METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Angels, 11-6, last night...New York is 7-3 in rubber games this year...The Mets are seeking their 14th series victory of the season...New York is 13-3-2 in 18 series this year...The Mets finish their final series of a 10-game, 11-day California road trip (4-5)...They have faced the Dodgers (2-2), Padres (1-2) and Angels (1-1)...The Mets are off tomorrow before they return home for a seven-game homestand against the Brewers (three games) and Marlins (four games).

HAPPY BIRTHDAY: LHP Thomas Szapucki celebrates his 26th birthday today... Tomorrow, catcher James McCann will turn 32...He is currently on the 10-Day IL recovering from a fracture of the left hamate.

IT'S BEEN AWHILE: The Mets are facing the Angels for the first time since May 19-21, 2017 at Citi Field and play for the first time in Angel Stadium since April 11-13, 2014... The Mets were slated to play the Angels in California from August 18-20, 2020... Francisco Lindor has hit three doubles and five home runs in 17 career games at the ballpark.

THEY'RE OUT OF OUR LEAGUE: The Mets continue Interleague play against the Angels tonight...The Mets are 2-3 this year against the American League...The Mets went 9-11 in Interleague play in 2021...The team's .510 winning percentage (228-219) is the second-best mark in the Senior Circuit vs. AL clubs since Interleague play began in 1997.

ANGELS-METS NOTES: The Mets are making just their fourth appearance at Angel Stadium...It's the first appearance since April 11-13, 2014 (1-2)...The have also played at the ballpark from June 16-18, 2008 (2-1) and June 13-15, 2003 (2-1)

HURTS DONUT: The Mets have been plunked a major league leading 40 times this year...The Mets have been hit 274 times since the start of the 2019 season...That is first in the majors in that span...Since 2019, Mark Canha has been plunked 60 times, which is the second-most in the majors...Pete Alonso ranks sixth with 46 HBP, while Starling Marte is seventh with 42 HBP and Jeff McNeil is ninth at 36 HBP.

THE GUILLORME CHEF: Luis Guillorme is one of 11 players in the majors with more walks than strikeouts this year (min. 100 PA)...He has 18 walks and 15 strikeouts this season...After batting .071 (11-14) in his first eight games, Guillorme is batting .365 (35-96) with 20 runs, five doubles, a home run, six RBI, 15 walks, a steal with a .450 OBP, a .448 SLG and an .898 OPS over his last 33 games...Among players with 100 or more plate appearances, Guillorme's .422 OBP is third in the majors and the-best in the NL.

RISPY BUSINESS: The Mets are second in the majors and top the NL with a .290 average with runners in scoring position...They rank third in MLB with a .359 OBP and fourth with a .456 SLG in those situations...Jeff McNeil - .388 (19-49), Tomás Nido - .379 (11-29), Mark Canha - .354 (17-48), Pete Alonso - .340 (18-53), J.D. Davis - .333 (8-24), and Francisco Lindor - .308 (18-61) are all hitting .300 or better with RISP... Alonso leads the majors with 41 RBI in RISP situations and has nine home runs with runner(s) in scoring position this year, three more than any other hitter in the majors.

FOGO POWER: Eduardo Escobar is on a five-game hitting streak, batting .450 (9-20) with five runs, three doubles, a triple, a home run and six RBI in that span...Over his last 18 games, Escobar is batting .333 (25-75) with 12 runs, seven doubles, a triple, three home runs, 15 RBI with a .573 SLG and an .898 OPS...He is batting .328/.362/.641 against left-handed pitching this season.

TOMÁS THE TANK ENGINE: Over his last 12 games, Tomás Nido is batting .351 (12-37) with seven runs, a double, six RBI and three walks...Over his last 21 games, he is batting .297 (18-64) with seven runs, two doubles, eight RBI, five walks with a .348 OBP...He has raised his batting average from .188 to .255 in 25 games since May 1.

ROAD TRIPPIN': New York is 20-14 on the road this year...Their .588 road winning percentage is the fifth-best in the majors and is the third-best in the NL...The Mets finished the first-half of the 2021 season going 19-26 on the road...They did not record their 20th road win until July 18 in 2021 (20-28)...New York is batting .259/.327/.399 away from Citi Field...Their .259 road average ranks second in the majors, while their .327 OBP ranks fourth.

