today enjoy a split doubleheader to conclude their three-game series at Comerica Park ... this is Detroit's third twinbill of the season as they have swept each of the first two -- April 26 vs. Baltimore and May 8 at Colorado ... after today, the Tigers take off for a quick three-game road trip at Tampa Bay this weekend before returning to Comerica Park for a six-game homestand starting Tuesday.

- At 47-27, the Tigers have the best record in the majors, 1.5 games ahead of the Cubs and Dodgers, and 4.0 games ahead of the Astros for tops in the A.L. ... the Tigers are off to their best start through 74 games in 19 years when they began 49-25 in 2006 ... the Tigers are 29-15 in their last 44 games starting April 30.
- The Tigers have posted a 47-24 record, a .662 winning percentage, in their last 71 games starting March 31 since enduring a three-game sweep to start the season at Dodger Stadium ... their 47-24 record, which is a 107-win pace over 162 games, starting March 31 is the best in all of baseball in that span and 6.0-games up on the Astros, the next closest A.L. team.
- The Tigers boast the best home record in the A.L. (25-11, .694) and the second-best home mark in all of baseball behind only the New York Mets (27-10, .730).
- This doubleheader with Pittsburgh concludes a stretch of nine out of 12 games in Detroit, a span that will later extend to 15 of 21 games at home to end the month of June thanks to next week's homestand vs. the ATH and the Minnesota Twins.

**IT TAKES TWO TO MAKE IT OUTTA SIGHT:** Spencer Torkelson (16 homers, 47 RBI) and Riley Greene (15 homers, 51 RBI) are the most dynamic duo on offense in the A.L., as they are the only set of teammates in the A.L. (and one of two in the majors) to have each reached 15 homers and 47 RBI.

- Greene has 15 homers, 51 RBI and 32 extra-base hits this season, joining Aaron Judge and Cal Raleigh as the only three players in the A.L. to reach those totals.
- Torkelson is fifth in the A.L. in homers and seventh in RBI while Greene is fourth in RBI and tied for sixth in homers ... [www.tigers.com/vote](http://www.tigers.com/vote).

**I WANNA ROCK RIGHT NOW:** Tarik Skubal is 7-0 with a 1.47 ERA (13 ER/79.2 IP) in his last 12 starts throwing the rock dating to April 8, featuring a 20.20 K/BB ratio during this span ... his seven-game winning streak is tied with Houston's Framber Valdez for the longest active same-season run in the majors and tied for the longest winning streak by any pitcher in the majors this season.

- Skubal's seven-game winning streak is the longest same-season run by a Tigers pitcher in nearly 10 years since Anibal Sanchez had a seven-gamer from June 9-July 22, 2015 ... Max Scherzer is the last Tigers pitcher to exceed seven games, as he had a 13-game winning streak 12 years ago from April 6-July 3, 2013.
- Skubal's seven-game winning streak is the longest same-season run by a Tigers southpaw in 30 years since David Wells had a nine-game winning streak from May 23-July 26, 1995.

**IT'S GOOD TO BE KING:** Tarik Skubal has 101 strikeouts and only five walks in his last 12 starts dating to April 8, just the second pitcher in major league history (dating to 1893) with 100 or more strikeouts and five walks or fewer in a 12-start span, joining Clayton Kershaw in 2016.

- Overall this season, Skubal has a 12.33 strikeout-to-walk ratio, which is more than double his next-closest competitor in St. Louis' Matthew Liberatore, who has a 6.00 K/BB ratio.
- The only big league pitcher ever to throw more than 100.0 innings in a season with a 12.0 strikeout-to-walk-ratio or better?: Clayton Kershaw with a 15.64 mark in 2016.
- Skubal enters tonight's outing having reached 7.0 innings pitched in four starts in a row for the first time in his career.

**WHEN LEFT IS RIGHT:** The Tigers this afternoon face lefthander Andrew Heaney, their third-straight opposing lefty starter ... the Tigers are 15-5 (.750) vs. southpaw starters this year, the most wins and tied with Houston for the best winning percentage against lefties by any club in the majors.

- The left-handed hitting Zach McKinstry is batting .361 (22-for-61) vs. left-handed pitching this season, the best average by a left-handed hitter vs. southpaws in the majors.