BY THE WAY: New York has won 39 games this season, the most in the National League...Their .639 winning percentage is second in the majors and is the best in the NL...The team has posted a 39-22 record through the team's first 61 games...Only the 1986 (44-17) team posted a better record through the first 61 games of the season... The 1988 team also went 39-22.

UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, DAVIS: Over his last 15 games, J.D. Davis is batting .346 (18-52) with 10 runs, four doubles, six RBI, four walks with a .397 OBP, a .423 SLG and an .820 OPS in that span...Over his last 24 games, Davis is batting .278/.337/.367... He owns a .313/.392/.448 slashline in 23 road games, compared to a .170/.264/.213 slashline in 16 games at Citi Field in 2022.

ROAD WARRIOR: Pete Alonso is batting .273/.322/.545 with 10 home runs and 32 RBI on the road this year...He owns a lifetime .942 OPS on the road...His .943 OPS is the highest in franchise history (min. 900 PA)...His .583 SLG on the road is also the best in franchise history...In 2022, his 10 road homers are tied for third in the majors and are the most in the NL...His 32 RBI on the road are second-most in the majors and top the NL.

RIGHT AWAY: The Mets are batting .272/.339/.418 against right-handed pitchers this year...Their .272 average and .339 OBP against righties is the best in The Show...Jeff McNeil tops the NL with a .336 (49-146) average against right-handed pitchers...Pete Alonso is tied for 10th in the NL with a .295 (52-176) mark, while Starling Marte is 12th in the Senior Circuit with a .292 (45-154) average...The Mets are 28-12 when facing a right-handed pitcher this year.

EL JEFF-E: Jeff McNeil's .324 (35-108) road batting average is the fifth-best in the Senior Circuit and 11th in the majors...He ranks 11th in the majors and fifth in the National League with a .312 batting average...His batting average has not dropped below .300 since it was .280 on April 22...He is hitting .336 (49-146) with 11 doubles, a triple, three home runs, 10 walks with a .384 OBP and a .486 SLG against right-handed pitchers this season...His .336 average against righties is sixth in the majors and is the best in National League.

MULTIPLICITY: Jeff McNeil has 21 multi-hit games this year which is third in the majors and the most in the National League...He has collected 131 multi-hit games in his career...That places him 36th in franchise history...Joel Youngblood and Ken Boswell are tied at 34th with 132 multi-hit games...Pete Alonso has recorded 106 career multi-hit games, placing him tied for 53rd with Asdrubal Cabrera in team history...Dave Kingman is 51st with 107 multi-hit games.

STRIKE THAT: The Mets ranked third in the majors with 551 strikeouts this season... Only the Milwaukee Brewers (577) and the Atlanta Braves (565) have struck out more batters this year...New York owns a 3.08 strikeout per walk ratio this year...That is tied with the Giants for the second-best ratio in the NL...The trail only the Dodgers (3.42).

STRIKE THAT: The Mets batters have struck out 456 times this year...That is the eighth-fewest strikeouts in MLB and the third-fewest in the NL...They have struck out 19.5% this year...The Mets are one of four teams who have struck out less than 20% this season... Their 19.5% strikeout rate is third in the majors and second in the NL.

TWO-OUT POWER: New York leads the majors with 118 two-out RBI this year...The club's .249 batting average with two outs is seventh in the majors and fourth in the National League...The Mets have hit .200/.273/.282 with two strikes this year...Their .200 batting average is the best in the majors, as is their .273 OBP.

DOMINATING DÍAZ: Edwin Díaz has recorded 11 saves this season, tied for the ninth-most in the majors...He is second in the major leagues and first in the NL among relievers with 43 strikeouts...His 16.35 strikeouts per nine innings is the best in the majors...He has struck out 43 of the 94 batters he faced, good for 45.7%...He is 2-1 with 11 saves, a 2.28 ERA (six earned runs/23.2 innings), allowing 16 hits and 10 walks...The Mets are 23-1 when Díaz appears in a game this year.

ED, EDD AND EDDY: Edwin Díaz has recorded 74 saves as a member of the Mets... That places him ninth on the franchise's all-time list...Next up is Francisco Rodriguez who recorded 83 as a member of the Mets...He has recorded 183 saves in his career, which places him sixth on the active list...Since arriving in New York, Díaz is 10-14 with 74 saves, a 3.76 ERA (71 earned runs/170.0 innings) with 69 walks and 281 strikeouts... His 281 strikeouts as a reliever in that span is the third-highest total in the majors... Only Liam Hendriks (309) and Josh Hader (301) have struck out more...Additionally, his 279 strikeouts are the 10th most by a reliever in franchise history...Seth Lugo is ninth with 287...Aaron Heilman is eighth with 289.