**THE DEPARTMENT OF GLEYBER:** Gleyber Torres, who leads all A.L. second basemen in All-Star voting, has posted a .789 OPS this year, the second-best OPS by any second baseman in the A.L. ... Torres leads all A.L. second basemen with a .375 on-base percentage and a .273 batting average, and is second in the A.L. with 34 RBI ... [www.tigers.com/vote](http://www.tigers.com/vote).

**WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE?:** The Tigers begin the day with the best record in the majors on the strength of a +84 overall run differential this year, trailing only the Yankees (+97) for the best mark in the A.L. ... in the A.L. Central, the Tigers have a +107 edge on the second-place Guardians (-23), are +80 on the third-place Twins (+4) and are +104 on the fourth-place Royals (-20).

**AND FINALLY:** The Tigers on Monday improved to 10 games above .500 against lefty starters with their 15-5 record ... no other team in baseball is more than four games above .500 vs. southpaws.

- Threw the first complete-game shutout of his professional career on May 25 against Cleveland, tossing a "Maddux". He needed just 94 pitches (72 strikes/22 balls) to record 27 outs, with 13 of those coming by way of strikeout, tying his career high. His 13 strikeouts were the most strikeouts by any pitcher in major league history in a "Maddux".
- In that outing, he became the first pitcher in Tigers history to throw a complete game issuing zero walks and allowing no more than two hits with at least 13 strikeouts ... he is the first pitcher in the majors to record such a start since Jacob deGrom did so on April 23, 2021.
- Struck out a season-high 12 batters on May 9 against Texas, marking the third 12-strikeout game of his career and his most in a game since his career-high 13 on July 7, 2024, at Cincinnati. With the outing, he became the first pitcher in MLB history to have 40+ strikeouts (50), no more than one walk (1) and an ERA under 1.00 (0.97: 4ER/37.0IP) over a six-start span since ERA became in official stat in both leagues in 1913.
- Went 3-1 with a 1.52 ERA (5 ER/29.2 IP) with 38 strikeouts and only four walks in five starts in April, a tick better than his April of 2024 when he went 3-0 with a 2.05 ERA (7 ER/30.2 IP) with 35 strikeouts and six walks in five starts en route to winning the A.L. Cy Young Award in unanimous fashion.
- Was the unanimous AL Cy Young winner in 2024, becoming the fifth Tiger to win the award, the first since Max Scherzer in 2013, and the second LHP in franchise history to ever do so (other, Willie Hernandez in 1984).
- Won the American League Pitching Triple Crown, finishing first in wins (18), ERA (2.39) and strikeouts (228)...became the third pitcher in franchise history and the 22<sup>nd</sup> pitcher in Major League history to win the Triple Crown, joining Justin Verlander (2011) and Hal Newhouser (1945).
- Started three games during the postseason, compiling a 1-1 record with a 2.37 ERA (5ER/19.0IP) and 20 strikeouts...started his playoff career by not allowing a run in 17.0 consecutive innings, tied for the fifth-longest streak in MLB history and longest since Ian Anderson started his postseason career with 17.2 straight scoreless innings in 2020.

- Earned a spot on his first career Opening Day roster after a standout spring camp, during which he didn't allow a single earned run over 10.2 innings (nine games) of relief...went 1-0, surrendering seven hits and three walks while striking out nine.
- Appeared in 21 games (three starts) for the Tigers in 2024, posting a 1-1 record with a 1.84 ERA (6ER/29.1IP), six walks and 23 strikeouts...also made 34 appearances with Triple-A Toledo last year, going 1-2 with one save, a 5.17 ERA (27ER/47.0IP) and 53 strikeouts.
- Made his first career Major League start on Aug. 8 at Seattle...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, became the first Tigers pitcher to finish and then start consecutive games since Steve Sparks, who finished the July 26, 2000, game vs. Tampa Bay and started on July 27, 2000, at Texas.
- Allowed only one earned run over 13 outings from Aug. 4-Sept. 7, posting a 0.49 ERA (1ER/18.1IP) with 13 hits allowed, three walks and 12 strikeouts.