WALKER NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Suffered the loss in his second consecutive start after allowing four earned runs on five hits over 6.0 innings on June 7 against the Padres at Petco Park...Threw a season-high 103 pitches.

NO FLY ZONE: Walker has allowed just three home runs in 46.2 innings this season, good for a 0.46 HR/9 ratio...That ranks 20th in the majors and 12th in the NL among pitchers with at least 40.0 innings...Prior to his last start, Walker had gone five starts without yielding a long ball, totaling 29.2 innings...The streak ended after he allowed a lead-off home run to Jurickson Profar.

VS. LOS ANGELES - AL: Walker will make his eighth career start against the Angels tonight...Walker is 3-3 with a 5.70 ERA (23 earned runs/36.1 innings) in seven career starts against the Halos... In two starts at Angel Stadium Walker is 2-0 with a 0.56 ERA (one earned run/16.0 innings)...On September 13, 2016, Walker threw a three-hit complete game, shutout with 11 strikeouts and zero walks.

SPLIT-FINGER SUCCESS: In eight starts this season, Walker has used his splitter just over 30% of the time and has held opposing hitters a .174 (12-69) batting average in at-bats ending in the pitch...17 of Walker's 25 strikeouts this season have come via the splitter.

FEW K, THAT'S OK: Through eight starts this season, Walker is 3-2 with a 3.28 ERA (17 earned runs/46.2 IP) with 25 strikeouts...Walker is one of 10 starting pitchers in the last 10 seasons to strikeout out 25 or fewer batters and sport a sub-3.50 ERA through their first nine starts (Min. 40.0 IP)...The last Mets starter to strikeout 25 or fewer batters and have a sub-3.50 ERA through their first nine starts of the season was Pete Schourek in 1992.

JOYFUL IN JUNE: In 20 June starts, Walker is 11-6 with a 3.25 ERA (46 earned runs/17.1 innings) his best totals for any month...Has 120 strikeouts in June, tied with April for the most in a month...Last season, Walker went 2-2 with a 3.26 ERA (11 earned runs/30.0 innings) in five June starts...His 33 strikeouts last season in June were the most in any month.

ROAD IMPROVEMENT: In six road starts this season, Walker is 2-2 with a 3.41 ERA (12 earned runs/31.2 innings)...Last season, Walker went 3-7 with a 5.82 ERA (44 earned runs/68.0 innings) in 14 road starts.

LIMITING LEFTIES: Since 2021, Walker has held left-handed batters to .194 (61-314) average, the seventh best mark among right-handed pitchers in that span (min. 200 left-handed batters faced)...Since his debut year, 2013, Walker has limited left-handed batters to a .229 (328-1431) average, 10th-best among right-handed arms during that span (min. 1,500 LHB faced).

DEFENSE WINS CHAMPIONSHIPS: Last season, Walker tied a career-high with four pickoffs, tied for the fifth most in the majors and the most among right-handed pitchers last season...In his second start of the season, Walker picked off Nick Castellanos at first base..The righty also posted a career-high 33 assists which ranked second in the National League and third in the majors, as well as a career-high 16 putouts which tied for 10th in the National League.

TUESDAY'S STARTER: RHP CHRIS BASSITT (4-4, 4.35)

LAST TIME OUT: In his first career start at Petco Park on June 8, Bassitt allowed seven runs (six earned) in 3.1 innings, his shortest outing of the season...Bassitt struck out six batters and issued two walks.

NEVER SAY NEVER: In 118 career games (105 starts), Bassitt has allowed six or more runs nine times...Bassitt has given up four or more runs 27 times...He has surrendered three runs or fewer in his remaining 78 starts...Bassitt's eight runs allowed on May 24 were the most he has ever allowed in a start.

- Hit two homers and drove in five on June 4 at Los Angeles-NL...Was his 13th career multi-homer game (tied for most since 2019).
- Has a 1.354 OPS with runners in scoring position, going 18-53 (.340/.467/.887) with two doubles, nine homers, 41 RBI and 15 walks.
- After putting up a .744 OPS in April, owns a .991 OPS since May 1 (10th-best in MLB)...Set a Mets record with 30 RBI in May...Willie Montañez (1978) had the old mark with 28 RBI in May...He is the seventh Met with 30+ RBI in a calendar month.
